The Architectural Evaluation Committee meeting report of May 14 and 15, 1973, was presented by Chairman Vanlandingham, as shown on Minute Pages 3201, 3202, and 3203.

It was moved by Mr. Vanlandingham and seconded by Mr. Wallace that the above report of the Architectural Evaluation Committee meeting be accepted and implemented by the Board. Motion carried.

The Landscape Architectural Evaluation Committee meeting report of May 14, 1973, was presented by Chairman Bowlsby, as shown on Minute Page 3204.

Mr. Knickerbocker stated that possibly we are allowing unqualified people to take the land surveying examinations and that possibly in our future evaluations we have to look a little more carefully through the file to determine whether they are qualified. However, Mr. Dryden felt we should not disregard the registered references who endorse the applicant as qualified for the examinations.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Knickerbocker that the Executive Director when he sends out the notice of examinations shall include with the one-page information sheet, more material concerning the subjects of the land surveying examination. Motion carried.

Prior to the report of the Engineering Evaluation Committee, Mr. Drewry read a letter, received special delivery on June 9, 1973, from Edgar Marshall Bollin, geological applicant, #73-232, who had appeared at the May evaluation meeting. Mr. Knickerbocker stated at the time he was interviewed, there was no evidence of his qualifications for registration under A.R.S. 32-126, nor could the committee consider him eminent in his field of practice. It was moved by Mr. Knickerbocker and seconded by Mr. Girand that the decision of the Engineering Evaluation Committee stand. Motion carried.

Letter from Aaron M. Kram, structural engineer applicant, #73-189, regarding the Engineering Evaluation Committee's recommendation at his interview on May 17, 1973, was presented as shown on Minute Pages 3206 and 3207. Dr. Newlin suggested that the Chairman direct the Executive Director to reply to this letter to the effect that the Evaluation Committee, which was properly constituted at the time of the meeting, does not pass judgment on the applicant prior to his appearance and the reason of the personal audience is to determine the qualifications with him face-to-face, and one of the reasons the structural engineers are required to be examined is the seismic input of the examination.

Dear Mr. Drawry:

On May 17, 1973 at 2:05 p.m. I appeared for a personal audience, per instructions of your letter dated May 2, 1973.

"I want to make this perfectly clear", I am not condemning your Board's requirements for registration. There is no doubt that the nine members of your Board have the prerogative to decide what background should be required to allow an individual to become registered in your State. However, I am at this time, protesting the total procedure which was followed in my particular case.

Per your request, I completed the application which clearly stated that I must be registered by "examination" as a professional engineer in my home state. I have been registered and in good standing in the State of Missouri since 1955. My registration in five other states has been by reciprocity.

I further stated that I have been in my own practice since February, 1964. There were no false statements, nor have I attempted to misrepresent myself in any way.

Your letter states that I was qualified to the point of a personal audience with the Evaluation Committee of the Board.

My first disappointment, in reference to this review, was the fact that only two engineers were present, in addition to yourself. Your Rules and By-Laws, Section II, Item \*8, Evaluation & Examination Committee, states that all engineering members (5) plus the ninth member of the Board, if he is registered as an Assayer, Geologist or Land Surveyor, shall be in attendance.

Secondly, the two engineers that questioned me determined that the Missouri examination did not comply with Arizona requirements. This decision is entirely up to your Board, which in my opinion, is and should be the last word.

However, I do not feel that your Board has done their "homework". If they had, they would have known and should have notified me, prior to my trio to Phoenix, that the Board could not accept Missouri's 16 hour examination. as satisfactory to Arizona.

The trip to Phoenix was expensive (\$193,00 air and \$40.00 miscellaneous expense), time consuming (1 2 days lost from my office) and, as a result of the above, a total disappointment.

I very strongly suggest that your Board formulate a policy which will eliminate the wasteful spending of money as well as "valuable" time to any applicant whose background, in your opinion, does not meet the requirements of your State.

Your Code, Rules and By-Laws do not indicate any requirements in education or background which may differ from the requirements of the State of Missouri.

This information indicated graduates of the ECPD curricula did substantially better on the examination than the non-ECPD, and the non-graduates brings up the tail end. He stated it might be helpful to the public to have this information. It was moved by Mr. Knickerbocker and seconded by Mr. Girand that the Executive Director prepare a news release to the technical societies, magazines and others relating the statistical analysis of the performance of the people who are taking the Engineer-in-Training examination. Motion carried.

Over the past months, our Chapter has become aware of the increasing popularity in attempting to obtain architectural services from students in our Colleges of Architecture. Such requests have come from many sectors; citizens in smaller communities to large corporations based in California. It is a fair statement that our Chapter concern with this practice is not principally with restricting a possible element of competition, but rather with the concern that such services would probably not meet minimums professional and legal standards, and the person performing these services might unknowingly endanger his or her opportunity for eventual registration.

Accordingly, our Professional Practice Committee, in cooperation with the U. of A. College of Architecture developed a position statement. The S.A.C. Board of Directors unanimously endorsed this statement on May 24, and directed me to send you a copy for your review. Provided you agree with the letter and intent of the statement, we would appreciate a brief acknowledgment from you, prior to our publication of the statement.

## SOUTHERN ARIZONA CHAPTER THE AMERICAN INSTITUTE OF ARCHITECTS

Non-registrants are occasionally requested to perform minor services of an architectural character. The Southern Arizona Chapter of the American Institute of Architects, the College of Architecture of the University of Arizona, and the University of Arizona Student Chapter of the A.S.C. A.T.A. submit the following statement of their position with regard to such requests:

- 1. The Code of the Arizona State Board of Technical Registration (Art. I, 32-101, B.#.) defines architectural practice as "any service or creative work requiring architectural education, training, and experience."
- 2. The Code further states (Art. 3, 43-145) that any non-registrant performing architectural services is guilty of a misdemeanor.
- 3. Art. 3, 32-144, #4 of the Code, excludes "a non-registrant who designs a building or structure, the cost of which does not exceed \$50,000., or who designs alterations to any one single story building, dwelling or additions or alterations thereto." (The City of Tucson requires the seal of a licensed architect on any commercial project over \$3,000.).

A non-registrant who is tempted to provide service of the type permitted by the Code should carefully evaluate the scope of the project to determine whether it is entirely within the limits of state law. The non-registrant should also evaluate his technical ability to undertake and successfully complete the service and verify that he has the time to execute the work without compromising his other responsibilities. Finally, he must determine whether the purchaser of the services is taking advantage of the situation by compromising standards of professional compensation or professional service.

It is imperative that any non-registrant inform the prospective purchaser of such services that he is not an architect, and that he is not representing the profession of architecture. Any non-registrant should realize that by undertaking any project that exceeds legal limits or ethical propriety he may be jeopardizing his professional future.

I have talked with two of the professional geologists who successfully passed their tests in December. I learned from them that there were five applicants who took the test; three of whom did not pass. Included in this group, if my information is correct, was a geologist who I do not know personally but I do know professionally. He has a degree in geology and was in effective charge of an office employing 20 technical and non-technical personnel. I am quite frankly, surprised to find that he did not pass the examination.

I obtained a list of the questions from one of the successful applicants as well as he can remember them and I compared them with the list of the questions I was required to answer when I took the examination in 1969. What concerns me is that questions in both examinations were poor and in no way measure the proficiency of the applicant in his profession. The questions were vague and somewhat ambigious and many of them covered such general subject matter as would have required a textbook of writing to answer them completely.

The authors of the examination failed to recognize that geology, as engineering, is a highly specialized discipline. It is no more possible to write a general geological examination than it is to write a general engineering examination. If such an examination were written it is possible that the mechanical engineers would be unable to answer the specialized questions designed for electrical engineers or civil engineers or vice versa. The geology test resembles an examination designed to weed out candidates applying for entrance into graduate school.

Under the present make up of the board, there is not and probably will not be a geologist represented on it. Thus, we have a situation wherein architects, civil engineers, electrical engineers, or landscape architects are attempting to judge the qualifications of geologists. This simply does not make sense and I am certain that you, as an architect, do not feel that I would be competent to judge your qualifications. The present arrangement is inequitable to say the least.

I know two geologists who were registered in the past 2 years that were not held for the examination. One of them registered under the grandfather clause in the State of California and then applied for registration in the State of Arizona. He was registered without examination based on reciprocity with the State of California. The other accomplished registration by virtue of being registered in a Canadian Province.

All of the registered geologists in the state know of many geologists who are holding themselves out for geological employment as consultants who are not registered. Most of them are afraid to take the examination for fear of failure. This is a real possibility because the test simply is no measure of the competence of the applicant.

I am distressed by the present situation in which one geologist attempts to follow the intent of the law, become registered and then do consulting work. He fails the examination and is, of course, unable to work. Another geologist disregards the law, does not apply for registration and consults illegally. Believe me, this is a common situation.

The State Board of Technical Registration is failing their mandate on two scores. First, the system of registration in the State of Arizona is inequitable. It does not measure the professional competence of the people it hopes to certify as professional geologists. Second, the State Board of Technical Registration is not stopping geologists from consulting who are not registered and, therefore, are in violation of the statutes. How long would a doctor, lawyer, real estate agent, or barber be allowed to practice his profession with a license. You and I both know the answer, not long.

I am aware that the State Board of Technical Registration requires information in writing from other geologists about those who are practicing without being registered. However, most registered geologists are relunctant to bring the violators to the attention of the State Board of Technical Registration because they fear the procedure followed by the State Board of Technical Registration in notifying the violators is not confidential and would, because of the small closed community of geologists in the state, subject them to considerable criticism from their professional associates.

These problems must be corrected. To start with, I would like to know who is preparing and grading the examinations for registered professional geologists. Finally, what is the procedure that must be followed to alert the Board to geologists who are consulting without being registered, and how confidential it is? I would appreciate your comments.

#### UNFINISHED BUSINESS

This is in reply to your letter of March 21, 1973, asking whether a county engineer must be a registered engineer.

A.R.S. § 11-561, last amended in 1972, states merely that the county engineer must be a "competent civil engineer and road builder", thus leaving it unclear as to whether the county engineer, as such, must be registered. However, if the county engineer carries out some of his duties personally, he will be required to be registered under A.R.S. § 32-142, concerning public works.

A.R.S. § 11-562 gives the duties of the county engineer. The duties in subsection A, requiring him to be the custodian of the records and property of the county relating to surveying, engineering and road construction, would not be an activity requiring registration as an engineer.

Subsection B of A.R.S. § 11-562 requires that the county engineer, except where highways are being constructed under the direction of a highway commission, shall, under the direction of the Board of Supervisors, have charge of all highways, other engineering construction and improvements, alterations and repairs to county property. This would not necessarily constitute an activity requiring registration unless the county engineer himself undertakes "direct supervision" of the construction of such public works under A.R.S. § 32-142, which requires that the construction of public works be under the direct supervision of a qualified registrant within the category involved.

A.R.S. § 11-562 B goes on to require that the county engineer "shall make surveys, maps, plans and specifications required" by the Board of Supervisors. If the county engineer undertakes to do this himself, he must be a registered engineer.
A.R.S. § 32-142 requires that all drawings, plans, specifications and estimates for public works of the state or a

political subdivision thereof be prepared by or under the personal direction of a qualified registrant within the category involved.

The Chairman noted that a quorum was present to conduct the business of the items on the agenda for this meeting.

Basically, the meeting was called, the Chairman stated, to discuss the application of Lynwood E. Brown, Jr., Architect, File No. 73-310.

Mr. Wyatt reported that Mr. Brown is an employee of Marriott Corporation who is furnishing the food service at the Phoenix International Airport and the applicant needs registration basically for this reason, and his employer requested we have a special meeting. Mr. Wyatt explained his application came to this office through the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards and meets all of the requirements for registration. It was moved by Mr. Wyatt and seconded by Mr. Vanlandingham that Mr. Lynwood E. Brown, Jr., be granted registration in Architecture and assigned the registration number 9091. Motion carried.

Discussion followed on a letter received from James Lakin, Chairman of the Professional Practice Committee of the Central Arizona Chapter, ATA, in regard to plans submitted under the title block of John W. Martin, General Contractor, and sealed by James I. McCausland, Civil Engineer, No. 7646, as shown on Minute Page 3242. The Executive Director reported he called Mr. McCausland after receipt of this letter for the particulars and was advised by Mr. McCausland he did not have the drawings in his office and would be unable to secure them from the City of Glendale as the gentleman who had them was on vacation until the end of the month. When the Executive Director went to the Glendale building inspections office, Mr. Baker stated that none of the staff was on vacation. In looking over the plans, Mr. McCausland had placed his seal on all the drawings with the word, "structural", under his seal including even the electrical drawings. The Executive Director requested Mr. Baker not to release these drawings and he stated they could not be released until sixty days after completion of the project which still had another month to go.

The Chairman stated, based on the above, there is a possibility of Mr. McCausland aiding and abetting the contractor.

It has been brought to my attention by an AIA Member that there is a building under construction in Glendale, Arizona known as the Glendale Office Plaza, at 5440 West Glendale, being builty by John W. Martin, General Contractor. The building is approximately 10,000 S.F. According to the complaint, an inquiry was made of the General Contractor on having a similar building constructed and was informed the plans would be furnished for free. I called the Building Department, City of Glendale and was informed that the plans submitted for the building permit was under the title block of John W. Martin, General Contractor and were stamped by James I. McCausland, Civil Engineer No. 7646.

I am questioning if this situation is in violation of Section 32-145-1 "offers to practice" and Section 32-143 "Engineer engaging in practice of Architect".

The following report on Fredonia High School District No. 30 regarding a project to build administration offices and a gymnasium was distributed to the Board members: by the Executive Director:

Craig Walling phoned July 16 to report that plans for this project were available for inspection at Plan Service, Phoenix.

He phoned again July 17 to ask if I had seen or photographed the plans. I told him that I had not. He stated that Mr. Kemper Goodwin thought it would be good to have such photographs. I asked him if he planned to take such photographs and he said he would try to do that, and mentioned that Plan Service would have to return the plans within a day or two.

I visited Plan Service July 18 and found a set of typed specifications and seven prints of drawings, identified only by School District title block, without initials or seal. The administration office building is 32' x 70' and the gymnasium is 110' x 148'. 20 ga. galvanized steel wall panels and 20 ga. steel roof deck are to be used. Specifications state "The contractor shall furnish complete calculations and structural drawings to the School District, signed by a licensed Arizona Professional Engineer."

The specifications also state "The building manufacturer shall furnish complete erection drawings showing anchor bolt settings, sidewall, endwall, and roof framing, transverse cross sections, covering and flashing details, and accessory installation details to clearly indicate the proper assembly of all building parts. On request the manufacturer shall also furnish a certificate, signed by a Registered Professional Engineer, that the building design meets the requirements of the specifications and is in accordance with accepted engineering practice."

I phoned Bill Howells, Coconino City Engineer, who informed me that the school superintendent is Dr. Bill McLaughlin of Fredonia. The bid was called by the Coconino Board of Supervisors.

Chairman Knickerbocker stated it appears from this report that credibility of the Board might be improved if there is some kind of specific action we can take in this regard. Suggested that we advise the Board of Supervisors that it requires an architect to prepare working drawings for this construction and it would be in violation of the law under 32-142 and of the misdemeanor penalty under 32-145.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Vanlandingham that the Executive Director be directed to write a letter to the Chairman and members of the school board of the Fredonia School District calling their attention to the fact that plans have to be prepared under the direction of a qualified registrant within the category involved, as outlined in A.R.S. 32-142, and secondly, we include in the letter a

copy of the letter dated April 30, 1969, which the Board circulated to all officials reminding them that all officials and elected members are required to uphold the laws of the State.

It was moved by Mr. Wyatt and seconded by Dr. Newlin that the above motion be amended to include that the school board shall be required to retain an architect registered in Arizona and other appropriate qualified Arizona registrants as required by the complexity of the project. The amendment carried with three ayes and two nays.

The motion, as amended, carried.

There being no further business the Chairman adjourned the meeting at 3:30 P.M.

#### REPORT OF THE PUBLIC INFORMATION COMMITTEE

Mr. Wyatt reported that he and Mr. Vanlandingham attended from June 27 - 30, 1973, the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards' Annual Meeting in Atlanta, Georgia, which was certainly a beautiful city. The general discussion at this meeting was the implementation of the new examination procedure which they are right in the middle of at this time. One problem facing Arizona is whether applicants from another state who became registered without the qualifying examination can be granted in Arizona without it. The other probelm discussed was the number of years required for actual job application prior to be examined as many states are trying to reduce this amount, allowing additional time for education.

Dr. Newlin reported on his attendance at the National Council of Engineering Examiners' Annual Meeting, held August 12-15, 1973, in New Orleans, Louisiana, and his attendance as a member of the Qualifications for Registration Committee. One of the charges given the National Council is to take a look at procedures in Canada wherein their non-graduate applicants or those who are not graduates of an accredited school are required to take a lengthy examination in all fundamentals of engineering. Dr. Newlin reported to the Committee that Arizona waives the EIT for graduates of an ECPD school but requires others to take the EIT and possibly by changing the fundamentals examination, similar to what Canada has done, may be the other states would adopt this format to which the committee agreed. The committee is going to study it for this year and make a recommendation to the Council next year.

Mr. Knickerbocker reported on his attendance at the National meeting and his attendance as member of the National Engineering Certification Committee. In the last year, considerable amount of time has been spent in updating the council record and reported the Engineering Evaluation Committee has this record on the table at this time to see if we can use it in the same light as the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards' council record.

#### REPORT OF THE BUDGET COMMITTEE

A Summary of the Budget Request for Fiscal Year 1974-1975 which was submitted to the Finance Department together with a report on the Technical Registration Fund was presented as shown on Minute Page 3268.

Mr. Wyatt noted the biggest increases are primarily in examination costs, and that there is an increase of approximately \$25,000 a year overall in the Technical Fund.

Chairman Knickerbocker directed the Budget Committee to take an in-depth look as to what should be done with the accumulation in our Technical Registration Fund and report at the next meeting. He suggested that when the Budget Committee is tudying this they could first come up with a price proposal covering say a period of three years and at the same time meet with the Rules and By-Laws Committee for any possible rule changes affected by their proposal.

#### REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The Executive Director presented his report as shown on Minute Pages 3269 and 3270. After discussion of this report, it was moved by Mr. Dryden and seconded by Dr. Newlin that we request a supplemental appropriation in the amount of \$12,000 for this fiscal year's expenditures. Motion carried.

#### REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The official Budget Request for 1974-1975 was delivered to the Budget Division August 28, 1973.

The significant items are summarized on Page 28. The total request \$131,500 includes the estimate of \$29,500 for examinations, recognizing that the price of architectural exams has doubled and N.C.E.E. exam prices will be 25% higher in 1974. Volume in applications, examinations and registrations increased approximately 25% between 1971-1972 and 1972-1973.

The examination estimates for 1973-1974 have not realistic because budget division rules require that the total cannot exceed the appropriation of \$108,000. It is estimated that architectural exam costs in the current year will approximate \$13,000, and the present inflationary trend will affect other items beyond the estimated amounts. It is therefore recommended that the Board should request a supplemental appropriation of \$12,000 to cover expenses in the current year, assuming the \$3,500 figure to be sufficient for investigations which may be required.

#### Technical Registration Fund

The carryover of \$174,209 estimated for June 30, 1975 is based on the present renewal fee of \$15.00. Reducing the fee to \$10.00 would reduce the carryover by approximately \$34,000. If this were done, total income is estimated to be \$125,000, which is less than the amount requested for operations in 1974-1975.

"To be assured that applicants for registration are satisfactorily qualified, the Board and/or its evaluation and examination committees have held 36 meetings throughout the year. This involved the selection of examination questions, the review of 1,687 examination grades, the appraisal of 907 applications and the granting of 737 registrations. Two formal hearings were held during the year, resulting in suspension of licenses and many other complaints were resolved without necessity for a formal hearing."

It was moved by Mr. Dryden and seconded by Mr. Wallace that the examination fees in the Rules be reviewed by the Rules and By-Laws and Budget Committees. Motion carried.

Cash Flow Report #1 was presented by the Executive Director. It was moved by Mr. Dyrden and seconded by Mr. Girand that this report be accepted as presented and ast shown on Minute Page 3272. Motion carried.

#### READING OF COMMUNICATIONS

Letter from Al Sayler, as shown on Minute Pages 3273 and 3274, was presented, and Mr. Harold Ditzler and Mr. George Sprinkle were welcomed to the meeting who were present to speak on behalf of this letter.

Mr. Wyatt explained that this subject was covered in a meeting about two years ago but since that time more architectural offices are coming up with standard detail documents whereby details of typical door frames, etc., are repeated time after time on every job in the same way which are detailed on a  $8\frac{1}{2} \times 11$  sheet and would be filed in a  $8\frac{1}{2} \times 11$  book similar to a specification book, and these details would be stamped on the index page and title page and on each individual page.

Mr. Sprinkle and MR. Ditzler expressed to the Board their appreciation of considering this problem and that they did want to comply with the requirements of the law but would appreciate a clarification as to whether the stamp is required on each and every page of the book of standard details since the City of Phoenix turns it down if it is not stamped in this manner.

After considerable discussion, it was moved by Mr. Wyatt and seconded by Mr. Girand that a book of standard details with the stamp appearing on the title and index page, if signed by the same person who signed the drawings, is considered to be in agreement with the Rules and By-Laws of this Board. Motion carried with 4 ayes and 3 nays.

The Chairman directed that the above policy be circulated to the City of Phoenix and other appropriate agencies.

It was moved by Mr. Dryden and seconded by Dr. Newlin that a copy of this policy statement be cleared with our Attorney General before being circulated. Motion carried.

A letter from George Burnet of the Engineering Education and Accreditation Committee of ECPD was presented which requested if our Board would select a member to serve as an observer when ECPD makes their visit to the Arizona State University for the purpose of accrediting their engineering curricula. It was suggested by Mr. Vanlandingham that the Executive Director ask Mr. Knickerbocker if he would like to be an observer since the other engineering members were unable to do so.

#### Gentlemen:

Our firm is attempting to improve our construction documents and also control our production costs, and one of the methods we are now using consists of a book of details bound in a document form like specifications.

We feel that this system will make it easier for an estimator to check details or schedules by turning the pages in a book while looking at a plan or section than it is to flip back and forth through large drawings. A person checking shop drawings will also benefit. Reproduction costs of '8-1/2" x 11" sheets are much easier and more economical if only one detail reproduction is desired. Many projects that are similar in nature have details that are standard and require tracing on large drawings on each project, but could be provided in the drawing documents quite economically if reproduced from a small master and inserted in the book.

Our problem is that the City of Phoenix is requiring that each detail sheet be sealed, signed and dated rather than permitting a seal, signature and date on a title page and index sheet for the book as required for specifications.

We would like to request that the Board of Technical Registration review this section of Rule IV and consider permitting a seal, signature and date on a title page and index of detail books or some other solution.

The enclosed detail book is an example of our proposed document, and you will note that this project contains very few standard details.

A local architect was approached and, in effect, asked to stamp a stock set of plans. He properly declined. Sometime later when the project was under construction the architect who declined to stamp someone else's work saw the plans being used for construction, the documents were the same as the set he was asked to stamp and they bore the seal of another architect. The prints had been sealed and signed rather than the job redrawn and the seal affixed to the original tracing. It may be possible, in this situation, to produce (1) the set of prints the local architect was asked to stamp and (2) the stamped duplicate set of prints being used for construction.

Your assessment of this situation and a reply would be most appreciated.

We are curious to know about the results of your investigation of the referenced project that was recently on file at one of the local plan rooms. You may recall we had several phone conversations and I requested that you stop by the plan room to see the documents that didn't bear the seal of a registrant.

The low bidder on the project, and I believe the only bidder, was Speros Construction Co. Rumor has it that Speros had a construction trailer on the site before the bids were opened.

The points we want to make are (1) this problem should not be over-looked and allowed to slip by because construction has started and we think it should be stopped, (2) The school district is in violation of the state law because there was only one bid and (3) the contract documents were not prepared by a registered architect or engineer, as required by law.

I would welcome a clarification of the law regarding the requirement for all public work to be designed by an architect or engineer. I personally don't think the \$50,000.00 limitation that allows a home owner to prepare his own plans also means a public project costing less than \$50,000.00 can be designed without the services of a registered projessional. The subject Fredonia project exceeds the \$50,000.00 figure, so there is no question as to its status.

We do have a set of slides of the Fredonia Documents and we will be happy to submit them to the Board.

A prompt reply would be appreciated because construction on the project is underway.

"Amend Rule No. IV, A, to read Rule IV, A, 1.

"Adopt Rule IV, A, 2., as follows:

12. Except when otherwise provided by law, the client shall have the prerogative to select and designate the prime professional and to approve the collaborating professionals selected for his project."

Mr. Wyatt stated that he preferred not to vote on this issue as he did not believe it was what the Code provided for, but in view of the fact the issue had divided the registered architects and engineers, he would cast his vote in opposition. Motion carried with 4 ayes and 3 nays.

## REPORT OF THE PUBLIC INFORMATION COMMITTEE

Mr. Dryden reported that this committee was established years ago because on numerous occasions Board members are asked to speak to a society or organization which is considered our only public information function.

## REPORT OF THE BUDGET COMMITTEE

Mr. Wyatt presented the report of the Budget Committee, as shown on Minute Pages 3295 and 3296. Considerable discussion as how to reduce the Technical Registration Fund besides reducing the annual renewal fee was made. Mr. Girand suggested the hiring of an investigator which he preferred to call a Quality Control Officer on a full time basis. He felt this was necessary due to the poor quality of plans which were being submitted to the City of Phoenix. Mr. Dryden felt we should hire an investigator or expertise as a complaint warrants the necessity of hiring for such investigation. The Chairman requested the Budget Committee to accept the responsibility of additional review for reducing the Technical Fund which would be of benefit to our registrants and make a positive recommendation at the next meeting. He, also, appointed Mr. Wallace as a temporary member of this committee.

### REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The Cash Flow Report shows expenses of \$24,688. Rent in the amount of \$4,000 has not been billed. The comparable figure as of November 30, 1972, was \$27,621 with rent included. The balance of appropriated funds is \$14,437 greater but the increase in exam costs is not yet apparent; because payment is not due.

As approved at the September meeting, a supplemental appropriation of \$12,000 has been requested through Representative McConnell, who has asked the Joint Legislative Budget Committee to introduce the request for action by the Legislature at the regular session.

The new national professional engineering exams were held in November, and the new professional exams for architects was held December 8 and 9. This was the first time that these examinations were given in each instance.

Changes in staff have occurred by resignation of Jean Karasek and Pauline Parks. Roberta Mareskes started work Monday, December 10 as an applications clerk and the personnel division has a request for applicants to fill the second vacancy.

#### TECHNICAL REGISTRATION FUND

The attached sheet shows the actual amounts added to the fund in five fiscal years through 1972-1973 and the estimated amounts for the next two years assuming the same increases in registration and in expenses as were used in the Budget request.

If the fee is reduced to \$10 beginning January 1, 1975, the addition of \$26,900 to the fund would change to a reduction of \$10,800 caused by the reduction in renewal fees from \$110,000 to \$73,000

However, the estimates were made for appropriation purposes and it is a fact that registration less than the estimate will result in lower income but not to the same extent in reduction of expense. If these figures remained the same as in 1972-1973, a \$10 fee would reduce the fund by \$14,000, or more if expenses increase. The recent change in both architectural and engineering examinations has precluded the use of historical figures in estimating future examination costs. It is known that 1973 year-end exams will cost at least \$3,200 more than 1972, but future rate of failure is not predictable and may cause a significant further increase, along with the amount caused by increased applications.

It is suggested that consideration be given to a fee of \$10 beginning January 1, 1975, with the recognition that it will probably be necessary to raise it in three to five years to maintain a working amount necessary for operation during the first half of the year before the renewal fees and examination fees are received.

It is my feeling that when a letter is written to the State
Technical Registration Board in protest of their action, they may
become defensive in their response of their previous decisions.
Although this is a letter of protest in regards to the application
of Mr. Rafael Lopez Valenquela, I would request the Board to
seriously consider the following, through investigation if necessary,
and recind their previous acceptance of application.

#### EDUCATIONAL BACKGROUND:

It will be found that the four years of high school academic requirements were not experienced, but that a G.E.D. test was the result of education with a few evening courses the extent of formal educational background.

#### ARCHITECTURAL EXPERIENCE:

That Mr. Valenquela does not have the adequate number of years served under direct supervision of a registered architect in conjunction with his educational background. The experience that has been received through the Phoenix Union High School System is not that which would be experienced in a professional office. Mr. Valenquela has been responsible for such things as plans for tenant layout, tennis courts, minor remodeling and supervision of draftsmen preparing these plans. Mr. Valenquela did act as laison for the system in new construction when plans were prepared by architectural firms. It must be noted that Mr. Valenquela did not participate in design or development of such plans. These were all handled outside and independent of his office.

#### PROFESSIONAL EHTICS:

Mr. Valenquela established himself as the sole inventor and developer of Science Equipment and participated in expenditure of funds issued by the Ford Foundation to support development. Evidence that I maintain and interviews of previous employees will expose the fraudulant attempt Mr. Valenquela made to promote himself. The equipment was taken directly from a "Kewaunee" catalog.

The purpose of such action was to promote himself and create sale of science equipment for those helping in the deception.

STRUCTURE and DESIGN:

Perhaps the one major structure Mr. Valenquela was responsible

for, of which he designed and prepared plans himself, was the

wood frame handball courts at Central High School. The courts

received wind damage which could have resulted in bodily injury

to students. When the system requested the drawing for review, Mr. Valenquela removed them from the files and disposed of them.

MORAL INTEGRITY:

Mr. Valenquela's own statements of his conduct and phone calls I personally received expresses a moral stability that would be considered uncommon. This may have resulted in a published divorce.

I have based my statement on facts and evidence that I can produce and my eleven years of experience while an employee of the Phoenix Union High School System working with Mr. Valenquela.

I will assist the Board in any and all inquiries that would relate to Mr. Valenquela's personal and professional conduct, as I know it to be.

Although I have no supporting evidence, it is my understanding, that Mr. Valenquela on more than one occasion has presented himself as an architect. When working with the System, Mr. Valenquela did introduce himself to the contractors as the architect.

Gentlemen:

We have considered your request that we reaffirm an opinion to your Board dated April 11, 1961, a copy of which is attached.

On August 21, 1962 the Attorney General issued Opinion No. 62-32 which considered, in essence, the same question considered in the letter of April 11, 1961. A copy of Opinion No. 62-32 is enclosed. Both opinions should be read together and when so read together we reaffirm them.

The result is that it is within the power of a city or county official to deny a permit for building construction when the drawings and specifications have been prepared by a person not qualified under, or exempt from the Technical Registration Act. Furthermore, if the city or county official knows or has reason to conclude that the drawings and specifications have been prepared by a person not qualified under, or exempt from, the Technical Registration Act, he is under a duty to deny a permit.

Dear Mr. Drewry:

We have become aware that during the past year or so, violations of the registration code applying to landscape architects and the practice of landscape architecture have increased substantially. The purpose of this letter is to seek the assistance and guidance of the Board in reducing, if not eliminating, such violations. Specifically, we would like to know how to present complaints, what kinds of evidence are necessary to support complaints, and what kinds of actions the Board is prepared to take or advises be taken if complaints prove justified. We are not yet in a financial position to incur legal expenses in this connection, but feel that every effort short of legal action should be made to stop illegal activities.

Two general types of violations are occurring: (1) those in which non-registrants and/or firms not listing the name of registrants are advertising serivces as landscape architects, in violation of Sections 32-141 and 32-145 of the Code; and (2) those in which other professional firms are not employing "qualified" persons and those who are habitually exceeding any reasonable interpretation of the term "incidental", as set forth in Section 32-143. We are assured by Mountain Bell Telephone Co. that, with the cooperation of the Board and this organization, it will police its directory advertising more closely. It would be most helpful if the Board would address a letter to each violator informing him that he is in violation of the Code and subject to legal action.

The second category of violations is more difficult; but at the same time more important with respect to the volume of sub-standard work being produced under the classification of landscape architecture. The basic need here is for a firm interpetation of the term "incidental". The gray area of overlap in architecture and landscape architecture is most pronounced and most difficult to define in the practice of site planning, and, unfortunately, we have little hope that an equitable division could be agreed upon. On the other hand, we feel that there is no such gray area with respect to design of landscape plantings and related construction. Almost any amount of landscape development could be interpreted as "incidental" in a very large architectural or engineering project. However, landscape development costs frequently exceed \$50,000 in rather modest architectural projects, and it seems to us that this passes the point of being "incidental". Some very bad work can be done and clients badly cheated at costs well below this figure.

Mease answer the questions in the first paragraph and give us whatever guidance you can in these matters.

Gentlemen:

We have received and reviewed your letter of September 7, 1973 wherein you requested our consideration of the following resolution of the Board:

A book of standard details with the stamp appearing on the title and index page, if signed by the same person who signed the drawings, is considered to be in agreement with the Rules and By-Laws of this Board.

We have considered specifically your Rule V(2) which provides:

#### 2. Use of Seals

An imprint on the registrant's valid seal shall appear on each and every sheet of drawings and on the cover and index page of each set of specification and/or reports or other professional documents prepared by a registrant or his bona fide employee. Superimposed over the imprint of the seal shall be the original signature of the registrant and the date indicated when the seal imprint was signed.

Because of lack of knowledge and expertise in the field, we are unable to determine whether a "book of standard details" described in the resolution is generally understood to mean "sheets of drawings" or a "set of specifications" as those terms are used in the rule.

From the resolution, it appears that the Board thinks that a "book of standard details" is a "set of specifications" or, at least, should be treated as such.

If any doubt exists, however, concerning the interpretation of "set of specifications" to include "book of standard details," we would suggest that the appropriate procedure is to amend Rule V(2) in conformity with the Administrative procedure Act.

The Personnel Division has carefully reviewed your request to recommend funding for a higher salary range for fiscal year 1974-75 for the exempt position of Technical Registration Board Executive Director.

After a review of all of the information submitted and obtained from other sources, the Personnel Board is recommending to the Legislature that the salary for the position of Technical Registration Board Executive Director be approved at the level of State Service Pay Grade 021, \$15,833 - \$21,540 to be effective July 1, 1974. This is approximately the same salary level that was recommended for this fiscal year.

We were unable to comply with your request to recommend a higher range of pay for this job because in a comparison with other Arizona State agency director positions this position is most similar in responsibility for staff and operating budget to other agencies that are presently or will be in the same salary bracket. We also have no salary information that would indicate that our salary is low in comparison with like jobs in other states whose programs would be similar in scope to ours.

Our recommendation does, however, include an across-the-board economic adjustment of 6.75% which hopefully will be approved by the Legislature.

It has been brought to the attention of the Structural Engineers Association that a number of our members have been signing this certificate, but the persons doing the inspection have not been employed directly by the Professional who signed and stamped the certificate.

It is the unanimous opinion of the State Board of Trustees of the Structural Engineers Association that this is in direct violation of the Registration Act, in that it is analogous to a registrant who reviews a non-registrant's drawings and then seals the said reviewed drawings. It is further our opinion that all work that an Architect or Engineer performs must be prepared by him or his bona fide employee.

Would you please send us a written ruling on this matter so we can notify our membership of proper action in this matter of inspection. Enclosed is a copy of the City of Phoenix Special Inspection Certificate. Thank you very much for your assistance.

I am writing this in response to our telephone conversation of this afternoon concerning the interpretation of the Code of the State Board of Technical Registration. My question, if you recall, was: "Are people providing engineering services for agricultural development exempt from the Code?".

There are at least two (2) people in the State of Arizona posing as agricultural developers that are, in my opinion, providing the services of an engineering firm under the guise of developers. Their services are as follows:

#### 1. LAND LEVELING

- a. Provide topographic survey work
- Design irrigation slopes based on soil permeability, stratification and economics
- c. Calculate quantities of earth for excavation and embankment
- d. Provide the land owner with construction drawings for the project and bidding data
- e. Inspect the work after the earthmoving contractor has finished for conformancy with the design

#### 2. CONCRETE IRRIGATION CANALS

- a. Provide topograhic survey
- b. Design elevations, slopes, and canal hydraulics
- c. Calculate quantities of earth for excavation and embankment
- d. Provide the owner with construction drawings and bidding data

I feel that these people are performing engineering work and that their clients are not being given the work of a professional.

The projects vary of course, but the project we discussed near Gila Bend will consist of some 10,000 acres this year with more in the future. The ranch consists of some 60,000

At a recent meeting, the Board discussed H.B. 2005 and the amendment, dated February 11, 1974.

This Board is not merely an advisory body, but his highly functional inasmuch as the members evaluate the professional qualifications to decide on appropriate action concerning each applicant with regard to a license to practice in Arizona, and thereby ensure the safety of the public through competent design of buildings and structures throughout the State.

To perform this action with a minimum number of meetings, the Board depends on its executive director and staff to assemble information from references, universities, present and previous employers, and, in the case of applicants from other states, to get a complete report from other state boards. This requires staff personnel in charge of application files to be familiar with every detail from receipt of the application to a point where a summary of all information can be typed for review by the executive director prior to evaluation by the Board.

For the six professions and the division of engineering into 16 branches, it is possible to give nearly 70 different four-hour examinations, twice each year, requiring a detailed knowledge and record of the status of each candidate at all times.

The Board is self-supporting and no monies other than those collected from application fees, examining fees and license fees, as determined by the Board from time to time, are required to carry out the various

activities of this Board. License renewals for registrants paying by December 31 are printed by the State EDP Department, but payments must first be recorded and receipts mailed to show current status. Delinquent collections are not practical except by manual follow-up methods.

The purpose of this explanation is to show the necessity for maintaining continuous highly specialized personnel to provide the Board with complete factual information for its decisions and to furnish the regulatory services required by law, including investigations and hearings to suspend or revoke licenses if negligence, incompetence or other violations are proven.

It is the opinion of the Board that its staff must be kept intact and that the attendance additional costs assigned to us by the proposed new agency would not result in a more effective service to the public nor to the applicants and registrans under jurisdiction of this Board.

It is, therefore, respectfully requested that the State Board of Technical Registration be excluded from the provisions of H.B. 2005.

### REPORT OF THE PUBLIC INFORMATION COMMITTEE

Mr. Knickerbocker advised that he will be speaking at the University of Arizona regarding registration on March 26 and 27.

Mr. Vanlandingham reported on the meeting of the Western Conference and its discussions of the Equivalency exam which may be required of applicants to Arizona from states in which it is not offered. He also reported that Mr. Wyatt was elected to a three-year term on the Executive Committee of the Conference.

The subject of the method of grade determination by E.T.S. was discussed. Dr. Newlin pointed out that the statistical grading system might not be legally compatible with the numerical passing grades in the Rules, also that the Board should have the option to establish the cut-off point for passing grades. The Chairman referred this subject to the Rules and By-Laws Committee for consideration.

#### REPORT OF THE BUDGET COMMITTEE

Mr. Drewry reported that HB 2099, the request for supplemental appropriation, has been recommended by the Budget Division and by the Joint Budget Committee.

### READING OF COMMUNICATIONS

Letter from Dr. Newlin to the Governor with a copy to the Board submitting his resignation, effective June 1, 1974, was presented. In accepting this letter, the Board expressed their regrets of his resignation.

#### UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Mr. Knickerbocker reported that the Attorney General has submitted certification forms for signature in connection with the rule change regarding the prime professional.

A discussion was held on the subject of availability of legal representation, including the possibility of retaining counsel using Technical Registration funds. It was moved by Mr. Dryden and seconded by Dr. Newlin that a letter from the Board be written by the Chairman, requesting the attendance of a representative of the Attorney General presentational Board meetings. Motion carried.

The formal hearing to be held in the matter of James McCausland cannot be held as scheduled for this meeting because Notice of Complaint was not issued. In discussing a new date for the James McCausland hearing, it appeared inappropriate to reschedule a formal hearing. It was moved by Mr. Dryden and seconded by Dr. Newlin not to hold a formal hearing, but to invite Mr. McCausland to the next scheduled Board meeting for discussion of the issue. Motion carried.

Mr. Valenzuela appeared before the Architectural Evaluation Committee on February 25, 1974, as a result of the letter from Mr. Brock. He responded to questions concerning his experience. His replies have been confirmed by letters recently received from his former employers. Mr. Wyatt stated that the experience does appear to be adequate and in compliance with requirements.

Discussion was held regarding Electrical Code Section 330(e), items H,I, and J as directed at the December Board meeting. Mr. Wyatt stated that he did not believe items covered to be in accord with the intent of the registration law. Mr. Wallace pointed out that the City Building Code could not pre-empt the State law. Mr. Knickerbocker suggested a letter from the Board stating that their review of these Code items indicates that any practice of same could result in violations of the Technical Registration law.

Mr. Wyatt provided background information regarding the structural inspection ruling under A.R.S. 32-125. Visitors Charles Magadini, George Sprinkle, Ed Mangotich and Bill Sawyer joined the Board discussion. Representatives present were advised by the Board that the Board could only judge each case involving this ruling on its own merit but could not resolve the matter between Architects, Structural Engineers and the City of Phoenix.

### PUBLIC HEARING ON PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

Chairman Knickerbocker announced it was the time set for the public hearing of the proposed rule change as published and dated May 31, 1974. Chairman Knickerbocker read Rule V, paragraph 2, as it exists, and then read the proposed rule change. Mr. Girand read a memo from Mr. Attebery to Mr. Harmon, as shown on Minute Page 3354, and Mr. Knickerbocker read the letters received from the following and as shown on Minute Pages 3355, 3356, 3357, 3358 and 3359:

Mr. Womack who was present for the hearing showed samples of the bound details of  $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 11" sketches which the City received, and stated the City usually received the original plans in conjunction with the bound details but not in all cases. Mr. Al Sayler who was present questioned the cross reference of section cuts referred to in Mr. Sienerth's letter as being more difficult than cross reference on drawings. Mr. Girand asked Mr. Womack if the City of Phoenix did not use a  $8\frac{1}{2}$ " x 11" standard city details bound in book form which are not stamped or sealed, and Mr. Womack would not comment on this. Mr. Nelson who was present felt whatever the Board established, he would be in agreement.

After considerable discussion, the Chairman announced that the public hearing had been held and was closed. The Board would take it under advisement later in our session today or tomorrow and will act on the proposed change. Mr. Dryden suggested that the matter be placed on the agenda beginning tomorrow morning and the Chairman so ordered.

### INTERVIEW WITH MR. JAMES McCAUSLAND

Mr. James McCausland appeared before the Board by invitation. The Assistant Attorney General, Michael Lowe, advised Mr. McCausland this was an informal investigation and he had a right to have an attorney or counsel to represent him. Subject: PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO RULE NO. V, 2 OF THE RULES OF THE BOARD OF TECHNICAL REGISTRATION

As you know, we are heavily involved in reading building plans and details. In this capacity we are opposed to the proposal that further encourages plans and details prepared in the form of small sheets of paper bound together.

Our objection is to this "method" of plans preparation and we realize that the Board is formally considering not the method, but only whether a seal on each sheet is required. We feel that the Board should reject this proposal because, at least, it will tend to encourage the method.

The full import of the significance of this plans preparation practice can only be gained by actually going through a project in a detailed plans check. However, the following points are made to shed some light on the problem:

- 1. "Reading" the plans for their intent on a specific construction item becomes very difficult. You might need to refer to 3 or 4 "section cuts" to gain full understanding; trying to find and read simultaneously 3 or 4 details from a bound book is difficult and time consuming; on a standard size drawing, quick scanning is possible enabling full comprehension.
- 2. 8-1/2" x 11" addendum sheets are issued which revise the original 8-1/2" by 11" plan sheets. This vastly increases the chances for error and "overlooks".
- The system produces conflicts between plan views and cut details, probably because the same draftsman doesn't follow through and in-house quality control is more difficult. Also the design offices tend to use their "standard 8-1/2 x 11 details" and many times these don't exactly fit the job.
- 4. These sheets tend to become lost, out of order, superseded or otherwise not fail-safe. The system allows the designer to excuse himself with a simple "sorry about that, you can see how easy the error is to make." .
- 5. Lack of seal further compounds the problem. No one could be held accountable for the responsibility of a detail because of no actual official identification-anyone could have inserted the sheet into the shelf of papers.

Mr. L. D. Womack, Structural Plans Engineer, of this department will be present at the Board meeting to show a typical example of a project delineated by "loose paper". This example should in no way be construed to reflect upon the designer personally; it is intended only to illustrate the system.

After checking with the City of Glendale, Mr. McCausland provided the office with a set of plans which showed his seal McCauston over the word "Structural" and also on the other drawings. Mr. Girand asked Mr. McCausland if he recognized these drawings in his hand and were they talking about the same subject to which Mr. McCausland said "yes." Mr. McCausland then explained about the plans indicating the contractor had asked him to do the structural calculations and revise a number of details which he subsequently stamped. Mr. Girand asked the Assistant Attorney General that if an administrative hearing such as this, is it necessary that our discussion be open? Mr. Lowe said it is not a formal hearing and it is understood by everyone present, but the Board has the right to ask for legal private advice. Mr. Place suggested we prepare a formal hearing and do it properly. The Assistant Attorney General advised in order for the Board to decide that the formal hearing is or is not desirable, it will be necessary for the Board to vote. The Chairman requested the private advice of their attorney and excused the public.

When Mr. McCausland returned the Chairman explained to Mr. McCausland when this complaint was received there was an indication there was something wrong to which you have readily admitted you felt the same way, and the Board had discussed it at two previous meetings. It did not seem necessary to put you through a formal hearing but we want you to know we were cognizant of these type of things, and the action is complete in this matter and hope you recognize what we are trying to do. Mr. McCausland assured the Board that there will be not recurrence of this problem. The Chairman thanked Mr. McCausland for appearing and excused him from the meeting.

### REQUESTS FOR RECONSIDERATION

Mr. Ray Alan Eastman, File #74-15, Geologist, appeared to discuss his letter requesting reconsideration and his application. It has come to our attention and it appears that at least two organizations have prepared plans and constructed public school buildings without the direction of a registrant.

Enclosed are two (2) sets of plans which have been copied from plans on file at the Gadsden Elementary School, Gadsden, Arizona.

One set of plans is a building design for classrooms at the school. The classroom building has been constructed apparently by the same person who prepared the plans, which is Cliff O. Boren Contracting Co., 2223 West 17th Street, Yuma, Arizona 85364. There appears to be no seal on the plans.

The other set of plans have recently been submitted to the Gadsden School in preparation for the apparent construction of the building. These plans which include foundation, mechanical, plumbing, electrical and other information have been apparently, submitted by Marston's Inc., P. O. Box 20827, Phoenix, Arizona 85036. Chardon Mobile-Modular, 2502 W. Durango, Phoenix, Arizona 85010 is the apparent builders of the structure. These plans have no seal on them either. Two similar buildings supplied by Marston's Inc. have already been constructed at Gadsden school. This building will make the third structure of this type.

The Western Chapter, Arizona Society of Professional Engineers is concerned with the health, safety and welfare of citizens in our area and especially children. We are particularly concerned about the footings and foundations under the buildings and the existing school utilities near and perhaps under the new buildings. It appears that construction of the three buildings mentioned was not supervised by a registrant.

The National Engineering Certificate Committee had asked Mr. Knickerbocker to make an effort to see if Arizona could adopt this as a professional record as we now do with the architects. He stated the requirements for attaining a NEC Council Record are:

- A. Engineers qualify by being a graduate of an accredited education, 12 years of experience, and 16 hours of written examination by some basic registration board, or
- B. By an accredited education, 20 years of experience and 16 hours of written examination, or
- C. By an accredited education, 20 years of experience and 8 hours of written examination.

He reported the Council Records are updated annually. It was moved by Mr. Dryden and seconded by Mr. Girand that we look them over as they come in and the application form is to be completed above the references. Motion carried.

After discussion of the structural engineering examinations, it was moved by Mr. Dryden and seconded by Mr. Girand that the Evaluation Committee should consider the specific qualifications of each applicant and recommend accordingly. Motion carried.

The Chairman adjourned the meeting to be resumed at 9:00 A.M. on Friday, June 28, 1974.

The Chairman recalled the Board meeting at 9:08A.M. on Friday, June 28, 1974, noting all Board members were present including Mr. Ralph Wyatt.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Dryden that the minutes of the meeting of the Board on March 15, 1974, be approved as presented. Motion carried.

### REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

No meeting and no report.

### REPORT OF THE RULES & BY-LAWS COMMITTEE

The report of this Committee was discussed, item by item. The proposed change to Rule II, Section A, paragraph 6, deleting it in its entirety was opposed by Mr. Girand as he felt the applicant should be allowed to request reconsideration. The Assistant Attorney General advised that the Supreme Court has ruled that applicants can review their examination when they flunk and favorable decisions by the court are more commonly handed down if the rules of an agency do set up standards for passing. It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Dryden that Rule II, Section A, paragraph 6, be retained. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Vanlandingham and seconded by Mr. Girand that Rule II, Section C, paragraphs 3 through 11 as it now exists be retained in the rules. Motion carried with 5 ayes and 2 nays. Mr. Wyatt suggested it be referred back to the Rules and By-Laws Committee to determine, if it is possible, some definition of how 70% or 75% is arrived at and it was so ordered by the Chairman.

It was moved by Mr. Vanlandingham and seconded by Mr. Dryden that Rule II, Section B, Paragraph 5 and Rule III, Section D, NO. 4, be deleted. Motion carried.

Discussion of deleting Rule II, Section C, paragraph 1, followed. The Assistant Attorney General in looking over the statutes and the application form which has the code of ethics on the last page suggested the Board might be able to incorporate certain items into the rules which would be covered by the law. The Chairman referred this Rule II, Section C, paragraph 1 back to the Rules and By-Laws Committee and suggested they look into the Code of Ethics as to what can be retained by law and adopted into the rules.

The Chairman announced that a public hearing will be called for the next meeting on the proposed rule changes approved at this meeting.

The Chairman then announced that the public hearing which was held on the proposed rule change on Thursday, June 27, 1974, be considered at this time. It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Dryden that the proposed rule change, as follows, be adopted. Motion carried with 5 ayes and 2 nays.

"Amend Rule V, 2:

"An imprint of the registrant's valid seal shall appear on each and every sheet of drawings, on the cover and index page of each set of specifications, on the cover and index page of details bound in book form and prepared specifically to supplement project drawings, on the cover and index page of reports and/or other professional documents prepared by a registrant or his bona fide employee. Superimposed over the imprint of the seal shall be the original signature of the registrant and the date indicated when the seal imprint was signed."

### REPORT OF THE LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE

Senate Bill 1059, regarding open meetings, was passed by the Legislature under Chapter 196, was discussed. Mr. Girand asked the Assistant Attorney General under the open meetings law, when discussing applicants, many times whose references we get are negative, and this type of derogatory information is discussed about an applicant, do we have to permit anyone to hear this information read? The Assistant Attorney General responded that the Attorney General's office is now working on how to define this law and will be advising the agencies of their decision.

The Arizona Legislature passed House Bill 2202 which added Section 32-106.01. Injunctive power, to our law under Chapter 57 and was approved by the Governor on May 1, 1974. This law will become effective on August 10, 1974. The Assistant Attorney General explained how the Registrar of Contractors' injunctive power is enforced and stated if it is an open and shut case, he usually can get a permanent injunction out in a month. If the complaint is sufficient, he needs two witnesses - the person who witnessed the violation and the secretary who has the records that he is not registered. Mr. Wyatt stated that over the years we were not sure how to use our excess funds and it appears that this law gives us some support for doing some real investigative work. Chairman Knickerbocker turned the chair over to Mr. Vanlandingham in order to be excused from the meeting. Mr. Wyatt suggested that we set up procedures of how to implement this injunctive power. Acting Chairman Vanlandingham appointed Mr. Wyatt and Mr. Wallace to determine these procedures. Chairman Knickerbocker returned and Acting Chairman Vanlandingham explained what had happened in his absence. Chairman Knickerbocker appointed Mr. Dryden to chair this committee and for them to determine the procedures for implementing the injunctive power and meet with the Budget Committee regarding the use of investigators.

Mr. Girand suggested that the Chairman set a date for this committee's report and requested the Assistant Attorney General to review a Supreme Court

decision of 10 or 15 years ago when some action of the Board was challenged and the court specifically stated we would be neglectful in our duties if we did not actively engage in enforcing our statutes. The Chairman requested the committee to have a report by the September Board meeting, and stated this new law is going to be of great value to the profession.

House Bill 2059, regarding Subdivision Plats by registered Civil Engineers and Land Surveyors, was passed by the Legislature under Chapter 130. In this connection the letter from Mr. Robert M. Williams, as shown on Minute Pages 3370 and 3371, was discussed and it was the consensus of the Board that a land surveyor may layout the streets but where drainage, etc., is involved, a civil engineer is required, and House Bill 2059 defines the use of land surveyors and civil engineers on plats and subdivisions. The Chairman directed the Executive Director to write an appropriate response to Mr. Williams after consulting with Mr. Dryden.

The Arizona Legislature passed House Bill 2099 which was a supplemental appropriation from the technical registration fund in the amount of \$12,000, and has been allocated for the Board's use.

The Chairman accepted the report of the Legislative Committee.

### REPORT OF THE EVALUATION & EXAMINATION COMMITTEES

The Architectural Evaluation Committee meeting report of May 13 and 14, 1974, was presented by Chairman Wyatt, as shown on Minute Pages 3372 and 3373.

It was moved by Mr. Wyatt and seconded by Mr. Vanlandingham that the above report of the Architectural Evaluation Committee meeting be accepted and implemented by the Board. Motion carried.

A letter from James A. Babcock, architectural applicant #73-603, who was denied at the March 15, 1974, Board meeting for failure to appear before the committee in a reasonable length of time, was presented. It was moved by Mr. Wyatt and seconded by Mr. Bowlsby that his application be reinstated. Motion carried.

The Landscape Architectural Evaluation Committee meeting report of May 13, 1974, was presented by Chairman Bowlsby, as shown on Minute Page 3374.

It was moved by Mr. Bowlsby and seconded by Mr. Wyatt that the above report of the Landscape Architectural Evaluation Committee meeting be accepted and implemented by the Board. Motion carried.

The Engineering Evaluation Committee meeting report of May 15, 16, and 17, 1974, was presented by Mr. Dryden, as shown on Minute Pages 3375, 3376 and 3377.

It was moved by Mr. Dryden and seconded by Mr. Wyatt that the above report, amended, of the Engineering Evaluation Committee meeting be accepted and implemented by the Board. Motion carried.

The Schedule of Examinations for November, 1974, was presented as shown on Minute Page 3378, and it was moved by Mr. Dryden and seconded by Mr. Bowlsby that this schedule be approved as presented. Motion carried.

Dear Mr. Knickerbocker:

I would like to bring to your attention a matter of the utmost importance to myself as well as all Registered Land Surveyors registered in the State of Arizona and currently practicing the profession of surveying.

First of all I would like to present a little history of the background leading up to the current problem. I became registered as a Land Surveyor (No. 4123) on July 26th, 1958 and immediately began laying out subdivisions in Arizona and certifying same with my Registration Seal. I have been actively engaged in this profession for the past 15 years and have always felt that I was performing my services with the approval and the right granted to me by the Arizona State Board of Technical Registrations and the Arizona Revised Statutes.

Recently I have been advised by a County Engineer that the Certification of a Registered Land Surveyor on either a Preliminary Subdivision Plan or a Final Plat is not sufficient. And that all such Plats must be stamped by a Registered Civil Engineer.

It has always been my understanding that a Land Surveyor under the law was able to among other things, perform a Boundary and Topographical survey, design a Subdivision Plat setting forth the location of the lots, streets and alleys, calculate and record same and then monument all corners. After all of this had been accomplished, anything of a structural nature such as road construction within the previously platted right of ways, water systems, sewer systems etc., must be done by a Registered Civil Engineer.

I would very much appreciate a clarification of this matter from the Arizona State Board of Technical Registrations and, if possible, from the Arizona Attorney Generals Office.

As I have previously stated, this matter is of a most urgent nature to me as I have spent a lifetime in the building of a Company that specializes in the design and platting of lands in Arizona and if I have been doing so in violation of the law obviously I would have to stop.

However if you find that I or any other Registered Land Surveyor in Arizona has the right to perform those surveying services not related to anything of a structural nature relating to the Platting of land it would be most helpful to have this point clarified.

### REPORT OF THE PUBLIC INFORMATION COMMITTEE

Mr. Wyatt reported on his attendance at the Annual Meeting of the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards in Dallas, Texas, on June 19-22, 1974., and stated that the architectural examination dates because of security will need to be given on the same dates across the nation. He stated problems are beginning to appear on the professional examination and about 50% of the states reported applicants are required to take the equivalency examination, but it will probably be phased out in two years. There are two states which require graduation from an accredited college and many states are now requiring two years of experience instead of three years. An internship program is being considered in which his architectural experience will carry him all the way through five years of study and three years of giving him professional guidance from the state level instead of school level. It is my feeling that the educators are more interested in graduates of an accredited school instead of qualified applicants. Mr. Wyatt stated he was now a member of the Executive Committee of N.C.A.R.B. and needed authoriation to travel to their next meeting in September. It was moved by Mr. Dryden and seconded by Mr. Wallace that Mr. Wyatt be authorized to attend this meeting. Motion carried.

The Executive Director reported on the Western Zone meeting of the National Council of Engineering Examiners in May in San Diego and one of the most significant points brought out at that meeting was that examination grading by Educational Testing Service will be discontinued. They will be graded by N.C.E.E. in the future.

### REPORT OF THE BUDGET COMMITTEE

Technical Registration Fund

The Technical Fund Balance as of June 30, 1974, will be approximately \$137,000. The amount of receipts allocated to the Fund during the year was \$123,225 and expenses were \$106,430.

With expenses for 1974-1975 estimated at \$130,000, and with income projected somewhat greater with increased registrations, it is expected that income and expenditures will be about equal for the ensuing year.

The amount of expenditures, \$106,430, is within  $1\frac{1}{2}\%$  of the \$108,000 originally appropriated by the Legislature, and the supplemental appropriation was not necessary. The amount expended was 11% greater than the 1972-73 amount of \$96,000.

The legislative appropriation for 1974-1975 is \$130,000 and it is suggested that the budget request for 1975-1976, required for submittal August 30, 1974, be approximately \$150,000. This amount provides for an additional clerk-typist in event of increased volume.

It was moved by Mr. Place and seconded by Mr. Vanlandingham that the report be adopted. Motion carried.

The Chairman referred this letter to the Injunctive Power Committee.

Letter from Michael Baker, Jr., Civil Engineering and Land Surveying applicant, was presented as shown on Minute Page 3398. It was moved by Mr. Dryden and seconded by Mr. Girand that Mr. Baker be advised that he is to appear at the Evaluation Committee meeting set up in August or his application will be denied. Motion carried.

Dear Mr. Drewry:

Thank you for your letter of April 10, 1974, and I am sorry it took so long to get an answer back to you.

The provisions that you mention have been in the Phoenix Code for a number of years and were thoroughly discussed at Committee meetings for approximately nine months. Members of the Committee included architects, engineers, contractors, home builders, etc.

Concerning the second paragraph of your letter, I want to assure you that all plans, whether they are prepared by an architect, an engineer, or a contractor, are thoroughly reviewed for compliance with the Electrical Code to prevent any serious safety hazards.

In most cases, where a 500 kva service is used, the building could cost more than \$50,000, and under our Code any building that is not constructed in accordance with Part 28 of the Code, which covers minor buildings, the plans have to be sealed by an architect or engineer registered in the State of Arizona. In many cases the construction cost of such buildings is less than \$50,000 and are sealed by an architect or engineer registered in the State of Arizona.

Concerning the last part of the third paragraph, I have no comment except to say that I have no intention of telling the Board how to enforce their law.

I should point out to you that the 500 kva you mentioned refers to the disconnecting means and the total service load restriction is 100 kva. A proposal by the Electric Consulting Engineers has been made to reduce this to 50 kva; the proposal will be presented to the Building and Safety Advisory Board at their next regular meeting.

Chairman Vanlandingham noted that there was a quorum present. He then read the Notice of the Proposed Rule Change to repeal Rule II, B(5) and Rule III, D(4) of the Rules of the Board of Technical Registration which now reads as follows:

"5. As a part of the Architect-in-Training program, both the applicant from an accredited architectural school and the applicant without a college degree will be required to obtain through the secretary of the Board at the time of their request for an Architect-in-Training application, an approved Architectin-Training log book in which will be set forth in detail the applicant's training record. Such log books must be accurately kept and all professional architectural experience vouched for and signed by the applicant's registered architectural employer during the full time of the applicant's required training period. The log will form the applicant's training record and must be filed with the secretary of the Board when applying for his professional registration."

It was moved by Mr. Dryden and seconded by Mr. Wallace for the adoption of the rule change. Motion carried.

Michael Low, Assistant Attorney General, instructed the Board on the open meeting law and informed them that all discussion affecting individuals or groups must be open, the only thing that can be private is questions to their counsel; also, when voting, it can be done by secret ballot.

### FORMAL HEARING

The Chairman announced it was the time and place for the formal hearing in the matter of Robert W. Sferra, Civil Engineer, No. 2960. Counsel for Mr. Sferra was Amil J. Ajamie; witnesses who appeared in his behalf were: Richard Pearce, registered Civil Engineer; Jerry O'Connell, Public Health Engineer, Maricopa County Health Department; and William Talbow, registered Land Surveyor.

Representing the Board was Assistant Attorney General Michael Low and witnesses were Louis B. Shaeffer, Irv Shuman and Alton McQueen of Salt River Project.
The Court Reporter was George Jones of John A. Brabec and Associates.

The Complainant, Louis B. Shaeffer, alleged that Robert W. Sferra had been grossly negligent or incompetent, as those terms are used in A.R.S. 32-128.A (2), in the practice of his profession. That Mr. Sferra was hired to prepare a drainage plan and to coordinate his efforts with Salt River Project's requirements for its Spillway No. 12 and his plan did two things: (1) rendered the spillway inoperative and (2) any decent rain would flood the stores which had been constructed at 43rd and Peoria Avenues in Glendale. Mr. Shaeffer had subsequently engaged James Samer, registered Civil Engineer to redo the drainage plan for acceptance by the City of Glendale and Salt River Project.

After testimony by all witnesses, the Chairman called for the vote on the charges alleged and by unanimous vote the Board found Mr. Sferra not guilty and dismissed the charges.

Chairman Vanlandingham adjourned the meeting at 6:30 P.M. to be reconvened at 9:00 A.M., Friday, in the Board office, Room 315, 1645 West Jefferson, Phoenix, Arizona.

The Chairman recalled the meeting at 9:10 A.M., on Friday, September 13, 1974, and noted that the same members were present and absent as on Thursday, September 12, 1974, with a quorum present.

The Chairman referred to the other formal hearing that was to be held on September 12, 1974, in the matter of Derek H. White and explained that Mr. White had called and sent a telegram requesting a continuance due to illness in the family. After discussion with the Assistant Attorney General, it was decided to grant Mr. White a continuance.

It was moved by Mr. Wallace and seconded by Mr. Girand that the minutes of the meeting of the Board on June 27 and 28, 1974, be approved as presented. Motion carried

### REPORT OF THE RULES & BY-LAWS COMMITTEE

Mr. Wallace reported that at the June Board meeting this committee was basically charged with finding some definition for the 70% and 75% in Rule II, C, and the committee suggests that no action be taken but the Board continue to determine what is equal to 70 or 75%. Also, basically there is very little in the Code of Ethics on the basis of past Attorney General opinions which allows us to make them a part of the Rules and suggests no action be taken by the Board.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Dryden that the report of the Rules and By-Laws Committee be accepted. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Dryden and seconded by Mr. Wyatt that the above schedule be approved as presented. Motion carried.

The Landscape Architectural Evaluation Committee meeting report of August 12, 1974, was presented by Mr. Wyatt, as shown on Minute Pages 3416 - 3417.

### REPORT OF THE PUBLIC INFORMATION COMMITTEE

Mr. Girand discussed the publication of a newsletter as he felt there had been a general loss of confidence by the public in governmental agencies in secrecy of their accounts. Since the notices will be mailed to our registrants in a few months, Mr. Girand suggested a summary be sent to them in order that they know what they are getting for their money. To be included in this memo would be a brief summary of the number of applications having been handled, an estimated number of man hours that Board members devote to this Board, write something on the disciplinary action

which the Board has taken without naming individuals; in this bulletin would relate to the number of applicants, in-state and out-of-state, segregated into architects and engineers; and finally, would invite comments from individuals and their professional societies to remind them that the integrity of the profession depends upon them as the Board can take action only when a complaint has been filed and we do not have a police force to hunt down violators. When sending out the newsletter with the renewal notice, enclose the Code, Rules and By-Laws. Motion earried.

It was suggested by Mr. Dryden that the newsletter be published periodically and it was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Dryden that the newsletter be published at the discretion of the Executive Director. Motion carried.

### REPORT OF THE BUDGET COMMITTEE

Mr. Wyatt presented the Report of the Budget Committee as shown on Minute Page 3427. It was moved by Mr. Wyatt and seconded by Mr. Girand that the report be accepted. Motion carried.

### REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Cash Flow Report #1, as shown on Minute Page 3428, was presented for the Board's information.

The report of the Executive Director was as follows:

Mr. Stan Jones at the County Attorney's office stated September 11th that Mr. Metzger is expected to make a plea and have his case considered by the Court on September 26th.

Mr. Carl Dorn, issuer of building permits for Coconino County, has issued a building permit for the Flagstaff Cultural Center. Drawings were sealed by Jack King, Structural Engineer No. 7478, evidently the prime design contractor. Mr. King was informed by phone July 11 that an architect registered in Arizona should be involved for the architectural portion of the project. He assured me this would be done. In a phone conversation September 11, he stated that he would again contact Mr. Reilly, who is the building contractor, and insist that an architect be engaged.

Addition to Gadsden School - worked with Dept. of Building Codes and drawings for the building were properly sealed by an architect before the building was released. The foundation drawing was sealed by T. Rader, Civil Engineer No. 6586 and Structural Engineer No. 7589. It was suggested to Mr. Maehling, Superintendent of Schools for Yuma County that a local architect or engineer be engaged to coordinate the project and supervise construction in the interest of safety of the occupants.

An article was noted in the Arizona Republic indicating tha the Consumer Protection Division of the Attorney General's office may file false advertising charges against contractors who advertise in the yellow pages of the Mountain Bell telephone directory.

A.R.S. 38-781.36. Employment beyond normal retirement date

- A. The personnel board shall adopt rules prescribing the procedures and standards to be followed for the continuation of employment beyond the normal retirement date.
- B. Any person employed as an officer or employee of the state or a political subdivision of the state may continue employment beyond the normal retirement date if:
- 1. Such officer or employee requests in writing, six months prior to his normal retirement date, that he be permitted to continue such employment, and
- 2. Such officer or employee is certified by his appointing authority as fully fitted by reason of experience and training to perform the duties of his position and the appointing authority approves the request for continued employment, and
- 3. The personnel board approves such request pursuant to its rules and regulations governing continued employment after the normal retirement date.
- C. The personnel board shall not approve a request for a term of continued employment exceeding one year but may approve as many annual requests for continued employment as they deem advisable.

OUESTION:

Is a county engineer, appointed pursuant to A.R.S. § 11-561, subject to the registration requirements pertaining to the practice of engineering in the State of Arizona contained in Article 2, Chapter 1, Title 32, Arizona Revised Statutes?

ANSWER: Yes.

Article 2, Chapter 1, Title 32, Arizona Revised Statutes, generally provides for the registration of individuals practicing in disciplines subject to the regulatory jurisdiction of the State Board of Technical Registration. Specifically, A.R.S. § 32-121 requires that:

A person desiring to practice the profession of architecture, assaying, engineering, geology, landscape architecture, or land surveying shall first secure a certificate of registration and shall comply with all the conditions prescribed in this chapter.

(Emphasis added.)

The term "engineering practice" received specific definition in A.R.S. § 32-101.B.7. That statute, in relevant part, reads:

7. "Engineering practice" means any professional service or creative work requiring engineering education, training and experience and the application of special knowledge of the mathematical, physical and engineering sciences to such professional services or creative work as consultation, research investigation, evaluation, planning, surveying, design, location, development, and review of construction for conformance with contract documents and design, in connection with any

public or private utility, structure, building, machine, equipment, process, work or project.

. . A person shall be deemed to be practicing or offering to practice engineering if he practices any branch of the profession of engineering, or by verbal claim, sign, advertisement, letterhead, card or any other manner represents himself to be a professional engineer, or holds himself out as able to perform or does perform any engineering service or other service or recognized by educational authorities as engineering. . . Id.

The laws that establish the office of county engineer and demarcate the scope of his activities are contained in Article 9, Chapter 3, Title 11, Arizona Revised Statutes.

A.R.S. § 11-561.A provides a succinct statement of the qualifications required of a county engineer. "The board of supervisors may appoint a county engineer, who shall be a competent civil engineer and road builder." Id. The county engineer's duties are fully detailed in A.R.S. § 11-562:

- A. The county engineer shall be custodian of the records and property of the county relating to surveying, engineering and road construction.
- B. Except where highways are being constructed under the direction of a highway commission, the county engineer shall, under the direction of the board, have charge of all highways, other engineering construction and improvements, alterations and repairs to county property, and shall make surveys, maps, plans and specifications required by the board.

Although the language of Subsection B above clearly speaks in terms that fit the definition of an "engineering practice", set forth in A.R.S. § 32-101.B.7, nowhere in Article 9, supra, is there any mention of a requirement that a county engineer must be enrolled on the list of registrants certified by the State Board of Technical Registration. Thus, the question arises as to whether the Legislature intended the sweep of the technical registration code to encompass the statutory office of county engineer.

We believe the correct answer is readily ascertainable upon examination of the legislative history of the respective laws. The original enactment creating the office of county engineer was contained in Laws 1913, Ch. 48, and codified at R.S. 1913, §§ 2618 - 2627. That legislation predates, by eight years, passage of the first technical registration act. Laws 1921, Ch. 135. Essentially, the later statutory scheme provided for the establishment of a Board of Registration as the licensing agency charged with regulating the professions of architecture, assaying, engineering and land surveying. Those sections of Ch. 135, supra, that are relevant to the question before us are as follows:

Section 1. In order to safeguard life, health and property, any person practicing or offering to practice as an architect, a professional engineer, a land surveyor or an assayer in this State, shall hereafter be required to submit evidence that he is qualified so to practice, and shall be registered as hereinafter provided, and from and after six months after this act becomes effective, it shall be unlawful for any person to practice or to offer to practice in this state, as an architect, a professional engineer, hereinafter called engineer, a land surveyor or an assayer, except under the provisions of this act.

Section 2. Nothing in this act shall be construed as requiring registration by an individual, firm or corporation for the purpose of practicing architecture, engineering, land surveying or assaying on property owned or leased by said individual, firm or corporation, unless the same involves the public safety or health; nor as requiring registration by any person, who prior to the time of passage of this act was engaged in the practice of architecture, engineering, land surveying or assaying; provided, however, such person shall not represent himself as, or use the title of "Registered Architect," "Registered Professional Engineer," "Registered Land Surveyor, " or "Registered Assayer," unless such person is qualified by registration under this act.

Section 12. The following shall be exempted from the provisions of this act:

\* \* \*

7. Practice of architecture, engineering, land surveying or assaying solely as an employee of this state or any political subdivision thereof, at the time this act becomes effective and thereafter only until the expiration of the then existing term of office for such employee.

\* \* \*

Section 14. One year after this act goes into effect, neither the state nor any county, township, city, town or village nor other political subdivision of the state, shall engage in the construction or maintenance of any public work involving architecture or engineering for which the plans, specifications and estimates have not been made by, and the construction and maintenance supervised by, a registered architect or a registered engineer; provided, that nothing in this section shall be held to apply to such public work wherein the contemplated expenditure for the completed project does not exceed Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars.

It seems clear from the above quoted sections of the 1921 act that the Legislature intended to bring all practicing engineers, whether in the private or public sector, ultimately under the jurisdiction of the forebear to the present day Board of Technical Registration. Not only were public employees, practicing in the technical fields, granted only a limited time exemption by Ch. 135, Section 12.7, supra, but added encouragement to become registered existed due to the Section 14 prohibition, supra, against a nonregistrant's involvement with a public work project in excess of \$5,000.00.

The public works prohibition presently reposed in A.R.S. § 32-142.A is an even stronger version. That statutory subsection reads:

certainly the drafters of the technical registration laws were fully cognizant of the impact Ch. 135 (specifically, sections 12.7 and 14) would have upon the office of county engineer. It is a well-recognized rule of statutory construction that the Legislature, when enacting a new provision, is aware of previous statutes that may bear upon the same or similar subject matter. In re Adoption of Wilcox, 68 Ariz. 209, 204 P.2d 168 (1949). Hence, it must be assumed that the Legislature chose to require that all county engineers become registrants in conformance with Laws 1921, Ch. 135, upon the expiration of their existing terms.

The foregoing legislative history, when considered in light of the fact that the present statutes pertaining to the office of county engineer fail to authorize any kind of registration exemption, forces the conclusion that a county engineer is subject to the requirements contained in Article 2, Chapter 1, Title 32, Arizona Revised Statutes. Accordingly, it is our opinion that county engineers must be registered with the State Board of Technical Registration in order to maintain their office.

Dear Mr. Drewry:

I am in receipt of your letter inquiry, dated July 16, 1974, pertaining to the validity of a nonregistrant's name appearing in the corporate name of an architectural firm.

Essentially, A.R.S. § 32-141 prohibits any firm or corporation from engaging in those disciplines licensed by the Board unless under the authority of a registrant who must be a principal of the firm or an officer of the corporation. The statute also requires that the name of the registrant must appear whenever the firm or corporate name is used in a professional capacity.

Our office has previously cpined that that law does not mandate the appearance of every registrant's name, from each proficiency in which the corporation practices, in the name of the professional corporation. Op. Ariz. Att'y Gen. No. 68-10-L. Inasmuch as a corporation is a distinct legal entity in the eyes of the law, the appearance of a nonregistrant's name as the corporate name would not run afoul of A.R.S. § 32-141 so long as a registrant's name was also present. Accordingly, the situation envisioned in your letter would be lawful provided that the name of the registrant appeared in sufficient proximity to the corporate name.

Dear Mr. Dryden:

I am responding to a letter inquiry from Ted Drewry, Executive Director of the Board, pertaining to the procedures I would follow in seeking to enjoin a non-registrant from practicing one of the professions subject to the Board's jurisdiction.

Because it is in the public interest to secure as swift a judicial order as possible, I would avail myself of a show cause procedure. Essentially, an expedited hearing date would be set by the Court for the purpose of issuing an injunction pendente lite (before trial). At that hearing, I envision the need for two (possibly more, depending on the number of violations and the complexity of the case) witnesses. An individual from the Board, probably Mr. Drewry, who could testify that the defendant is not, and was not at the time of the alleged violation, registered. The second witness would have to testify as to the events that compose the unlawful activity (e.g., engineering). This individual would probably occupy some kind of contractual relationship with the defendant - that is, either his employer or the party for whom the services were to be performed. This witness would also be served with a subpoena duces tecum, requiring the production of the relevant documents (e.g., contracts, plans, specifications, etc.) that would prove the unalwful activity. The defendant would also be served with a similar subpoena for the production of these needed documents in his control and custody.

At the hearing the witnesses would testify and the documents would be introduced. Upon the close of the presentation of the Board's case I would move the court to consolidate this pre-trial hearing with the trial, so that a permanent injunction may be issued. Generally, the Court will grant such a motion. In those cases it does not, the preliminary injuction will nevertheless issue and a trial date will be set, at which time the case will again be presented with all witnesses and evidentiary documents.

Hopefully, this brief review answers the kinds of questions implicit in Mr. Drewry's letter. Your obvious concern appears to be identifying the outside witness that will testify as to the substantive offense. As previously stated, this individual will generally be an employer (possibly an employee) or a party with whom the defendant has contracted to provide services.

If you have any further questions, don't hesitate to contact me.

### FORMAL HEARINGS

Chairman Vanlandingham announced it was the time and place for the formal hearing, Complaint No. 74-2, in the matter of Derek H. White, a registered Civil Engineer, No. 6409, who was present without counsel. William R. Wood appeared on his behalf as a witness. Representing the Board was Assistant Attorney General Michael Low and witnesses were Joe O'Brien of the City of Phoenix and Ben Thompson of SRK Realty, Inc.

The complaint alleged that Mr. White signed, stamped and sealed plumbing drawings, prepared by William A. Wood and Associates, a non-registrant, on an apartment complex located at 6131 North 16th Street, Phoenix, Arizona, filed under City Log No. 1791 and in doing so is charged with aiding and abetting an unregistered person to evade the provisions of A.R.S. 32-128,A, (3).

After testimony by all witnesses, the Chairman called for a vote on the charges alleged. It was moved by Mr. Wyatt and seconded by Mr. Knickerbocker that the respondent Mr. White has violated the law as set forth in the complaint and the penalty to be imposed is a 90-day suspension. Motion carried unanimously. The suspension was to become effective immediately.

The Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law in this matter were that respondent was approached by Mr. William R. Wood, who was hired by Mr. Simpson of Bayshore Development Company to design the electrical and mechanical plans for SRK Realty Company on the project mentioned above, to review the plumbing plans and place his seal and signature on them for securing the building permit in Arizona.

That respondent or his bona fide employee did not prepare these plans which were prepared by William R. Wood and Associates.

That conduct of the respondent Derek H. White constitutes grounds

Pursuant to A.R.S. 32-128, A, (3), and A.R.S. 32-125, C, for suspension

or revocation of his certificate of registration as charged in the complaint.

Chairman Vanlandingham advised Mr. White that he had 35 days in which to appeal the Board's action.

At 3:00 P.M., Chairman Vanlandingham announced it was the time and place for the formal hearing, Complaint No. 74-3, in the matter of Albert V. McEowen, a registered Civil Engineer, No. 1899. Counsel for the respondent was Wade Church and witnesses who appeared in his behalf were: Paul Emch, All-Seasons Child Care Center Manager, and Gary Vielstorf, estimator for Wayne Barnes construction Company.

Representing the Board was Assistant Attorney General Michael Low and witnesses were Joe O'Brien of the City of Phoenix and Donald H. Cramer, Architect.

The Complainant, Donald H. Cramer, alleged that he examined a set of working drawings for a Child Care Center being constructed at 1208 North 24th Street, Phoenix, Arizona, under City of Phoenix Log No. 2670, building permit No. 20689 and the drawings had the registration seal and signature of Albert V. McEowen. These drawings were sepias of drawings that were prepared by his staff in his office for a Child Care Center in Albuquerque, New Mexico. His file number 7307 was still on all the drawings and some of the drawings were not changed at all. Therefore he charged Mr. McEowen was in violation of A.R.S. 32-125,C, and A.R.S. 32-143.

After testimony by all witnesses, the Chairman called for the vote on the charges alleged. It was moved by Mr. Knickerbocker and seconded by Mr. Dryden that based upon the evidence that had been presented, the respondent was found in violation of A.R.S. 32-125,C, but based also upon the evidence presented, there was no violation of A.R.S. 32-143. Motion carried unanimously. It was moved by Mr. Knickerbocker and seconded by Mr. Dryden that Mr. McEowen's registration be suspended for a period of thirty days. Motion carried with six ayes and one nay. The suspension was to become effective immediately.

The Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law in this matter were that respondent placed his seal and signature on a set of plans for a Child Care Center, located at 1208 N. 24th Street, Phoenix, Arizona, under City log No. 2670, after doing the structural calculations only, at the request of contractor's representative, Mr. Gary Vielstorf.

That respondent did not prepare the plans for the Child Care Center which the Owner Mr. Emch had secured from Donald H. Cramer, registered Architect, who had designed the Child Care Center for a project in Albuquerque, New Mexico.

That conduct of the respondent Albert V. McEowen constitutes grounds pursuant to A.R.S. 32-125,C, for suspension or revocation of his certificate of registration as charged in the complaint.

Chairman Vanlandingham advised Mr. McEowen that he had 35 days in which to appeal the Board's action.

The Court Reporter for these hearings was Ronnie Bilodeau of John Brabec and Associates.



#### READING OF COMMUNICATIONS
