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On October 27, 2020 this matter came before the Arizona Board of Technical Registration ("Board") for consideration of the State's Motion to Deem Allegations Admitted regarding the Complaint and Notice of Hearing and the imposition of disciplinary action pursuant to A.R.S §32-128(F). Respondents were not present and were not represented by legal counsel. The State was represented by Assistant Attorney General Scott Donald. The Board received independent legal advice from Assistant Attorney General Mona Baskin. The Board, after due consideration of the issues before it, granted the State's Motion to Deem the Allegations Admitted and adopted the Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and issued the following Order:

#### FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The Board is the duly constituted authority for the regulation and control of the practice of land surveying, etc., and the firms under which registrants practice pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-101, et seq.
- 2 Respondents do not hold required Board-issued registrations to practice land surveying in Arizona.

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- 3. On or about March 2, 2017, the Board received a complaint alleging that Respondent, through Respondent Firm, advertised professional land surveying services to the Town of Taylor, Arizona, without required Board registration. Respondent's website and business cards advertised that Respondent and Respondent Firm could provide 'surveying' services to the public.
- 4. On March 17, 207, staff sent Respondent notice of its investigation into this complaint and requested that he respond and provide pertinent records.
- 5. On March 27, 2017, Scott Stiles, a partner in Respondent Firm, responded to the Board's request. He told staff that Respondent Firm and its employees were not surveyors, 'only data collectors.' Staff informed Mr. Stiles that Respondent Firm's website could not indicate that it provided surveying services to the public unless it was registered. Mr. Stiles told staff he would remove all references to 'surveying' from the Respondent Firm's website, and confirmed this avowal in a March 30, 2017 email to Board staff.
- 6. From May through June 2017, Board staff attempted to contact Respondents in writing and by phone to resolve this case informally, without success.

#### **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

- 7. Respondent, Wayne Quimby, may be guilty of a class 2 misdemeanor pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-145(2) when he advertised or displayed a device (a business card and firm website) that may have indicated to the public that he was registered or qualified to practice land surveying without Board registration.
- 8. The conduct alleged above constitutes grounds for discipline pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-106.02, in that Respondents were not registered with the Board to practice land-surveying in Arizona at the time Respondent entered into an agreement to provide surveying services to the Town of Taylor, Arizona, as required pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-121 and A.R.S. § 32-141.
- 9. The conduct alleged above constitutes grounds for discipline pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-128(C)(4) as it relates to A.A.C. R4-30-301(4), in that Respondent engaged in the practice of land surveying through an unregistered firm.

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Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Board issues the following Order:

- CIVIL PENALTY. Within ninety (90) days of the effective date of this Order, 1. Respondents shall pay to the Board a civil penalty in the amount of four-thousand dollars (\$4,000.00) by certified check or money order made payable to the State of Arizona Board of Technical Registration or by credit card. A.R.S. § 32-106.02(B).
- COST OF INVESTIGATION. Within ninety (90) days of the effective date of 2. this Order, Respondent shall pay to the Board the cost of investigation in the amount of sevenhundred and fifteen dollars (\$715.00) by certified check or money order made payable to the State of Arizona Board of Technical Registration or by credit card. A.R.S. § 32-128(H).
- ATTORNEYS FEES. Within ninety (90) days of the effective date of this 3. Order, Respondents shall pay to the Board attorneys fees in the amount of three-hundred and sixty-two dollars (\$362.00) by certified check or money order made payable to the State of Arizona Board of Technical Registration or by credit card. A.R.S. § 32-128(H).

## Right to Petition for Rehearing or Review

Respondents are hereby notified that they have the right to file a motion for rehearing or review. Pursuant to A.R.S. § 41-1092.09(B) and A.A.C. R4-30-126(A) the motion for rehearing or review must be filed with the Board's Executive Director within 30 days after service of this Order. Service of this Order is defined as five calendar days after mailing.

The motion for rehearing or review must set forth legally sufficient reasons for granting a rehearing or review. A.A.C. R4-30-126(C). If a petition for rehearing or review is not filed, the Board's Order becomes effective 35 days after it is mailed to Respondents. Respondents are further advised that the filing of a motion for rehearing or review is required to preserve any rights of appeal to Superior Court.
