MINUTES OF THE STATE BOARD OF TECHNICAL REGISTRATION March 28, 1969

The meeting of the State Board of Technical Registration was called to order by Mr. N. R. Feldman, Chairman, in Suite 923, United Bank Building, Phoenix, Arizona, at 9:15 A.M., March 28, 1969.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Cassidy that the minutes of the meeting of the Board on December 13, 1969, be approved as presented. Motion carried.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Lew Place, Vice-Chairman

No meetings and no report.

REPORT OF THE RULES AND BY-LAWS COMMITTEE

The Executive Secretary reported to the Board that the Board's official seal required complete revising due to the addition of landscape architects as a proficiency registered under the Board.

It was moved by Mr. Dryden and seconded by Mr. Girand that the Executive Secretary be authorized and instructed to revise the official seal of the Board and to make the appropriate change in the By-Laws for adoption at the June meeting. Motion carried.

A discussion was held by the architects requesting that the Board consider the possibility of record examinations being given to persons previously registered. The Executive Secretary handed out Minute Pages 1716 and 1733 for information on previous actions on record examinations, portions of which are as follows:

SUBJECT: "Record" Examinations for Arizona Registrants

In a way, past actions of the Arizona Board in granting registration on eduction and experience to persons known to be highly qualified has worked a hardship on the registrant. These men, because of their expanding business and standing in the profession, are now faced with securing registrations in other states which do not grant such registrations without a written examination. On the case in hand, if we administer an examination for Hawaii, we would still have no future record of the grade assigned to the registrant and he would then, if forced to apply in another state, be granted registration on a written examination from a state other than the state of his basic registration.

It is recommended that the Board consider establishing a policy wherein a registrant granted on education and experience be permitted to take a "record"

examination in Arizona. The proposal would in no way change the man's basis for registration in Arizona but would permit us to report to other states as follows:

This office anticipates that the "record" examination could be given to those registrants desiring same at the regularly scheduled examination time for a fee not to exceed \$20.00 and such "record" examination would be of eighthour duration consisting of Parts III and IV of our written Engineering examination graded as an indivisible unit.

Under this policy, it is anticipated that the only recorded grades would be when the registrant has satisfactorily passed an examination. Re-examinations would be permitted.

These "record" examinations could be reported to the Board under a separate section when regular written examination grades are recorded.

If such a policy was established by the Board, which in my opinion could be done without a rule change, this office would endeavor to notify all registrants by education and experience at the time of the next annual renewal notice that such examination was available to them.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Royden that the report of the Executive Secretary on "record" examinations be referred to the Engineering Examinations Committee for further study and a report at the September meeting of the Board. Motion carried.

Dr. Shell reported on "record" examinations as per the recommendation of the Board that the Engineering Examination Committee review the report of the Executive Secretary and report at this meeting. Dr. Shell reported that his committee does not recommend at this time allowing the policy of "record" examinations for persons already registered.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Vanlandingham that the matter be referred to a special committee of the Rules and By-Laws Committee for report at the June meeting. Motion carried.

Chairman Feldman appointed the following members to the special committee for consideration of record examinations:

REPORT OF THE LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive Secretary reported on the January Legislative Committee meeting and was presented to the Board as Minute Page 2381. Mr. Dryden, Chairman of the Legislative Committee, reported that the suggestions contained as a part of the Executive Secretary's report on the Statutes were still in the Legislative Committee and that a further report by the committee would be made at a later date.

Mr. Dryden further reported that there was considerable activity on the part of the Arizona Society of Professional Engineers and the American Insitute of Architects to prepare suggested changes in the Technical Registration Act for the January, 1970, Legislature. It is the intent of his committee to work closely with these groups for a unified presentation.

Mr. Vanlandingham reported that he had been approached by the American Insitute of Architects to serve as a member of their committee on this same matter.

Dr. Newlin reported to the Board that the Legislative Committee should consider the impact to the profession if the category of "Planners" was passed by the Legislature.

The Executive Secretary passed out Page 4 of the March, 1969, Registration Bulletin, Minute Page 2382, which summarized the actions and direction proposed by the National Council of Engineering Examiners and the National Society of Professional Engineers.

REPORT OF THE EVALUATION AND EXAMINATION COMMITTEES

The Board held a discussion on the philisophical aims of the Board and what is accomplished by written examinations. At the conclusion of the discussion, it was the consensus of the Board this matter should best be referred to the Legislative Committee for consideration when proposed revisions to the Technical Registration Act were contemplated.

It was moved by Mr. Dryden, Chairman of the Legislative Committee, and seconded by Dr. Newlin that his committee become the entire Board and that special meetings be held at the call of the Chairman. Motion carried.

Discussion was held by Chairman Feldman and elaborated upon by Dean Fahey of the possibility, feasibility and possible content of written examinations prepared for each applicant for registration immediately prior to his appearance before the appropriate evaluation committee.

Mr. Vanlandingham, speaking in behalf of the Architectural and Landscape Architectural Evaluation Committees, indicated that they prefer to delay a policy change on the adoption of written examinations until a further study could be made.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Dryden that the preparation of any written examination or other procedure for use by the evaluation committee be referred to the Engineering Evaluation Committee for implementation. Motion carried.

SUBJECT: Legislative Committee

The Legislative Committee of the Board met on January 10, 1969, at 9:00 A.M.. in the office of the Board, Phoenix, Arizona, with the following members

It was the consensus of this Committee that the Board not sponsor any legislation in the current session but prepare for submittal to the Legislature in January, 1970, all items requiring changes. It was the belief of the Committee that approval of the professional and technical societies on legislative changes should be acquired.

Due to the overlapping of membership by the Legislative and Budget Committees, this Committee directed the Executive Secretary to prepare and present a supplemental appropriation to the current Legislature and arrange for such meetings as required on our regular budget for the fiscal year 1969-1970.

The Executive Secretary was directed to prepare a summary on items in our present Law which would require changes by the Legislature to make it more functional.

In regard to the above directions of the Committee, there follows the Executive Secretary's ideas of items requiring change. Please note the changes refer to the Chapter under the present Law by section and paragraph.

NSPE CHANGES POLICY

(Continued from page 1)

Education Required

If engineering is to be recognized as a truly learned profession, then the laws setting up the qualifications for registration and entry into the engineering profession must include education at an acceptable collegiate level. A number of people in the engineering profession hold the view that within the next ten years a master's degree will become recognized by industry, government, and education, as well as private practice, as being the minimum educational requirement for an engineer to perform the duties expected of him. If this is the case, it would seem realistic at this time for our state licensing laws to provide that a person have at least a baccalaureate degree as a requirement for registration.

Entry Into The Profession

There is a real need to recognize those people graduating from a recognized engineering college as being qualified to enter the engineering profession. The recommendations proposed by the Registration Committee would provide such identity without the immediate certification that these graduates are qualified to offer their services to the public.

Immediate Action Required

The task of securing the enactment of legislation revising the registration laws falls squarely on the shoulders of the member state societies affiliated with NSPE. Unless something is done to update registration laws to attune them to presentday engineering practice, the whole scheme of engineering registration is likely to become outmoded and dropped. There is not much time, and it is suggested that NSPE and all of the state societies get about this task on an organized basis in all states. Revising state laws takes a lot of work and a lot of time. It would seem appropriate to tackle the most important problems first. The recommendations of the Registration Committee have , been limited to the most pressing problems concerned with the registration process, and do not contain all of the revisions in the laws deemed either necessary or desirable.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR BOARD ACTION

It is recommended that NSPE and the member state societies accept as an immediate objective the adoption in all states of the following provisions in the registration laws and their administration:

- Establish the bachelor's degree in engineering or related science as the absolute minimum educational requirement for registration.
- Make the sixteen-hour written examination a uniform requirement in all states.
- 3. Make the experience requirement:
 - (a) For graduates of engineering curricula approved by the State Registration Board, four years' experience acceptable to the Board.
 - (b) For graduates of related science curricula approved by the State Registration Board, six years' experience acceptable to the Board.
- 4. Allow graduates of engineering curricula approved by the State Registration Board to take the sixteen-hour written examination prior to or at graduation, and allow graduates of related science curricula approved by the State Registration Board to take the sixteen-hour written examination after completion of two years' experience acceptable to the Board.
- 5. Award a Certificate of Registration as a Professional Engineer without authority to offer services to the public or to certify documents, upon:
 - (a) Graduation from an engineering curriculum approved by the State Registration Board, and passing the sixteen-hour written examination.
 - (b) Graduation from a related science curriculum approved by the State Registration Board, completion of two years' experiience acceptable to the Board, and passing of the sixteen-hour written examination.
- 6. State Registration Boards grant authority to offer services to the public and to certify documents, upon:
 - (a) Graduation from an engineering curriculum approved by the State Registration Board, passing a sixteen-hour written examination, and completion of four years' experience acceptable to the Board.
 - (b) Graduation from a related science curriculum approved by the State Registration Board, passing a sixteen-hour written examination, and completion of six years' experience acceptable to the Board.
- 7. Allow experience credit of one year for completion of a master's degree in engineering or a related science, and one additional year for completion of a doctoral degree in engineering or related science.

The Executive Secretary presented to the Board a report prepared by Edwyn D. Smith, Instructor in Electrical Engineering at the University of Arizona, and one of the graders of the professional engineering examination in electrical engineering, Part 3, Engineering Analysis, given in December, 1968. The Executive Secretary explained to the members of the Board that this report had been requested by him due to a report of an implied legal action on the part of a registered Professional Engineer (Electrical) in the Tucson area.

Discussion of Professor Smith's report indicated that clarification was needed from Professor Smith on the last paragraph of is report and the Executive Secretary was instructed to secure same and circulate it to the members of the Board.

The members of the Engineering Evaluation Committee expressed concern over the apparent proliferation of the proficiencies of engineering presently registered by this Board and it was moved by Dr. Newlin and seconded by Mr. Cassidy that the Legislative Committee take cognizance of such proliferations on their deliberation of changes to the Statutes. Motion carried.

The Executive Secretary reported to the Board on the status of all correspondence received since the last meeting of the Board regarding landscape architects, and particularly pointed out the letter dated March 19, 1969, from A. Wayne Smith, President of the Arizona Association of Landscape Architects, Minute Page 2384, which commended the Board on its actions.

The Architectural Evaluation Committee reported on its meeting and it was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Dr. Newlin that the Architectural Evaluation Committee report of March 11, 1969, which included the grades of December, 1968, written examination be accepted and implemented and the grades contained therein be certified, see Minute Pages 2385 - 2389. Motion carried.

Prior to the presentation of the Landscape Architectural Evaluation Committee report, the Executive Secretary presented the following report, Minute Pages 2390 and 2391. Discussion among the members of the Board of the Executive Secretary's report indicated that it was not their belief that a deliberate misrepresentation was made by the applicant.

It was moved by Dr. Newlin and seconded by Mr. Dryden that Mr. Laos should be given an opportunity to correct his landscape architectural application, #68-338, by deletion of the reference to his registration in California as a landscape architect designer prior to his being considered for registration at the June meeting.

Mr. Kemper Goodwin, registered Architect, Tempe, Arizona, appeared in behalf of Rolf Olaf Osland, #69-7, landscape architect applicant, presenting additional information which could be considered favorably by the committee.

The Landscape Architectural Evaluation Committee meeting report of March 12, 1969, Minute Pages 2392 and 2393, were presented to the Board.

It was moved by Mr. Vanlandingham and seconded by Mr. Gonzales that the above report of the Landscape Architectural Evaluation Committee meeting be accepted and implemented by the Board. Motion carried.

SUBJECT: Hector Elias Laos, Landscape Architectural Applicant, #68-338

Mr. Laos submitted an application for landscape architectural registration and was evaluated at the March 12th meeting, and scheduled for granting of registration as a Landscape Architect under the Grandfather Clause at this meeting.

We have enclosed Xerox copies of the cover sheet of Mr. Laos' application on which #6188 architectural registration was granted and his landscape architectural application which shows a difference in Section 3. Previous Registrations.

At the time of Mr. Laos' personal audience he was questioned on the statement shown on his application "Landscape Designer, California, 1956, Grandfather Clause, Lapsed," and at that time made a statement that he had applied to the California State Board of Architectural Examiners in 1956 for registration under the Grandfather Clause as a Landscape Designer. Mr. Laos further stated that he did not have the correspondence available. At the request of a member of the Board, Mr. Laos was to explain his statement further and he has done so per the attached letter.

I am somewhat acquainted with California architectural and landscape architectural registration and could not, in my mind, reconcile Mr. Laos' statements to what I believed to be the facts and conducted the following investigation.

In a conversation with Mr. William E. Barbeau, Executive Secretary of the California State Board of Landscape Architects, I ascertained that Mr. Laos had never applied nor be registered as a Landscape Architect or Landscape Designer in California and their Grandfather Clause required an application between June, 1953, and June, 1954. Mr. Barbeau further repudiated Mr. Laos' statement that landscape architects or landscape designers had ever been under the California State Board of Architectural Examiners.

My next call was to the California State Board of Architectural Examiners and they reaffirmed that they had never handled landscape architects or landscape designers and a complete review of Mr. Laos' file dating back to 1952 indicated that no correspondence had ever been received by them from this individual relating to anthing except his application for architectural registration in California. The California Board further verified that Mr. Laos' registration as an architect in California has been lapsed since 1967 and will at the end of a five-year period be unrenewable.

It is the opinion of this office that because of Mr. Laos' failure to show the alleged landscape designer registration on his architectural application of 1965 and showing it on his landscape architectural application of 1968 together with his information letter of March 17th poses a distinct problem to the Board regarding his landscape architectural application under A.R.S. 32-128, quoted in part as follows:

- "A. The board may take disciplinary action against the holder of a certificate under this chapter, charged with the commission of any of the following acts:
- "1. Fraud or misrepresentation in obtaining a certificate of qualification, whether in the application or qualification examination."

It is respectfully suggested that for the record the Board take a position on Application No. 68-338 as to whether or not misrepresentation was made on the landscape architectural application before such registration is granted.

Considerable discussion has been held with Professor Sigmund Smith, College of Mines, University of Arizona, concerning the Assayer examination. This examination was last revised many years ago and the content has not been updated to reflect new procedures in the assaying of materials in atomic absorption and spectograph.

It is the feeling of Professor Smith that we are continually licensing assayers by written examination when the examination is still in the fire assaying stage and should be revised to include the new methods.

Discussion with Professor Smith indicated that possibly the best way to revise this examination was to have the Board sponsor a conference at the University of Arizona sometime prior to June first and the Board invite voluntary participation by all registered assayers in Arizona, approximately 19. The cost for this conference would be borne by the registrant in the form of a luncheon and participation charge.

It is hoped that out of this conference Professor Smith would be able to incorporate all of the thinking of our practicing registered assayers and be able to revise the examination for the December, 1969, examination in line with the improved technology.

The Committee should recommend to the Board that the Executive Secretary and the Assistant Attorney General investigate this person and if the allegation made can be substantiated, the Attorney General be directed to file a complaint in the appropriate civil court under A.R.S. 32-145.

3. Complaint from Gordon H. Long, registered Land Surveyor, #6713, with the Tonto National Forest, copy of letter attached, alleges that Robert L. Owen of Payson, not registered, is performing land surveying. The drawing referred to will be passed around at the meeting.

This matter is being investigated by the Central Chapter, American Institute of Architects, and apparently Carl Adam of Foltz, Hamlyn and Adam has disclaimed any knowledge of same. Mr. Dreagoux is a non-registrant and it is rumored that he operates out of an office of William F. Cody in Havasu City. The document attached would indicate a violation of A.R.S. 32-145 in the case of the non-registrant and and also other charges against Cody/Adam.



- Preparation of all required bidding documents and observation and control of all negociations required to secure acceptable proposals for the work.
- b. Recommendation of technically proficient persons for employment as supervisory personnel required for the satisfactory completion of the Project.
- c. Observation and control of the construction of the Project preparation and approval of all payment requests during the construction period. Checking and authorization of the use of all shop drawings and samples required for the project.
- Filing the NOTICE OF COMPLETION jointly with the Owner.

The Owner shall assume all responsibility for the following:

- a. Obtain, at the Owner's cost, a topographic and boundry survey of the site showing one foot (1°) contours at $1/8" = 1^{\circ}-0"$ scale.
- b. Assume direct costs of all printing of construction documents and preliminaries attributeable to the Project.
- c. Assume direct costs for all necessary long distance telephone calls directly related to the Project.
- Assume direct costs for Plan Check and Building Permit Fees required for the Project.

e. Assume direct costs for transportation, lodging and meals directly attributeable to the Project when the distance traveled, one way, is greater than sixty (60) miles from the Designer's office in Lake Havasu City, Arizona.

The Owner and the Designer further agree as follows:

- a. Major changes ordered by the Owner after the working drawings have been started shall be paid for by the owner at a rate of three (3) times the drafting costs plus twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per hour for the Designer's time. The Designer shall notify the Owner of the approximate cost of said major changes before the work is incorporated into the working drawings.
- b. The drawings and specifications shall become the exclusive property of the Owner and shall not be used by the Designer on any other project.
- c. It is understood that no Mechanital or Electrical Engineers will be employed on the Project, except as specifically required by Building Code or local ordinance.
- d. It is understood that all work required for the Project shall be performed in the Lake Havasu City office of the Designer and that said work shall be open for review of the Owner at any time.
- e. It is understood that the Designer assumes no responsibility for the accuracy of cost estimates on the Project. Cost estimates provided by the Designer are not tobbea-fide considered as contractural agreements or bona-fide bids on the Project or any part thereof.

METHOD OF PAYMENT FOR ABOVE DETAILED SERVICES

- a. Upon execution of this agreement the Owner shall pay to the Designer, in the form of a retainer, an amount not less than one thousand two hundred fifty dollars (\$1,250.00), of which two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) will pay for the topographic and boundry survey.
- b. Upon completion and written approval of Phase I and prior to the commencement of Phase II, the Owner shall pay to the Designer and amount not less thannthree thousand dollars (\$3,000.00).
- c. Upon completion of fifty percent (50%) of the working drawings and specifications, the Owner shall pay to the Designer andamount not less than four thousand four hundred dollars (\$4,400.00).
- d. Upon completion of Phase II and approval thereof, the Owner shall pay to the Designer and amount not less than four thousand four hundred ninty-five dollars (\$4,495.00).
- e. Upon filing the NOTICE OF COMPLETION, the Owner shall pay to the Designer the final payment of not less than

three thousand dollars (#3,000.00) plus all direct costs involved in the project as defined herein above.

Drawings sealed with notes saying mechanical, electrical, and plumbing by owner or contractors who are not registered are also guilty of encouraging malpractice and are definitely guilty of aiding and abetting.

The electrical engineers have set up some minimum standards for electrical plans which have been reviewed and accepted as guide lines for basic requirements.

As an interested electrical engineer, I have been working closely with the City on codes, standards, and revisions, and feel the

The copied plans have been modified to meet the owner's final requirements, and we agreed to make all of the changes, but one, using a common conduit from meter panel to serve two or more apartments. This we said was contrary to good professional design and installation pr actice. This problem was resolved in court to that I was paid for my services less attorney fees and court costs, so I still am out approximately \$350.00.

Mr. Meier copied these drawings without our knowledge or permission and collected for his work. I was forced to take legal action to be partially paid for my time. Mr. Meier's license should be suspended until he has compensated me for my costs and then the Board can decide what further action is necessary.

Dear Mr. Vanlandingham:

Attached is a legal opinion from the City's Attorney, Mr. Walter Reynolds, indicating that, in his opinion the State Law requires an Architects seal on construction plans only on public building construction projects.

It is my feeling that this is not in the best interests of the citizens of the State of Arizona, as chaotic and unsafe building construction will result if untrained people are permitted to construct buildings, only according to their own personal desires and experience. As you know, most building codes are enforced through the plan check proceedure as it is impossible for building inspectors to be on all construction sites for any length of time. If incomplete and inadequate plans are submitted, the building inspection check will certainly be incomplete.

If there is any Attorney Generals opinion or Court decision which refutes the City Attorney's opinion, I would be most anxious to receive a copy of this document. Also I would appreciate your comments, or the boards comments, concerning this problem.

MEMORANDUM TO ZONING BOARD

Subject: Architectural Seals requirement

This Memorandum is in reply to the Memorandum Request dated March 11, 1969, from the City Manager relative to matters in connection with architectural seals.

Under the law, there is no requirement that plans and specifications be stamped. However, a registered architect or civil engineer is required to stamp his plans when he has finished them for his client. These seals merely indicate the status of the individual who has prepared the plans and serve no other purpose. Therefore, the mere fact that plans and specifications are submitted to someone which do not bear a stamp or seal is not significant, at least as far as the person who is accepting the plans is concerned. With respect to the person who prepared the plans and specifications, he might be in trouble under the law for either failing to put his seal on the plans, or he might be in trouble because he does not have a seal to put on the plans. That is, if he has no seal, he is not a registered architect or engineer.

So it doesn't really make any difference whether the plans are stamped by a registered architect or registered civil engineer, as far as the recipient of the plans is concerned. It might be very significant, on the other hand, with respect to the person who actually prepared the plans. A civil engineer certainly is not allowed to practice architecture.

It follows, therefore, that the consequences of accepting plans which are not stamped either by a registered architect or a registered civil engineer creates no problems for the recipient, at least so long as the plans are not for public work building or structures. Where the building plans are for private, commercial and industrial developments, only the person submitting the plans could be in trouble.

With reference to the second matter in the above mentioned Memorandum-Request, there has been no recent opinions from the State Attorney General with respect to this particular matter. There was an opinion issued some years ago, but not pertinent to the particular questions asked here. There is also an opinion by Mr. J. LaMar Shelley, General Counsel for the League of Arizona Cities and Towns, on the question of the consequences of accepting plans and specifications for public works projects not drawn up by registered architects and/or engineers. Mr. Shelley was of the opinion that such plans and specifications could be accepted although they could not be implemented by reason of the statutory prohibition against utilizing plans, specifications, drawings, etc., that were not done by a registered architect and/or engineer.

has no authority to refuse plans, specifications, etc., simply because they do not have an architect or a civil engineer's seal on them. Under our present ordinances, and under the present law of the State of Arizona, municipal building inspector can only reject plans and specifications, etc., which do not conform to our building code. That is the scope of his authority, and he is not authorized

to reject plans and specifications on any other basis.

One possible exception, of course, would be in the field of public works. Under the law, a public works building must be wholly designed, etc., by a registered Arizona architect. While the building official still would not have the authority to reject the plans, certainly he could have some authority to hold the matter up until it was ascertained whether or not the plans and specifications were made by a registered Arizona architect. This does not mean, however, that if the plans and specifications submitted met with the minimum standards of our housing, building and other codes within the City, that he has the right to withhold his approval of same. Such approval can only be withheld by the City Council acting with full knowledge that they could not construct a building that was not designed by a registered Arizona architect.

I hope that this answers your questions.

Dear Mr. Edelblut:

I have reviewed a Memorandum to the Zoning Board, dated March 18, 1969, prepared by the City Attorney for Chandler, Arizona. The apparent conclusions of this Memorandum are two-fold:

- Registered professional architects and engineers are not required to put their seal on plans and specifications except in the case of public works or buildings.
- 2. Municipal officials exceed their authority by refusing to issue building permits unless the plans and specifications bear the seal of registered professional architects or engineers.

These conclusions are not in accordance with the law as it has been consistently interpreted by this office.

A.R.S. § 32-125.B provides:

"Plans, specifications, plats or reports prepared by a registrant or his bona fide employee shall be issued under his seal."

Rule IV.2, Rules and By-Laws of the State Board of Technical Registration provides:

"An imprint of the registrant's valid seal shall appear on each and every sheet of drawings and on the cover and index page of each set of specifications and/or reports or other professional documents prepared by a registrant or his bona fide

employee. Superimposed over the imprint of the seal shall be the original signature of the registrant and the date indicated when the seal imprint was signed."

With regard to the duty of municipal officials to enforce seal requirements on plans, specifications, plats or reports, enclosed is a copy of Attorney General Opinion No. 67-32-L which specifically states that state and municipal boards and agencies are required by their oath of office to uphold all of the laws of the State of Arizona, including the Technical Registration Act. The opinion concludes that the Technical Registration Board may secure an order from the Superior Court to enforce this compliance.

Therefore, in view of the clear provisions of the statute and previous written opinions from this office, I conclude that plans, specifications, plats and reports prepared by a registered professional architect or engineer must be sealed, and that municipal officials are bound to enforce this requirement.

Finally, please note the general requirements of the Technical Registration Act, specifically A.R.S. § 32-121, which provides that no person may practice architecture or engineering unless he is registered with the Board of Technical Registration, except the limited circumstances described by A.R.S. § 32-144. Persons violating the provisions of the Technical Registration Act are guilty of a misdemeanor.

The Chairman shall, as soon thereafter as practicable appoint from among the members of the Board the following standing committees: Executive, By-Laws and Rules, Public Information, National Council of Architectural Registration Boards, Budget Committee, Grievance Committee No. 1, Grievance Committee No. 2, and such other committees as may be required to facilitate the work of the Board.

Motion carried unanimously.

REPORT OF THE LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE

Mr. Dryden presented the report of the Legislative Committee, dated May 2, 1969, as shown on Minute Pages 2440, 2441, 2442, 2443, 2444 and 2445, on proposed changes to the present law. He advised that a joint committee of environmental design professions consisting of representatives from the architectural, structural engineers, professional engineers, consulting engineers, landscape architectural

The Legislative Committee met May 2, 1969, in the office of the Board to discuss items referred to them at the regular meeting of the Board held March 28, 1969, and submit for the Board's consideration the following report on items discussed:

- The Technical Registration Act should be revised to include a preamble which states that this chapter is enacted for the protection of the public health, welfare and safety.
- 2. Individuals, partnerships and corporations offering to practice as consulting engineers be qualified and secure certificates of qualification and furnish evidence of financial responsibility before such certificate be issued.

The Committee felt that Arizona could consider qualification of the above as now presently done in the Florida statutes.

- 3. Land planners be registered by this Board and appropriate exemptions for architects, engineers and landscape architects be included in A.R.S. 32-141.
- 4. That the consideration of whether or not proficiencies of engineering be eliminated and registrants be professional engineers be referred back to Board for its discussion and decision.
- 5. After a discussion on temporary certificates, the Committee suggests that this item be revised to require that a person receiving a temporary certificate have on file an application for permanent registration in Arizona. The Committee further recommended that the fees for temporary certificates be uncreased.
- 6. The Committee recommends that no action be taken to require persons found guilty under one misdemeanor charge be charged with a felony on second or subsequent charges.

- 7. The Committee recommends that regarding manufacturers' exemptions under A.R.S. 32-144 be discussed further with the various professional societies in Arizona for acceptable language and restricting manufacturers to in-plant engineering only.
- 8. At the March meeting of the Board there was a summary of the Technical Registration Act circulated to the members but no report was released by this Committee. The Committee now recommends to the Board that this summary of the Technical Registration Act, which may include recommendations heretofore mentioned, be considered by the Board. The report, as amended, reflecting the thoughts of this Committee, is as follows:

A.R.S. 32-101

Subparagraph 1. - No change

Subparagraph 2. - Perhaps architects should have protection for site development as related to buildings or structures as well as protection from the additional use of any prefix or suffix to the word architect or holds himself out as an architect except as defined, i.e., landscape architect in this Chapter.

Subparagraph 3. - Architects-in-Training should have a five year degree or experience rather than four.

Subparagraph 4. - No change

Subparagraph 5. - No change

Subparagraph 6. - No change

Subparagraph 7. - Engineering requires definition to protect from inclusion from future splinterized categories, i.e., landscape architecture, and perhaps the engineering-land surveying relationship should be formalized. (Committee recommends no action unless change to professional engineer is authorized.)

Subparagraph 8. - No change

Subparagraph 9. - No change

Subparagraph 10. - No change

Subparagraph 11. - No change

Subparagraph 12. - No change

Subparagraph 13. - If in the second sentence after "shall not include the design", the words "or location" were added, then perhaps this would clarify the architect-landscape architect relationship.

Subparagraph 14. - No change

Subparagraph 15. - Perhaps it should be spelled out that no engineering is to be performed by Land Surveyors.

A.R.S. 32-102

Subparagraph A. - It was felt by the Committee that the membership of the Board should be increased by one and that the Deans of the accredited Engineering Colleges and the Deans of the accredited Architectural Colleges have the opportunity of serving alternately. However, at no time should both serve from the same university. Terms and schools should be alternated on a three year basis.

Subparagraph B. - Any changes in this section will be dependent upon any changes in the above Section A.

Upon request of the State Board of Technical Registration, the Attorney General shall apply to the Superior Court within the judicial district in which a violation of any of the provisions of Sections 32-101 to 32-147 is alleged to have occurred for an order enjoining or restraining commission or continuance of the acts complained. Thereupon the court shall have jurisdiction of the proceeding and shall have power to grant such temporary or permanent relief as it deems just and proper. In such proceedings it shall be unnecessary to allege or prove that an adequate remedy at law does not exist or that irreparable damage would result if such order were not granted. The remedy provided by this section shall be in addition to any other remedy provided by law.

If professional engineer is adopted under 32-106.B, the following is needed:

Gentlemen:

On October 29, 1969, in conformance with Rules and Regulations adopted by the Board pursuant to authority of Section 32-106, Arizona Revised Statutes, 1956, amended April 1956 and March 1968, I submitted application and fee for registration as a landscape architect.

In consonance with provisions of Section 32-146, referenced code, and confirming data submitted with my application, it is difficult for me to understand why my 35 years of experience in the field of land-scape architecture does not qualify me for registration under Section 32-146 without further examination.

On March 12, 1969, after an unavoidable wait of three hours past the hour of my appointment, I was granted a three minute audience with your Landscape Architectural Evaluation Committee. At this time the Committee requested additional references which I submitted.

Your letter dated May 23, 1969, now states that under the rules of the Board, adopted <u>December 13, 1968</u>, applicants must comply with Rule IIA, Examinations.

Thirty landscape architects were granted registration without examination under Section 32-146 in September and December, 1968.

My application was in your hands well in advance of your December 13, 1968, ruling.

Your ruling on my application, at this late date, cannot but appear to me to be arbitrary and capricious and a circumvention of the intent and purpose of the "grandfather clause", Rule 32-146.

This becomes particularly germane when one notes applicants granted registration whose education is no greater and experience far less than mine.

Some who have become registered under 32-146, have the same mixed bag of landscape architectural experience, tied to contracting and other allied fields as I have.

Had registration not been granted to those whose experience included that which was acquired in the allied fields cited, it is likely that registration would have been limited to a handful rather than to 30 individuals.

In the very brief discussion I had with the Evaluation Committee in March, heavy stress, possibly upon advice of advisory members of the A.A.L.A., appeared to be placed upon pure design for fee, as a dominant criterion of acceptability for registration.

I respectfully call your attention to Section 32-101 Definitions, Paragraph 13. This states, in part, "...or responsible supervision in connection with the development of land and incidental water areas where, and to the extent that the dominant purpose of such services is the preservation, enhancement or determination of proper land uses, natural land features, ground cover and planting, naturalistic and esthetic valves, the settings and approaches to buildings, structures, facilities or other improvements, natural drainage and the consideration and determination of inherent problems of land relating to erosion, wear and tear, light or other hazards.", etc.

It is respectfully requested that my application for registration be re-evaluated and that I, like some 30 others who preceded me, be registered without examination, under the provisions of 32-146.

SUBJECT: Western Zone Meeting of N.C.E.E.

Dean Walter Fahey and the Executive Secretary attended the Western Zone meeting of the National Council of Engineering Examiners in Portland, Oregon, on May 8th and 9th, and all of the states of the Western Zone were present as well as Dr. Sams, President George Branigan, Leo W. Ruth and Harry Rodman of National Council of Architectural Registration Boards accompanied by Peter Loret of Educational Testing Service.

Considerable discussion was carried on the first morning concerning the E.I.T. Fundamentals of Engineering examination and the possibility of making at least four hours objective type examinations, similar to those used by the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards. The Educational Testing Service procedures on preparing, evaluating and conducting objective type examinations were thoroughly explored, and, it might be said, these discussions were the highlight of the meeting.

In discussing the December, 1968, Fundamentals examinations, it was reported that approximately 70% passed after the Boards raised the basic cut-off score or 64% before any adjustments of the final percent passing. Eighty-four percent had ECPD degrees and of the remaining 16% without ECPD degrees, 37% were non-graduates. It was noted that the Boards raised the raw scores approximately 10%.

It was resolved at this meeting that recommendations would be made to use the Educational Testing Service Fundamentals examination for the first four hours starting April, 1971, and the earliest release date would be the third Saturday in April. It was further recommended that the various Boards provide, when requested, problems of the objective type for use in this examination.

THE COMMITTEE ON UNIFORM LAWS AND PROCEDURES INTERIM REPORT April 24, 1969

On October 3, 1968 questionnaires were mailed to all member boards of the National Council of Engineering Examiners requesting information which would allow the up-dating of the 1958 issue of Digest of Court Decisions concerning the registration of engineers and surveyors. This first mailing was followed up with two additional mailings to those slow in replying.

As of this date, April 24, 1969, replies have been received from all but four boards: Canal Zone, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, and Guam. Twentyone boards returned information on court actions and attorney general opinions which affect the registration laws under the jurisdiction of these boards. The balance of the boards replying stated that no court actions had occurred which would affect their registration laws.

The information received is now being processed and it is hoped that this work may be completed in sufficient time to allow for printing and distribution at the Annual NCEE meeting in August.

CODE OF CONDUCT OF ENGINEERS

Fundamental Principles of Professional Engineering

The Engineer, to uphold and advance the honor and dignity of the engineering profession and in keeping with high standards of ethical conduct:

I. Will be honest and impartial, and will serve with devotion his employer, his clients, and the public;

II. Will strive to increase the competence and prestige of the engineering profession;

III. Will use his knowledge and skill for the advancement of human welfare.

Relations With the Public

1.1 The Engineer will have proper regard for the safety, health and welfare of the public in the performance of his professional duties.

1.2 He will endeavor to extend public knowledge and appreciation of engineering and its achievements, and will oppose any untrue, unsupported, or exaggerated statements regarding engineering.

1.3 He will be dignified and modest in explaining his work and merit, will ever uphold the honor and digmity of his profession, and will refrain from selflaudatory advertising.

1.4 He will express an opinion on an engineering subject only when it is founded on adequate knowledge and honest conviction.

1.5 He will preface any ex parte statements, criticisms, or arguments that he may issue by clearly indicating on whose behalf they are made.

Relations With Employers and Clients

The Engineer will act in professional matters as a faithful agent or trustee for each employer or client.

He will act fairly and justly toward vendors and contractors, and will not accept from vendors or contractors, any commissions or allowances, directly or indirectly.

2.3 He will inform his employer or client if he is financially interested in any vendor or contractor, or in any invention, machine, or apparatus, which is involved in a project or work of his employer or client. He will not allow such interest to affect his decisions regarding engineering services which he may be called upon to perform.

2.4 He will indicate to his employer or client the adverse consequences to be expected if his engineering udgment is over-ruled.

2.5 He will undertake only those engineering assignments for which he is qualified. He will engage or

advise his employer or client to engage specialists and will cooperate with them whenever his employer's or client's interests are served best by such an arrangement.

2.6 He will not disclose information concerning the business affairs or technical processes of any present or former employer or client without his con-

sent.

He will not accept compensation-financial or otherwise-from more than one party for the same service, or for other services pertaining to the same work, without the consent of all interested parties.

The employed engineer will engage in supplementary employment or consulting practice only with the consent of his employer.

Relations With Engineers

3.1 The Engineer will take care that credit for engineering work is given to those to whom credit is

properly due.

3.2 He will provide a prospective engineering employee with complete information on working conditions and his proposed status of employment, and after employment will keep him informed of any changes in them.

3.3 He will uphold the principle of appropriate and adequate compensation for those engaged in engineering work, including those in subordinate ca-

pacities.

3.4 He will endeavor to provide opportunity for the professional development and advancement of engineers in his employ or under his supervision.

3.5 He will not injure maliciously the professional reputation, prospects, or practice of another engineer. However, if he has proof that another engineer has been unethical, illegal, or unfair in his practice, he should so advise the proper authority.

He will not compete unfairly with another en-

gineer.

He will not invite or submit price proposals for professional services, which require creative intellectual effort, on a basis that constitutes competition on price alone. Due regard should be given to all professional aspects of the engagement.

3.8 He will cooperate in advancing the engineering profession by interchanging information and experience with other engineers and students, and by contributing to public communication media, to the efforts of engineering and scientific societies

and schools.

SUBJECT: Investigation of Complaints

The Executive Secretary and Assistant Attorney General, Mr. Joseph Clifford, spent April 23rd and 24th in Mohave County investigating complaints referred to the Board by Grievance Committee #1.

As directed by the Board, the Executive Secretary and Assistant Attorney General were to investigate and file a complaint with the appropriate county attorney if a violation existed.

1. The Executive Secretary and Assistant Attorney General visited with Mr. Harry Herman who was alleged in the Bullhead City newspaper as being architect and engineer for Holiday Shores, Inc., of Bullhead City. The visit with Mr. Herman indicated that he was preparing plans, however, were unable to determine the value of the construction costs in the instances checked. Mr. Herman is a very fine draftsman and appears well-versed in the field phases of architecture, and, when informed that perhaps he should apply for architectural registration assuming he could prove eight years of experience of a character satisfactory to the Board, he seemed delighted to do so. Mr. Herman was thoroughly briefed on the Technical Registration Act and informed that future reports to the Board alleging violations of the Technical Registration Act would result in misdemeanor charges being filed against him.

It is the recommendation of the Assistant Attorney General that the present complaint be closed for insufficient evidence to warrant prosecution.

 The Executive Secretary and Assistant Attorney General visited with Mr. Fred Moninger who is associated with Shoreline Construction Company in Bullhead City, Arizona.

Mr. Moninger denied that he was referring to himself as an architect nor that he produced plans the cost of which exceeded \$10,000. In driving around the area, the Executive Secretary and Mr. Clifford saw numerous buildings with Shoreline Construction Company signs, but no signs of a registered architect on the projects. While visiting with Mr. Moninger, the Assistant Attorney General thoroughly briefed him on the statutes and informed him that violations would result in a misdemeanor complaint being filed against him.

It is the recommendation of the Assistant Attorney General that the present complaint be closed for insufficient evidence to warrant prosecution.

3. The Executive Secretary and Assistant Attorney General went to Havasu City to investigate Verne E. Dreagoux as reported to the Board by the American Institute of Architects. It was alleged by the American Institute of Architects that Mr. Dreagoux was violating the Technical Registration Act by entering into a contract for services between himself and a prospective client. Investigation in Havasu City indicated that Mr. Dreagoux is no longer in the area and apparently leaving under a cloud. From the best information available it appears that Mr. Dreagoux, while apparently operating on his own, was representing an Arizona registered architect, William F. Cody of Palm Springs, California. While there was no evidence which would prove that Mr. Cody was operating an office with a non-registrant in charge, the appearances indicated that this was the case.

It is the recommendation of the Assistant Attorney General that the present complaint be closed for insufficient evidence to warrant prosecution.

4. While in Havasu City, the Executive Secretary and Assistant Attorney General reviewed the Makarczyk Nursery School which was designed by a non-registrant by the name of K. Wayne Read. This complaint was reported to the Board in 1968 by the Arizona State Department of Health. It was determined by the Executive Secretary and Assistant Attorney General that while the actual building and construction costs exceeded \$10,000, it was believed that the statute of limitations on a misdemeanor had expired and no action could be taken. It was, therefore, recommended by the Assistant Attorney General that the files be returned to the Arizona State Department of Health and the complaint closed.

The Executive Secretary and Assistant Attorney General had a long visit with Mr. Leonard C. Langford, County Attorney, who after reading the opinion previously forwarded carried us to visit with the Planning and Zoning Director, and, after receiving our opinion on second mailing, wrote the Zoning Director, as per the attached letter.

The Assistant Attorney General and Executive Secretary further requested a registrant in the Havasu City area to keep us apprised of any drawings of non-registrants so that action could be instituted to file in Mohave County.

The Assistant Attorney General and Executive Secretary have yet to investigate the complaints filed in the Pine-Payson-Prescott areas, however, will attempt to do so prior to the next committee meeting or the Board.

Re: Building Permits

Dear Mr. Voigt:

As I advised you recently, it is my opinion that the Mohave County Planning and Zoning Commission has the right and the duty to deny building permits when it appears from the documents submitted in applying for the building permit that a violation of any State law or regulation has or, necessarily, will occur if the building permit is granted and the building is constructed in accordance with the documents submitted.

Two examples of possible law, other than Planning and Zoning Laws, that might give grounds for denial of the building permit would be a violation of Section 32-145, A.R.S., regarding unauthorized practice of architecture, etc., and a violation of Section 32-1164, A.R.S., regarding contracting without a license.

The attached Department of Law Letter Opinion No. 67-32-L (R-95) supports the position I have taken in this letter.

SUBJECT: Definitions of "Gross Negligence", "Incompetency"

and 'Misconduct' .

Sometime ago, the Wisconsin Examining Board of Architects and Professional Engineers made a survey of the registration boards throughout the United States and Canada in an attempt to obtain definitions for the terms "gross negligence", "incompetency" and "misconduct". We received reports from a total of 80 boards; 32 were architect boards, 39 engineering boards and 9 joint boards.

Only 3 boards have a definition of gross negligence, 5 have a definition of incompetency and 12 have a definition of misconduct. The definition of gross negligence appears in the statutes of 3 states, and in the board rules of 1; the definition of incompetency appears in the statutes of 2 states and in the board rules of 3; the definition of misconduct appears in the statutes of 6 states and in the board rules of 8. (In some states the definitions appear both in the statutes and board rules.)

It is not possible to arrive at composite definitions which would apply in all jurisdictions. Gross negligence has been defined as being any act or omission in the carrying out of work by a professional person that shows a reckless or deliberate disregard of or indifference to the rights or safety of others. It has also been defined as being carelessness, indifference and negligence in the preparation of building documents and in the supervision of their execution.

Incompetency has been defined as failure to use due diligence in planning or inspection resulting in a structure being improperly constructed; lack of adequate knowledge or neglect or failure to exercise ordinary skill as a professional; failure to use due diligence in preparing documents for the protection of a client. It also has been defined to include mental incompetency and habitual addiction to drugs or alcohol.

Because of the variety of definitions of misconduct appearing in the statutes and board rules of the respective states, it is difficult to arrive at a summation of the various definitions of this term. Most states have a definition including "unprofessional" conduct as a form of 'misconduct'.

pefinitions of misconduct include paying or accepting funds which might tend to influence the awarding of contracts; improper stamping of plans; permitting the contractor to perform construction in substantial variance with approved plans and specifications; being willfully untruthful or deceptive in professional reports; performing professional services for which one is not qualified by education, training or experience; falsely or maliciously injuring the reputation or practice of another professional.

Since the laws in each state vary, the terms "gross negligence", "incompetency" and "misconduct" must be defined in relation to the law of the particular state involved. So long as there is a variance between the state laws, definitions adopted in one state cannot be readily applied in another. Also because of the variance in facts from case to case, it becomes difficult to frame definitions for these terms to cover all situations. Any rules adopted by this Board defining these terms must be related to the statute as it now exists.



As instructed by the Board at their March meeting, there follows the correct wording for By-Laws, Section I, Sub 2., regarding the seal of the Board of Technical Registration. Please note that actually who the Board registers has been deleted from this seal so that it would not require revision if any changes in proficiencies registered are made.

Under Section IV of the By-Laws, this rule may be changed at the present meeting in accordance with "these By-Laws may be amended at any regular or · special meeting of the Board by favorable majority vote of the members present, provided a copy of the proposed amendment or amendments shall have been mailed to each members of the Board at least two weeks prior to the meeting at which it or they are to be considered."

By-Laws, Section I, Sub 2. The seal of the Board shall be as follows: an embossed circular seal consisting of two concentric circles, one and one-half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ inches and one and three-quarters (1-3/4) inches in diameter. Beginning near the bottom of the left side between the two circles shall appear the words "Arizona State Board of Technical Registration." At the bottom of the annular space between the two circles shall appear the date "1921." Within the inner circle shall appear the shield from the great seal of Arizona.

The conference was held in Room 125, College of Mines, University of Arizona, Tucson, and commenced at 10:30 A.M., Friday, May 16, 1969.

Professor Sigmund Smith of the College of Mines began the meeting with a tour of the facilities at the college, displaying the equipment used by the students in their assaying and metallurgical engineering studies. At the conclusion of the tour, a lunchbreak was taken.

During the afternoon, the primary discussion was the examinations, as attached, and the meeting was determined to be a success upon the completion of the discussion since this was the first opportunity ever offered for all registered Assayers in Arizona to be collected in one group.

Regarding the examinations, the Executive Secretary advised that each person present would receive a copy of the proposed examination content when they had been revised by Professor Smith, later this summer, and before the examination would be finalized.

The group felt it was necessary that they keep in contact with each other and formulate a so-called society in order to collectively approach the Legislature with changes affecting assayers in the law as they felt the definition of assayer needed up-dating considerably. Therefore, they selected Pete Flores to serve as Secretary and Roward B. Nicholas as Chairman for this group to initiate its beginning.

The meeting concluded at 4:45 P.M.

Following is the discussion on the Assayer's Examination of December, 1968:

PART I

The first suggestion was that Problem #5 be eliminated as analysis for copper on an ore could be made either on a dry or wet basis.

Problems #2 and #3 are too similar on moisture and suggested Problem #3 be used.

problem #4 raised the question should an assayer know about ounces on per metric ton basis. Consensus was that there should be at least one question on system of measures on precious metals. Problems #6 and #12 were similar and should have just one question covering measures.

Problem #7 was okay.

Problem #8 suggested change word from "fusion" to "ignition."

On Problem #9 needs more information after the figure 0.005, suggested millimeters or CC.

Problems #10 and #11 are same type of problem and suggested one problem on gravimetric calculations.

Overall it was felt that too much emphasis was place on fire assaying in this examination.

PART II

It was suggested on Problem #1 that the word "wet" be deleted.

On Problem #2 it was suggested that 4 or 5 methods be listed to determine metals in ore (standard or basic).

It was suggested on Problem #3 the examinee write a paragraph on procedures behind fluxing, which would also encompass Problem #10.

Use either Problem 5 or 6 and include metallics in the question.

Again, too much emphasis on fire assaying in this examination.

It was felt the examination should be broken down as follows:

20% - Fire Assaying

20% - Colorimetric

20% - Atomic Absorption (a diagram, description & illustration question on the use of atomic absorption giving basic prinicpals)

20% - Molybdenum concentration (what methods to use on it?)

20% - Spectograph (what does it actually do?)

Several questions were suggested to be used:

1. How does a PH meter work?

2. What is sulphide and non-sulphide copper? Make a distinction between sulphide and non-sulphide copper.

3. Make a list of minerals - identify the ones which have copper.

4. Determine amount of sulphur in copper bullion. 5. An acidity question.

On June 10, 1969, Governor Williams appointed Mr. James L. Knickerbocker to replace Mr. N. R. Feldman, effective June 30, 1969, and at the same time reappointed Mr. Vanlandingham.

Due to the change in the By-Laws, see Minute Page 2439, the election of officers for the ensuing year was held and the results are as follows:

It was moved by Mr. Place and seconded by Mr. Gonzales that Charles W. Newlin be elected Chairman. Motion carried unanimously.

It was moved by Mr. Gonzales and seconded by Dr. Newlin that Earle M. Cassidy be elected Vice-Chairman. Motion carried unanimously.

It was moved by Mr. Gonzales and seconded by Dr. Newlin that M. L. Vanlandingham be elected Secretary. Motion carried unanimously.

SUBJECT: Report of Grievance Committee #1 Meeting held August 8, 1969

Grievance Committee #1 held a meeting on August 8, 1969, beginning at 9:30 A.M. in the office of the Board, 3550 N. Central Ave., Suite 923, Phoenix, Arizona. The following members of the Committee were present as well as Mr. James L. Knickerbocker from Grievance Committee #2:

The Committee accepted the following report from the Executive Secretary regarding complaints filed in the office of the Board and the recommendations of this Committee to the Board immediately follow the report by the Executive Secretary in each instance:

1. Robert L. Owen, Payson, Arizona

Mr. Clifford and the Executive Secretary went to Payson, Friday, July 25, 1969, and were unable to locate Mr. Owen due to his temporary employment in Overton, Nevada. We were, however, able to get word to Mr. Owen regarding our visit and the results of this are as the attached letters, Items 1 and 2.

As we lack further information at this time, we recommend to the Committee that this complaint be held in abeyance until we have an opportunity to talk to Mr. Owen upon his return to Arizona.

The Committee recommends to the Board that no action be taken in this matter of Robert L. Owen pending further report from the Executive Secretary.

2. Douglas E. Perkins, Sedona, Arizona

The Board received a drawing for a residence in Sedona, which contained the seal and signature of Douglas E. Perkins indicating he was providing engineering services. We visited with Mr. Perkins in his office which had on the front glass a large sign "Douglas E. Perkins, Engineering Services," and Mr. Perkins identified the drawings as being his work and containing his signature and seal. Mr. Perkins obviously denied he was practicing engineering. The subject plans were received anonimously by the office of the Board.

At the conclusion of the visit with Mr. Perkins, we proceeded to Prescott where the plans were delivered to Mr. T. L. Beck, Yavapai County Attorney, who accepted same as evidence of a misdemeanor under A.R.S. 32-145 and proceeded to have the sheriff photograph the sign on Mr. Perkin's window. He stated that as County Attorney he had jurisdiction and would take prompt action against Mr. Perkins.

It was the recommendation of the Assistant Attorney General and the Executive Secretary that Mr. Beck prosecute Mr. Perkins for holding himself out as an Engineer.

No further action is required by the Board of Technical Registration unless Mr. Beck requires professional testimony during his prosecution.

The Grievance Committee #1 accepts the action of the Executive Secretary and concurs that Mr. T. L. Beck, Yavapai County Attorney, has jurisdiction in this matter and recommends to the Board that this matter be closed. The Executive Secretary was directed to secure for the files of the Board the outcome of Mr. Beck's efforts.

3. Joseph W. McShane, Jr., Prescott, Arizona

While in Prescott, we attempted to investigate the matter of Joseph W. McShane, Jr. who is alleged to have designed a church in Show Low. Said allegation was conveyed to the Board from Herbert W. Schneider, Secretary of the Central Chapter of the American Institute of Architects, and enclosed a copy of the Show Low White Mountain Eagle dated October 4, 1968.

To locate Mr. McShane's whereabouts it was necessary to call him at home from which we determined his office was located in Arc Realty's "office." To secure this information, the Executive Secretary had to identify himself over the phone. We immediately proceeded to Arc Realty and discovered Mr. McShane had left moments before to have some tires changed on his car but would return shortly. We sat in the office for sometime but the subject did not return.

Mr. Clifford must return to Prescott on other State business in the near future and will either further investigate Mr. McShane or will take the Executive Secretary with him for the investigation. Further report to the Committee will be made after we have contacted the subject individual.

The Committee recommends to the Board that no action be taken in this matter of Joseph W. McShane, Jr. pending further report from the Executive Secretary.

4. Del Elia Consultants, Inc., Scottsdale, Arizona

The office of the Board received on May 24, 1969, a complaint from Mr. William W. Thompson which attached a letterhead and card used by Del Elia Consultants, Inc., attached to this report as Items 3 and 4.

We were able to find Mr. Del Elia in Scottsdale, Arizona, at the address listed, and were amazed to find Consulting Engineers in iron letters, two feet high, in front of the office. The interior of the office was the magnificent work of a qualified interior designer, plush and impressive in every respect. Mr. Del Elia and his associate had an extensive library of engineering publications and we were able to observe two drafting tables with draftsmen.

Mr. Del Elia and his associate, name unavailable, denied the practice of engineering in Arizona and denied that they were practicing engineering at all even though he was highly qualified and consultant to numerous foreign countries.

He further stated that his firm had now changed their name to DELCOR, Inc., and were issuing their first public stock. He further promised that the sign in front of the building would be taken down immediately and he would provide the office of the Board with a copy of his name, letterhead and business cards together with a statement as to their practice.

It is the opinion of Mr. Clifford and myself that Mr. Del Elia's practice involves misinforming the public and somewhere there will be a financial loss by some individual. We were unable to determine whether they are in fact practicing engineering and cannot recommend prosecution at this time.

We do recommend that the Board authorize a professional "in depth" investigation of Joe Del Elia, his associates and his corporation and make such information as is available from this investigation to the appropriate State agencies.

Crievance Committee #1 directed the Executive Secretary to reply to Mr. Del Elia's letter and require that the telephone listing, page 300 of the Phoenix telephone directory, be deleted (these items were handed out at the meeting, attached as Items 5 and 6). The Committee further recommends to the Board no action be taken in this matter.

5. Klatt Autotechnics and Engineering Co., Tempe, Arizona

We visited with Mr. Klatt of 117 E. Ellis Drive, Tempe, Arizona, regarding a complaint received May 2, 1969, from the Arizona Society of Professional Engineers' Ethical Practices Committee and determined that Mr. Klatt was indeed operating in Ft. Huachuca and Sierra Vista in automobile services, parts and equipment, and gasoline service stations. Mr. Klatt provided us with his long range development plan in which he desires to acquire book-keeping, management companies and escrow services. It was quite obvious Mr. Klatt was not practicing engineering but was using the term to further himself in his operations in the field of repairing and designing modified automobiles and proposes to use same in his management operations.

We recommend that Mr. Klatt be requested to eliminate the term engineering in his company, as per the attached letter, Item 7, and that if he does so voluntarily, no further action be taken.

Grievance Committee #1 directed the Executive Secretary to notify Mr. Klatt, as per the letter submitted, and recommends to the Board that this matter be closed. The Grievance Committee #1 further directed the Executive Secretary to keep closer liaison with the Corporation Commission regarding issuing of corporate names.

The main reason for the special Grievance Committee #1 meeting and possible special meeting of the Board is due to the following complaint:

6. Arthur H. Levin, Civil Engineer, Los Angeles, California Herman Charles Light, F.A.I.A., Los Angeles, California

The office of the Board received an inquiry from the City of Mesa whether a set of plans submitted to the City of Mesa Building Inspection Department, having the title block of Arthur H. Levin, Civil Engineer, his seal and signature, and signature of Harold L. Williams, Architect, was in accordance with the Statutes.

At the time this inquiry was made the office advised that it was not so and that Mr. Williams as architect must acquire a temporary certificate. In attempting to develop a temporary certificate for Mr. Williams, he informed us that he had only prepared preliminary sketches for the project and that Mr. Levin was in fact the person employed by the client. This office on the advice of an architect-member refused to issue a temporary certificate and advised Mr. Levin by telephone that he should notify the client to employ an architect registered in Arizona. Subsequent to this conversation, a new set of plans appeared in the office of the City of Mesa Building Inspection Department which appeared to be identical to the ones originally submitted and showed evidence of changes, the title block and seal of Mr. Levin's and signature of Mr. Williams were erased, and the seal and signature of Mr. Herman C. Light substituted thereon. The changes were made to comply with the request of the City of Mesa. These changes of a minor nature will be pointed out on the plans.

Dr. Newlin and Mr. Vanlandingham examined the plans in the office of the City of Mesa Building Inspection Department and directed further investigation. Mr. Clifford was authorized by the Attorney General that investigation be continued here and in California as well.

Mr. Clifford and I spent the day in Los Angeles and the following are the results:

A visit with Harold L. Williams, Architect and now applicant for registration in Arizona, indicated that he did do the preliminary work on the design of the Mesa Post Office and the plans carrying the title block Arthur H. Levin represented the design performed by him and that the drafting being done in the office of Arthur H. Levin under his supervision.

We next attempted to contact Mr. Herman C. Light who was reported to be out of town.

We next visited the office of Arthur H. Levin. Upon request, Mr. Levin produced the original drawings of the Mesa Post Office which showed evidence of his title block and his seal and signature being erased. In response to questioning, Mr. Levin stated that the tracings were prepared by his employee, Rudy. Rudy was also present and assisted Mr. Levin in identifying these drawings as his work. Also, in response to questioning, Mr. Levin confirmed that the original tracings were prepared under the supervision of Mr. Williams which had not been altered prior to the erasuring described above and the addition of Mr. Light's seal and signature.

It is the recommendation of the Executive Secretary that Grievance Committee #1 consider reporting to a special meeting of the Board that the evidence available indicates a violation of the Technical Registration Act on the part of Mr. Herman C. Light under A.R.S. 32-128, A.2 and A.3. The Executive Secretary further suggests to the Grievance Committee #1 that it report to the Board an apparent violation exists on the part of Arthur H. Levin under A.R.S. 32-128, A.2.

Grievance Committee #1 recommends to the Board that Mr. Herman Charles Light, Architect, Arizona Registration Number 5579, be charged under A.R.S. 32-128, A.2 and A.3 with misconduct in the practice of his profession and the full paragraph on aiding and abetting. Grievance Committee #1 further recommends to the Board that Mr. Arthur H. Levin, Civil Engineer, Arizona Registration Number 5398, be charged with a violation of A.R.S. 32-128, A.2, other misconduct in the practice of his profession.

The Committee having no further business adjourned at 11:00 A.M.



It was determined that a supplemental appropriation would be required to publish this annual report and by direction of the Chairman, the Executive Secretary was instructed not to advertise for bids until after the Budget Committee had received the supplemental appropriation or was able to allocate other funds.

REPORT OF SPECIAL OFFICE PROCEDURES COMMITTEE

As presented in the Executive Secretary's report on the 48th Annual Meeting of the National Council of Engineering Examiners, the Board discussed the securing of Social Security numbers from all applicants and registrants, and the Chairman directed the Executive Secretary to secure such Social Security numbers.

Mr. Vanlandingham as Chairman of the Special Office Procedures Committee directed a discussion on the issuance of temporary certificates which proposed that temporary certificates no longer be issued to out-of-state residents. As the issue was not resolved, the Chairman directed the Special Office Procedures Committee to report at the next December meeting of the Board and the agenda of that meeting be suspended to bring this matter as one of the first orders of business.

Mr. Vanlandingham issued an oral report on the forms proposed by the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards for use by this Board on all architectural applications. The matter not being resolved, the Chairman directed that the Special Office Procedures Committee prepare an in-depth report at the December meeting.

The Executive Secretary reported on the difficulties experienced with the Finance Department in securing the services of their computer system as it was anticipated that the Finance Department would demand our becoming a part of the computer system after short notice, and that the Board should expend some of its funds to Personal Services to implement a program which would allow assimilating data which would be required for the computer. It was moved by Dean Fahey and seconded by Mr. Knickerbocker that the Executive Secretary be authorized to spend from Personal Services those funds required to implement this procedure. Motion carried.

Report of the 48th Annual Meeting of the National Council of

Engineering Examiners

The Arizona Board was represented by the Executive Secretary at the Annual Meeting held in San Antonio, Texas, August 25th through the 29th and it was indeed one of the better meetings they have held in the past few years. Mr. Jack W. Beretta of the Texas Board was Chairman of the Host Committee and presented a fine capsule tour of San Antonio and Texas together with excellent parties and entertainment.

During the work sessions, the Executive Secretary attended primarily the Western Zone meeting, the meeting of the State Board Secretaries and the general sessions.

The next meeting of the Western Zone will be held in Salt Lake City either April 24-25 or May 15-16, 1970, the exact dates to be worked out by Grant Borg, Western Zone Director, and James Sams. The Western Zone meeting recommended to the National Council of Engineering Examiners George Sutton's, of Nevada, Code of Professional Conduct which Mr. Sutton has presented at previous meetings and proposes to be incorporated in the Model Law. Copy of this proposal is attached, and is now a part of the Nevada Registration Act.

The Secretaries meeting spent the entire morning on a discussion of forms to be used for transmittal of information between the Boards regarding applicants. The final adoption of a standard form will not be made until 1970 and will probably be similar to the form we are now using. One of the discussions during this meeting was that in the future the Fundamentals examinations will probably be transmitted using the Social Security number. Each Board should consider including the applicant's Social Security number as part of the information provided with the application, and as Executive Secretary, I wholly endorse this and make a later recommendation in this report that this office begin immediately requiring the Social Security number of all applicants.

The general meetings of the National Council of Engineering Examiners were continuation of previous meetings and reports with excessive discussion on Universal Comity and the Model Law.

Regarding Universal Comity, I have extracted, as follows, the recommendation adopted by the National Council of Engineering Examiners from the Committee on Qualifications for Registration:

"Mr. President, I request this report be received for printing.

"Mr. President: The committee wishes to make the following motions:

"(a) I move that Part IV of the Declaration of Universal Cimity be amended to read '....has never been found in violation of the

trust inherent in his registration or license if questioned by a Registration Board or Authority in answer to a complaint' involving his...

- "(b) I move that the Declaration of Universal Comity be made the established policy of the National Council of Engineering Examiners.
- "(c) I move that those Boards presently accepting the Declaration be noted in THE PRACTICE OF ENGINEERING IN THE UNITED STATES."

All motions carried.

The Universal Comity according to National Council of Engineering Examiners is as the following Declaration and eliminates the personal audience requirement:

- "(a) It is recommended that <u>all</u> States will accept fully certification of education, experience and references through the Committee on National Engineering Certification;
- "(b) It is recommended that <u>all</u> States will license by Comity those Registered Engineers in good standing who have the following qualifications:

I--graduation from an ECPD accredited engineering curriculum, and

II -- satisfactory completion of 16-hours of approved examination, and

III--four or more years of satisfactory experience in engineering practice, and

IV--that an applicant for registration by Comity or Reciprocity shall certify that he has never been found in violation of the trust inherent in his registration or license if questioned by a Registration Board or Authority in answer to a complaint."

In accordance with the Board's previous instructions I voted opposing the Declaration of Universal Comity due to our personal audience requirement and propose this Board notify the National Council of Engineering Examiners that Arizona not be listed among those Boards presently accepting this Declaration. I believe this requirement is necessary to maintain our personal audience status.

The discussion on the Fundamentals of Engineering examinations indicates that April, 1970, will be the first time in which four hours of the Fundamentals of Engineering examination will be prepared by Educational Testing Service in multiple choice form.

Discussion of the Model Law was lengthy and certain changes were approved and others rejected. However, the bitterness between the States on the changing of the wording regarding the written examinations necessitated all changes to the Model Law be withheld until the 1972 Seattle meeting. Members of the

Board who may be appointed to the Model Law Committee in the interim will find considerable work as a committee member in that changes to the Model Law and how the Model Law should read is by no means unanimous even among members of the member-boards.

The next meeting and 50th Anniversary of the National Council of Engineering Examiners will be held in Chicago, with the 1971 meeting in Puerto Rico, and the 1972 meeting in Seattle, Washington.

It is recommended that the Board instruct the office to secure the Social Security number on every applicant and to notify the National Council of Engineering Examiners the Board's position on Universal Comity.

Preamble

The Engineer in the practice of his profession is often faced with choices of procedure which are not dictated by technology, but by interpersonal and personal considerations. While no code of conduct or set of rules can be framed which will particularize all of the duties of the Engineer in all the relations of professional life, the following code of conduct is adopted as a guide for the required maintenance of a high standard of integrity and dignity in the profession of engineering.

Rule 1. Definition; Disciplinary Action; Construction.

1.1 As used in this code of conduct "Engineer" means a person who, by reason of his professional education and practical experience, is registered by proper authority to engage in the practice of professional engineering as defined by law.

1.2 This code of conduct constitutes rules of professional conduct. The willful breach of any of the rules shal be punished as authorized by law. The specification by the rules of certain conduct as unprofessional is not to be interpreted as approval of conduct not specifically mentioned. Nothing in these rules is intended to limit or supersede any provision of law relating to the duties and obligations of Engineers or the consequences of a violation thereof.

Rule 2. Relations with the public.

2.1 While the primary responsibility of an Engineer is to his specific client, he shall not perform any engineering work or design which detracts from the safety, health and welfare of the public.

2.2 While an Engineer may advertise his qualifications required by law for the practice of professional engineering, such advertisements shall not indicate a comparison with any other Engineer or Engineers, nor shall they include any general superlatives.

2.3 An Engineer shall not issue a public expression of opinion on engineering matters without indicating that such is his opinion. He shall properly distinguish between engineering fact and engineering opinion.

2.4 An engineer shall make no public comment as to the qualification, or lack of qualification, of another Engineer, except that he may attack the

except that he may state whether or not another is registered.

2.5 An Engineer shall not offer to pay, directly or indirectly, any fee, contribution or refund in order to secure work,
but he may use an employment agency to obtain a salaried

Position.

Rule 23. Relations with employers and clients.

3.1 An Engineer shall undertake only those engineering

assignments for which he is qualified.

3.2 An Engineer shall accept no commissions or allowances directly or indirectly from any vendor or contractor unless such vendor or contractor is a bona fide client.

3.3 An Engineer shall inform his employer or client of any financial interest in any vendor or contractor, invention, machine or apparatus actually involved in any project or work

of his employer or client.

3.4 An Engineer shall disclose no information concerning the business affairs or technical processes of any present or former employer or client without consent from such employer or client.

3.5 An Engineer shall accept no compensation, commission or allowance from more than one person for the same engineering

service without the consent of all interested persons.

3.6 An Engineer shall not engage in supplementary engineer-

ing employment without the consent of his employer.

3.7 An Engineer shall inform his employer of the potential effect of any changes in a design required by his employer. A notification of such possible effects will absolve him of responsibility under this code of conduct, but if his stamp is affixed to such design, he is legally responsible therefor.

3.8 The Engineer-client relationship, once established, is

continuous until the engagement is terminated.

Rule 4. Relations with engineers.

4.1 An Engineer shall not take credit for any engineering work performed by another.

4.2 An Engineer shall not mislead any prospective engineering employee as to working conditions and proposed status of employment.

4.3 An Engineer shall not injure maliciously the profession-

al reputation, prospects or practice of another Engineer.

4.4 An Engineer is required to present to the state authority charged by law with registering Engineers any evidence of malpractice or other violation of the law governing professional engineering which comes to his attention.

4.5 An Engineer shall not compete unfairly with another Engineer by either claiming technical superiority or a lesser

charge structure.

4.6 An Engineer shall not submit bids for engineering services, but he may submit proposals for engineering services which include a description of such services and the proposed charges therefor. He shall not modify such proposal after submission, so that only the fee is changed. Correlary modifications of both services and fees are permitted.



Program Objective or Purpose

PURPOSE: This agency is established to register and regulate the practice of Architects, Assayers, Engineers, Geologists, Landscape Architects and Land Surveyors for the protection of the health, welfare and safety of the public.

FUNCTION: As defined in Title 32, Chapter I, ARS 1956

ARTICLE I. BOARD OF TECHNICAL REGISTRATION

No. 32-101. Definitions

Under this section, the definitions of the professions registered (Architect, Architect-in-Training, Assayer, Engineer, Engineer-in-Training, Geologist, Geologist-in-Training, Landscape Architect, Landscape Architect-in-Training and Land Surveyor) are defined as well as definitive descriptions of the practice authorized for these professions.

No. 32-102. Board of Technical Registration.

Established the Board and defines the method, terms, and size of Board

appointed by Governor as well as the ex-officio member. No. 32-103. Qualifications of Members.

No. 32-103. Qualifications of Members.

Defines qualifications of appointive members.

No. 32-104. Compensation.

Defines allowances for mileage and travel expense, prohibits compensation to members and authorizes renewal without payment of fee.

No. 32-105. Organization.

Established the organization of the Board and prescirbes the minimum number of meetings.

No. 32-106. Powers and Duties.

Defines the powers and duties and responsibilities,

No. 32-107. Board Secretary: Duties; Salary.

Defines this officer's duties, salary and responsibility.

No. 32-108. Annual Report; filing copies of lists of registrants.

Requires annual reporting to the Governor, Secretary of State, and Board of Supervisors.

No. 32-109. Technical registration fund.

Established technical registration fund and prescribes method of depositing and disbursing.

ARTICLE II. REGISTRATION

No. 32-121 through 32-128 describes the method of registration of the authorized professions, types of registration and certificates, defines seals and use for registrants, authorizes and describes for revocation of certificates.

ARTICLE III. REGULATORY PROVISIONS.

No. 32-141 through 32-145 authorizes and defines practice by registrants in firms or corporations, requirements of registrants on public works, grants exception to practice of registrants within the professions, authorizes exemptions and limitations on non-registrants, and enumerates violations and penalty for non-registrants.

All past expenditures of this agency have been to impliment this program.

The Grievance Committee #2 met in the office of W. J. Fahey, Tucson Arizona, to discuss items referred to it for consideration by the Board. Submitted for consideration by the Board is the following description of the Committee's deliberations and recommendations relative to these items.

 Participation in the Committee's deliberations by Mr. Lew Place, Tucson, Arizona, was accomplished by telephone. He concurs with the views and recommendations expressed below.

2. Regarding:

- a) C. P. Nichols Engineering Company, Inc., 2013 South Alvernon Way, Tucson, Arizona.
- b) The Temprite Engineering Company, 2102 East 14th Street, Tucson, Arizona.

These items were discussed together because of their common characteristics. The allegation is that these companies are in violation of the Arizona law by virtue of including the word "engineering" in the company name while not having registered engineers on their staffs. (For complete details, see the Executive Secretary's files.) In particular, a violation of Section 32-145, Paragraph 2, of the Arizona Revised Code may be indicated.

However, it is noted that the complaint here is against a corporate entity. The Arizona State Board of Technical Registration is constituted to deal with persons, including both registrants and non-registrants. The Arizona Corporation Commission exists, presumably, to assure compliance by corporate entities within the State with the laws of Arizona.

Therefore, it is the recommendation of this Committee that the Board instruct the Executive Secretary to advise the Arizona Corporation Commission of these apparent violations, to direct the Commission's attention to relevant parts of the A.R.C. (including "engineering practice"), and further to attempt to assure that in future approvals of company names, the Commission act -- in cooperation with the Board as necessary -- to prevent unlawful use of the word "engineering".

3. Regarding:

a) Mr. Clyde Cook. It has been alleged that Mr. Clyde Cook is practicing illegally as an architect in offering and doing architectural services not incidental to engineering. (For full details, see the Executive Secretary's file.) No evidence of unlawful behavior, other than the allegation itself, was made available to this Committee.

Therefore, it is the recommendation of this Committee that the Executive Secretary be instructed by the Board to accomplish further investigation of the alleged unlawful activity by Mr. Clyde Cook, and to report the results of such investigation to this Committee.

4. The Committee recommends to the Board the acceptance and implementation of this report and the specific recommendations contained therein.



SUBJECT: Policy on Firm Names

As you are aware, there have been occasional considerations by the state registration boards of appropriate policy on the use of names of retired or deceased partners or officers in firm names. Several state registration boards have adopted policies or regulations on this matter.

The National Architect-Engineer Liaison Commission, composed of representatives of NSPE, AIA and CEC, appointed a task force to study this matter and to seek to determine whether it would be desirable to suggest a uniform policy to the state boards. Following a comprehensive survey and study of the subject the NAELC adopted a policy statement for submission to the state boards. A copy is enclosed for your information and such action as the state boards may wish to take. The American Institute of Architects has furnished the policy statement to the architectural registration boards. The enclosed policy has been approved by the Board of Directors of NSPE.

Please let us know at any time if the NSPE Registration Committee can be of assistance to the state boards.

PROPOSED POLICY ON FIRM NAMES

"Names used by firms of architects and of engineers shall meet the following requirements in a manner satisfactory to the appropriate Registration Board:

- (1) Names of retired or deceased partners or officers may hereafter be retained in the firm name after their retirement or death, only if:
 - a. There is a written agreement providing for the continued use of the names of the partners or officers in the firm name, and
 - b. They had been active partners or officers continuously for not less that five (5) years at the time of retirement or death, and
 - c. The retired partner or officer does not practice his profession under his own name, and
 - d. The names of the retired or deceased partners or officers are appropriately included on the stationery with suitable indication of status.
- (2) When the firm name does not include the names of all active partners or officers:
 - a. Their names and addresses and other pertinent data required by the Board shall be on file with all applicable Registration Boards."

(Approved by NSPE Board of Directors, January 1969)

Sub-Para 3. Change the four years experience requirement in line 3 to the experience requirement outlined in the current standards of the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards.

Sub-Para 7. Beginning with line 5 and ending with line 11:

Omit - "Consultation, investigation, evaluation, planning, design and supervision of construction for the purpose of assuring compliance with specifications and design, in connection with any public or private utility, structure, building, machine, equipment, process, work or project, and includes plans and designs relating to the location, development, mining and treatment of ores and other minerals."

Insert - "Consultation, research, investigation, evaluation, planning, surveying, design, location, development and review of construction for conformance with contract documents and design, in connection with any public or private utility, structure, building, machine, equipment, process, work or project. Such services and work includes plans and designs relating to the location, development, mining and treatment of ores and other minerals.

ARS 32-102

para A. It is concluded that the present provision for an exofficio member of the Board be eliminated. All nine members to
be appointed by the Governor, three to be Architects, five to be
professional Engineers and one to be from one of the remaining
categories administered by the Board.

Para B. That this paragraph be changed to reflect changes made in Paragraph A above.

ARS 32-103

Sub-Para 3. Delete reference to Architect-Engineer. Reword as: "Have at least ten years of active experience as attested by registration under this chapter."

ARS 32-106

Para C. That lines one, two and three be changed as:. . . "Represented at National Councils or organizations of proficiencies registered under this chapter, and may pay. . . "

ARS 32-107

Para B. That this paragraph should be deleted with no substitution.

ARS 32-122

Para B. Change present paragraph "B" to paragraph "C". Add new paragraph "B" as follows: "An applicant for registration as a Professional Engineer shall be not less than twenty-five years of age and of good moral character and repute, and shall have received a Bachelor's Degree in an Engineering or related Science curricula approved by the Board together with being engaged actively for at least four years in Engineering work of a character satisfactory to the Board of which not more than two years may be accomplished in the academic instruction, teaching or research area."

ARS 32-124

That the title be changed to: Registration, Examination and Miscellaneous fees.

And that the entire section one through four be deleted and substitute: The Board shall establish and publish in its rules a schedule of fees for applications, examinations, and such other miscellaneous fees for services rendered as required.

ARS 32-125

Para A. That this paragraph be deleted in its entirety and substitute: The Board shall adopt and shall prescribe seals for the use of registrants who hold valid certificates. Each seal shall bear the name of the registrant, the category under which he is registered, registration number and other such data the Board deems pertinent.

ARS 32-127

Para C. Delete - Subparagraphs 1 and 2.

Substitute - "The Board shall establish the annual renewal fees for each proficiency registered under this chapter.

ARS 32-1.42

para A. To be changed to read as follows: Drawings, plans, specifications and estimates for public works of the state or a political subdivision thereof involving Architecture, Assaying, Geology, Engineering, Landscape Architecture, or Land Surveying, shall be prepared by or under the personal direction of, and the construction of such works shall be executed under the direct supervision of a qualified registrant withing the category involved.

Add subparagraph C. All public work funded by monies from any source be designed by resident registrants as evidenced by the payment of taxes for two consecutive years.

ARS 32-143

This paragraph should be changed to:

"Registrants under this code may engage in practice outside the category within which they are registered only to the extent that such registrant is qualified and as such work may be necessary and incidental to the work of his profession on a specific project."

ARS 32-144

Add Para A to initial wording

Sub-Para 4. Change ten thousand to thirty thousand and three thousand to ten thousand.

Add Para B: The requirements of this code shall not apply to any public service corporation or by full time employees of any of them, provided such work is in connection with or incidental to products, systems or non-engineering services related to such common carriers or public service corporation and not for use by the public. The terms products or systems as used in this subsection shall not include buildings, structures, building components, site development, transportation facilities, route design or location except as defined in Subparagraph 'A' above.

- "3. ARS 32-122
 Also delete engineer and engineering from paragraph A.
- 114. ARS 32-142 last line correct word 'within.'
- ms. ARS 32-144
 para beginning with the word Architects label A.
 sub-para 4, change to read,

A non-registrant who designs buildings or structures for single family residence, the cost of which does not exceed fifty thousand dollars for each building, or who designs alterations to any single story building, the cost of which does not exceed five thousand dollars for each building.

Mr. Dryden handed out a report of the meeting held December 5th in which other changes to the October 28th report presented, see Minute Page 2603.

The ramifications of these proposed changes to the Technical Registration Act were reviewed in detail and the members presented other information as to proposed bills and trends of the professions.

Mr. A. R. Turk, visitor, was asked to present his comments on the Joint Council of the Design Professions. He stated that the association in the Tucson area had never heard of this Joint Council of the Design Professions and there was an apparent lack of communications between the Phoenix area and his area. He commented that he was pleased to see the in-depth discussion on the part of the Board and sincerely hoped that the Board and the professional societies in the Phoenix area would endeavor to inform their southern counterparts.

Chairman Newlin noted that while individual members of the Board seemed fully informed on the reports of the reviewing professionals, it would appear necessary that the Legislative Committee of this Board arrange for, as soon as practicable, a meeting with the Joint Council of the Design Professions to fully ascertain the recommended legislation by this group prior to its presentation to the Legislature and that the Legislative Committee be authorized to act in behalf of the Board according to their best judgment.

REPORT OF THE EVALUATION & EXAMINATION COMMITTEES

Mrs. Joan S. Brooking, landscape architectural applicant, File No. 69-82, requested reconsideration, see letter on Minute Page 2604, and appeared before the Board. She presented an in-depth discussion of her qualifications and limitations. Mr. Vanlandingham, as Chairman of the Landscape Architectural Evaluation Committee, stated that in the case of Mrs. Brooking his committee recommends that the Board's previous action, shown on Minute Page 2462, be reaffirmed. 1. "Delete Para 2 in the preamble as it should be easier for a registrant

from another state to get registration. Para 2 in the October 28 proposed changes read as follows: "Any person applying for a permit should undergo the same investigation and/or examination as any regular applicant... and in the same course of time."

The council concurred in this deletion but largely for other reasons:

a. This was not the proper place for such a requirement. It should be

under 32-124, "Registration fees."

- b. Since a previously recommended change had been to completely change this article in name and context, making the establishment of fees for applications, examinations, permits, etc., a matter of Board determination such wording as had been shown in the above para 2 of the preamble was redundant.
- 2. ARS 32-101. Sub para 2 Omit beginning with design investigation, design and review of construction for conformance with contract documents and design, in connection with any planning, building, site development on project.

The council objected to this change as being a somewhat confused attempt to retroact and eliminate wording which had been carefully worked out to satisfy all of the disciplines concerned.

- 3. ARS 32-122. Also delete "engineer" and "engineering" from para A. Council concurred.
 - 4. ARS 32-142. Last line, correct word "within". Council concurred.
- 5. ARS 32-144. Para beginning with Architects label "A", sub para 4 change to read: A non-registrant who designs buildings or structures for single family residence, the cost of which does not exceed fifty thousand dollars for each building, or who designs alterations to any single story building, the cost of which does not exceed five thousand dollars for each building.

Council concurred except that they voted to have "fifty thousand" changed to "twenty-five thousand". In addition Chairman Walling brought one more change. Architects asked that in ARS 32-142, para A, the words "and estimates" be deleted. After considerable discussion, this was voted down, Walling abstaining.

Discussion of Draft No. 1. "Professional Collaboration in Environmental Design". As the discussion of the registration law changes had taken up excess time, this will be put off until the next meeting set for Friday, January 9, 4:00 P. M. at Superlite Building.

Gentlemen:

Following my appearance on September 9, 1969, the Engineering Evaluation Committee made its recommendations to the State Board of Technical Registration. After the September 26, 1969 Board meeting, I was notified by your letter of September 29, 1969 that I was held for all four sections of the written examination.

During the September 9, 1969 interview I was informed that I had satisfied the Committee as to my comprehension of the Arizona Law and Board Regulations; however, I was disappointed with their evaluation of my other qualifications and that I was held for all four sections of the written examination.

I realize that it is not always an easy matter for a person, however well qualified he may be, to evaluate the capabilities and qualifications of another unless there is a rather close personal association and of course this cannot be the case; but because of the slant of some of the questions asked of me during my interview and because of the Board's decision in my case I think it likely that someone has attempted to influence the Board with the mistaken notion that Engineering design done by the City of Phoenix Division of Engineering essentially consists of mere processing of the work done for the City by Consultants, under engineering and architectural contracts, and should be weighed as less than qualifying experience. Paper shuffling.

Nothing could be further from the truth; particularly when applied to the "Special Projects Section" which I have been in charge of for the past several years. Although it is true that my responsibilities include the handling of a good many building and engineering projects done for the City by Consultants, with the accompanying "paper shuffling" such as the examining and approving of claims for payment from the Consultants and the Contractors and of course handling Federal forms by the bundle, my main work consists of the design of projects, many of which are similar in size, scope and difficulty to those for which we from time to time hire Consultants. Many of the projects for which I am responsible require special training and a very broad background in engineering and in construction, to such a degree that with very few exceptions, Consultants which we have hired in the past have been unable to deliver the quality of design equal to that done by my group. Of course this does not necessarily reflect poorly on the Consultants anymore than does the fact that neither I, nor most other Engineers can properly and competitively design a "Glulam" beam, for instance.

In order that my proficiency be better evaluated I would welcome a thorough investigation of my work. I would especially like to have a comparison made between the quality and level of my work and that of the various Consultants who do projects for the City. Upon completion of such an investigation I am sure that you will agree that I am entitled to registration on my proven merits.

I am making no claim that I am competent in every facet of engineering, only that my competence as a professional engineer when judged by the prevailing current professional standards has been more than adequately demonstrated by the fact that I have "filled the shoes" over a great enough period of time to allay any doubts about my qualifications.

Although I know that it would be extremely difficult for me to pass the four sections of the written examination, it is my opinion that it would be equally difficult for most now registered engineers who are of my age and experience to do so.

It would be equally unfair.

For the reasons I have herein explained, I respectfully request that I be allowed to appear before the full Board for reconsideration of my qualifications.

1. This program for the protection of the public consists of considering and passing upon applications for registration, and upon complaints or charges, within its jurisdiction. The Board can compel attendance of witnesses, administer oaths and take testimony. A register is kept which shows date of each application for registration, name, age, qualifications, and place of business of applicant and disposition of application.

BUDGETARY ANALYSIS:

PERSONAL SERVICES The recommendation for Personal Services is based on the Personnel Commission's implementation plan plus the request for one exempt position amounting to 5%.

OPERATING EXPENDITURES It is recommended that the Professional and Outside Services expenditures remain at approximately the current level as this amount appears to be adequate based on past expenditures.

A limited increase in Travel - State and Travel - Out-of-State is recommended in order to provide for greater travel needs.

The recommendation for Other Operating Expenditures is primarily based on the request except for Occupany rent and printing. The recommendation provides for an increase in rent in order that different quarters may be obtained since the cost of renewing the present lease appears to be prohibitive. The printing expenditures are not recommended since state reproduction facilities should be able to service the printing needs.

CAPITAL OUTLAY

The request for Capital Outlay - Equipment consists of one replacement typewriter at \$500, one microfilm card reader printer for \$1,500 and a file cabinet for microfilm jackets at \$500. The typewriter is recommended at the current bid price of \$425 since the present model has excessive years of service. The microfilm card reader printer is not recommended as the Library and Archives can perform any microfilm printing that is necessary. However, it is recommended that \$350 be appropriated for a reader as this item appears to be essential. A file cabinet is recommended at \$107 which is the current bid price.

ANALYSIS: Personal Services - The J.B.C. Staff recommendation would provide full implementation of the state salary plan and an additional step increase for all classified positions resulting in a total \$132.00 above the \$33,236 Executive recommendation.

Other Operating Expenditures - Recommended that \$5,000 be allowed for printing. Other communications items appear higher than necessary. The resulting total for communications is \$3,145 above the Executive recommendation.

The J.B.C. Staff concurs with Executive recommendation for all other categories.

With the heavy emphasis on concrete, steam, and steel in the E.I.T. exams, is there any wonder that growing numbers of E.E. students are electing to bypass them?

Until the P.E. groups catch up with technology, they will continue to be ignored by large numbers of IEEE members, with justification.

STATE BOARD TECHNICAL ALGULATION

Dear Walt:

This morning I was contacted by John Frank, attorney for a Mr. Arnold, a leading architect in town. They believe the following activity to be lawful: Mr. Arnold is to be hired by a contractor to prepare incomplete sketches for the ultimate design and construction of buildings to be sold by the contractor. Mr. Arnold will have no responsibility for the final plans and he will not supervise construction. He does not wish to put his architect's seal on his work for the contractor and does not believe it is necessary that he do so.

I informed Mr. Frank that the law is not clear in this area and that it would be difficult to resolve any such problem without reference to a detailed set of facts. Further, since the law is unclear, there probably is room for Board interpretation as they see fit. Therefore we agreed that a detailed factual proposal would be submitted to the Board for its discussion and ultimate referral to this office with recommendations.

I told Mr. Frank that my preliminary analysis was that a violation of law was likely under the circumstances he described. The architect would be preparing "plans" which would at least become the foundation for the final design. It seems clear that some registrant must assume

responsibility for the end product, since homes erected for sale are not exempt from the Act. Therefore, it seems likely that the architect who ultimately seals the drawings would be adopting Mr. Arnolds work. This course of action would jeopardize both architects: Mr. Arnold has not sealed his work, while the second architect has sealed work not prepared by himself or his bona fide employee. Should the contractor construct these houses without the benefit of an architect's participation in the project, he would, of course, be guilty of a misdemeanor.

The above is only a preliminary analysis of the matter, and must be examined in the light of facts, whill will be established. Perhaps it is possible for Mr. Arnold to remain within the confines of the law, though I fail to see how he can comfortably do so.

Dear Mr. Edelblut:

On February 20th I appeared before a committee of three board members for the purpose of obtaining registration as a Structural Engineer by reciprocity with California. Although I doubt any remedial action can be taken, I wish to express my sincere concern over the manner the examination was conducted and it's apparent outcome. Let me say for your information that my request to become registered was neither frivolous nor certificate hunting. A number of building contractors in Arizona have recently agreed to represent our firm and it is our hope to do considerable business there in the future. Although registration was not required due to the fact that the design is completely performed in California and the building is shipped as a pre-engineered product, I felt professionally obligated to obtain registration where we would be doing business.

As a past president of the Structural Engineers Association of Central California and vice-president of SEAOC, I have strong professional feelings and in my desire to obtain registration, spent considerable time reviewing principals and techniques I had not recently used in order that I might demonstrate my qualifications to the board.

The low score I received on the 20 minute examination was not an indication of my disregard for your regulations as was implied by the board committee or that I was not familiar with the registration act, it only reflects that I considered reviewing my engineering more important than studying the Act. I admit I was not prepared for as detailed an examination in the letter of the registration act as was presented.

After discussing my test score, the committee dwelt at length on my responsibilities with Cuckler Building Systems relative to the requirements of Rule III of the Rules, Regulations and Bylaws. I definitely received the impression that certain members of the board had bias against the metal building industry. Although our company is 100% owned by Mr. D.E. Cuckler, I am the Manager of Engineering and am totally responsible for all engineering decisions. I emphasized to the committee that I am the principal engineer in the firm and could forward a letter to the board signed by Mr. Cuckler.

which certified to this. After this discussion I was asked to leave the nearing room and I cannot believe that my test grade was the subject discussed for the five minutes I waited. However, when I returned there was no further discussion concerning my job responsibilities, I was asked a question from the Act regarding revocation and although I answered part of it, I was told very sarcastically that it was obvious I was not "fully conversant with the Technical Registration Act" and would have to return in three months. I received the clear impression that the board considered me a captive employee and expressed their disregard for "house" engineers by asking me to return for another "examination". Rather than admit to this feeling, the test question subterfuge was resorted to.

This letter may appear strong Mr. Edelblut but I can only say that I have appeared before many boards and committees and have always been favorably received and treated. I was not prepared for the attitude displayed toward me and am convinced this attitude could not have been generated simply by my missing some detailed questions on the letter of the Arizona practice act.

I would appreciate a review of my application and as I noted to the board committee, will be pleased to have a letter forwarded certifying as to my freedom to make engineering decisions as a principal in the firm.

STATE BOARD OF TECHNICAL REGISTRATION

FOR

ARCHITECTS, ASSAYERS, ENGINEERS, GEOLOGISTS LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTS AND LAND SURVEYORS

The following Rules and Regulations were adopted on SEP 1 0 1970 by the Board pursuant to authority of Section 32-106, Arizona Revised Statutes, 1956.

RULE I. GENERAL RULES

A. Applications, General

- 1. The Board meets regularly in March, June, September, and December to consider applications for registration. Prior to consideration by the Board each applicant will be required to appear before an Evaluation Committee of the Board at a time and place established by the committee. The applicant will at this time complete the personal audience requirement, outlined in Rule II, E.
- 2. No application will be evaluated by the committee nor presented to the Board for consideration until all of the required information, including transcripts, concerning the application has been received. This includes a standard application form completely filled out, including required signatures on application, photograph, affidavit, and authorization and release.
- 3. Architectural applicants required to submit a treatise and problem on seismic forces will not be scheduled for evaluation until the treatise and problem have been submitted, satisfactorily graded and accepted by the Evaluation Committee.
- 4. It is the applicant's responsibility to secure transcripts of his records from all colleges attended. The applicant must arrange to have these transcripts sent directly from the college registrar to the office of the Board. The applicant's sole responsibility regarding references is that of furnishing a suitable list. The office of the Board will request such information as it deems necessary from the references submitted by the applicant. References submitted by an applicant should include at least three persons registered in the same general field of experience as the applicant and two references who are now, or have been, the applicant's immediate supervisors. Other persons will be evaluated as references only if their responsibility and their ability to evaluate the technical competence of the applicant can be established by the Board.
- 5. Engineers desiring registration in more than one branch must submit a separate application for each branch and pay the regular fee with each application. Registration in engineering will be granted in the major branches of engineering included in the college curricula approved by the Board. Major branches of engineering presently recognized by the Board are: Aeronautical, Agricultural, Chemical, Civil, Electrical, Geological, Geophysical, Highway, Industrial, Mechanical, Metallurgical, Mining, Nuclear, Petroleum, Sanitary, and Structural

- 6. The Board does not grant registration to residents of other States, except under unusual circumstances, unless they hold registration in the state of their legal residence.
- 7. When an application for registration is denied or withdrawn, the applicant will be so notified of the Board's action. No re-application will be accepted until one year has elapsed from the date of the formal Board action denying the original application. When applications for registration are denied on initial Board action, excluding withdrawals, the refunds will be as per the schedule under Rule III.
- 8. Applicants whose applications for registration are denied subsequent to initial Board action will receive no refund of their application fees.
- 9. No application made on any other than a printed form issued by the Board will be accepted or considered by the Board, except that, in the event any printed form issued by the Board does not contain sufficient space for the necessary evidence to be submitted, the applicant may attach additional sheets to said form to any desired extent, but such attached sheets must be of the same size as the printed form and shall be securely attached thereto.
- 10. An applicant may withdraw his application for registration by written request to the Board for approval of such withdrawal. An approved withdrawal is deemed by the Board to be a denial of an application for registration with neither prejudice nor refund of the application fee to be made.
- II. An applicant for any of the in-training programs shall, in order to be admitted to the in-training examinations, submit an application to the Board on the prescribed form for approval by the Board. It will be necessary for an applicant to pay the application fee required under Rule III for registration as an Architect-in-Training, Engineer-in-Training, Geologist-in-Training, or Landscape Architect-in-Training, as well as the examination fees stated in Rule III.

B. Reconsideration of Initial Board Action

1. Applicants when notified of initial Board action on their application may request reconsideration of same by written petition at least thirty days prior to the subsequent meeting date shown in Rule I. A(1). At the time of the petition the applicant should indicate whether or not he desires a personal appearance before the Board.

C. Experience

1. Qualifying experience, other than time allowed for education, shall in general be limited to that time in which an applicant has been directly employed in a responsible position of a character satisfactory to the Board.

RULE II. EXAMINATIONS

A. General Rules, Applicants for Professional Registration

Initial Examination

1. Applicants for professional registration held for written examination as

a result of initial Board action on their original application or reapplication will be denied their application for registration and forfeit all application and examination fees if they fail to take their first scheduled application and examination following notification of their being held for written examination. However, the Board may waive this rule when an applicant who is unable to take the first scheduled written examination notifies the Board at least ten days prior to the scheduled examination date and requests an extension in writing. Applicants for professional registration held for written examination pursuant to this rule, who have been granted an extension on the first scheduled written examination and who fail to take the next regularly scheduled written examination offered by the Board, shall have their application for registration denied.

Re-examination

- 2. Applicants for professional registration who take the written examination pursuant to Rule II, A(1), and fail to achieve a passing grade will be allowed to re-examine. To be re-examined applicants for professional registration must request re-examination thirty days prior to the next scheduled written examination date, by letter, and pay the scheduled re-examination fee for each part of the examination on which a passing grade was not achieved. Applicants for professional registration who fail to request re-examination and pay the scheduled re-examination fees for two consecutive examination periods shall have their application for professional registration denied.
- 3. Applicants for professional registration who have requested re-examination and paid the scheduled re-examination fee shall forfeit the re-examination fee for failure to appear for the re-examination unless excused by the office of the Board. A request for an excuse must be directed to the office of the Board in writing at least ten days prior to the scheduled written examination date. Applicants for professional registration excused from a re-examination must appear for the next scheduled written examination or his application for professional registration shall be denied.
- 4. The written examination or portions thereof may be waived by the Board when, in the Board's opinion, an applicant has a proven experience record of unusual and comprehensive quality. The Board may require a Comprehensive Oral examination.
- 5. Written examinations for applicants for professional registration as Architect, Assayer, Engineer, Geologist, Landscape Architect and Land Surveyor will be given twice annually at a time and place designated by the Board; other examinations will be given at a time and place established by the Board. The Board shall select and publish the examination dates and locations at least 90 days prior to the date selected.

Reconsideration of Examination Grades

6. Applicants desiring reconsideration of their failing examination grade shall file a petition with the Board at least thirty days prior to the regular meeting subsequent to certification of grades by the Board. At the time of the petition the applicant should indicate whether or not he desires a personal appearance before the Board.

B. General Rules, Applicants for Architect-in-Training, Engineer-in-Training, Geologist-in-Training, Landscape Architect-in-Training

- 1. Engineer-in-Training, Geologist-in-Training and Landscape Architect-in-Training examinations will be given twice annually, at a time and place designated by the Board, and concurrently with the written examinations for professional registration. Applications for in-training examinations and certification must be received in the office of the Board at least thirty days prior to the scheduled date of the examination.
- 2. Applicants for Engineer-in-Training, Geologist-in-Training, and Landscape Architect-in-Training will be permitted to take the in-training examination prior to graduation, but in no event will their probationary period start until they have completed the requirements for graduation. Applicants without college degrees desiring to enter the in-training program will be permitted to take the examination prior to the completion of four years of satisfactory experience by submitting an application bearing the approval of a registered engineer, geologist, or landscape architect, respectively, but their probationary period will not begin until the four years of experience satisfactory to the Board requirement has been met. The in-training applicant who is a student pursuing a curricula which will lead to an engineering, geology or landscape architect degree shall have his application blank certified by his dean or faculty advisor.
- 3. Applicants for Architect-in-Training will be permitted to take the Architect-in-Training examination within twelve months after graduation from an accredited architectural school. The graduates from an accredited architectural school must obtain the signature of the Dean of the College of Architecture on their Architect-in-Training application form. Applicants without college degrees from an accredited architectural school desiring to enter the Architect-in-Training program will be permitted to apply after five years of architectural training under a registered architect by submitting an application to the Board bearing the approval and signature of the current employer. Permission to enter the intraining program, upon application, will be granted by the Architectural Evaluation Committee after review to determine that the applicant has the experience as outlined in the current standards of the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards in architectural work of a character satisfactory to the Board.
- 4. Architect-in-Training examinations will be given twice annually and at a time and place designated by the Board and concurrent with the written examinations for professional registration. Application for the in-training examination and certification from graduates of an accredited architectural school must be received in the office of the Board at least thirty days prior to the scheduled date of the examination. Application for the in-training examination and certification from non-graduates requesting examination and certification under Rule I. B(3) must be received in the office of the Board at least sixty days prior to the date of the scheduled examination.
- 5. As a part of the Architect-in-Training program, both the applicant from an accredited architectural school and the applicant without a college degree will be required to obtain through the secretary of the Board at the time of their request for an Architect-in-Training application, an approved Architect-in-Training log book in which will be set forth in detail the applicant's training record.

Such log books must be accurately kept and all professional architectural experience vouched for and signed by the applicant's registered architectural employer during the full time of the applicant's required training period. The log will form the applicant's training record and must be filed with the secretary of the Board when applying for his professional registration.

- 6. Applicants for Architect-in-Training are not permitted re-examination.
- 7. If an Architect-in-Training passes the in-training examination, credit for History and Theory, Structural Design, and Building Equipment will be given him towards his full professional examination, but, if he fails the intraining examination, no credit will be given and the applicant will have to wait until his required years of training have been completed, at which time he may apply for professional registration, should he meet all of the requirements.
- 8. If an Engineer-in-Training passes the in-training examination, credit for Fundamentals of Engineering will be given him towards his full professional examination, but if he fails the in-training examination, no credit will be given.
- 9. At the time of application for professional registration, credit will be given for Fundamentals of Engineering to any graduate of an ECPD accredited engineering curriculum.
- 10. If a Geologist-in-Training passes the in-training examination, credit for Basic Geology will be given him towards his full professional examination, but if he fails the in-training examination, no credit will be given.
- 11. If a Landscape Architect-in-Training passes the in-training examination, credit for History and Theory; Planting, Design and Identification; and Landscape Architectural Design will be given him towards his full professional examination, but if he fails the in-training examination, no credit will be given.
- 12. Passing an in-training examination will not obligate the Board to accept the applicant for registration as an Architect-in-Training, Engineer-in-Training, Geologist-in-Training, or Landscape Architect-in-Training. It will, however, satisfy the examination requirement should he be accepted and so certified.
- 13. All in-training certificates shall expire eight years after issuance.

C. Context of Written Examinations

- 1. All examinations may contain questions covering the Code of the State Board of Technical Registration and its published Code of Ethics.
- 2. Architect-in-Training -- This is a one-part examination of 13 hours duration on which a passing grade of 75% is required in each subsection. The Board need not offer these subsections to the applicant on the same or successive days. The subsections are not divisible parts of the Architect-in-Training examination. The examination will include: History and Theory concerning the development of architecture; the effect of geography, climate and material resources; the factors of site and orientation; the influence of science and technology; the

varying response to the needs and desires of the changing social pattern; the evolution of design, methods of construction, structural systems and building equipment, the influence of tradition and law; typical historical examples. Structural Design concerning the knowledge of various structural systems; when, how and why each would be used; the determination of safe and efficient sizes of structural elements and arrangements of combinations of such elements as slabs, beams, girders, trusses, columns, walls, foundations, and footings, designed in various materials by either graphical or mathematical analysis. Building Equipment concerning principles of design and detail knowledge concerning heating, ventilating, air conditioning, plumbing, electric wiring, refrigeration, fire protection, and vertical transportation; taking into account scientific, technical, economic and practical factors; also compliance with codes for public health and safety.

3. Architecture -- This examination will be of 36-hours duration, and will consist of the following parts: (C) History and Theory, the development of architecture; the effect of geography, climate, and material resources, the factors of site and orientation; the influence of science and technology; the varying response to the needs and desires of the changing social pattern; the evolution of design, methods of construction, structural systems, and building equipment; the influence of tradition and law; typical historical examples. (D) Site Planning, a short design problem involving a group of public or private buildings of any type, intended to demonstrate the candidate's ability to safeguard the interest of both client and public with respect to land values, obsolescence, traffic; to develop a functional arrangement of buildings and site which will also results in a visually satisfying composition of forms in space. (E) Architectural Design, a specific practical problem involving application of the principles of space design to solution of the program for a building such as might be found in architectural practice. The solution shall be submitted in drawings of specified number, kind, and scale to present an efficient arrangement, logical structural organization, compliance with basic codes for health and safety; also appropriate economy and satisfying aesthetic quality. (F) Building Construction, the use of materials and methods of construction, the selection of appropriate materials and knowledge of how they are combined for use under given conditions, considering their practicality and durability; also the factors of safety, economy, and architectural expression; supervision of construction, detection and correction of defects; sequence of construction operations. (G) Structural Design, the knowledge of various structural systems; when, how, and why each would be used; the determination of safe and efficient sizes of structural elements and arrangements of combinations of such elements as slabs, beams, girders, trusses, columns, walls, foundations, and footings; designed in various materials by either graphical or mathematical analysis. (H) Professional Administration, questions relating to the ethical, legal, and administrative responsibilities of the architect; relationships between architect, owner, and contractor; building arbitration. (I) Building Equipment, principles of design and detailed knowledge concerning heating, ventilating, air conditioning, plumbing, electric wiring, refrigeration, fire protection, and vertical transportation; taking into account scientific, technical, economic and practical factors; also compliance with codes for public health and safety. A passing grade of 75% will be required on each parts of the examination. Certified Architects-in-Training will be allowed credit for the following sections of the examination: (C) History and Theory, (G) Structural Design and (I) Building Equipment.

- 4. Assaying -- This will be a one-part, 8-hour examination, and the Board may, at its discretion, divide the examination into two indivisible subsections which will be given on the same day. The examination will include questions on sampling and fire assaying; gravimetric and volumetric chemical analyses; the theory and use of emission spectograph, atomic absorption spectograph; and colorimetric methods of assaying minerals and mineral products for the more important metals. A passing grade of 70% will be required on the examination.
- 5. Engineer-in-Training -- This is a one-part examination of 8 hours duration which will include questions on fundamentals of engineering. A passing grade of 70% will be required on the examination. The Board may, at its discretion, divide the examination into two individual subsections which will be given on the same day.
- 6. The Board may, also, at its discretion, accept from the Deans of Engineering at Arizona Universities certification that senior students enrolled in ECPD accredited curricula have satisfactorily passed an examination equivalent to the Fundamentals of Engineering offered by the Board.
- 7. Professional Engineering -- The complete professional engineering examination will consist of four parts with the exception of Structural Engineering, which will consist of six parts. Each part of the examination will be of four hours duration and requires a passing grade of 70% on each part of the examination.

All professional engineering examinations are open book and the applicant may bring any text or reference desired.

The parts of the professional engineering examination are defined as follows:

Part 1 Fundamentals of Engineering

Part 2 Fundamentals of Engineering

Part 3 Engineering Analysis

Part 4 Engineering Design

Part 5 Comprehensive Engineering Design

Part 6 Structural Engineering Design

- 8. Geologist-in-Training -- This will be a one-part, 8-hour examination, on which a passing grade of 70% is required. The Board may, at its discretion, divide the examination into two indivisible subsections which will be given on the same day. The examination will consist of questions covering the principles of physical, historical, and structural geology and mineralogy, as well as problems in structural geology.
- 9. Geology -- The complete professional examination for geology is of 16-hours duration, consisting of four parts, on which a passing grade of 70% will be required for each part. The parts of the professional geology examination are as follows:

Part 1 Basic Geology

Part 2 Basic Geology

Part 3 Applied Geology

Part 4 Geological Problems

- 10. Landscape Architect-in-Training -- This will be a one-part examination of 18-hours duration on which a passing grade of 75% is required in each subsection. The Board need not offer these examinations on the same or successive days. The subsections are indivisible parts of the Landscape Architect-in-Training examination. The Landscape Architect-in-Training examination. The Landscape Architect-in-Training examination will cover History and Theory (2 hours); Planting, Design and Identification (6 hours-divided into a 1-hour subsection and 5-hour subsection); and Landscape Architectural Design (10 hours). Reference material will not be permitted for any of these examinations.
- 11. Landscape Architecture -- The complete professional examination for landscape architecture is of 30-hours duration consisting of five parts on which a passing grade of 75% will be required on each part. The parts of the professional landscape architectural examination and the hours of each are as follows, and reference material will not be permitted on these examinations except for Part 4:
 - Part 1 History and Theory (2 hours)
 - Part 2 Planting, Design and Identification (6 hours-divided into a 1-hour subsection and 5-hour subsection)
 - Part 3 Landscape Architectural Design (10 hours)
 - Part 4 Construction (10 hours-divided into a 2-hour subsection and 8-hour subsection)
 - Part 5 Professional Administration (2 hours)
- 12. Land Surveying -- The land surveying examination will be of 16-hours duration and will consist of four parts which will include questions to determine knowledge of the techniques of land surveying, also knowledge of rules and regulations of land surveying, and laws pertaining to the type of work described in Section 32-101 (15) of the Arizona Revised Statutes. A passing grade of 70% will be required on each part of the examination.
- 13. Examination Rules -- The Board will publish prior to each written examination the rules under which the examination will be held for each specific part, and, at the time of the examination will provide the examinee with the questions for the examination and a workbook for all of his submittal.

D. Comprehensive Oral Examination

1. The applicant for professional registration who has received a waiver of the written examination and a comprehensive oral examination substituted therefor by the appropriate Evaluation Committee, shall personally appear at a time and place indicated by the Board for oral demonstration of his proficiency in the area for which professional registration is applied. The oral examination held by the Board shall be of such duration as necessary to demonstrate the applicant's proficiency.

E. Personal Audience

1. A personal audience will be required of all applicants in order to complete professional registration. The personal audience will consist of an oral and/or written examination of 15 to 30 minutes duration and will

include questions covering the Code and Rules of the State Board of Technical Registration. The personal audience will be given at a time and place convenient to the Evaluation Committee of the Board.

- 2. No applicant will be granted registration until he has fully satisfied the committee as to his comprehension of the Arizona Revised Statutes and Board Regulations.
- 3. An applicant who has been given two opporutnities to appear for a personal audience before the Evaluation Committee and fails to do so shall have his application denied unless this rule is waived by the Board for good cause shown.

RULE III. FEES

The Board pursuant to A.R.S. 32-124 and 32-127.C has adopted the following fees for applications, examinations, renewals, refunds and such other miscellaneous fees for services:

A. Application Fees

The following fees shall accompany an application for registration for a certificate:

- 1. For an architect, assayer, engineer, geologist, landscape architect and land surveyor, who is a bona fide resident of Arizona, twenty-five dollars.
- 2. For an architect, assayer, engineer, geologist, landscape architect and land surveyor, who is a legal resident of another state, territory or foreign country, fifty dollars.
- 3. Architect-in-Training, Engineer-in-Training, Geologist-in-Training and Landscape Architect-in-Training, ten dollars.

B. Examination Fees

The fees, payable in advance, for taking or retaking the examinations, over and above and exclusive of fees required with the application for registration, shall be as follows:

C. Renewal Fees

For renewal of a certificate of registration, if received prior to December 31st of each year (a certificate of registration not renewed prior to December 31st of each year shall accrue a penalty of 10 percent of each month or fraction of month delinquency), the following fees will be required:

E. Refunds

An application for professional registration which has been denied by initial Board action will receive the following refunds:

- 1. For an architect, assayer, engineer, geologist, landscape architect and land surveyor, who is a bona fide resident of Arizona, ten dollars.
- 2. For an architect, assayer, engineer, geologist, landscape architect and land surveyor, who is a legal resident of another state, territory, or foreign country, twenty-five dollars.

RULE IV. PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE

The Board pursuant to A.R.S. 32-106 has adopted the following definition of terms used in this Chapter.

The definitions enumerated in this Rule shall have full force and effect upon the professional practice of each registrant of this Board.

The definitions shall be used to determine if a violation exists under A.R.S. 32-128 upon which the Board shall take disciplinary action.

A. A.R.S. 32-101

The professional practice of registrants under this Chapter shall be in accordance with the custom and tradition of the registrant's certificate of registration as defined in A.R.S. 32-101 and as limited by A.R.S. 32-143.

B. A.R.S. 32-141

1. The term "responsible charge of a registrant" within the section defining "firm or corporate practice" stating that "no firm or corporation shall engage in the practice of architecture, assaying, geology, engineering, landscape architecture, or land surveying unless the work is under the full authority and responsible charge of a registrant, who is also a principal of the firm or officer of the corporation. The name of said registrant shall appear whensoever the firm name is used in the professional practice of the firm or corporation" shall mean that the principal of the firm or officer of the corporation shall reside in Arizona when such firm or corporation maintains an Arizona office or mailing address.

- 2. The term "the name of said registrant shall appear" within the section defining "firm or corporate practice" stating that "no firm or corporation shall engage in the practice of architecture, assaying, geology, engineering, landscape architecture, or land surveying unless the work is under the full authority and responsible charge of a registrant, who is also a principal of the firm or officer of the corporation. The name of said registrant shall appear whensoever the firm name is used in the professional practice of the firm or corporation" shall mean that the name of said registrant be imprinted on all firm or corporate stationery used in the professional practice of the firm or corporation.
- 3. The principal of the firm or officer of the corporation residing in Arizona (Rule III. B(1) shall be assigned to the principle Arizona office of the firm or corporation. This principal may, at his discretion, operate other Arizona offices of the firm or corporation provided, however, that each office has in it a person registered under this Chapter for each classification of services provided. This regulation shall be interpreted to exempt only offices established to observe construction for conformance with contract documents and design.

RULE V. SEALS AND IDENTIFYING MARKERS FOR REGISTRANTS

1. Description of Seals

Each person registered under this law must secure and use a rubber stamp, one and one-half (1½) inches in diameter, consisting of two concentric circles, the inner circle to be one and one-eighth (1-1/8) inches in diameter. The upper portion of the annular space between the two circles shall bear whichever of the following phrases is applicable to the registrant: "Registered Architect," or "Registered Professional Engineer" together with the branch of engineering in which registered, "Registered Geologist," "Registered Landscape Architect," "Registered Land Surveyor," or "Registered Assayer." At the bottom of the annular space between the two circles shall appear the inscription "Arizona, U.S.A." The inner circle shall contain the name of the registrant, his registration number, and the words "Date signed."

2. Use of Seals

An imprint of the registrant's valid seal shall appear on each and every sheet of drawings and on the cover and index page of each set of specification and/or reports or other professional documents prepared by a registrant or his bona fide employee. Superimposed over the imprint of the seal shall be the original signature of the registrant and the date indicated when the seal imprint was signed.

3. Seals, Securing

The registrant shall order his seal through the office of the Board of Technical Registration by paying the cost of manufacturing said seal, and signing an imprint of the seal and affidavit regarding its use for the records of the Board. Seals secured by registrants under prior rules established by the Board shall remain valid. Engineers registered in more than one branch shall secure and use a seal for each branch of engineering in which registration has been granted.

4. Identifying Markers, Securing

Registered Land Surveyors and registered Professional Engineers, when engaged in land surveying, shall secure at their own expense metal rods, pipes, tags, caps or embossed nails which shall show the registrant's Arizona Registration Number as issued by the State Board of Technical Registration and each registration number shall be prefixed by the letters L.S. or P.E., respectively, as the case may be.

5. Use of Identifying Markers

Registered Land Surveyors and registered Professional Engineers, when engaged in land surveying, shall securely attach one identifying marker to every permanent survey point set during the practice of surveying tracts of land for the determination of their correct locations.

RULE VI. CERTIFICATIONS

A certificate of registration of such size and form as the Board may approve shall be given to each registrant. Each registrant shall also receive a card on which shall be set forth all of the data that appears on the registrant's certificate of registration. Certificates of registration shall expire on December 31st of each year, and shall be invalid after that date unless renewed by payment of the required renewal fee as established in Rule III. Receipt by the registrant of a renewal card for the current year shall be evidence that the certificate of registration is valid.

RULE VII. REVISIONS

Any revisions in the Rules and Regulations adopted by the Board pursuant to the authority of Arizona Revised Statutes of January, 1956, as amended, shall be proposed and discussed at a meeting and, if approved, publication shall be made and a hearing shall be called as required by law for the next regular meeting of the Board, at which time action will be taken.

Section I

NAME, SEAL, MEETINGS, AND ORGANIZATION

1. Name:

The name of this Board shall be the State Board of Technical Registration. This organization shall subsequently be referred to in these By-Laws as the Board. Wherever reference is made to Law, the same shall refer to Arizona Revised Statutes of January, 1956, and amendments thereto.

2. Seal:

The seal of the Board shall be as follows: an embossed circular seal consisting of two concentric circles, one and one-half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ inches and one and three-quarters (1-3/4) inches in diameter. Beginning near the bottom of the left side between the two circles shall appear the words "Arizona State Board of Technical Registration." At the bottom of the annular space between the two circles shall appear the date "1921." Within the inner circle shall appear the shield from the great seal of Arizona.

3. Meetings:

Except as hereafter provided, regular meetings of the Board shall be held quarterly within each of the months of March, June, September, December, the exact date or dates of each meeting to be determined at the preceding meeting, or by the Chairman or Acting Chairman if the Board leaves the decision to him or if an emergency makes it unwise to conform to the decision reached by the Board.

When in the judgment of the Chairman of the Board, the work as prescribed for the Board by statute and by the procedure elsewhere set forth is insufficient to warrant the expense of a meeting of the Board, the Chairman may require a referendum of the Executive Committee, and on such support order the regular meeting to be postponed to another date, or waived for the quarterly period and memorandum of such action entered in the minutes of the next subsequent meeting of the Board.

All meetings shall be called for such time and at such place as may be designated by the Chairman, and stated by notice of such meetings, which notices shall be sent to all members of the Board two weeks in advance of the date thereof. Special meetings may be called at any time by the order of the Chairman, and shall be called by the Secretary when written request is filed therefor by three members of the Board. Due notices of such special meetings shall be given each member.

4. Organization:

At the regular meeting of the Board in June of each year the Board shall elect from its members a Chairman, Vice-Chairman and Secretary who shall assume the duties of their office at the close of this meeting. The Chairman shall, as soon

thereafter as practicable, appoint from among the members of the Board the personnel of the Committees enumerated in Section II of the By-Laws and/or personnel other Committees as may be required to facilitate the work of the Board.

Section II

DUTIES

1. Chairman:

The Chairman shall, when present, preside at all meetings, shall appoint all committees, shall sign all certificates, and other official documents, other than correspondence, and shall otherwise perform all duties ordinarily pertaining to the office of Chairman. All claims shall be signed by either the Chairman or Vice-Chairman, and Secretary of the Board. The Chairman shall be Ex-Officio member of all committees.

2. Vice-Chairman:

The Vice-Chairman shall, in the absence or incapacity of the Chairman, exercise the duties and then possess all the powers of the Chairman.

3. Secretary:

The Secretary of the Board shall perform all duties as prescribed by the Law and shall act as the general advisor of the Board, to the office of the Board. The Secretary shall sign all claims encumbered against Board funds.

4. Executive Director:

The Board shall retain an Executive Director, who shall have charge of the office of the Board, together with such clerical assistance as may be deemed necessary.

5. Executive Committee:

The Executive Committee shall consist of all members of the Board and its duties shall be to transact all business of the Board during intervals between regular or special meetings (except authorize the issuance of Certificates of Registration) and to make a report to the Board thereon at its next special or regular meeting. A quorum shall consist of five members.

6. Rules and By-Laws Committee:

The Rules and By-Laws Committee shall consist of three members who shall from time to time consider and recommend to the Board such modifications of the rules and by-laws governing examinations and other procedure of the Board as will secure best operating results.

The Committee shall report to the Board at each regular meeting and may report at any special meeting.

7. Legislative Committee:

The Legislative Committee shall consist of three members of the Board who shall from time to time recommend to the Board investigations of the Statutes as required.

8. Evaluation and Examination Committees:

There shall be three Evaluation and Examination Committees, consisting of the following:

Architectural Evaluation and Examination Committee - all architectural members of the Board.

Engineering Evaluation and Examination Committee - all engineering members of the Board and the ninth member, if registered as an Assayer, Geologist or Land Surveyor.

Landscape Architectural Evaluation and Examination Committee - two Architects, two Engineers, and the ninth member, if registered as a Landscape Architect.

These committees shall consider all applications, pertinent to their discipline, conduct the personal audience with the applicants, review examination questions for applicants, certify examination grades and report their recommendations to the Board at each regular meeting.

9. Public Information Committee:

The Committee on Public Information shall consist of all members, and its duties shall be to disseminate information concerning the policies and activities of the Board.

10. Budget Committee:

The Budget Committee shall consist of three members of the Board. The duties of this committee shall be to present to the Board at each June meeting of the proposed budget for the following and subsequent fiscal years.

Section III

PROCEDURE

1. Order of Business:

At each regular or special meeting of the Board the order of business shall be as follows:

Reading of the minutes of the last meeting.

2. Report of the Executive Committee.

3. Report of Rules and By-Laws Committee (required at regular meetings)

4. Report of the Legislative Committee.

5. Report of the Evaluation and Examination Committees.

6. Report of Public Information Committee.

- 7. Report of Budget Committee.
- 8. Report of Executive Director.
- 9. Reading of Communications.
- 10. Unfinished Business.
- 11. New Business.
- 12. Adjournment.

2. Voting:

Unless otherwise provided by the Law, a quorum of the Board being present, it shall be considered that favorable action has been taken upon any question if a majority of those present vote favorably.

Section IV

1. Authorized Fees

Under authority of A.R.S. 32-124 and A.R.S. 32-127.C, the Board shall publish and establish the fees required. The Board shall review its Schedule of Fees at the March meeting of each year and if revised and approved, publication shall be made and a hearing called for the June meeting of each year to establish the fees for the following fiscal year.

Section V

1. Amendments:

These By-Laws may be amended at any regular or special meeting of the Board by favorable majority vote of the members present, provided a copy of the proposed amendment or amendments shall have been mailed to each member of the Board at least two weeks prior to the meeting at which it or they are to be considered.

CODE OF THE STATE BOARD OF TECHNICAL REGISTRATION FOR ARCHITECTS, ASSAYERS, ENGINEERS, GEOLOGISTS, LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTS AND LAND SURVEYORS

Revised Code Adopted January, 1956

Amended April, 1956, March, 1968, and April, 1970

ARTICLE 1. BOARD OF TECHNICAL REGISTRATION 32-101. Purpose; definitions

- A. The purpose of this chapter is to provide for the safety, health and welfare of the public through the promulgation and enforcement of standards of qualification for those individuals licensed and seeking licenses pursuant to this chapter.
 - B. In this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:
- 1. "Architect" means a person who, by reason of his knowledge of the mathematical and physical sciences, and the principles of architecture and architectural engineering acquired by professional education, practical experience, or both, is qualified to engage in the practice of architecture as attested by his registration as an architect.
- 2. "Architect-in-training" means a candidate for registration as a professional architect who is a graduate of a school approved by the board as of satisfactory standing or who has experience as outlined in the current standards of the national council of architectural registration boards in architectural work of a character satisfactory to the board. In addition, the candidate shall have successfully passed the examination in the basic architectural subjects. Upon completion of the requisite years of training and experience in the field of architecture under the supervision of a professional architect satisfactory to the board, the architect-in-training shall be eligible for the second stage of the prescribed examination for registration as a professional architect.
- 3. "Architectural practice" means any service or creative work requiring architectural education, training and experience, and the application of the mathematical and physical sciences and the principles of architecture and architectural engineering to such professional services or creative work as consultation, evaluation, design and review of construction for conformance with contract documents and design, in connection with any building, planning or site development. A person shall be deemed to practice or offer to practice architecture who in any manner represents himself to be an architect, or holds himself out as able to perform any architectural service or other servcies recognized by educational authorities as architecture.
- 4. "Assayer" means a person who analyzes metals, ores, minerals, or alloys in order to ascertain the quantity of gold or silver or any other substance present in them.
 - 5. "Board" means the state board of technical registration.

- 6. "Engineer" means a professional engineer who, by reason of special knowledge of the mathematical and physical sciences and the principles and methods of engineering analysis and design, acquired by professional education or practical experience, is qualified to practice engineering as attested by his registration as a professional engineer.
- 7. "Engineering practice" means any professional service or creative work requiring engineering education, training and experience and the application of special knowledge of the mathematical, physical and engineering sciences to such professional services or creative work as consultation, research investigation, evaluation, planning, surveying, design, location, development, and review of construction for conformance with contract documents and design, in connection with any public or private utility, structure, building, machine, equipment, process, work or project. Such services and work include plans and designs relating to the location, development, mining and treatment of ore and other minerals. A person shall be deemed to be practicing or offering to practice engineering if he practices any branch of the profession of engineering, or by verbal claim, sign, advertisement, letterhead, card or any other manner represents himself to be a professional engineer, or holds himself out as able to perform on does perform any engineering service or other service or recognized by educational authorities as engineering. A person employed on a full-time basis as an engineer by an employer engaged in the business of developing, mining and treating ores and other minerals shall not be deemed to be practicing engineering for the purposes of this chapter if he engages in the practice of engineering exclusively for and as an employee of such employer and does not hold himself out and is not held out as available to perform any engineering services for persons other than his employer.
- 8. "Engineer-in-training" means a candidate for registration as a professional engineer who is a graduate in an approved engineering curriculum of four years or more of a school approved by the board as of satisfactory standing, or who has had four years or more of experience in engineering work of a character satisfactory to the board, and, in addition, has successfully passed the examination in the basic engineering subjects, and who, upon completion of the requisite years of training and experience in engineering under the supervision of a professional engineer satisfactory to the board, is eligible for the second stage of the prescribed examination for registration as a professional engineer.
- 9. "Geological practice" means any professional service or work requiring geological education, training, and experience, and the application of special knowledge of the earth sciences to such professional services as consultation, evaluation of mining properties, petroleum properties, and ground water resources, professional supervision of exploration for mineral natural resources including metallic and nonmetallic ores, petroleum, and ground water, and the geological phases of engineering investigations.
- 10. "Geologist" means a person, not of necessity an engineer, who by reason of his special knowledge of the earth sciences and the principles and methods of search for and appraisal of mineral or other natural resources acquired by professional education and practical experience is qualified to practice geology as at-

tested by his registration as a professional geologist. A person employed on a full-time basis as a geologist by an employer engaged in the business of developing, mining or treating ores and other minerals shall not be deemed to be engaged in "geological practice" for the purposes of this chapter if he engages in geological practice exclusively for and as an employee of such employer and does not hold himself out and is not held out as available to perform any geological services for persons other than his employer.

- 11. "Geologist-in-training" means a candidate for registration as a professional geologist who is a graduate of a school approved by the board as of satisfactory standing or who has had four years or more of experience in geological work of a character satisfactory to the board. In addition, the candidate shall have successfully passed the examination in the basic geology subjects. Upon completion of the requisite years of training and experience in the field of geology under the supervision of a professional geologist satisfactory to the board, the geologist-in-training shall be eligible for the second stage of the prescribed examination for registration as a professional geologist.
- 12. "Landscape architect" means a person who, by reason of his professional education, practical experience, or both, is qualified to engage in the practice of landscape architecture as attested by his registration as a landscape architect.
- 13. "Landscape architect-in-training" means a candidate for registration as a professional landscape architect who is a graduate of a school approved by the board as of satisfactory standing or who has had four years or more of experience in landscape architectural work of a character satisfactory to the board. In addition, the candidate shall have successfully passed the examination in the basic landscape architectural subjects. Upon completion of the requisite years of training and experience in the field of landscape architecture under the supervision of a professional landscape architect satisfactory to the board, the landscape architect-in-training shall be eligible for the second stage of the prescribed examination for registration as a professional landscape architect.
- 14. "Landscape architectural practice" means the performance of professional services such as consultations, investigation, reconnaissance, research, planning, design, or responsible supervision in connection with the development of land and incidental water areas where, and to the extent that the dominant purpose of such services is the preservation, enhancement or determination of proper land uses, natural land features, ground cover and planting, naturalistic and esthetic values, the settings and approaches to buildings, structures, facilities, or other improvements, natural drainage and the consideration and the determination of inherent problems of the land relating to erosion, wear and tear, light or other hazards. This practice shall include the location and arrangement of such tangible objects and features as are incidental and necessary to the purposes outlined in this paragraph, but shall not include the design of structures or facilities with separate and self-contained purposes for habitation or industry, such as are ordinarily included in the practice of engineering or architecture; and shall not include the making of cadastral surveys or final land plats for official recording or approval, nor manditorially include planning for governmental subdivisions.

15. "Land surveyor" means a person who engages in the practice of surveying tracts of land for the determination of their correct locations, areas, boundaries and description, for the purpose of conveyancing and recording, or for establishment or reestablishment of boundaries and plotting of lands and subdivisions.

32-102. Board of technical registration

- A. There shall be a state board of technical registration. The board shall consist of nine appointive members, who shall be appointed by the governor. Three of the appointive members shall be architects, five shall be professional engineers and the remaining member shall be an assayer, landscape architect, geologist or surveyor.
- B. Upon the expiration of any of the terms a successor, qualified pursuant to subsection A of this section, shall be appointed for a full term of three years. The governor may remove an appointive member of the board for misconduct, incapacity or neglect of duty. Appointment to fill a vacancy caused other than by expiration of term shall be for the unexpired portion of the term.

32-103. Qualifications of members

Appointive members of the board shall:

- 1. Be at least thirty-five years of age.
- 2. Have been a resident of the state for at least three years immediately preceding his appointment.
- 3. Have had at least ten years active experience as attested by registration under this chapter.

32-104. Compensation

- A. Members of the board shall receive no compensation for their services, but shall receive mileage and travel expense as prescribed for state officers.
- B. The certificate of registration of board members shall be renewed without payment of the renewal fee.

32-105. Organization

The board shall annually elect from its membership a chairman, vice-chairman and secretary. It shall hold at least two regular meetings each year and such special or called meetings as the by-laws provide. Not less than five members, of whom at least two shall be architects and three engineers, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

32-106. Powers and duties

- A. The board shall:
- 1. Adopt by-laws and rules for the conduct of its meetings and performance of duties imposed upon it by law.
- 2. Adopt an official seal for attestation of certificates of registration and other official papers and documents.
 - 3. Consider and pass upon applications for registration.

- . 4. Hear and pass upon complaints or charges.
- 5. Compel attendance of witnesses, administer oaths and take testimony concerning all matters coming within its jurisdiction.
 - 6. Keep a record of its proceedings.
- 7. Keep a register which shall show the date of each application for registration, the name, age, qualifications and place of business of the applicant, and the disposition of the application.
- 8. Do other things necessary to carry out the purposes of this chapter.
- B. The board shall specify on the certificate of registration and annual renewal card issued to each registered engineer the branch of engineering in which he has demonstrated proficiency, and authorize him to use the title of registered professional engineer. The board shall decide what branches of engineering shall be thus recognized.
- C. The board may hold membership in and be represented at national councils or organizations of proficiencies registered under this chapter and may pay the appropriate membership fees. Members or regular employees of the board selected to represent the board at such meetings shall be reimbursed for actual and necessary expenses in connection therewith. The board may conduct standard examinations on behalf of national councils, and may establish fees therefor.
- D. The board is authorized to employ and pay on a fee basis persons, including full-time employees of a state institution, bureau or department, to prepare and grade examinations given to applicants for registration and to fix the fee to be paid for such services. Such employees are authorized to prepare, grade and monitor examinations, and perform other services the board authorizes, and to receive payment therefor from the technical registration fund.
- E. The board is authorized to rent necessary office space and pay the cost thereof from the technical registration fund.

32-107. Board secretary; duties

The secretary shall be the custodian of the records of the board, receive applications for registration and lay them before the board, file complaints with the proper officials against violators of any provision of this chapter, assist in the prosecution of such cases and perform other duties the board prescribes.

32-108. Annual Report; filing copies of lists of registrants

In January of each year the board shall make a report to the governor which shall be accompanied by a copy of the list of registrants. A copy of the list shall also be filed with the secretary of state, and with the clerk of the board of supervisors of each county.

32-109. Technical registration fund

A. The secretary shall transmit to the state treasurer all fees or other revenues received by the board. The treasurer shall place ten per cent thereof in the general fund to assist in defraying the cost of maintaining the state government and shall place

the remainder in a separate fund known as the technical registration fund, to be used only in defraying expenses of the board and in prosecuting violations of this chapter.

- B. Any other provisions of law to the contrary notwithstanding, the unexpended balance remaining in the technical registration fund at the end of the fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund, but shall be credited to the fund for the succeeding fiscal year.
- C. The board shall not incur any expenses or approve any claim against the fund in excess of the balance therein, nor shall the commissioner of finance issue a warrant against the fund in excess of such balance.

ARTICLE 2. REGISTRATION

Certificate required for practice of architecture, assaying, engineering, geology, landscape architecture, or land surveying.

A person desiring to practice the profession of architecture, assaying, engineering, geology, landscape architecture, or land surveying shall first secure a certificate of registration and shall comply with all the conditions prescribed in this chapter.

32-122. Qualifications of applicant

- A. An applicant for registration as an architect, engineer, geologist or landscape architect shall be not less than twenty-five years of age and of good moral character and repute, and shall have engaged actively for at least eight years in architectural, engineering, geological or landscape architectural work of a character satisfactory to the board, but each year of teaching architectural, engineering, geological, or landscape architectural subjects or of study satisfactorily completed in an architectural, engineering, geological, or landscape architectural school approved by the board up to a maximum of five years, may be considered equivalent to one year of active engagement.
- B. An applicant for registration as an assayer or a land surveyor shall have engaged actively for at least four years in assaying or land surveying work of a character satisfactory to the board, but each year of teaching assaying or land surveying or of study satisfactorily completed in a school approved by the board, up to a maximum of two years may be considered equivalent to one year of active engagement.

32-123. Application for registration

- A. A person desiring to practice architecture, assaying, engineering, geology, landscape architecture, or land surveying shall make application for registration on a form prescribed by the board, subscribed under oath and accompanied by the registration fee. If the evidence submitted satisfies the board that the applicant is fully qualified to practice the profession for which registration is asked, it shall give him a certificate of registration, signed by the chairman and secretary and attested by the official seal.
- B. If in the judgment of the board the applicant has not furnished satisfactory evidence of qualifications for registration, it may require additional data, or may require the applicant to submit to an oral or written examination.

C. If the application is denied, the registration fee shall be returned, less the cost of considering the application, as determined by the board.

32-124. Registration, examination and miscellaneous fees

The board shall publish in its rules a schedule of fees for applications, examinations, and such other miscellaneous fees for services rendered as required which shall not exceed one hundred dollars.

32-125. Seals for registrants

- A. The board shall adopt and prescribe seals for use of registrants who hold valid certificates. Each seal shall bear the name of the registrant, shall state the vocation and, in the case of engineering, the branch or branches thereof he is permitted to practice, and other data the board deems pertinent.
- B. Plans, specifications, plats or reports prepared by a registrant or his bona fide employee, shall be issued under his seal.
- C. It is unlawful for a registrant whose certificate has expired or has been revoked or suspended to use the seal, or for a registrant to sign, stamp or seal any document not prepared by him or his bona fide employee.
- D. It shall be unlawful for any nonregistrant to cause or permit the illegal use of a registrant's seal, signature or stamp on any document prepared by the nonregistrant.

32-126. Registration without examination

The board may register without examination an applicant who holds a valid and subsisting certificate of registration issued by another state or foreign country which has requirements for registration satisfactory to the board, or who holds a certificate of qualification issued by a national bureau of registration or certification.

32-127. Renewal of certificates; delinquency penalty; renewal fees

- A. Certificates of registration shall expire on December 31 of each year, and shall be invalid after that date unless renewed by payment of the required renewal fee. If the renewal fee is not paid prior to the expiration date, it shall be accompanied by a penalty of ten per cent for each month or fraction of a month of delinquency.
- B. If a registration has lapsed for three years, a new application, accompanied by the proper fee, shall be required, but time spent by a registrant in any branch of the armed forces of the United States since 1939 shall not be included in computing the three-year period.
- C. The board shall establish the annual renewal fees for each proficiency registered under this chapter which shall not exceed twenty-five dollars.

32-128. Revocation of certificate; hearings; notice of findings

A. The board may take disciplinary action against the holder of a certificate under this chapter, charged with the commission of any of the following acts:

- 1. Fraud or misrepresentation in obtaining a certificate of qualification, whether in the application or qualification examination.
- 2. Gross negligence, incompetence, bribery, or other misconduct in the practice of his profession.
- 3. Aiding or abetting an unregistered person to evade the provisions of this chapter or knowingly combining or conspiring with an unregistered person, or allowing one's registration to be used by an unregistered person, or acting as agent, partner, associate or otherwise, of an unregistered person with intent to evade provisions of this chapter.
- B. The board shall have authority to make investigations, employ investigators, and conduct hearings to determine whether a license issued under this chapter should be revoked or suspended upon a complaint in writing, under oath, or when the board after receiving an oral or written complaint not under oath, makes an investigation into such complaint and determines that there is sufficient evidence to warrant a hearing, on its own motion may direct the secretary to file a verified complaint charging a possessor of a certificate under this chapter, with commission of an offense subject to disciplinary action and give notice of hearing. The secretary shall then serve upon the accused, by registered mail, a copy of the complaint together with notice setting forth the charge or charges to be heard and the time and place of hearing, which shall not be less than thirty days succeeding the mailing of notice.
- C. The accused may appear personally or by his attorney at the hearing and present witnesses and evidence in his defense and he may cross-examine witnesses against him.
- D. If five or more members of the board find the accused guilty, his certificate shall be suspended or revoked, but may be reissued upon the affirmative vote of five or more members of the board. Should the certificate of a registrant who is a principal of a firm or executive officer of a corporation be suspended or revoked for cause attributable to the firm or corporation, said revocation may be deemed just cause for revocation of the certificates of all or any other principals or officers of the firm or corporation.
- E. The board shall immediately notify the secretary of state and clerk of the board of supervisors of each county in the state of the revocation of a certificate or of the reissuance of a revoked certificate.

ARTICLE 3. REGULATORY PROVISIONS

32-141. Firm or corporate practice

No firm or corporation shall engage in the practice of architecture, assaying, geology, engineering, landscape architecture, or land surveying unless the work is under the full authority and responsible charge of a registrant, who is also a principal of the firm or officer of the corporation. The name of said registrant shall appear whensoever the firm name is used in the professional practice of the firm or corporation.

32-142. Public works

A. Drawings, plans, specifications and estimates for public works of the state or a political subdivision thereof involving architecture, engineering, assaying, geology, landscape architecture or land surveying, shall be prepared by or under the personal direction of, and the construction of such works shall be executed under the direct supervision of a qualified registrant within the category involved.

B. Surveys, maps or assays required in connection with public land surveying or assaying shall be made by or under the personal direction of a qualified registrant.

32-143. Exceptions

Registrants under this chapter may engage in practice in another category regulated pursuant to this chapter only to the extent that such person is qualified and as such work may be necessary and incidental to the work of his profession on a specific project.

32-144. Exemptions and limitations

- A. Architecture, engineering, geology, assaying, landscape architecture or land surveying may be practiced without compliance with the requirements of this chapter by:
- 1. An officer or employee of the United States, practicing as such.
- 2. A consulting associate of a registrant, if he is a non-resident with no established place of business in this state and is qualified to practice in the state or country where he resides.
- 3. An employee of a registrant or of a person exempt from registration, if such employment does not involve direct responsibility for design, inspection or supervision.
- 4. A nonregistrant who designs a building or structure, the cost of which does not exceed fifty thousand dollars, or who designs alterations to any one single story building, the cost of which does not exceed fifteen thousand dollars, or who designs a single family dwelling or additions or alterations thereto.
- 5. A nonregistrant who designs buildings or structures to be erected on property owned or leased by him or by a person, firm or corporation, including a utility, telephone, mining or railroad company, which employs such nonregistrant on a full-time basis, if the buildings or structures are intended solely for the use of the owner or lessee of the property and are not for sale, rental or use by the public.
- B. The requirements of this chapter shall not apply to work done by any communications common carrier or its affiliates or any public service corporation or by full-time employees of any of them, provided such work is in connection with or incidental to the products, systems or non-engineering services of such communications common carrier or its affiliates or public service corporation, and provided that the engineering work is not offered directly to the public.

32-145. Violations; penalty

Any person who commits any of the following acts is guilty of a misdemeanor:

- 1. Practices, offers to practice or by any implication holds himself out as qualified to practice as an architect, assayer, engineer, geologist, landscape architect, or land surveyor, who is not registered as provided by this chapter.
- 2. Advertises or displays a card, sign or other device which may indicate to the public that he is an architect, assayer, engineer, geologist, landscape architect, or land surveyor, or is qualified to practice as such, who is not registered as provided by this chapter.
- 3. Assumes the title of engineer, architect, geologist, assayer, landscape architect, or land surveyor, or uses or attempts to use as his own a certificate of registration of another, or uses or attempts to use an expired or revoked certificate of registration.
- 4. Presents false evidence to the board for the purpose of obtaining a certificate of registration.
 - 5. Otherwise violating any provision of this chapter.

The Arizona State Department of Public Safety checked the post office box used by Mr. Burton in Fredonia, No. 272. It was rented 10/17/69 and closed 5/19/70. When he rented the box he used an old Phoenix address of 2802 West Diana, which he resided in for approximately 1½ years in 1957-1958 when employed by the Arizona State Highway Department. The Diana house was checked through tax rolls and it has not been in Mr. Burton's name for several years and has changed hands several times in the past.

On Apri 14, 1970, Mr. Burton applied for an Arizona
Driver's License. He gave his address as 1936 East Harvard.
This is an older home owned by an elderly woman who rents
extra rooms. Burton lived there for a very short time.

Upon applying for his Arizona Driver's License, he did not surrender a valid Utah License. He told Motor Vehicle officials that he had an old Arizona License only, and it was expired.

The Department of PUblic Safety determined that Burton had a valid Utah License NBR C31448, valid until 11/13/72. His date of birth on the Utah License is 6/16/29, the same as his Arizona License. According to the Arizona Revised Statutes 28-601, Article 5, Paragraph 3, Burton is in violation for failing to comply by not surrendering his Utah License. This is a misdemeanor violation under the State Motor Vehicle Code.

The Department of Safety contacted the Utah Department of Highways, Personnel office, which stated Burton had worked continuously since 10/20/50 in the department. However, this writer has information from credit sources as well as from Burton's own application, that in 1957-1958, he worked for the Arizona State Highway Department.

Burton's motor vehicles were checked in both Arizona and Utah and none were found registered in either his or his wife's name.

A neighbor at the 1936 East Harvard address said he may be driving a Utah Department of Highways vehicle, however, this was not verified.

The address given as 4444 North 47th Street belongs to a Ted Nielson who has owned the property for sometime. The neighbor did not know of Burton. It is unknown as to the relationship of Burton and Nielson.

I WOULD SUGGEST AT LEAST ONE MORE TESTING PERIOD WITH ALL QUESTIONS IN THEIR PRESENT FORM, SINCE A MORE ACCURATE PICTURE OF THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE REVISIONS IS OBTAINED FROM ADMINISTERING THE QUESTIONS TO MORE THAN ONE GROUP OF PERSONS. AFTER THE NEXT TESTING PERIOD AND ITEM ANALYSIS, MORE ACCURATE SUGGESTIONS FOR FURTHER REVISIONS AND CHANGES CAN BE MADE.

Additionally, there are no common law powers or duties which attach to the office of the Attorney General, but only those prescribed by statute. Shute v. Frohmiller, 53 Ariz. 483, 90 P.2d 998.

As I note that a copy of your correspondence has already been directed to the office of the Chief Executive, I am forwarding your suggestions to the Board of Technical Registration for review or whatever action they deem necessary.

SUBJECT: Arizona State Technical Board of Registration

Dear Mr. Miller:

You will recall from our recent correspondence and telephone conversation that we feel the Arizona Technical Board of Registration has failed to act on behalf of the citizens in connection with the violation of state law. I have selected three representative examples for your information and further investigation and I Mave in my possession several other situations that are similar in nature.

You will note that the reference items number one and two are signed by architects and advise their client that they are not responsible for a complete set of plans and/or the electrical contractor is responsible for installation and calculations. In either case the professional (?), is aiding and abetting contractors to perform engineering services. The third example is of a contractor signing as an engineer without a seal.

The first and third examples were presented to the State Technical Board of Registration and they have taken no action for over one year. In fact several other of my personal requests for investigating malpractice have been ignored.

Please do not consider my own experiences as the only times that the Board has failed to act or even investigate unprofessional conduct or professional practice not short of fraud. The City of Phoenix Building Department has litterally given up trying to get action. The exact number of unprofessional designs submitted to the City is unknown, but I would judge they are in the hundreds. These records can be subpoenaed to substiantiate the facts, if necessary.

I will appreciate a reply to this matter at your earliest convenience, and volunteer to assist you in anyway possible to see that the Technical Registration Board begins to function in the best interest of all people in our fine State. Maybe your office needs to give them additional support in matters effecting public health and safety.

At 1:30 P.M., Chairman Vanlandingham reconvened the meeting of the Board after the luncheon adjournment and announced it was the time and place for the public hearing on the proposed rules as filed with the Secretary of State at least twenty days prior to this meeting date and was duly advertised as required by law.

Mr. Girand reported that each member of the Board and guests had before them a pink pamphlet which was a correct report of the proposed rules scheduled for adoption and that this pink pamphlet was identical to Minute Pages 2671 through 2682A as reported to the June meeting of the Board.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Wyatt that the existing Rules I through VII be repealed in its entirety and that the proposed Rules I through VII as identified above with the following correction be adopted:

"The correction being on Minute Page 2682, Rule IV, B(3), wherein the reference is made Rule III, B(1), and the correct reference should be Rule IV, B(1)."

Discussion on the motion followed with the members of the Board and guests participating. The Executive Director reported that the office of the Board had received only one letter which protested the increase in renewal fees to \$20.00 per annum. Mr. Dryden spoke in opposition to the fees covered in Rule III, as recommended on Minute Pages 2679 through 2681, and most particularly on Item III, C, Renewal Fees for Registrants. After discussion of the proposed rules, Mr. Dryden moved that the motion to repeal the existing rules and adopt the new rules be amended in that Rule III,C, Renewal Fees, Item 1, be changed to \$10.00 per annum. "Mr. Dryden's motion died for lack of a second."

The vote on the original motion was called for by Dr. Newlin and the original motion as moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Wyatt carried with eight members voting, seven ayes and Mr. Dryden recorded as a vote in opposition to the adoption of the rules.

Chairman Vanlandingham thanked the guests for both their interest and attendance at this meeting.

REPORT OF THE LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE

Mr. Dryden reported that the Legislature was not now in session and that his committee had held no meetings and had no recommendations at this time for the Board's consideration.

REPORT OF THE EVALUATION AND EXAMINATION COMMITTEES

The Architectural Evaluation Committee meeting report of August 25, 1970, was presented by Chairman Wyatt, as shown on Minute Pages 2744, 2745, 2746 and 2747.

It was moved by Mr. Cassidy and seconded by Mr. Wyatt that the above report of the Architectural Evaluation Committee meeting be accepted and implemented by the Board. Motion carried.

The schedule for the Architectural Examinations in December, 1970, was presented as shown on Minute Page 2748.

It was moved by Mr. Wyatt and seconded by Dr. Newlin that the above schedule be approved as presented. Motion carried.

The schedule for the Landscape Architectural Examinations in December, 1970, (some landscape architectural applicants under the old rules and some under the new rules) was presented as shown on Minute Page 2749.

It was moved by Dr. Newlin, as Chairman of the Landscape Architectural Committee, and seconded by Mr. Girand that the above schedule be approved as presented. Motion carried.

The Engineering Evaluation Committee meeting report of August 26, 27, and 28, 1970, was presented by Chairman Knickerbocker, as shown on Minute Pages 2750, 2751 and 2752.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Dr. Newlin that the above report of the Engineering Evaluation Committee meeting be accepted and implemented by the Board. Motion carried.

The schedule for the Engineering Examinations in December, 1970, was presented as shown on Minute Page 2753.

It was moved by Mr. Knickerbocker and seconded by Mr. Cassidy that the above schedule be approved as presented. Motion carried.

Mr. Girand reported to the Board that there were six examinees who had taken the professional examinations more than eight times and deserved assistance from the Board in considering their individual problems or weaknesses in securing professional registration. The Board was advised that it was a part of their responsibility to assist applicants for professional registration in every way possible wherein such assistance did not violate the Board's statutory responsibilty. It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Knickerbocker that to assist the engineering applicants in question, the Board authorize the Engineering Evaluation Committee to meet individually with each of the applicants to determine the weaknesses in the applicant's background or examination and advise them how best to complete satisfactorily the failed portions of their written examinations prior to the next regularly scheduled examination in December. Motion carried.

The Chairman directed the Executive Director to correspond with each of the engineering applicants, previously discussed, inviting them to appear before the Evaluation Committee for such assistance as the Board could render, and he further directed that the letter inviting these individuals to the meeting be reviewed by the Chairman of the Engineering Evaluation Committee prior to release.

REPORT OF THE PUBLIC INFORMATION COMMITTEE

Dr. Newlin reported orally on his attendance at the National Council of Engineering Examiners' annual meeting in Chicago, Illinois, August 17-21, 1970. He commented that he was a member of the Model Law Committee and that this committee after completing the Model Law for engineers was now attempting a Model Law for both engineers and land surveyors in combined boards, and, if unrestrained, for years could be preparing model laws for the National Council of Engineering Examiners. He announced that one of the aims of the Executive Secretary was a national comity with no personal audiences by the individual state boards and that Arizona was particularly pointed out as a State requring a definite appearance by each and every applicant in that it was not proper for Arizona to delegate its responsibility to a national organization.

He further reported that Arizona did receive a favorable report on law enforcement at this meeting and that discussion of an uniform form for State-to-State information was considered but at the present he did not recommend its adoption by the Arizona Board.

The national committee meetings indicated that greater acceptance was given to the Fundamentals of Engineering examination (E.I.T.) with California now adopting its use. The problems faced by the Arizona Board in preparing professional examinations was also faced by the Examination Committee of the National Council, in particularly the electrical engineering examination.

Dr. Newlin closed his comments with the information the new National President of the National Council of Engineering Examiners was Chester A. Arents who desires to expand registration and recognition of engineers while in his opinion this was more truly a function of the professional societies and not the National Council of Engineering Examiners.

It was moved by Mr. Dryden and seconded by Mr. Wyatt that the Board accept the report of Dr. Newlin. Motion carried.

REPORT OF THE BUDGET COMMITTEE

Mr. Cassidy reported to the Board on the budget for Fiscal Year 1971-1972 which had been submitted to the Commissioner of Finance as required by State statute prior to September 1, 1970. The budget incorporated the wishes of the Board as discussed at the June meeting, and was presented for the record, in its entirety, as shown on Minute Pages 2758 through 2780.

REPORT OF GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE #1

Mr. Dryden reported on a discussion held with Mr. N. J. Devlin regarding problems in Mohave County, Kingman, with another professional engineer. The other professional engineer, Mr. Herb Shipley, reported on his comments of Mr. Devlin to the Board by letter, as shown on Minute Pages 2781 and 2782. Mr. Dryden recommended to the Board as there was no complaint of a violation of the statutes that the Board take no action at this time in the Devlin-Shipley matter. It was moved by Mr. Cassidy and seconded by Mr. Girand that the Board accept Mr. Dryden's recommendation and take no action in this matter until such time a complaint of a violation of the statutes was made by one or the other registrant. Motion carried.

Mr. Knickerbocker commented for the record that if the Board had at the present time an investigator, it might determine more fully the basis for the conflict between these individuals.

The Executive Director reported on the allegations by Mr. Joseph Gabriel against Mr. John K. Parsons, a registered Civil Engineer, No. 4426, and a registered Structural Engineer, No. 4427, regarding an apartment complex in Lake Havasu City, on Lot 15, Block 5, Tract 115, as shown on Minute Page 2783. The Executive Director advised the Board that the plans in question were available to the office of the Board and that Mr. Gabriel's allegation charging Mr. John K. Parsons with aiding and abetting a non-registrant in the illegal practice of architecture appears substantiated. The Executive Director recommended to the Board, after consultation with counsel, that Mr. John K. Parsons should be held for a formal hearing for revocation or suspension and be charged with aiding and abetting a non-registrant and misconduct in the practice of his profession. It was moved by Dr. Newlin and seconded by Mr. Girand that the Board hold a formal hearing and file a complaint against Mr. John K. Parsons, registered Civil Engineer and Structural Engineer, in the matter of the Palm Royale! Apartments, Lake Havasu City, as alleged in the complaint of Joseph Gabriel, registered Architect. Motion carried. The date of the formal hearing is to be established by the Chairman of the Board as soon as the Attorney General and staff have prepared the necessary documents and completed its investigations.

The Executive Director reported on another complaint from Mr. Joseph Gabriel regarding Robert R. Johnson, registered Civil Engineer, No. 6391, and the complaint is shown as Minute Page 2784. It is with regard to the Zeski Commercial Building, located on Lot 20, Block 2, Tract 161, Lake Havasu City, wherein Mr. Gabriel alleges that the drawings were prepared by Mr. N. Joe Yogurst, a non-registrant, and sealed by the registrant, Robert R. Johnson. The Executive Director advised the Board that the subject plans were not presently available and a recommendation regarding this complaint could not be made. It was moved by Mr. Knickerbocker and seconded by Mr. Dryden that the Executive Director secure the necessary drawings as referred to in Mr. Gabriel's complaint on Minute Page 2784, and report to the Board as soon as practicable. Motion carried.



Last Friday, July 31st, I received a copy of a letter addressed to one of my clients. The letter was from one N.J. Devlin, a consulting engineer in Kingman. The letter is written in such a manner as to be so derogatory and unethical in context that it becomes almost inconceivable that it could be written by a so-called "professional" engineer. As you recall, I telephoned you and made the contents of the letter known.

At your suggestion, I attempted to contact Mr. Dryden at his office in Flagstaff. At the particular time, I believe around 3:30 P.M., he was out and was to return later. Instead of attempting to contact Mr. Dryden again, I decided to let myself cool off for several days and reconsider my feelings. This has been done. I have considered the matter very carefully in my mind and have decided that this matter, along with other grievances should logically be considered by the northern area committee of the Board.

Attached is a copy of the letter referred to above. I would like this referred to Mr. Dryden and have the following comments:

- 1) Mr. Devlin has a history of his continuing harassment of me as well as other engineers that are trying our damndest to operate privately in this County. I am ready to go into great detail on this at any hearing or any court in this State.
- 2) This letter clearly emphasises the "tin-god" that all engineers (and land developers) must bow to in our County. Not to metion the incredible conflicts-of-interests involving this "consulting" County Engineer, we are daily faced with his continuing underhanded efforts to wipe out any form of competition or to eliminate any questioning of the highly debatable administration of his office of County Engineer.
- 3) Of course, I totally deny any truth of the comments made in Devlins letter. These will be discussed at the hearing I shall assume will be scheduled by the Board.

Hopefully, a great many things involving engineering in of Mohave and the City of Kingman can be resolved-before is wiped out.

On July 24, 1970, I sent a survey crew to attempt to locate and survey a parcel containing the well on Lot 27, Block C, Punto De Vista Unit #2, TR 1060-B.

It was found that apparently at least Lot 27, 28, and 29 have never been staked in the field.

In retracing the Boundary of adjoining Unit 1, TR 1060-A, a considerable descrepancy was found between measured distances and angles and that which is recorded on the subdivision plat. This, however, is not conclusive since no identity or identification was found on any of the corners between which measurements were made.

Under the circumstances, I must report that a proper survey to locate and stake Lot 27 and a portion thereof containing the well would take several days or even weeks depending on the magnitude and location of the discrepancies which must be resolved.

I don't know what arrangement you had in regarding to staking of the lots in this unit, but from our preliminary search, I do not believe that a considerable portion of the lot corners in this unit have ever been set.

Having been involved in similar type facilities, I have a pretty fair knowledge of how much engineering and how much architecture constitutes an automobile agency. I can assure you, and the Board, there is a great deal more architecture. It has been my understanding that the Board has always looked objectively at the often difficult situation of engineering and architecture.

I have discussed this particular project with some material suppliers. In their opinions, which I realize often might be prejudiced, the dwarings for this project are, at best, far below the minimum standards suggested by the Board.

Since these drawings now are public record - with the Building Department of the City of Glendale - it might behoove the Board to request viewing them.

I would like it clearly understood that, in no way, am I protesting this particular project because I "lost the job". I never was interviewed, nor did I know in advance it was planned. I merely question whether this constitutes a

FORMAL HEARING

Chairman Vanlandingham announced that it was the time and place for the formal hearing the matter of Complaint No. 70001, Edmund C. Foerstel, registered Professional Engineer (Structural), No. 5124.

Tony Paro of John A. Brabec and Associates was the court reporter present to transcribe the hearing.

The Assistant Attorney General called on Mr. Walter J. Edelblut, Jr. and Mr. W. Kirby Lockard, President, Southern Chapter of American Institute of Architects, as witnesses in behalf of the State, regarding a certain set of architectural plans for Big Brake, Incorporated, to be constructed in Tucson, Arizona, bearing the seal and signature of Edmund C. Foerstel, and title block of E. L. Moore Design Service.

The counsel for the defendent called on Mr. Foerstel to testify in his own behalf and concluded his client's testimony by stating he was pleading guilty to the charges set forth in Complaint No. 70001 by not being cognizant of the laws of the State Board of Technical Registration. Since there was no further evidence to be presented by either prosecution or defense, Chairman Vanlandingham advised Mr. Foerstel and his attorney that the Board would notify them as soon as Practicable the results of this hearing.

After a short recess, discussion followed as to what portions of the Complaint Mr. Foerstel was guilty in committing. Mr. Ryan pointed out that the Board should determine whether Mr. Foerstel was:

- 1. Guilty of aiding and abetting.
- 2. Knowingly combining or conspiring with a non-registered person.
- 3. Guilty of aiding and abetting with intent.

It was moved by Dr. Newlin and seconded by Mr. Dryden that we find the defendent guilty in that he did aid and abet a non-registered person to evade the provisions of the Technical Registration Act (A.R.S. Sec. 32-101 etseq.). Motion carried with eight ayes.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Dryden that he be found not guilty of knowingly combining or conspiring with a non-registered person with the intent to evade provisions of the Technical Registration Act (A.R.S. Sec. 32-101 etseq.). Motion carried with seven ayes and one nay by Mr. Knickerbocker.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Wyatt that he be found guilty of allowing his registration to be used by a non-registered person by placement of his seal and signature on that certain set of architectural plans for Big Brake, Incorporated, 1598 Monrovia Avenue, Newport Beach, California, said building to be constructed in Tucson, Arizona, when, in fact, the plans were prepared, designed and the creative work of E. L. Moore Design Service, Montclair, California. Motion carried with eight ayes.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Dr. Newlin that he be found guilty of misconduct in the practice of his profession by placing his seal and signature on that certain set of architectural plans for Big Brake, Incorporated, when, in fact, the seal used by the registrant was not authorized for use in Arizona by the Technical Registration Act. Motion carried with eight ayes.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Place that the registrant's license be suspended. Motion carried with eight ayes.

Discussion followed as to what length of suspension should be assessed.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Dr. Newlin that the registrant's license be suspended for a period of six months from the date of this hearing. Motion carried with seven ayes and one nay.

It was moved by Mr. Knickerbocker and seconded by Mr. Girand that because of the mitigating circumstance the registrant's license be reinstated at this meeting. Motion carried with six ayes and two nays.

Chairman Vanlandingham: The meeting is now in session relative to the

public hearing on the proposed rule changes as published by the Executive Secretary dated July 6, 1970. We have a question relative to the legality of having a public hearing without the hearing being recorded by a court reporter. We would like the opinion of the Attorney General.

Mr. Tom Miller: It is my opinion that there is no legal require-

ment that the proceedings of such a hearing be recorded by a court reporter. Insofar as publicity was given and a public hearing was held, I believe

that meets the requirements of the Statute.

Mr. Girand: Mr. Chairman, I move that the adoption of the

Is there any more discussion relative to the adoption of the rules.

Mr. Turk:

I would like to ask a question. Right below the rule on Renewal Fees, Miscellaneous Fees and Services, Items #1 and #2, Annual Report and New Certificates. Is it going to be a policy to charge for each registrant for a copy of the annual report now, or are these copies, charges for copies requested by individuals, and new certificates, is this going to be an additional charge to a new registrant or will he be issued a certificate at no cost?

Mr. Edelblut:

No sir, the intent of the Miscellaneous Fees for services is over-the-counter sales in the office of the Board. When we get an out-of-state firm as a contractor or someone write in for an annual report or a magazine, we tell them it cost \$1.00. When a fellow says "I have lost my certificate, I want a new one to replace it" it cost us two dollars and some cents to have it prepared and that is the cost of the charge to cover that. This is only over-the-counter sales. The policy of the free annual report to the registrants and a certificate to each new registrant is still to be continued.

Mr. Turk:

Fine. The second item. I think that there is a typagraphical error on the front of the last page. Paragraph 3, the second line refers to Rule III, B(1), I think it is suppose to be Rule IV, B(1).

Chairman Vanlandingham:

On the front of the last page?

Mr. Turk:

Right.

Mr. Edelblut:

That is correct, sir.

Mr. Turk:

Paragraph 3, second line, it says Rule Roman Numeral III, I think it is suppose to be Roman Numeral IV.

Mr. Edelblut:

That is correct; it is an error.

Mr. Knickerbocker:

Mr. Chairman, to be consistent in the use of alphanumeric characters, I see no reason to spell out \$20 in regard to the renewal fees when we have used numbers in every other instance. Next to the last page.

Mr. Edelblut:

You'll have to ask the secretaries about that because if you look under "A." where we say the application fees in a sentence, they use the word twenty-five dollars spelled out and fifty dollars spelled out,

where you use the things in a list we use the numerical numbers and then we went back to a sentence that said the renewal fees so they spelled it out, again. You'll have to ask the secretaries what is the standard procedure. I don't know.

Chairman Vanlandingham: That is a matter of style.

Mr. Edelblut: If you correct that one, maybe you'll want to change the others, too.

Mr. Knickerbocker: I don't think that is necessary, Walter.

Chairman Vanlandingham: Are there further comments relative to the rules?

Dr. Newlin: Question?

Chairman Vanlandingham: All in favor of adoption ...

Mr. Dryden: Mr. Chairman, how do I file this minority report of mine?

Mr. Thompson Reid, File #70-334, Civil Engineer, appeared before the Board to amplify on his experience since it was indicated during his personal interview he would be held for part of the examination and Mr. Reid felt since he planned on doing primarily water supply and treatment work in Arizona, the examination should be waived. Chairman Vanlandingham thanked Mr. Reid for his appearance and would be advised later as to the Board's determination.

Discussion followed and Mr. Knickerbocker said that since Mr. Reid is considering employment as Assistant City Engineer for City of Flagstaff, he will be in contact with all phases of civil engineering work not just water supply and treatment work, he should take Part 4 of the examination, but did not consider him for Parts 3 and 4 because of his very specialized background and extensive experience. Dr. Joseph C. Mehrhoff, Dean of the College of Engineering at Northern Arizona University together with Dr. Troxler, Associate Dean, Chairman of the Electrical Engineering Department and Dr. Young, Assistant Dean, Chairman of the Mechanical Engineering Department, appeared before the Board to discuss approval of Northern Arizona University students to enter the Engineer-in-Training program.

Dr. Mehrhoff began by thanking the Board for the opportunity to appear and described in detail the creation of the College of Engineering at Northern Arizona University, stating the first engineering degree from Northern Arizona University was awarded in 1967. Dr. Mehrhoff explained the college is now attempting to become accredited by the Engineers' Council for Professional Development and the curriculum is being established for such accreditation with comparable hours as Arizona State University and University of Arizona require for graduation. Dr. Mehrhoff passed out to the Board members a brochure on the present classes offered and a background of the teachers for these courses. Dr. Mehrhoff sought the Board's consideration based on this information in allowing Northern Arizona University students to enter the Engineer-in-Training program.

Mr. Girand quoted to Dr. Mehrhoff the definition of Engineer-in-Training as outlined in A.R.S. 32-101, B(8), and elaborated on that portion regarding a graduate in an approved engineering curriculum of four years or more of a school approved by the board as of satisfactory standing.

Mr. Knickerbocker stated that in regard to Engineers' Council for Professional Development accreditation, the Board has not tried to be an accrediting institution but uses their accreditation as a guideline for evaluations.

The Board reiterated that each applicant is reviewed on his own merit and applications from Northern Arizona University were not returned because of their attendance at this school but because they did not meet the four year requirement.

Dr. Troxler explained that some of their students were transfers from an accredited college and wanted to know if they would be eligible.

Dr. Newlin pointed out that if the applicant in such a case is a transfer and could document four years experience of a character satisfactory to the Board, they would allow him to take the examination. At the present time, however, the Engineer-in-Training application presently used by the Board would need modification, and suggested to the Board the application form be changed in some manner for use by applicants from Northern Arizona University.

Chairman Vanlandingham thanked Dr. Mehrhoff and his associates for their appearance and invited them to stay for the remainder of the meeting.

SUBJECT: Reciprocity

The purpose of the communication is to provide information regarding the California State Board of Landscape Architects provisions for reciprocity, that is, waiver of the written examination requirement. It is requested that this information be disseminated to members of your group. This information should prove helpful to you, additionally, in discussing California's provisions for reciprocity with individuals licensed outside California.

With the amendment of the Landscape Architects Law (effective November 1968) which set forth mandatory licensing of all persons practicing landscape architecture in California (except those in the employ of a licensee), together with other amendments; a provision was also enacted relating to Section 5651 which provided for waiver of the written examination requirement, under the conditions set forth therein. This is the only requirement for which the Board may exercise the waiver provision, and the waiver may only be accomplished when the applicant (Sec. 5651) ". . . has taken an examination for license in another state substantially equivalent in scope and subject matter to the written examination last given in California before such determination is made, and has achieved

a score on the out-of-state examination at least equal to the score required to pass such California written examination." Out-of-state licensees who have not successfully completed a written licensing examination, but were licensed by virtue of a "grandfather" provision, are not eligible for waiver of the written examination.

What exists in the California Landscape Architects Law today is a provision for individual reciprocity only. For this reason, the California State Board of Landscape Architects is strictly prohibited from entering into any formal or ratifying reciprocity agreements with any states.

The same requirements as were enacted in the original Landscape Architects Law (1953) are still in effect--21 years of age, six years of education and practice, good moral character, successful completion of a written examination, successful completion of an oral examination.

It is hoped that this information will prove of assistance to you. Any persons interested in applying in order to determine whether they would be eligible for licensure in California are invited to do so by contacting the Board Office at the address indicated above.

In reviewing the file of Mr. Parsons, there is some inference that he may have aided and abetted an unlicensed person to practice in Arizona by stamping the plans he or his employees did not prepare. Also that some of the plans may constitute the practice of Architecture by an engineer. However, there are other possible explanations and problems of presentation of proof.

One evidentiary problem is in determining who prepared the plans. The owner-developer of the apartment complex has left the jurisdiction, as has the draftsman who worked with Mr. Parsons. The Oregon engineer whose stamp also appears on the drawings is not subject to subpoena, and the builder of the apartment complex merely believes the plans came from Oregon. For the above reasons, I hesitate to recommend conducting a formal hearing.

I am not qualified to render an opinion as to whether any of the plans bearing Mr. Parsons' seal constitute Architecture, and, therefore, offer no recommendation as to a disciplinary hearing on that basis.

Mr. Knickerbocker felt there was more information required before such an adhoc committee was established. It was moved by Mr. Knickerbocker and seconded by Mr. Girand that our Chairman appoint a committee to make a formal report on what this discussion is to be about and present it at any meeting the Chairman wishes to call. Motion carried.

I have reviewed the Complaint by Joseph Gabriel against Mr. Johnson; the photos of the Zeski Commercial Building in Lake Havasu City, Arizona; and the Investigative Report by Steve C. Fotinos.

On the alleged charge of aiding and abetting an unlicensed person to practice, I cannot recommend to the Board that they conduct a formal hearing.

Drawing your attention to the portion of the Investigative Report as follows:

"Mr. Yogerst said he ran an office in the Martinie Building for Imperial Designs. It was a business owned by Mr. Robert R. Johnson and Johnson traveled to Lake Havasu once a week or once every two weeks. Yogerst admitted drawing the plans by (sic) said Johnson went over them and did the 'calc's' and checking. Mr. Yogerst was unsure after the conversation continued as to how much of the work he did and what Johnson actually did."

The exemption of A.R.S. \S 32-144(A)(3) of an employee of a registrant appears applicable as does sealing the work of a bona fide employee.

Here again, I am unable, without architectural or engineering background, to determine if the plans stamped by Mr. Johnson constitute Architecture rather than Engineering, and if so, whether such Architecture was incidental to the Engineering work.

I have reviewed the Complaint filed by Mr. Joseph Gabriel accusing Charles Perret with aiding and abetting an unlicensed person to practice Architecture. I have also reviewed a set of plans for a Vetinary Clinic and Commercial Building, as well as the Investigative Report of Mr. Steve Fotinos. The plans I reviewed have no stamp other than a cover sheet which bears the name "White Brothers Development Co.".

The Complaint by Mr. Gabriel assums that the plans were prepared by other than Mr. Perret. The investigator notes that the printing, etc., of other plans of White Brothers appears to be the same as those submitted to the Board; I assume, inferring that the work is not that of Mr. Perret.

The only direct evidence of the history of the submitted plans appears to be the testimony of Mr. White of White Brothers Development Co. His allegation that he hired Mr. Perret to do the work and that Mr. Perret did some of the work at White Brothers' office appears unrefuted by other evidence.
