1) Geological Engineering Exam

The Board conducted a geological engineering examination workshop on December 11 at the Board office. Dr. Jack Warner guided the participants through the processes to validate the geological engineering examination that was administered in October and to expand the pool of items. Arizona and Idaho administered the examination in October.

The State of Mississippi has indicated an interest in participating in the future development

of the examination and the utilization of the examination.

2) Staff Training

Susan Skrzycki completed mediation training presented through South Mountain Community College this month. The training is a Maricopa County Justice Court training program and the presenter was a former Arizona Assistant Attorney General. Susan will start on the next phase of the program after the holidays. She will provide pro bono mediation services in sixteen Justice Court cases to complete her certification requirements. All investigators will be attending a class on Managing Multiple Priorities in the next month.

2005 Registration Boards Forum Las Vegas, Nevada March 19, 2005

Hosted by the
National Society of Professional Surveyors (NSPS)
A member of the
American Congress on Surveying and Mapping (ACSM)

I have not yet received a copy of the minutes and attendance information but there were approximately twenty Board members present, a representative from the American Society of Photogrammetry and Remote Sensing (ASPRM) and several private surveyors

The following subjects were discussed:

- Model Law for Surveying Status of photogrammetry and GIS in various jurisdictions: Several states currently license photogrammetrists as a separate discipline and the representative from ASPRM expressed the desire for more states to either license photogrammetrists separately or as a separate category of land surveying. This led to more discussion on possible categories of land surveying but no consensus was reached.
 NCEES has developed a photogrammetry exam but they do not yet have the necessary ten states requesting the exam.
- 2. Status of photogrammetry and GIS in various jurisdictions. A few states license photogrammetrists but most, like Arizona, require photogrammetry to be performed under the direction of a Land Surveyor. There was a lot of discussion as to whether the states should consider separate registration for photogrammetrist and GIS people or to create sub-categories of land surveying, similar the branches of engineering now licensed. No consensus was reached.
- 3. <u>State Specific exams:</u> This was a lively topic for the private surveyors. The different ways that the states deal with the exam ranged from Wyoming, (they mail the exam to out of state applicants and the pass rate is a surprising 100 %!) to California (taken onsite with a pass rate of less than 10%).

The consensus was that state specific exams are necessary due to the different state laws but the states should make the exam more accessible and not, like certain states, use the exam as a barrier to out-of-state registrants. Suggestions ranged from mailing the exam to applicants to providing an online method for out of state applicants to take the exam.

4. <u>Calculator policy</u>: Ms. Rita M. Lumos, from the NCEES, presented an update on the calculator policy and mentioned that the fall LSIT exam will be a new test. As of April 2004 the NCEES restricted the calculator type to "no text editing or communication abilities". Beginning with the fall exam only the following calculators may be used: HP 33's, HP 9's, Casio – FX 115 MS & FX 115 MS + ("SR" ok), TI 30X IIS & TI 30X IIB, and TI 36X Solar.

- 5. Four Year Degree Requirements: Various states continue to push for a requirement that only graduates from an accredited four year degree survey program be allowed to apply for registration as Land Surveyors. No consensus was reached on this but representatives from the NCEES did state that the LSIT exam continues to be modified so that a non-college educated surveyor will have a difficult time passing the exam. It was interesting to note that while graduates of the (few) four year programs did much better on the LSIT exam, the differences between those taking the Professional exam were negligible.
- 6. Responsible charge issues: I missed part of this as I had to leave early due to another commitment and will have more information when I receive a copy of the meeting minutes. There is a growing concern over how an out-of-state survey firm can ensure the quality of a local survey. Some states have addressed this by having requirements that the firm have an in-state office, manned by a local registrant. Another concern was that of how a registrant can supervise work that is outsourced to another country or state. This is a bigger issue with the photogrammetry industry but is getting to be an issue with GPS data processing. No clear cut answers here but something the boards need to be thinking about.
- 7. Online Processor User Service (OPUS): This is a service provided by the National Geodetic Survey. It allows a GPS user to occupy a point, record data, and send the data (via email) to NGS for processing. The results are usually returned within an hour. The results are not "survey grade" but do allow one to get a Latitude and Longitude of a point in a remote area without differential processing. The results are generally in the submeter range depending upon how long the station is occupied. I am not sure why this was being discussed as it has not been a problem in Arizona and is generally used only by surveyors.
- 8. <u>Board Consolidation</u>: The pressure to consolidate boards (see California's attempt) was discussed. Again, I was not present for this discussion but am sure that Ron is well aware of what the other states and Arizona are doing.
- 9. <u>E & O Requirements</u>: Some states are looking at adding rules which would require the registrant to carry E & O insurance. I don't think that this is something that the boards want to get involved with unless a specific problem or public protection need can be identified.

Other notes: Study guides for the new LSIT exam will be available in May on the NCEES website.

Current statutes permit licensure for architects, engineers, geologists, and landscape architects after eight years of education, experience, and completion of required examinations.

Current rules require completion of eight years of education and experience before an applicant is considered qualified to take the required examinations.

The rule changes:

- Permit application and approval to take the required examination for architect, engineer, geologist, and landscape architect applicants after 72 months of education and experience;
- · Separate applications for examination from applications for licensure;
- Make it possible for an applicant to meet all requirements for registration at the eight year level without waiting to take the examination;
- Clarify the Board's ability to recognize national exam scores not administered by the Board;
- Clarify that communication between applicants and national councils about exams administered by outside agencies is between the applicant and the examining agency;
- Clarify that Home Inspectors are not included in those groups using multi-division exams and division scoring;

The preliminary summary of the economic, small business, and consumer impact:

There are significant positive economic impacts for applicants who complete required testing before reaching the required eight years of education and experience. By beginning the testing process at the 72 month education and experience level, the applicant has an opportunity to determine whether there is a need for additional education or experience in specific areas by an evaluation of his or her

examination results and may take steps to gain additional knowledge in areas of weakness and still complete the examination before reaching the 96 month and experience level required for registration. Early completion of the examination process allows the applicant to meet all registration requirements at the eight year level rather than begin the examination process at that education and experience level. The positive economic impact is the difference in the applicant's salary for the period of time that it takes the applicant to complete the examination process.

There are moderate positive impacts on small businesses and consumers due to a larger pool of qualified registrants.

- A. An applicant for professional registration as an architect, assayer, engineer, geologist, landscape architect, or land surveyor shall submit an original and one copy of a completed application package for professional registration that contains the following:

Applicants shall arrange to have their examination results sent directly to the Board from the applicable testing agency holding the examination results;
 - 2. The information set forth in subsections (B)(1) through (15); Name, residence address, mailing address if different from residence, and telephone number, of the applicant;
 - 3. The applicable fee. Date of birth and social security number of the applicant;
 - 4. Citizenship or legal residence of the applicant;
 - Category, and branch of engineering if applicable, for which the applicant is seeking registration;
 - 6. A detailed explanatory statement and documentation, regarding;
 - a. Any disciplinary action, including suspension and revocation, taken by any state or jurisdiction on any professional or occupational registration, certification, or license held by the applicant in any state or jurisdiction;
 - b. Refusal of any professional or occupational registration, certification, or license to the applicant by any state or jurisdiction:

If an applicant cannot supply the names and addresses of supervisors for at least three engagements, the applicant shall provide to the Board a written, sworn statement explaining the inability to provide this information, and the names and addresses of three references, unrelated to the applicant, at least two of whom are registered in the category for which registration is sought, unless previously provided to the Board pursuant to R4-30-204;
- 13. A release authorizing the Board to investigate the applicant's education, experience, moral character, and repute;

- 14. Certificate of Experience Record and Reference Forms from the applicant's present and past immediate supervisors, unless previously provided to the Board pursuant to R4-30-204. The applicant shall also provide Certificate of Experience Record and Reference Forms from additional references as required by the Board. The applicant shall provide the name, address, and telephone numbers of all references. The applicant shall ensure that completed reference forms are provided to the Board;
- 15. Evidence of successful completion, or waiver by the Board, of the applicable in-training examination, unless previously provided to the Board pursuant to R4-30-204. An applicant for registration who has successfully completed an in-training examination in another jurisdiction in the category for which registration is sought equivalent to the examination for that category administered in Arizona shall submit proof of examination directly from the authority that administered the original examination. An applicant seeking professional registration as an architect or landscape architect may take the in-training examination at the same time as the professional examination. An applicant seeking professional registration as an assayer, engineer, geologist or land surveyor shall pass the applicable in-training examination before admission to the professional examination:
- 16. Certification that the information provided to the Board is accurate, true and complete; and3.17. The applicable fee.
- B. An applicant who wishes to sit for professional examination shall submit an original and one copy of a completed application for professional examination, and provide the following:
 - 1. Name, residence address, mailing address if different from residence, and telephone number of the applicant;
 - 2. Date of birth and social security number of the applicant;
 - 3. Citizenship or legal residence;
 - Category, and branch of engineering if applicable, for which the applicant is seeking registration;
 - 5. A detailed explanatory statement, regarding:
 - a. Any disciplinary action, including suspension and revocation, taken by any state or

jurisdiction on any professional or occupational registration, certification, or license held by the applicant in any state or jurisdiction;

- b. Refusal of any professional or occupational registration, certification, or license by any state or jurisdiction;
- c. Any pending disciplinary action in any state or jurisdiction on any professional or occupational registration, certification, or license held by the applicant;
- d. Any alias or other name used by the applicant; and
- e. Any conviction for a felony or misdemeanor, other than a minor traffic violation.

 6. State or jurisdiction in which any other professional or occupational registration, certification, or license is held, type of registration, certification, or license number, year granted, how registration, certification, or licensure was granted (that is, by examination, education, experience, or reciprocity), and the number of examination hours taken by the applicant;
- 7. Name of the state or jurisdiction, the type of professional or occupational registration, certification, or license the applicant is seeking, and the current status of any professional or occupational application for registration, certification, or license pending in any state or jurisdiction;
- 8. Name, mailing address, years attended, graduation date, major, and type of degree received from each college, university, or educational institution the applicant attended.
- Certified transcripts sent directly to the Board from the registrar of each college, university, or educational institution the applicant attended.
- 10. Name, current address, and telephone number of the applicant's current and former employers in the category for which registration is sought; dates of employment; applicant's title; description of the work performed, and number of hours worked per week;
- 11. Names and addresses of immediate supervisors in past and present employment in the category for which registration is sought. Applicants who have been working in the category for which registration is sought for ten or more years shall provide the names and addresses of all immediate supervisors during the most recent ten year period. If an applicant cannot supply the names and addresses of supervisors for at least three engagements, the applicant shall provide to

the Board a written, sworn statement explaining the inability to provide this information, and the names and addresses of three additional references, unrelated to the applicant, at least two of whom are registered in the category for which registration is sought;

- 12. A release authorizing the Board to investigate the applicant's education, experience, moral character and repute;
- 13. Certificate of Experience Record and Reference Forms from the applicant's present and past immediate supervisors. The applicant shall also provide Certificate of Experience Record and Reference Forms to additional references as required by the Board. The applicant shall provide the name, address, and telephone numbers of all references. The applicant shall ensure that completed reference forms are provided to the Board;
- 14. Evidence of successful completion, or waiver by the Board, of the applicable in training examination. An applicant for professional registration, who has successfully completed an intraining examination in another jurisdiction in the category for which registration is sought equivalent to the examination for that category administered in Arizona, shall submit proof of examination directly from the authority that administered the original examination. An applicant seeking professional registration as an architect or landscape architect may take the in training examination at the same time as the professional examination. An applicant seeking professional registration as an assayer, engineer, geologist, or land surveyor shall pass the applicable in training examination before admission to the professional examination;
- 15. Certification that the information provided to the Board is accurate, true, and complete.

 B. If an applicant does not have the required education and experience for registration, the Board may, upon request of the applicant, hold the application for a period of time that does not exceed one year from the date the application is filed with the Board. All time-frames adopted pursuant to Title 41. Chapter 6.

 Article 7.1 are suspended during the above-referenced time.
- C. An applicant holding a certificate of qualification issued by one of the national registration bodies recognized in R4-30-203(B) shall arrange to have the record forwarded to the Board by the national registration body. If the forms provided by the national registration body contain all the information described in A.R.S. § 32-122.01 and subsection (B) (A), the Board may accept the forms in lieu of

requiring the applicant to furnish the information directly to the Board.

- D. The Board staff shall review all applications and, if necessary, refer completed applications to an advisory committee for evaluation. If the application for registration is complete and in the proper form and the Board staff or committee is satisfied that all statements on the application are true and that the applicant is eligible in all other aspects to be registered in the field for which the application was filed, the Board staff or committee shall recommend that the Board certify the applicant as eligible to take the examination or if exempt from examination pursuant to statute or rule, as eligible for registration. If for any reason the Board staff or committee is not satisfied that all of the statements on the application are true or that the applicant is eligible in all respects for examination or registration, the board Board staff shall make a further investigation of the applicant. The Board staff and committee shall submit recommendations to the Board for approval. The Board may also require an applicant to submit additional oral or written information if the applicant has not furnished satisfactory evidence of qualifications for examination or registration.
- E. The Board may permit an applicant who has successfully satisfied the requirements of an intern development program approved by the Board to qualify for an appropriate examination, accept documentation that an applicant has passed a written national examination in the area for which registration is sought from a national council of which the Board is a member or a professional association approved by the Board.
- F. The Board shall not accept an application for registration renewal unless the applicant has responded to the questions on the application relating to good moral character and other misconduct and signed the application for renewal. The Board shall return an incomplete application to the applicant which may result in assessment of a delinquent renewal fee under R4-30-106.
- G. An applicant may withdraw an application for registration by written request to the Board. Any fee paid by the applicant is non-refundable. If an applicant withdraws an application, the Board shall close the file. An applicant whose file has been closed and who later wishes to apply for professional registration shall submit a new application package to the Board pursuant to R4-30-201 and R4-30-202.

R4-30-204 Examinations

A. An applicant with at least 72 but less than 96 months of required education and experience who wishes to sit for the professional examination for architecture, assaying, engineering, geology, landscape architecture or land surveying shall submit an original and one copy of a completed application package for professional examination that contains the following:

- 1. Name, residence address, mailing address if different from residence, and telephone number, of the applicant;
- 2. Date of birth and social security number of the applicant;
- 3. Citizenship or legal residence;
- 4. Category, and branch of engineering if applicable, for which the applicant is seeking registration;
- 5. Name, mailing address, years attended, graduation date, major, and type of degree received from each college, university, or educational institution the applicant attended;
- Certified transcripts sent directly to the Board from the registrar of each college, university, or educational institution the applicant attended;
- 7. Evidence of 72 months of required education or experience in the category for which registration is sought. The name, current address, and telephone number of the applicant's current and former employers in the category for which registration is sought; dates of employment; applicant's title; description of work performed; and number of hours worked per week;
- 8. Names and addresses of immediate supervisors in past and present employment in the category for which registration is sought. If an applicant cannot supply the names and addresses of supervisors for at least three engagements, the applicant shall provide to the Board a written, sworn statement explaining the inability to provide this information, and the names and addresses of three additional references, unrelated to the applicant, at least two of whom are registered in the category for which registration is sought;
- 9. A release authorizing the Board to investigate the applicant's education and experience;
- 10. Certificate of Experience Record and Reference Forms from the applicant's present and past

immediate supervisors. The applicant shall also provide Certificate of Experience Record and Reference Forms from additional references as required by the Board. The applicant shall provide the name, address, and telephone numbers of all references. The applicant shall ensure that completed reference forms are provided to the Board;

- 11. Evidence of successful completion, or waiver by the Board, of the applicable in-training examination. An applicant who has successfully completed an in-training examination in another jurisdiction in the category for which registration is sought equivalent to the examination for that category administered in Arizona shall submit proof of examination directly from the authority that administered the original examination. An applicant seeking professional registration as an architect, or landscape architect may take the in-training examination at the same time as the professional examination. An applicant seeking professional registration as an assayer, engineer, geologist, or land surveyor shall pass the applicable in-training examination before admission to the professional examination;
- Certification that the information provided to the Board is accurate, true, and complete; and
 The applicable fees.
- B. An applicant with at least 96 months of required education and experience who wishes to sit for the professional examination for architecture, assaying, engineering, geology, landscape architecture or land surveying may submit a combined application for examination and registration that contains the information required in subsection (A) and R4-30-201, and shall pay the applicable fee.
- C. The Board staff shall review all applications and, if necessary, refer completed applications to an advisory committee for evaluation. If the application for examination is complete and in the proper form and the Board staff or committee is satisfied that all statements on the application are true and that the applicant is eligible to take the examination, the Board staff or committee shall recommend that the Board certify the applicant as eligible to take the examination or exempt from the examination requirement. If for any reason the Board staff or committee is not satisfied that all of the statements on the application are true or that the applicant is eligible in all respects for examination, the Board staff shall make a further investigation of the applicant.
- A. D. All examinations An examination administered by the Board shall be given at the times and places

determined by the Board. Once the Board approves an applicant to sit for any a Board-administered examination, the applicant shall communicate all questions and concerns regarding extensions and refunds to the applicable testing agency Board. The applicant shall make any request for additional time or other special examination accommodation to the Board within a reasonable time before the examination date.

The Board shall not refund any examination fee paid to a testing agency.

B. E. An applicant who fails to achieve a passing grade on any division of any examination administered by the Board may request re-examination by notifying the Board in writing of the applicant's desire to retake the examination and paying the applicable examination fee. An applicant who re-takes any examination shall advise the Board of any changes in the information provided under R4-30-201(B) subsection A of this Section and R4-30-202(B) within 30 days from the date of the change. The Board shall close an applicant's file if the Board does not receive written confirmation from the applicant of the applicant's desire to re-take the Board-administered examination within one year from the request for re-examination. An applicant whose file has been closed and who later wishes to apply for professional registration examination shall submit a new examination application package to the Board pursuant to R4-30-201 and R4-30-202.

E. F. An applicant, except for a home inspector applicant, who has failed any division of a multi-divisional examination shall be re-examined only on the division failed. The Board shall deny an application if the applicant fails to pass all divisions of an examination within five years after first taking any division of an examination. The applicant shall submit a new application for examination, and retake and pass any division of the examination, except the in-training examination, with results that are five or more years old.

D. G. An applicant for a Board-administered examination who wishes to review the applicant's examination scores shall file a written request wit the Board within 30 days after receiving notification of the failing grade. The applicant may review an examination by making prior arrangements with the staff and paying the applicable fee. The applicant shall complete any review within 60 days of the request for a review. In reviewing multiple choice questions, an applicant may review only those questions that were incorrect.

E. H. An applicant who desires a re-grade of an examination and, where applicable, has exhausted all remedies for regarding with the applicable testing agency, shall file a written request with the Board within

30 days after receiving notification of the failing grade or within 30 days after reviewing the examination, whichever is applicable, and pay the applicable fee. The applicant shall identify the questions to be reviewed. The applicant shall state why a review of the item is justified. The applicant shall provide specific facts, data, and references to support any assertion that the solution deserves more credit. The Board shall determine whether it will re-grade the examination or whether it will send the examination to the applicable testing agency for re-grading.

- F. If an applicant does not have the required education and experience, the Board may hold the application for a period of time not exceeding one year upon request of the applicant. All time frames adopted pursuant to Title 41, Chapter 6, Article 7.1 are suspended during the above referenced time.

 G. An applicant may withdraw an application for registration or designation by written request to the Board. Any fee paid by the applicant is non refundable. If an applicant withdraws an application, the Board shall close the file. An applicant whose file has been closed and who later wishes to apply for professional registration or in training designation shall submit a new application package to the Board pursuant to R4 30 201 and R4 30 202.
- L. Examinations administered by a national council of which the Board is a member or a professional association approved by the Board shall be given at the times and places determined by the testing agency. Once approved to sit for a non-Board-administered examination, the applicant shall communicate all questions and concerns regarding extensions, additional time, special accommodation, re-examination, and refunds to the applicable testing agency. The Board shall not refund any examination fee paid to a testing agency.
- J. The Board shall deny an application for registration as a architect, assayer, engineer, geologist, landscape architect, or land surveyor if the applicant fails to pass all divisions of the applicable examination within five years after first taking any division of the examination.

Firm registration

The Board directed staff to develop a program for the issuance of annual notices of re-application for firm registration. Staff has worked with a vendor to develop a computerized notice to be mailed to firms. We will test the program in November and December by pulling up the list of firms expiring in each month and comparing the list to the notices to be mailed to ensure that all firms expiring in each month are on the list. All firm registrations will expire on the last day of the specified month.

The program will consist of a query that lists all firms expiring in the specified month. A second query will be initiated of the computer database which will consist of instructions to create an application form for all firms expiring in the specified month. The printed forms will be cross checked to the list and then the forms will be mailed out no later than 45 days prior to expiration.

Staff will be asking for a fee of \$25 to cover costs of the program at the November meeting.

Once the program starts, any firm not filing a completed application and submitting the proper fee by the last day of the expiring registration month will be deemed to not be registered and any practice or advertising after the end of the month without a proper registration will subject both the firm, and its responsible registrant, to a civil penalty for unlicensed practice and investigation costs. Applications will be deemed to have been timely filed if the application is postmarked on, or before, the last day of the month of expiration.

On-line renewal of individual registrations

Staff has been working with the Government Information Technology Agency and IBM to develop the ability to accept renewal of individual registrations over the internet utilizing credit cards. It is anticipated that this program will become operational by the end of March. The technology is already in use by the Department of Motor Vehicles and the Real Estate Department. I have been employed continuously by Fanning, Fanning and Agnew, Inc., Consulting Engineers, since April 29, 1976. From that date to September 1, 1978, I worked as a part time employee during the school year and as a full time employee during three summers. My duties during that period of time included drafting contract drawings under the direct supervision of Registered Professional Engineers. I was given sketches of heating, ventilating, air conditioning, plumbing, lighting and power designs for commercial and institutional buildings and transcribed them into scaled engineering drawings.

From the dates of September 1, 1978 to August 20, 1982 I attended Texas Tech University in Mechanical Engineering. I worked as a part time employee while attending classes in the fall and spring semesters of this time period. I worked full time during the summers of 1979, 1980 and 1981. As I better interpreted instructions from my supervisors during this time period, I was given increasingly more responsibility in system design, specifically in sizing components of heating, ventilating and air conditioning systems.

During this time period, a typical assignment included meeting with the Project Engineer and receiving instructions with the specific requirements of a job, including the necessary information required to estimate the heating and air conditioning loads of the building. I was also told the type of heating and air conditioning system which was to be used for the particular job, based on the judgement of the Project Engineer and meetings with the client and/or owner. I then calculated the load of the building, sized and layed out the components of the system, and drafted the drawings. At the end of each project, the Project Engineer then checked all calculations and selections and critiqued the project design. I made the necessary corrections and the job was delivered to the architect or the owner.

My experience during this time period was valuable to me because I concurrently attended college and was able to relate the theoretical knowledge I was gaining to each project assignment. My mentor during this period was Jack F. Roberts, P.E., Texas # 9325. I worked on several jobs which were built in New Mexico.

I graduated from the College of Engineering at Texas Tech University on August 20, 1982. I received a Bachelor of Science in Mechanical Engineering. From that time until February 20, 1987, I was employed continuously as a Project Engineer. My duties under this engagement consisted of selecting the heating and air conditioning system for the job based on my judgement and input from the client or owner, coordinating the design with the architect, owner, structural engineer, electrical engineer, utility company, building official and code requirements, producing contract documents (drawings and specifications), presiding at bid openings, reviewing submittals and shop drawings for compliance with the contract documents, reviewing pay requests by the contractor, and performing site inspections concluding with the final inspection.

During this period of my employment at Fanning, Fanning & Associates, Inc., my direct supervisors were Registered Professional Engineers in Texas and other states. At the end of a project, a registered principal Engineer in the firm performed a quality control review of my work and sealed the contract documents.

During the course of my duties, on a typical job, I performed the following engineering activities:

Pressure relationships are monitored and alarmed with room pressure monitors. A modular boiler provides heating water to the reheat coils. An air cooled

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packaged chiller provides chilled water for the HVAC system. An RO system feeds a gas-fired humidifier to maintain humidity levels in the lab. Controls include a full web-based DDC system capable of offsite notification and alarming, with auto-paging.

Electrical systems include an emergency generator that serves all critical lab functions. Existing labs in the main building were added to the generator. Multiple transfer switches have been provided for reliable electric service to the lab. Security system included video surveillance of the lab, and security cameras for adjacent corridors. Proximity card readers provide access control. The fire alarm system for the building is fully addressable.

All MPE components were integrated into the air-tight lab space. All HVAC and electrical system components are accessible from outside the lab space for added security.

Director's Report December 2005

Rule Package Status Report R4-30-201, 204, & 214. Approved by GRRC. Published 9-2. Final as of 10-1-06.

R4-30-208. A docket has been opened and will remain open for one year from the date of opening (12-27-04). If the Board has not filed a notice of proposed rule making by that date the docket will automatically terminate.

Firm registration

The Board directed staff to develop a program for the issuance of annual notices of re-application for firm registration. Staff has worked with a vendor to develop a computerized notice to be mailed to firms. We started testing the program in November. The program is expected to be fully implemented 1-1-06.

The program will consist of a query that lists all firms expiring in the specified month. A second query will be initiated of the computer database which will consist of instructions to create an application form for all firms expiring in the specified month. The printed forms will be cross checked to the list and then the forms will be mailed out no later than 45 days prior to expiration.

Any firm not filing a completed application and submitting the proper fee by the last day of the expiring registration month will be deemed to not be registered and any practice or advertising after the end of the month without a proper registration will subject both the firm, and its responsible registrant, to a civil penalty for unlicensed practice and investigation costs. Applications will be deemed to have been timely filed if the application is postmarked on, or before, the last day of the month of expiration.

On-line renewal of individual registrations

Staff is working with the Government Information Technology Agency and IBM to develop the ability to accept renewal of individual registrations over the internet utilizing credit cards. It is anticipated that this program will become operational by the end of March. The technology is already in use by the Department of Motor Vehicles, the Real Estate Department and the Pharmacy Board. The Board of Technical Registration is the next agency to attempt to convert their system to allow this feature.

The test electronic renewal page was reviewed by the development team on 12-12-05 and appears to have all necessary elements for renewal. An operational test will take place in early January.

Sunset Review

On September 9, the committee of reference reviewed the Board's written reply to the sunset review questions, and received an oral report from me on the regulation of the regulated groups and accepted public input relating to the Board's efficiency and effectiveness.

The committee then voted 8-0 to recommend to the full legislature the continuance of the Board for 10 years. This recommendation will be received and acted upon by the legislature in the next legislative session after committee meetings in each chamber.

WCARB meting

The western region meeting of the NCARB will be meeting in Tucson in March of 2006. Some of the Board staff will be providing support at the meeting.

Over the last 26 years that I have been the department manager, responsible for engineering, I have employed the services of consultants John Patterson, P.E., Bill Ellett, P.E. and more recently Mike Gaynor, P.E., of the consulting firm of Patterson, Ellett & Gaynor. In the first 15 years, we had two full system sectionalizing studies done. Within a year they were out dated and getting a P.E.'s approval s documented was disorganized.

Because of the disorganization about 10 years ago, I asked Patterson & Ellett to change the way Trico's sectionalizing studies were being done. Trico was growing very fast and sectionalizing changes were needed monthly, later weekly and then almost daily.

I asked Patterson & Ellett to do a sectionalizing study on each substation as it relates to our power supplier and on each circuit as it relates to each substation and load. I also asked them to keep a dynamic file on each substation and circuit on file, at Trico and at their office. The resulting sectionalizing file on each substation and circuit did not work.

There were several underlying problems:

- The P.E. consultants were not 100% sold on the process.
- The P.E. consultants had never tried to keep up with a utility growing and changing as fast as Trico.
- Requests for sectionalizing changes were not coming from mutual sources inside of Trico, some without the authority to request the changes.
- Changes were being made before Trico's P.E. Consultant's could approve.
- Maps and circuit diagrams were not up-to-date or correct.
- System models not being kept up-to-date and therefore "what if" scenarios were inaccurate and unreliable.

To solve this highly libelous and unethical situation, I brought Scott Mesich directly under my management but under the Trico Professional Engineering Consultants to supervise all the engineering work dealing with sectionalizing system coordinator, system design, voltage drop studies, and "what if" scenarios to evaluate system problems and adding new loads.

Scott has done everything I dreamed of in this area. His sectionalizing file is very organized with changes or additions request defined, solution recommend and approvals documented from Trico's P.E. consultants, Trico Operations and Trico Planning. Scott has done over 109 sectionalizing studies under Patterson, Ellett & Gaynor's supervision with increasingly greater responsibility for the studies. Scott keeps Trico's sectionalizing studies, maps, circuit diagrams and computerized system model updated weekly. These engineering tools and studies are as up-to-date if not more up-to-date than any other electric utility in the state. With Scott's work and dedication, Trico has solved its engineer ethic and liability problems. On July 12, 2004, I met with Prem K. Bahl, P.E., before he gave his approval on Trico's last Construction Work Plan and Cost of Service. This Arizona Corporation Commission's Engineer, Trico's audited sectionalizing studies and system models. He found nothing lacking in these areas and said he was very impressed.

I feel it is time for Scott to take another step in responsibility for Trico's engineering work. To do this he needs to be registered as a professional engineer. I think he is ready for this step and recommended the State of Arizona Board of Technical Registration allow his work experience with Patterson, Ellett & Gaynor to count as direct supervision under a Professional Engineer.

To Whom It May Concern:

My "yes" answer to the above referenced question stems from two violations. In March of 1998 and February of 2000, I was arrested, charged and convicted of driving under the influence of alcohol. Both incidents occurred in the City of San Diego and San Diego Metropolitan Police were the arresting agency. The San Diego Municipal Court was the convicting agency (Docket No. T195045 for the 1998 DUI and Docket No. M795841 for the 2000 DUI).

The police report for the 1998 DUI has been purged from the records (see attached certification from the SD Police). I have included a certified copy of the original complaint and court documents. Leaving a building industry related function, I was pulled over for speeding, was arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol and convicted of prima facie DUI. The terms of the conviction were as follows: 3-month DUI program (which includes MADD and AA meeting attendance throughout 3-month period), 5-days public work service, payment of fines and restitution, 3-months restricted driver's license, 200 hours of volunteer work, and one year probation. During the course of the court proceedings, the court vacated speeding violation given to me at the time of arrest. I compiled with all of these conditions in 1999.

For the 2000 DUI, I have enclosed a certified copy of the police report, the original complaint, the court documents and a letter from my attorney explaining the outcome of the court proceeding. After separating from my now ex-wife, I went through a difficult time of depression. The night of the arrest, I was drinking at a downtown bar with a friend. Approximately 2 blocks from were I parked, I misunderstood a traffic signal and thought that I had the right-of-way for a left turn. The oncoming traffic didn't stop and I clipped the front end of an oncoming car. At the time, I didn't even realize that we had made contact until I was pulled over a block away from the incident. After taking a breath-test, I was arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol. Due to the prior conviction, the terms of this conviction were very harsh: 18-month DUI program (which includes MADD and AA meeting attendance throughout 18-month period), 12-days public service work, payment of fines and restitution, 1-year revoked driver's license, 2-year restricted license, 3 years with ignition interlock device, and five years probation. Also, during the course of the court proceedings, the court vacated additional traffic

violations given to me at the time of arrest. I have compiled with all of the court orders as of June of 2003 and I am waiting for my probation period to end in June of 2005.

There is no excuse for these violations. However, at the time of my arrests, I was going through a very difficult period in my personal life. Drinking and driving only exacerbated my personal problems. I have paid a very high price for these mistakes (e.g. financial, humiliation, lost time and opportunity, lost driving privilege, etc.) and will not ever let this happen to me again.

I appeared on your behalf and was unable to get the charge reduced to a lesser charge. As such I entered a plea of guilty to VC23152(a)(DUI) and admitted that you have a prior conviction. You were placed on summary probation to the court for a period of five years subject to terms and conditions below.

You are ordered to pay a fine of \$1,100.00 and \$100.00 restitution fine, plus a \$100.00 DUI Assessment fee which you must pay at your DUI Alcohol Monitoring interview. You were given credit for \$50.00 for one day your served in custody making it a total fine of \$1,250.00, you must report to court collections officer after my appearance on August 10, 2000, and make arrangements to make monthly payments on this. You are to pay the restitution amount of \$100.00 to K. Naas. You must also attend one MADD class as indicated on the Minute Order.

To Whom It May Concern:

My "yes" answer to the above referenced question stems from my recent application for my Real Estate Broker's License in the State of Arizona. My application was denied based upon my previous two DUI convictions in the State of California (please see the attached explanation related to these convictions). According to the Arizona Department of Real Estate, these two convictions reflect poor moral character which is grounds for denying the application. However, as I have explained to the Department of Real Estate, these two incidents were isolated mistakes during a very difficult period in my personal life and do not reflect the hard work, dedication and honorable life the rest of my accomplishments and past exemplify. I truly am sorry and ashamed of my behavior, however, the convictions are both over 5 years old. I have paid my dues to society and, since the convictions, have consistently demonstrated my good character with my family life and business dealings.

Accordingly, I am currently appealing the Department of Real Estate's decision to deny my broker's license. I have already attended one hearing to appeal their decision. I attended that hearing representing myself since I thought I could adequately convince the hearing officer of my good character. However, I lost the hearing and the Department's denial was affirmed. Since that time, I have hired an attorney to represent me with this situation. My attorney has filed a request for a re-hearing of the case based upon additional information demonstrating my good character and based upon the fact the that the hearing officer's decision was based on old law.
