The Board of Registration met in the City Planning Room, City Hall, Phoenix, Arizona; at 10:00 A. M. in accordance with the call of the Chairman of the Board.

Present at the time of meeting: Butler, Jones, Fraizer, Wallingford. There being a quorum and the hour of meeting having arrived, the Secretary called the meeting to order in the absence of the Chairman and vice-chairman. Messrs. Fitzhugh and Herrington arrived shortly after the opening of the meeting. Absent: Kruse.

Minutes of the meeting of the Board of October 4th, 1930, and of the Executive Committee meeting of October 27, 1930, read and approved.

Moved by Fraizer and seconded by Butler that the action of the Executive Committee in the applications of F. W. LeCron, F. F. Boyd, and A. J. Curtiss, be confirmed. Carried.

Report of the Finance Committee, as set forth in the audit of C. J. Smith, read by H. E. Jones, as being the annual report of the Board for submission to the Governor. On motion, the report was accepted and approved.

A letter of recommendations from the Auditor of the Board accounts, Mr. C. J. Smith, was also read as supplement to the report of the Finance Committee.

Moved by Fraizer, seconded by Jones, to approve the suggestions of auditor, providing the same are found to be legal and practicable. Carried.

The action of the Secretary in granting registration to Ernest A. Bickley, Cyril O. Gilliam, and Raymond E. Lawrence, as a result of satisfactory grades made in their examinations, was approved.

registration be granted. Carried.

Application of Robert M. Cushing, now registered as Land Surveyor, for registration as Civil Engineer, presented. Moved by Fraizer, seconded by Butler, to grant registration. Carried.

Application of R. T. Evans, now registered as Structural Engineer, for registration as Architect, presented. Moved by Jones, seconded by Herrington, to request the applicant to submit evidence of ability to design safe construction, to the Executive Committee, and to give the Executive Committee power to act upon the application following the data furnished by Mr. Evans. Carried.

Application of Joseph H. Snyder, for registration as Professional Engineer, proficient in Civil and Structural Engineering, having been held in suspense for about two years owing to Mr. Snyder 's age at the time of application, was presented and read. Moved by Jones, seconded by Fraizer, to register in Civil Engineering. Carried.

Application of C. M. MacFarlane, Parker, Arizona, for registration in Mining Engineering, presented. Moved by Butler, seconded by Jones, to register. Carried.

Application of Herman Kanatzar, for registration in Civil Engineering presented. Graduate of University of Arizona, B.S. in C.E. Record shows
that he has not completed the legal requirements of two years 'experience following graduation. Moved by Butler, seconded by Fraizer to hold without
prejudice until he has completed the necessary time, and to so advise Mr.
Kanatzar. Carried.

Application of Kenneth S. Greene presented. Graduated University of Utah, B.S. in C.E. 1927. Moved by Fraizer, seconded by Jones to grant registration as Civil Engineer. Carried.

L. G. Knipe: Structural Engineer. College record transcript attached. Following full discussion, moved by Butler, seconded by Fraizer to grant registration. Carried.

- D. J. Lyons for registration in Civil Engineering: Holds degree of B.S. in Mining from Lafayette College. Moved to ask for evidence of ability to execute designs for engineering structures, and to authorize the Executive Committee to act on the application following such data. Carried.
- S. Charles Lee: Application on Form B. Registered in Illinois, and California. Moved by Wallingford, seconded by Butler to grant registration in Architecture. Carried.

in Civil Engineering work. No reply to letter of Secretary dated October
9th, being in the file or recorded, no action was taken by the Board and the
application was held for the next meeting without prejudice.

B. A. Willmoth: For registration as Iaml Surveyor. New application, without filling in new form, being renewal of old application. Moved by Jones, seconded by Herrington, to hold for examination. Carried.

Tom R. Johnson: Held over from the July and October meetings as not of the required age of twenty-five years (Born Nov.26,1905). Moved by Fraizer, seconded by Butler, to register in Civil Engineering. Carried.

J. M. Peck: Mechanical and Refrigerating Engineer. Filed late, and questionnaire returns not received from references. Held for investigation and the Secretary requested to ask for evidence of technical training, or to have the applicant submit to examination. This being embodied in a motion by Herrington and seconded by Jones. Carried.

A. M. Burtt. Architecture. Returns incomplete. Referred to the Executive Committee with power to act when the application is complete. Motion by Fraizer, second by Butler, carried.

E. F. Jacques. Architecture. Moved to leave to the Executive Committee with power to act after investigation. Returns from references do not furnish sufficient data for the Board to act upon. Secretary instructed to ask for additional evidence of ability. Motion by Jones, second by Herrington. Carried.

Gerald Sherman: Mining. Application incomplete and references not in file. Moved by Herrington, seconded by Fraizer, to authorize the Executive Committee to grant registration if the returns from references are satisfactory. Carried.

J. B. Lippincott: Civil Engineering. Notation of no fee with the application. Moved to grant registration when and if the fee is deposited. Carried.

Paul M. Thornburg: Mechanical. B.S. in Mechanical Engineering,
Purdue, 1924. Moved by Fraizer, seconded by Butler, to register. Carried.

Shirley Balderson: Electrical. 18 years electrical inspector for the City of Phoenix. Moved by Herrington seconded by Jones, to refer to the Executive Committee with power to act after report from further investigation. (Ask W.E.Hornberger and B.F.Carter). Carried.

Edward F. Sibbert. Architecture, Brooklyn, New York. Moved by Wallingford, seconded by Fraizer, to register. Carried.

John Slak. Mining. No replies having been received from references, was held for next meeting. No action.

Ralph A. Macdonald. Electrical and Civil. Mesa. B.S. in E. E.,
U. of A. Moved to register in Electrical and Civil Engineering. Carried.

No report by the Committee on By-Laws.

committee on Examinations reported the completion of an examination in Engineering, by D. M. Thompson, and the papers were handed to Dean Butler for transmission to Examiner at the University.

It was moved by Butler, seconded by Jones, to authorize the Executive Committee to register Mr. Thompson, provided the examination grades are of passing percentage. Carried.

No report from the Public Information Committee: Under this subject Mr. Jones read a letter from Vic Householder commenting upon the published report of the meeting of the National Council of Engineering Examiners, and recommending that this Board maintain membership in and attend the meetings of the National Council.

Letter from the National Council of Engineering Examiners, with notice of assessment for the 1931 expense and membership fee, read. On motion of the Secretary, seconded by Butler, the assessment was approved as an item of Board expense and so ordered. Carried.

The Secretary reported irregularities in the registration and payments for same of L. E. deGuerin; and copy of a letter to Mr. deGuerin was read. It was moved and seconded that the registration of L. E. deGuerin be cancelled unless satisfactory returns were received from the letter by February 1, 1931. Carried.

APPLICATIONS:

The application of Herbert P. Martinson, for registration as

Land Surveyor, and withdrawing former application for registration as

Professional Engineer, was presented. Moved by Jones, seconded by Herrington to grant registration as requested in amended application. Carried.

Application of S. J. Mayo for registration as Civil Engineer, being employed by the Union Pacific Railway in Utah and north rim of Grand Canyon, presented. Moved by Fraizer, seconded by Butler, that

W. H. Douglass, Civil. Secretary-Engineer for Phoenix Zoning Commission. Moved to reaffirm former action as being unnecessary to register. Carried.

Oscar A. Maupin. Highway (Civil) Education and references being insufficient to justify registration, moved by Jones, seconded by Fraizer, to hold for examination. Carried.

L. H. Foster: Reciprocal under rules of National Council. Moved by Butler, seconded by Herrington, to instruct the Secretary to advise Mr. Foster that the opinion of the Board does not justify Reciprocal Registration at the present time. Carried.

There being no other applications for the action of the Board, the Chairman called for Unfinished Business.

No Unfinished Business other than the applications held from previous meetings, and handled in the course of recorded actions.

REPORT OF SHECIAL COMMITTEE ON LEGISLATION:

The Committee has held two meetings with the American Association of Engineers, Phoenix and Tucson Chapters and one conference within the Board. Has worked out a series of amendments to the law as now coded, and seeks to present in the form of a bill for introduction to the Legislature.

In Committee of the Whole, the several suggestions were read, discussed and revised, and placed in the hands of the Chairman of the Board for final formation.

NEW BUSINESS: In reply to a question as to supply of application blanks, the Secretary replied that there was on hand a limited supply and that the budget anticipated the printing of new blanks within the biennium. It was suggested that the new forms eliminate the question as to previous residence in Arizona, and change the wording of the time of birth to make it intelligible to simple minds.

Complaint was made of the practice of A. C. Hooper who was not registered, having failed and refused to take an examination, as requested by the action of the Board, and Secretary was instructed to investigate the advisability of prosecution.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 4:10 P.M.

FINANCE COMMITTEE: Report of the action of the Tenth Legislature in adopting a budget allowing the sum of \$1810.00 per annum for the next biennium, was discussed; and without formal action the Board accepted such data as basis for the work and expenditures for the period named.

BY-LAWS COMMITTEE: No report.

EXAMINATIONS: Jones reported that the examination to be given B. A. Willmoth had not been given owing to inability to complete arrangements for date.

Dean Butler reported that examination questions for D. J. Richards in Mining had been pigeonholed by a former member of the Board, and would be ready within a week from present date.

PUBLIC INFORMATION: No report.

READING OF COMMUNICATIONS: Letter from State Auditor regarding claim of

H. S. McCluskey for preparation of a bill for introduction in the Legislature

amending the present registration law; that the claim was not allowed. The

reason for this action being that the Board has no authority to incur an

obligation for legal expense other than thru the Attorney General.

Letters from the National Council of Architectural Registration

Boards, regarding the 1931 annual meeting and other matters read, and Secretary authorized to answer same justified by their nature and contents.

APPLICATIONS FOR REGISTRATION:

The following applications being on file and presented to the Board for consideration, were read and acted upon as noted hereafter:

OCTAVIUS W. MORGAN: Architect: Form B. California Architect. Granted unanimously.

D. J. LYONS: Referred by the meeting of January 10 to the Executive Committee, and following advice of the Attorney General that the registration of an applicant could not be granted other than by the Board, was again brought to the attention of the Board for action. Mr. Lyons having present/further data regarding experience, and following the reading of a letter dated February 7,1931:

Moved by Kruse, seconded by Fraizer, to register as proficient in Civil Engineering. Carried unanimously.

C. E. ADDAMS: Now registered as proficient in Mining Engineering; Applied for designation as proficient in "Mining and Civil" engineering, and the file being inspected by the Board, it was moved by Butler and seconded by Kruse that there

Jones to have been elected, and Mr. Jones expresses the intention to attend the meeting; Therefore, moved by Wallingford, and seconded by Fitzhugh, that from the funds of the Board a sufficient amount may be advanced to Mr. Jones to provide for the necessary travelling expenses. Carried by two affirmative votes and no negative.

There being no other business to come before the meeting, the Executive Committee adjourned.

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE BOARD OF REGISTRATION, OCTOBER 7, 1932.

The Board of Registration met pursuant to the call of the Chairman, at ten

A. M. in Room 303 Heard Building. Chairman Harry E. Jones, presiding.

There being a quorum present at the appointed hour, it was moved by Wallingford and seconded by Fitzhugh, to suspend the by-laws and the usual proceedure; to take up the application of W. E. Dickinson. Carried unanimously.

The application of W. E. Dickinson, Federal Engineer in charge of U. S. Geological Survey for Arizona, being read and all references having replied favorably, it was moved by Butler, seconded by Fitzhugh, that registration be granted and the applicant be registered as proficient in Civil Engineering. Carried unanimously.

Mr. Dickinson having executed and filed an oath of office, was introduced as a duly appointed member of the Board of Registration.

The special business of the board requiring the suspension of the by-laws having been attended, the board was reconvened in regular session.

Present: Chairman Jones, Secretary Wallingford, and members Becker, Butler, Dickinson and Fitzhugh. Absent: Kruse.

Mr. Becker was introduced as a new member of the Board appointed to fill the unexpired term of Mr. I. P. Fraizer, deceased.

The minutes of the meeting of July 1, 1932, and of the meeting of the Executive Committee of September 21, 1932, were read and approved.

Committee reports: Executive Committee, as set forth in the minutes of the meeting of September 21st.

Finance Committee : No report.

By-Laws and Rules: Butler reported a feeling that there should be no agitation regarding the revision or amendment of the present law at the present time.

Mr. Fitzhugh demurred, and asked for a special hearing at a later time to discuss the same question.

EXAMINATIONS: Examination papers submitted by J. C. Dunne, in re-examination as authorized by the Board at the July meeting were presented by the Secretary for grading. The same were ordered submitted to an examiner, to be taken by Butler.

Papers submitted by A. O. Grant having been graded by the Secretary, were presented, and the grading checked. Showed a grade of 81%.

This was followed by a general discussion of the proceedure in examinations, with the suggestion from Fitzhugh that a printed set of rules should be prepared by the Secretary, for the information of all examiners appointed to supervise the work of applicants.

Moved by Butler, seconded by Fitzhugh, that A. O. Grant be granted registration in Civil Engineering, as supported by the results of the examination. Carried unanimously.

No return being made of the questions submitted to M. L. Tophoy, who was held for examination at the April meeting, and given an extension of time at the July meeting; the Secretary recommended that the application be deemed to be denied by the provisions of the by-laws. This being provided for, and an automatic action, no further action by the Board was required.

Public Information Committee reported thru the Secretary that a news story of the meeting had been published in the Phoenix dailies, and that a further story of the meeting would be furnished the press.

Special Committees: Chairman Harry E. Jones made a written report with running comment, of the meeting of the National Council of Engineering Examiner Boards, in New York City; followed by discussion of some of the issues discussed at that assembly. Moved by Fitzhugh, seconded by Butler, to accept the report and to file the same. Carried.

A. J. Brenner, having made personal request for an opportunity to appear before the Board to support his previous application, was introduced and addressed the Board. He was questioned by Fitzhugh, Butler and Wallingford,

and his application was studied. Mr. Brenner agreed to arrange with the Architect members of the Board for an examination in structural problems at a time convenient for all parties, to be taken within sixty days of this date. There being no objection the matter was left in this form by unanimous consent.

APPLICATIONS:

The following applications were presented to the Board for consideration:

R. M. GAMMELL: Oatman, Mining. Moved by Butler, seconded by Fitzhugh

to hold for written examination. Carried unanimously. Dean Butler agreed to

prepare a set of questions and problems for the applicant, using data and forms

from the files of the Secretary.

- J. M. SELLERS: Civil. There being two references unreported, it was moved by Butler, seconded by Dickinson, to grant registration as applied for, providing additional references be returned, and there was no adverse or unfavorable replies. Carried unanimously.
- A. J. GILBERT, JR. Graduate of University of Arizona, Highway Department of Arizona since graduation. Moved by Butler, seconded by Dickinson to grant registration as stated. Carried unanimously.
- W. H. ROPER, Nogales, Civil and Highway (aged 61). Moved by Butler, seconded by Fitzhugh to hold in suspense and to secure collegiate record, and to ask him for data on construction-design experience. Carried unanimously.

SASHA HEADMAN: For Reciprocal Registration: Investigation showed that this type of registration had been given Mr. Headman in 1927. Secretary was instructed to inform the applicant of this fact and to say that if his RR card had been lost a duplicate would be furnished.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: None other than had been attended under action on Committee Report.

NEW BUSINESS: Election of a vice-chairman to take the place of Jones who had been advanced to the post of Chairman by the retirement of Herrington from the board and the action of the Executive Committee: Butler nominated W. E. Dickinson. There being no other nominations, moved by Wallingford and seconded by Fitzhugh to close the nominations and to instruct the Secretary to cast the unanimous ballot of the meeting for Mr. Dickinson. Carried and so ordered.

Moved to instruct the Secretary to prepare suitable resolution of the Board concerning the death of I. P. Fraizer, and forward the same to the widow of Mr. Fraizer, and to spread a copy thereof on the minutes of the meeting. Carried unanimously.

"WHEREAS, a great misfortune has befallen the family of Isaac P. Fraizer in his untimely and untoward accidental death, and

"WHEREAS, the State of Arizona which he served faithfully and well in many capacities; and the Board of Registration of which he was a worthy member and counsellor; have suffered an irreparable loss by his untimely departure, Therefore,

"BE IT RESOLVED, by the members of the Board of Registration that this expression of sorrow be conveyed to those who survive our fellow member; and that a copy of this resolution be made a part of the minutes of this meeting of the Board.*********

At the request of Dean Butler, and following inquiry of Mr. Dickinson concerning the details of annual reports of the Board, it was suggested by those present that segregation by counties as well as the present classification should be made. Agreed without other action.

As a deferred matter for the attention of the Board, Mr. Fitzhugh led a discussion of desirable amendments and revisions of the present statute, including a number of improvements and clarifications as the result of much study. The revisions as discussed were ordered assembled and prepared for transmission to the members of the Board as soon as practicable, with the intent to present to the Legislature at the January session. So ordered.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meetingwas adjourned at 3:15 P. M.

Pursuant to the call of the Chairman of the Board, the members met at Room 308, Heard Building, at 10 A. M. January 5, 1933.

Present: Becker, Butler, Fitzhugh, Jones, Kruse, Wallingford.

Absent: Dickinson.

Preliminary to the meeting of the Board, the Finance Committee, consisting of L. M. Fitzhugh, H. V. Kruse and W. H. Becker, met with the Auditor,
C. J. Smith and went over the Journal accounts, and the Annual Report.

Messrs. L. D. Houck and Wm. R. Dickson, being applicants whose applications were to be submitted to the board at a later hour, were introduced to the members present, and interrogated regarding experience.

Chairman Harry E. Jones called the meeting to order at 10:20 A. M. Minutes of the meeting of October 7, 1932, read and approved.

REPORTS. Executive Committee. No report.

From the minutes of the October meeting, the action on the application of J. M. Sellers, being incomplete, and the additional data required having since been received; it was moved by Butler, and seconded by Kruse to register as Civil Engineer. Carried.

Finance Committee. Reported their inspection of the books and report of Auditor, and offered the same in exhibit.

Moved by Butler, seconded by Kruse to accept the report of the committee, including the approval of the auditor's report. Carried.

In the discussion of future finance and assets of the Board, whether under appropriation from the Legislature, or on funds received from the registrations and renewals; it was requested that the Secretary be directed to ascertain the amount of income remitted to the State Treasurer; and to ask the Legislature for a small appropriation for current expense following the end of the present

fiscal year, ending June 30, 1933. This being on the assumption that no funds will be appropriated, and the board made dependent upon the income as above. Such appropriation being in advance of the renewal season at the end of the year and only for expense of the board from July 1, 1933 to December 31, 1933.

By-Laws and Rules Committee: No report.

Examinations: Butler reported grading of papers submitted by J. C.

Dunne, in re-examination; as graded by Prof. F. C. Kelton, and showing adverse
grades below passing standard. The Secretary was instructed to advise the applicant that he has failed in the examination on Engineering theory and structural
design, but that he shows such a degree of proficiency in field work that he
may be registered as a land Surveyor. The option is offered Mr. Dunne of
failure to achieve registration in Engineering, or registration in Land Surveying,
from the present showing.

Butler reported the grading of papers submitted by A. J. Brenner in Structural design examination and showing satisfactory grades. It was moved by Fitzhugh and meconded by Becker to authorize registration in Architecture, as previously applied for. Carried.

Questions for examination in Mining as requested by R. M. Gammell, Oatman, and prepared by Dean Butler, were presented.

In connection with the questions just named Dean Butler discussed certain past examinations, and particularly the papers of John Slak and the grading thereof.

Public Information Committee: No report other than that concerning News Story in daily papers regarding the meeting of the board.

COMMUNICATIONS: Secretary read from a circular of information sent out by the California Board of Registration for Engineers; regarding their attitude of support for the National Bureau of Registration, and their discontinued acceptance of N. C. Reciprocal Registration cards. In this connection the Secre-

tary read from the minutes of July 1, 1932 of this Board; and Dean Butler moved, seconded by Kruse, that the Arizona board discontinue the issue of Reciprocal Registration cards. Motion carried.

Other letters from persons unable to pay 1933 renewals, and concerning matters not requiring action by the Board were read and passed to the files.

APPLICATIONS:

Frank H. Higgins, Silverbell, Arizona. Dates show him to be aged 66.

Desires registration as Assayer, and also permission to examine and sample mines.

Discussion of the extent to which he might go, and to which he could legally go in the examination of mining property, established this rule: He can take samples, and assay the same and may report the result of the assays, but he may not report the findings as establishing the extent or value of ore-bodies, nor make estimates of such data as a consultant or for the use of any person in connection with the valuation of properties sampled and the ores assayed.

Moved by Butler and seconded by Fitzhugh to authorize registration in Assaying.

Carried unanimously.

D. F. Murphy, Kingman. Electrical Engineering. Data furnished shows no experience in the theory of Electrical Engineering; but pertains to the field work and practical construction of electrical lines and some apparatus. Moved by Kruse, and seconded by Butler to require examination. Carried.

Stiles S. Dixon, Architecture. Form B. Registered in North Carolina.

and showing the information required by our law in such cases. Moved by

Fitzhugh, and seconded by Butler to authorize registration as named.

S. A. Madrid. Tucson, Metallurgy, Engineering. References incomplete, and the application shows no theoretical training. Hold for references and report to the next meeting. Also ask him for additional references, and such as can be reached. (This application gave one reference residing in Burma, the postage being 12 cents was returned by the post office for additional postage,

and the letter was not forwarded.) Advise him who replied to our letter.

D. M. Downey: Arizona Highway Department, Phoenix. Moved by Kruse and seconded by Butler to require a technical examination. Carried.

Meeting adjourned at 12:00 until 1:30 P. M.

Reconvention of the Board at 1:30. Applications continued.

Claude E. Mc Lean: Assayer. Very complete data and preparation. Moved by Butler and seconded by Becker to authorize registration as asked; and to advise the applicant that he has satisfied the board that he is eligible to registration as Chemical Engineer, on the payment of full fee of Fifteen Dollars, instead of the Ten Dollars. Motion carried.

R. A. Morse: Architecture. Form B. Copy of certificate of registration in the State of New York. Moved by Fitzhugh and seconded by Becker to register. Carried unanimously.

Jos. T. Howland. Civil- Mining. Incomplete in replies, and experience does not justify Civil Engineering registration. Should ask for Mining only.

The Secretary was directed to ask him for references from Engineers, and to await returns including scholastic record. Action incomplete.

L. D. Houck: Mining. One of the men who made inquiry before the meeting of the board. Following personal appearance, and discussion, he asked the right to withdraw the application until a later time.

Wm. R. Dickson. Mining. Incomplete and no opportunity to reach references. Personal interview and examination by the Board. Moved by Butler and seconded by Kruse, that the application be held for additional data and to complete the file; and to refer the same to the Executive Committee with direction to issue registration if the returns are of satisfactory standard. Motion carried.

H. A. Twitchell: Application for registration enclosed in a parcel with exhibits. Has not been made into a file or references consulted.

Application for Civil and Architectural engineering registration. This application is filed from New York and bears the address of applicant as resident in that state. The Secretary was directed to advise the applicant of the rule of the board to require registration in his own state, if such law is in effect in that state, as a prerequisite to registration in Arizona.

William York Peters: Architect. The exhibits and experience record do not furnish satisfactory data on structural design. If the application is ready for the next meeting with additional data and the evidence of structural design ability, it will be acted upon at that time. Action on the application left incomplete. Moved by Butler and seconded by Kruse to ask for submission of data on structural design. Carried.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

The question of proposed amendments to the registration law, Sections 2499 to 2506, being in order; a draft of the altered law was read by Mr. Fitzhugh and the discussion led by Fitzhugh and Butler, other members of the board participating. Mr. Fitzhugh was asked to further develop the proposal with those slight changes in wording suggested by the discussion, and all agreed to further and promote the passage of a legislative act for such amendments.

The Secretary having presented a demand from the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards, for annual renewal fee, amounting to Twenty-five dollars, asked for advice. Moved by Butler, and seconded by Fitzhugh to authorize payment of the demand.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 3:30 P. M. agreeing that the April session shall be called to meet in Tucson.

APRIL 7, 1933. TUCSON, ARIZONA.

The Board of Registration met pursuant to the call of the Chairman, at ten o'clock, A. M., at the office of the Dean of Engineering, University of Arizona.

Present: Butler, Becker, Fitzhugh, Jones, Kruse, Wallingford. Mr. Dickinson was unable to attend the meeting due to illness.

A quorum being in attendance the meeting was called to order by Chairman Harry E. Jones. Minutes of meeting of January 6, and Executive Committee January 14, read and approved.

Dean Butler moved that the regular order of business be suspended, and that the application of Leland W. King, Jr., be made the special order of business for the immediate attention of the Board. Seconded by Fitzhugh. Carried.

Application, in prescribed form being read, and replies from references given by applicant being read and inspected; Mr. King, being in waiting, was called before the board for examination. Mr. King was introduced and presented exhibits of his work and experience, discussed the problems involved and the solutions given. On interrogation by the Board, his experience and training were discussed informally. Mr. King was excused from further attendance, and left with his exhibits. Moved by Fitzhugh, seconded by Butler; to register as Architect. After discussion, the motion was carried unanimously.

REGULAR ORDER OF BUSINESS resumed:

Committee Reports:

Executive Committee made no report other than the minutes of special meeting of January 14, 1933.

Finance Committee, and By-Laws and Rules Committees made no reports.

Examinations: Report of grading of examination papers submitted by R. M. Gammel, in Mining Engineering, by G. M. Butler with discussion of the results of

examination, and showing a grade of 57%. Moved by Butler, and seconded by Kruse that the application be denied by reason of failure of applicant to show proficiency. Carried.

Report of Secretary of examination papers submitted by D. M. Downey, and graded by Swan Erickson, Phoenix, State Highway Department; and subsequently checked by Becker, Jones and Fitzhugh.

The applicant having made a grade of 80%, it was moved by Becker, seconded by Kruse to grant registration in Civil Engineering. Carried unanimously.

No other examinations were ready to report.

Public Information: Chairman Jones presented a typed copy of a report said to have been made by Col. C. W. Steinman, on a placer property in Arizona, and discussed the report in outline with collateral data. Col; Steinman was at one time an applicant for registration by this board, and being held for examination had refused to take such examination. No action was taken, but the letter was to be filed for future reference and possible use in event of later investigation of this man's activity.

Chairman Jones also called attention to E. L. Sweeney, Phoenix, and his advertisement in the Arizona Mining Journal, as being a violation of the law in the "offer to practice" provision.

The Secretary was directed to write to Mr. Sweeney and others advertising in the "offer to practice" requesting application for registration.

Special Committees: Mr. Fitzhugh reported the work with the Legislature and the efforts to secure passage of amendments to the present law which had failed of passage owing to many difficulties; and in spite of the support and sponsorship of the Phoenix Building Congressand the Labor element in the House of Representatives.

Mr. Fitzhugh also suggested that the Secretary be directed to make a written request to Governor Moeur to include the consideration of this bill in his call for Special Session; discussing the fact that the bill had been introduced in both

houses of the eleventh Legislature, and had had full committee study. This being a fact, there should be but little time required by the special session for action.

No formal action by the board was taken on these suggestions or the report, except that the matters were deemed to be in status quo.

The Secretary was requested to advise Mr. Geo. D. Diehl to renew his registration. (Motor of muling was the Diehl larger. he has more form requests).

Moved by Fitzhugh and seconded by Kruse, to direct the Secretary to communicate with advertisers "offering to practice"; as previously discussed. Carried.

No communications other than as referring to matters already considered or in reference to applications to be considered.

APPLICATIONS:

The application of S. A. Madrid, carried over from January meeting, reread, asking for registration as Metallurgical Engineer.

Moved by Butler to advise the applicant that his record of experience shows training in operation of milling plants; but does not show evidence of theoretical training in the science of metallurgy, and to offer him an examination. Seconded by Kruse, and carried unanimously.

Harold Ekman: Architecture. Renewed application suspended in 1931 owing to under age of applicant at that time, and showing additional scholastic training.

After discussion of the wording of the law, the interpretation of "eligibility" and the defects inherent in the existing law; moved by Wallingford and seconded by Butler to register as applied for. Carried.

J. J. Hedderman: Miami, Arizona. Civil Engineering: After careful survey of all data offered, it was moved by Becker and seconded by Butler to require the applicant to take written examination; or accept registration as land Surveyor. Carried. This applicant does not show experience making use of his schooling, but he has done chiefly surveying work.

Robert H. Willow: Chemical Engineering. Moved by Butler and seconded by Eruse to register as requested. Carried.

Robert R. Reid: Geological Engineering. Moved by Kruse, and seconded by Butler to register as requested. Carried.

Joe A. Montgomery; Civil Engineering. Shows collegiate training and degree of B.Sc. in C.E. Discussion of the best application of the educational standards set up in the law, and their pertinence to later experience. Moved by Kruse and seconded by Butler to grant. Carried.

Karl M. Fisher: Land Surveying. This applicant having been before the board in 1929, and having declined to take an examination at that time, was withdrawn. Moved by Becker and seconded by Kruse to register as applied for in the present application. Carried.

H. A. Twitchell: Structural Engineering: Resident in New York. This application having been considered at the January meeting and the applicant having been advised of the rule of the board with regard to non-residents; further correspondence was offered by the Secretary including reference to the National Bureau of Engineering Registration. No action having been taken by the N.B.E.R. the board declined to alter the former action. On motion of Fitzhugh, seconded by Butler, the secretary was directed to so advise the applicant. Carried. (return \$10.00 of fee.)

A. G. Randall. Civil Engineering. Presented Reciprocal registration N.C.E.R. and California card, with application on Form B. Moved by Butler, seconded by Fitz-hugh to register as provided by law at \$1.00 fee. Carried.

W. T. Wishart: Civil Engineering. Presented educational credentials showing graduation from University of Arizona, 1931. Moved by Becker, seconded by Butler to register as requested. Carried.

William R. Dickson: Mining. Presented at January meeting, without returns from references, and referred to Executive Committee. Showing degree of B.Sc. E.M. University of Pittsburgh; and references being satisfactory; moved by Butler and Seconded by Becker to register as applied for. Carried.

Jos. T. Hovland; Mining and Civil Engineering. Action incomplete at time of January meeting; was re-presented. There being evidence of a hiatus in his experience record, and the references being of non-technical nature, the Secretary was requested to demand additional references and information concerning the interval 1913 to date as applied to professional work in engineering activity. Pending the completion of this data, no action was taken.

Frank R. Brown. Nowhegistered as Land Surveyor, asks for registration as Civil Engineer. Kingman, Arizona. Secretary directed to investigate schooling claims, and to require written examination, or to reject the application. Motion by Kruse and second by Butler. Carried.

C. A. Firth, Safford. Now registered as Land Surveyor; applies for registration as Civil Engineer. Moved by Butler and seconded by Kruse to require written examination. Carried.

No unfinished business except as covered by other matters.

New business: Dean Butler presented correspondence with the president of the National Council of Engineering Examiner Boards, concerning revision of the constitution of the National Council, with particular reference to the standard qualifications of State Boards, and the membership dues.

Moved by Butler, and seconded by Wallingford to instruct the Secretary to advise the National Council that the Board of Registration of Arizona is opposed to any changes which set up limiting qualifications for State Boards, prerequisite to membership; as tending to defeat the primary purpose of the Council as organized; and to further protest proposed changes with regard to membership dues as related to registrants. Carried. (Butler will furnish form of letter).

Moved by Butler and seconded by Kruse, that the Board establish a maximum fee of Five Dollars to be paid to Examiners for grading examination papers, when done by others than members of the Board, (it being assumed that members of the Board shall receive no fees for such work). Carried.

Mr. Fitzhugh requested the writing of a letter of advice by the Secretary to L. T. Alexander, (and any others known to be acting in like capacity) regarding violation of the law with regard to preparation of architectural or engineering plans and specifications by un-registered men.

Unanimous approval without formal motion.

The Board moved and voted appreciation of the hospitality and courtesy of the University of Arizona for the conditions and conveniences offered. Meeting adjourned 3:30 P. M.

The general policy of this Board relative to giving credit for experience in instances where applicants hold a bachelor's degree in branches of engineering different from those in which they have subsequently practiced, which shall be subject to modifications when courses taken have included unusually high proportions of elective work in the branches in which they have practiced, shall be as follows:

- 1. Holders of bachelor's degrees in electrical engineering who desire to be registered in mechanical engineering, and vice-versa; three years.
- 2. Holders of bachelor's degree in civil engineering who desire to be registered in mining engineering, and vice-versa: three years.
- 3. Holders of bachelor's degrees in electrical or mechanical engineering who desire to be registered in civil or mining engineering, and vice-versa: two years."

Moved by Merritt, seconded by Becker that students with college training in one field and practical experience in another be granted permission to take an examination in subject matter involved in practical experience. Board reserves the right to make exceptions based on the experience and training of applicants. Carried unanimously.

GEORGE MARTIN BURGETT, moved by Fernald seconded by Becker that registration be granted as Civil Engineer (only). Carried unanimously.

Call for the State Board of Technical Registration to designate a representative, and to participate in the deliberations of the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards, was not received by the Secretary or the Chairman until after the regular meeting of the Board, April 4, 1936.

The matter of representation, was not threfore taken up at the board's regular meeting. A suggestion by a member of the board, that a referendum by letter-ballot be taken both to authorize representation and to name a representative, had the approval of the Executive Committee, and the undersigned was delegated to represent this state and its Board of registration. The vote of the referndum was: For, Six. Against, One.

For the remainder of this report I will speak in the first person, as the representative of the State Board of Technical Registration, for Arizona.

Leave of absence from employment was asked, and arrangements by purchase of transportation, Pullman berth, and advance reservation of accomodations at hotel at the place of meeting, were made (including a temporary loan at the Phoenix National Bank.)

I left Phoenix via Santa Fe, Thursday evening, April 30, and arrived at Old Point Comfort, Virginia, Monday morning at 11:20, May 4.

The Council was already in session at the time of my arrival, and that was the first item of attention.

Aside from reports of income, increase in registrations, and a few states entry into the National Council following adoption of registration laws; the major theme of the council meetings was Examinations of candi-

dates for registration: Primarily for interstate and reciprocal registration, and secondarily as a means of setting up state-standards.

I was assigned to a room at the Chamberlin Hotel with Emery Stanford Hall, Secretary-Treasurer of the National Council, and a member of the Illinois State Board; thus I was able to discuss many features of the work and the National Council program in a very intimate way outside the formal meetings.

The meetings of the council adjourned at midnight, May 4, to give way the natary for the Convention of the Americal Institute of Architects, with the request that all representatives of State Boards be in attendance if possible, and to make a point of attendance and discussion with the Committee of the Institute on Registration Laws and Examinations, to be held Wednesday evening.

I took frequent notes and participated in the discussions, by question and suggestion, (and after sessions, with Mr. Hall), and while it will not be either convenient or necessary to repeat these observations in detail, my comments are based upon impressions supported by the notes.

I believe that the annual meetings of the Council are helpful and that all State Boards should participate in the discussions and representation.

There are at present thirty-eight of the states and territories which have registration, license, or examination laws. Our own laws are not the best, but are likewises far from the worst or weakest: Several States have dual-coverage laws for Engineers and Architects. Tennessee has 3 Architect, 3 Engineers, on The Seard.

The practice of Architecture may properly be called an evidence of cul-

tural progress, and the services of architects appeal to people of culture; but the requirement of a cultural background for practitioners, or the recognition of such by those who would (or many of those who do) enage in the practice of the profession is not too apparent. It must be said, however, that the leaders in the profession and in the national council are men of mature minds,

cultured bearing, tolerant attitude, and open mind.

The personnel of the American Institute gathering was men of past sixty, and under forty. The possible explanation being that the men in the middle brackets were too busy at the present time to leave their work and delegated representation to the older and younger men.

With further reference to the registration laws: The purpose of these is theoretically to protect the public against incompetent design of buildings of every nature; but the tendency is to create a monopoly of the right to do all designing, to develope a sort of snobbery of differentiation in the educational preparation of practitioners.

I am not convinted that every piece of structural development, domestic alteration, improved housing, or small commercial enterprise necessarily requires the interference of an architect: Particularly if the chief reason for his interference is based upon a legal enactment. Such a situation can become what is commonly called, at the present time, a "racket". If the architect's services are not definitely valuable to his client, he has nothing of more use that a condensation of the builders ideas into a set of indifferent drawings, if he does not know but about half as much as a well trained journeyman mechanic; then he has no right to enforce a racket by means of legal enactment.

This is of course very definitely related to the question of what laws should or shall be enacted, how shall they be administered, and what standards are to be erected for determining the competent, incompetent, qualified, trained, and whatnot; and for what types or costs or purposes of use, Architects shall be employed, and to what extent may their interference be dispensed with.

Moreover, men to be admitted to the practice, and legally labelled as worthy of trust will have to be examined by such standards as questioned above, and in addition examined as to personality, judgement, experience, education, tasts and tact, skill in design, accuracy in specification-descriptions, knowledge

personal integrity.

of materials, economics, finance, law, psychology, A and history.

I am convinced that the minmum age of eligibility should be thirty years, or beyond that; if the proposals of the National Council and its standard examinations are to rule. But I do not wish to be understood as opposing the erection and wide recognition of the high est standards of personality and preparation possible. I am further convinced that the administration of any law, ours in particular, with its medium standards of requirements, could work injustices upon applicants both by admission or rejection of their applications.

I am coming to the belief that no one should be passed without a personal appearance and oral quiz regardless of every other favorable or unfavorable aspect of the case.

Some of the states, and the National Council for interstate certification, require resident, written, examination of from thirty to thirty-eight hours duration (that is devoted to the work for a number of consecutive days) involving history, actual solution of a design problem, engineering design, specifications, contracts, and something in the way of a thesis or discussion involving experience in research.

I am not entirely at one with the advanced thinkers of the profession, but I would not wish to lag behind them too far. My education has been much stimulated by the opportunity given me by the Board and this event, but I cannot say that it is either finished or definitely guided to unescapable conclusions.

Epitomizing/in our own domain I made the note that "Where the laws are either indefinite, or weak in their authority, such laws should not be administered too leniently". Our registrants, except as individuals, have no standing with other states, but I think that is as it should be; and should be our attitude towards those of other states and their registrants. Such a situation may seem to be hard on those who might get work in some other state, but one going to another part of the country will find many other things to adjust himself to, as well.

If in time our own law becomes more stringent, exacting or specific than now,

it will be because the public is better educated to the need of Architectural services, and the Architects are better prepared to render the services, and moreover those services will be more necessary.

For such as must have interstate registration or spread their services over a larger domain than the single state of Arizona, the National Council has a schedule of examinations, general requirements, and a method of securing general certification.

As an educational adventure, a means of contact with a wider world, and the opportunity to see some of the most charming areas of the country in the freshness of spring; I greatly appreciate the courtesy of the board in authorizing the event.

Chairman: "The defense having waived reading of the charges, and there being no further statements from the Board members at this time, we will proceed to hear the defense.

Mr. Houston: "As I told you gentlemen before, I was just called into this case a short ago. I have looked into it, made an investigation, found out what it was all about, found out that this young man did make a mistake in regard to his age, birth date and several other details in his application for a license or certificate to practice as an architect. However, I have had a talk with him and he tells me that he did make a statement there as to his age that wasn't true, but in this case, as in all cases, I find mitigating circumstances, and when you gentlemen hear them I think you will feel more charitable toward the boy than to criticise or censure him for what he has done. I intend to put him on the stand here for the purpose of answering certain questions which I will ask him. I will of course grant you gentlemen the same privilege and you may cross-examine or question him as you see fit. This boy wants to do the square thing and I know that he appreciates this opportunity that you have given him to come here and straighten this matter out. The only way to right a wrong is to meet it with charity and fair treatment, and I know that he appreciates this opportunity to be heard by your Board and submit certain evidence in support of his contentions.

"We have records here to show that this boy is one of the outstanding architects in our county, as well as the entire state. This boy has done a quarter of a million dollars worth of business this year and paid for it. We can show that he is qualified in every way, all but age, to be registered under the State Law, and I say that, after you hear his story and consider the evidence in this case, I am sure you gentlemen will be willing to cooperate in every way that you can, so far as the law will permit."

Chairman: "I am going to ask counsel for the Board to read Section 11 and follow that with Section 16 of Chapter 32. I will say, in support of that ruling, that this Board is a Board with only limited powers, as set up by the law, and we can only act on such matters as these as are within the scope of the law. Mr. Winsett, will you please read those two sections."

Mr. Winsett: "I am reading Section 11 of Chapter 32, Session Laws of 1935:

- (Sec. 11)- "Eligibility requirements. An applicant for registration as architect or engineer shall be not less than twenty-five years of age and of good moral character and repute. If an applicant for registration as an architect or an engineer, he shall have engaged actively for at least eight years in architectural or engineering work of a character satisfactory to the board, but each year of teaching of architectural or engineering subjects or of study satisfactorily completed in an architectural or engineering school approved by the board, up to a maximum of five years, shall be considered equivalent to one year of active engagement. If an applicant for registration as an assayer or a land surveyor, he shall have engaged actively for at least four years in assaying or land surveying work of a character satisfactory to the board, but each year of teaching of assaying or land surveying or of study satisfactorily completed in a school approved by the board, up to a maximum of two years, shall be considered equivalent to one year of active engagement."
- Sec. 16 "Revocation of certificate; hearing; notice of findings. The Board may revoke the certificate of any registrant found guilty of fraud or deceit in obtaining such certificate, or of gross negligence, incompetence, bribery, or other misconduct in the practice of his profession. Charges shall be in writing and sworn to by the complainant, and, unless dismissed without hearing, shall be determined within three months. A copy of the charges, together with notice of the time and place of hearing, shall be served on the accused not less than thirty days before the date set for the hearing. The accused may appear personally and by counsel, cross-examine witnesses against him, and produce evidence. If five or more members of the board find the accused guilty, his certificate shall be revoked, but may be reissued upon the vote of five or more members. The board shall immediately notify the secretary of state and the clerk of the board of supervisors of each county in the state of the revocation of a certificate or of the reissuance of a revoked certificate."

Chairman: "It is my belief that the powers of this Board are limited to action under the law as set up by Section 11, and the present hearing is based on an interpretation of Section 16. Counsel for the defendant having admitted misrepresentation by his client, without comment upon the reasons, it would seem as though that portion of the hearing is a confession of actual guilt as having obtained the certificate by that misrepresentation; however, I am willing to abide by counsel and the action of the Board.

Mr. Houston: "Say, what is this? Am I on trial? Judging from the Chairman's

Mr. Winsett: "I suggest, just in the common spirit of fairness, that you gentlemen be patient enough to hear what this defendant and accused sees fit to testify to, and, after you have heard his testimony and considered--

Mr. Merritt: (Interrupting) "I move that we hear counsel." Motion seconded by Fernald. Passed unanimously.

Mr. Winsett: "Mr. Moore, will you stand up, please. Hold up your right hand. Do you swear that you will tell the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth?"

Mr. Moore: "I do."

Mr. Winsett: "Mr. Houston, will you proceed?"

Mr. Houston: "State your full name, please, Cecil."

Moore: "Cecil Hall Moore."

Houston: "Where do you reside, Mr. Moore?"

Moore: "Tucson, Arizona, at 523 East Mable Street."

Houston: "How long have you lived in Tucson?"

Moore: "Nine or ten years. Ten years."

Houston: "You came there, when?"

Moore: "I don't know exactly. The year 1926."
Houston: "What is your business or profession?"

Moore: "The Board is trying to determine now, whether or not I am an architect."

Houston: "How long have you been an architect?"

Moore: "Do you mean making drawings?" 14 years."

Houston: "You mean ever since you were fourteen years of age?"

Moore: "Yes, sir."

Houston: "For whom did you first work?"

Moore: "My father."

Houston: "Your father was a contractor, was he not?"

Moore: "Yes".

Houston: "Mhereabouts? In Tucson? And you drew his plans?"

Moore: "Yes. And various other contractors."

Houston: "Have you worked for any other architects?"

Moore: "Yes. Mr. Starkweather- M. H. Starkweather; H. O. Jaastad, and the Lincoln Mortgage Company."

Houston: "How long did you work for each one as anarchitect?"

Moore: "Oh, for a period --. I started before I entered high school. The exact years I cannot state. Practically all of the time between those three outfits."

"But you had had the eight years practical experience before you applied for a license as an architect?"

Moore: "I feel so."

"In your application, Cecil, the Board says you stated that you Houston: were born February 19, 1910, when in truth and fact you were born February 19, 1913. Is that right?"

"Yes. sir." Moore:

Houston: "State your correct birth date."

Moore: "February 19, 1913."

Houston: "Thy did you furnish the false statement as to your age? Thy did you say you were born in 1910, when the truth of the matter is. you were born in 1913?"

"To gain a livelihood, and I thought submitting evidence of other abilities was sufficient. I thought age was of minor importance as to a certificate so long as I could convince the Board I could do the work."

Houston: "You have a family, do you not? You are married?"

"Yes." Moore:

Houston: "How long have you been married?"

Moore: "Three years." Houston: "Any children?"

Moore: "Yes. One." louston: "How old?" Moore: "Two years."

Houston: "Is your father living or dead?"

Moore: "Dead."

Houston: "Did you make this application after his death or before?"

Moore: "Shortly afterwards."

Houston: "Did your father ever assist you in any way? Financially, or in getting jobs?"

Moore: "Yes; naturally."

Houston: "You stated that you were formerly employed by M. H. Starkweather. Why did you leave Mr. Starkweather? What happened there?"

Moore: "I was laid off."

Houston: "Did you try to get a job anywhere else?" Moore: "Yes, but didn't have much luck at that time." Houston: "You were laid off by Mr. Starkweather when?"

Moore: "In March, 1935."

Houston: "Couldn't you have gotten another job?"

Moore: "It is very doubtful."
Houston: "Did you try to get employment?"

Moore: "I inquired around to some of the architects there and none of them had enough work and I --

"Was it necessary for you to have a registration as an architect Houston: in order to make a living?"

Moore: "It seemed so. I felt that it was."

Houston: "Couldn't you find employment anywhere until you were registered?" Moore: "Sufficient to make a livelihood -- it is doubtful. I made a

partial livelihood. There was very little work at that time."

Houston: "It was either make this application or go on relief?"

Moore: "That is about the truth." Houston: "And you chose this way?"

Moore: "Yes."

Houston: "How long did you work for Mr. Starkweather?"

Moore: "Off and on for six or seven years."

Houston: "He was satisfied with your work, was he?"

Moore: "Yes. He seemed to be."

Houston: "Do you have a docket there as to some of the work that you do, Cecil? Gentlemen, Dean Butler has the impression, some way or another, that this boy is not qualified for this work. Not on account of his age, necessarily, but just on general principles."

M.. Moore submits rolls of blue prints. Mr. Houston instructs him to start at the beginning, to turn the pages slowly, and to give full information concerning each one.

Moore:

(1) "Plans drawn for residence of Dr. Littlefield, physician and surgeon. El En Canto Estates. Under construction now."

Mr. Wallingford: "What price job?"

Moore: "\$15,500.00."

Houston: "Did you draw the plans?"

Moore: "I drew the plans."

Houston: "El Encanto is one of the leading subdivisions, is it not, in Tueson?"

Moore: "It is."

Merritt: "Is that being built under contract?"

Moore: "Yes."

(2) "Plans for residence of C. W. Dice."

Houston: "What is the address?"

"Tucson, Arizona; in the 900 Block on East Speedway. Not under construction yet but will be in the next ten days. El Monte Video Subdivision."

Houston: "Did you draw that plan, Mr. Moore?"

Moore: "I did."

Houston: "What price job?"

Moore: "\$9,000.00."
Houston: "Is it already signed for, Cecil, or not?" Moore: "No, there are a few minor changes to be made."

(3) "This is the residence of L. L. Jackson in Foothills Estates, Tucson. Arizona. \$12,500.00. It is completed."

Houston: "That is in an exclusive subdivision in Tucson, isn't it?"

Moore: "Yes".

Houston: "How much is involved there?"

Moore: "\$12,500.00."

(4) Moore: "This one is the plans for the service station of Mr. Shifman. located at Stone and 4th Streets in Tucson. The cost, approximately \$12,300.00."

"That is a filling station, is it not, and is completed? you drew the plans?"

Moore: "Yes, it is completed, and I drew the plans."

Dickinson: "Are all those plans you are going through of the same job the filling station?"

Moore: "Yes, different units. All the same job."

Becker: "Who had charge of the construction of these buildings?"

"I did. I run the Moore Building Company, and of these I have named, I built them all."

Dickinson: "You built all these buildings?"

Moore: "Yes."

(5) Moore: (Calling attention to another plan). "I drew this one for Elmer Dow."

Houston: "Where does he live in Tucson?"

Moore: "On East 2nd Street."

Houston: "He is a contractor himself, isn't he?"

Moore: "Yes. This is really a home for Mr. Hi Corbett. Mr. Dow is the contractor. This job will run approximately \$9,500.00."

Houston: "Did you draw the plans?"

Moore: "I did."

Houston: "Is that in an exclusive subdivision, or not?"

Moore: "It is within the city limits."

(6) Moore: "This one is a residence for Miss Leonie C. Boutall, out near El Capital Subdivision, 15 miles out on the Oracle Road. Cost, \$80,000.00. Includes main residence, two guest houses, swimming pool, corrals, chicken-houses, everything."

Wallingford: "What is that a drawing of?" Moore: "Foundation of the main residence."

Wallingford: "Is that complete now, or not?"

Moore: "No. About 70% completed." (Turning another page) "This is the floor plan of the main residence."

Houston: "How much money is involved in that deal?"

Moore: "\$80,000.00."
Dickinson: "Did you build that?"

Moore: "No, I supervised it."

Mr. Wallingford: "very nice plans."

Mr. Moore: "Thank you, Sir."

(7) Moore: "I have another one here for Mr. and Mrs. Hayden Fulton, in Colonia Solano Subdivision, which is also an exclusive subdivision in Tueson. It will run about \$23,500.00. 80% complete now."

Dickinson: "Did you draw the plans for that building?"

Moore: "Yes."

Winsett: "Did you ever build anything in Fairmont - my old tract?"

Moore: "Yes, I built a few there this year." Houston: "Is that all of the plans, Cecil?"

Moore: "That is all I had on file. We have in the office now approximately \$150,000.00 worth of residences - 50% complete on the board."

Dickinson: "Can you recall, Mr. Moore, any other drawings that you have done for residences in exclusive subdivisions in Tucson?"

"I think these are about all and will answer. The main purpose Moore: that I want to show the drawings - I wanted to show that we have received over 50% of the residence drawings in Tucson. Our business will amount to close to one half million dollars if it continues as it has the past six months in Tucson. No other architect in Tucson is doing anywhere near that much business."

Houston: "Some of your competitors there in Tucson knew your age, didn't they, Cecil?"

Moore: "Yes, I think they did."

Moore: "I took the I.C.S. course, and mostly homestudy of hand books."

Winsett: "Did you graduate from the I. O. S .?"

Moore: "No, I didn't complete that."
Winsett: "And you didn't complete your high school course?"

Moore: "No. Sir."

Winsett: "Did you go to college at all?"

Moore: "No, Sir."

Winsett: "Well, your training in architecture. Can you tell me, in a more or less concise manner - begin at the beginning - what your training in architecture consists of."

"I got my training in architecture from study in offices and from help offered me by Mr. Starkweather. We were building a school at that time. Mr. Starkweather had interest and liking for me and would send me down to this school and other jobs with instructions to the foremen to answer any questions I might happen to ask, and with handbooks and help from other architects and engineers in his office, and through all the experience I had with my father's building -- "

Minsett: "Was your father an architect?"

Moore: "No, my father was not an architect but was a contractor and builder."

Winsett: "Over how long a period of years did all that occur?"

Moore: "I would say ten years. "

Winsett: "What is your present age?"

Moore: "Twenty-three."

"You started the study of architecture at the age of 13?" Winsett:

Moore: "Yes, about that. What I absorbed. I am not saying how much." Winsett: "What age were you when you actually started to draw plans with full authority to submit them?"

"Possibly 1927 or 1928. My father was practically out of business in 1931. I drew in the neighborhood of 80 homes for him when I was around 16 and 17 years of age.

Dickinson: "In looking at these plans, it has been brought out that you drew the plans."

Moore: "The original design; all of the details of the construction. It isn't merely a matter of drawing them. It is designing and planning. The handling of the pencil has very little to do with it."

Dickinson: "T hese various things were designed by you and are all your plans; not merely your drawings?"

Moore: "Yes."

Merritt: "What do you call your business, Mr. Moore?"

"Moore Construction Company. Cecil Moore, Architect, and Moore Construction Company; a building company.

Merritt: "How many other architects do you employ?"

Moore: "Sometimes have five. At the present time, only two."

Merritt: "Are those two registered architects?"

Moore: "Yes.

"Do you supervise their work?" Merritt:

Moore: "Yes."

Merritt: "This question! Do you actually draw those plans in Tucson? You are not associated with any architects outside of the state? The work is completely done in your office?"

Moore: "Yes.

Neeb: "What are the names of the two registered architects you have in your office now?"

Moore: "At present I have Edmond F. Jacques and George Wolff."

Chairman: "Were you familiar with all of the details, or at least the wording of the law, at the time you made your application?"

Moore: "I was."

Chairman: "Were you familiar with the particular clause that was read here, at my request, from the law as it now stands?"

Moore: "I was. I am not definitely sure where I had the information but I gathered it from Kidder's New York Statutes. That 's where I got it."

Chairman: "Had you read this particular law which applied in Arizona?"

Moore: "I couldn't say. I have read it a good many times since I received your notice."

Neeb: "In reading the high school record, I understood you to say the dates of your application were all worked out to fit and make a plausible story for your application."

Moore: "Well, yes, that is true."

Becker: "If one of the architects employed by you, who is registered, would sign your plans, that wouldn't interfere in any way with your income or livelihood, would it?"

Moore: "That I couldn't tell you until later. Those men have both been in Tucson a number of years and haven't made very much by themselves."

Fernald: "But you could carry on the business, being the business manager of it, and have them do the detail work?"

Moore: "I suppose so. Mr. Jacques has been there a number of years and has never had the opportunity to hire anyone."

Houston: "Your business is just what you have made it, isn't it, Cecil?" Moore: "That is right."

Chairman: "Mr. Winsett, just what does our authority cover in connection with this hearing?"

Winsett: "Gentlemen, I think that you all can only do one of two things; either not revoke Mr. Moore's license, or revoke it, and you may, if you see fit, also vote to reissue the certificate when he arrives at the age of 25 years."

"I hope the Board will take all these things into consideration. Houston: Before you sponsor anything else, I want you to hear this. No matter how hard we try to make a law fair and impartial, it works a hardship on some one, and this law has surely worked a hardship on this boy. He has worked hard at his profession; he is getting the business, and if it wasn't for that you would never have heard of this thing. Mr. Starkweather and all those men knew this boy was applying for a license. That is the reason Mr. Starkweather let him go. He didn't think he could get out and do anything. I think that the Board could suspend his license for two years, or until he becomes 25 years of age. I think it would be a fine thing. I am a citizen of this State and belong to the legal profession. I don't want every Tom, Dick and Harry to pass the bar. But my goodness, now, I would like to have a young boy like this, 23 years old. He has shown here what he can do; what he has done. He is married; has a

wife and baby. It was either make this false application or go on relief, and by God, I have more respect for him for taking this course than to go on relief. Now, as I say, I am not pinning a bouquet on Cecil Moore for making a false statement, but I admire him for being man enough to make his own livelihood; for coming in here, making a clean breast of this thing, laying his cards on the table; and I think you should be just as lenient with him as you can. He has learned a lesson, and I know he feels badly about all this. Mr. Wallingford here has looked at these plans, and if ever there was an authority on architecture, he is. They say he is a regular Old Maid when it comes to those things, and we will have to admit that he is the hardest man in the State to please. I know this boy feels grateful for being considered here. I know his wife is very upset over this thing. He didn't tell you but he sends money to his mother back home. Besides that, he takes good care of his family, his business, and is an all-round good citizen in the community. He employs two boys in his office that are registered architects; fine boys, but when it comes to getting out and getting the business, it takes Cecil here to do it. Now, I know all of you want to be fair on this situation and that you went a long way at the other meeting to do all you could for this boy. I know he appreciates this, as does his family, and justice, tempered with mercy, is what he needs and what we all need"

Neeb: "Mr. Houston, you say you are a member of the legal profession. Do they have an organization comparable to this Board, known as the Bar Association, with certain requirements?"

Bar Association, with certain requirements?"

Houston: "Yes. 21 years of age." "Yes, that is why there is a question about this age limit. For the general public, it is a good thing, and a man should have eight or even ten years' practical experience before drawing plans, but different people have different talents. These plans and this work, as Cecil says, is all he was ever worth a darn for." (Laughter)

Neeb: "Mr. Moore said he had had as high as five men working for him. What phase of the work do they do?"

Moore: "What any draftsman does. Use the pencil." "All of these lines, I do not put on these drawings, but all of them I am responsible for. I couldn't make that many drawings all by myself in six months."

Neeb: "In other words, this is work done by others, with your help, under your supervision and direction?"

Houston: "Now I think that is a little confusing."

Neeb: "He says, and you say, that he did all these drawings. Now, he said he has had as many as five men in his employ. He admits he couldn't possibly have made all these drawings in six months."

Houston: "Those employees of his might do the mechanical part of it but he is undoubtedly responsible for the idea expressed in that form and is responsible for them, having signed them. That is customary conduct in an architect's office."

Merritt: "Surely, that is alright. They all do that." "Mr. Moore, do you have any men in your employ who do special parts of these plans which you are unable to do? Do you employ any men to do work on these plans which you are not qualified and competent to do?"

Moore: "I wouldn't say that. When we become rushed, I put on more men."
Dickinson: "Have you found any kind of design or drawing you couldn't do?"
Moore: "I haven't as yet. However, if I ran into a big stadium job, or
something like that, I wouldn't attempt it. On these plans, no.
But in the future, if anything came up that I felt incompetent
for, I would put on an architect or engineer that I knew could
do it."

Mr. Winsett: "I think we have heard --"

Mr. Houston: (Interrupting) "As a general rule, your law is a good thing, but as to this particular boy, I think you will admit it is a hardship."

Winsett: "Mr. Chairman, have you heard all of the evidence you want?"

Fernald: "Pardon me, Mr. Chairman. I was City Engineer of Tucson for five years. I have known this boy for a long time. He has worked hard and has worked for Tucson. He did Starkweather's work and is a dam good architect; pardon my French! I am for him, hands and feet and both fists. I think our law is really unconstitutional. I don't think we have a right to limit a man in his age when it comes to his work. He can vote at twenty-one.

Winsett: "If I may express my opinion about it, as a lawyer, Mr. Fernald, I think the law is constitutional, but as to the wisdom of it - I am not saying."

Fernald: "You can't say a man cannot practice medicine until he is 25!"
Winsett: "I think it is a question of policy, and the wisdom of it I am not questioning or approving, but since they have said that, I feel it is my duty to say that I don't think the law is unconstitutional."

Fernald: "I would like very much to see it put to a test."

Houston: "Those things are always expensive."

Dickinson: "Mr. Chairman, I move you that the Board now recess until after lunch."

Several: "No, no - let's get through with this."

Dickinson: "I withdraw my motion, Mr. Chairman. Apparently it is time for the Board to go into executive session to consider this matter."

Becker: "Mr. Moore, would you be willing, or would you care to have your application withdrawn without prejudice and recall your application and registration certificate? Would you care to ask the Board to withdraw your application and the whole thing of no record and transaction?"

Winsett: "In my opinion, you really are not allowed to do that. His application has been acted on; he has been granted a certificate; you may, if you see fit, go on record as being in favor of reissuing the --"

Houston: "Could we amend the application? Instead of saying 1910, say 1913, and just scratch the "High School" and add "Equivalent to High School", and let the application stand?"

Winsett: "I see no objection. The only action the Board can take is the action of revoking his certificate, but if they see fit they can allow him to amend his application to conform with the facts and the truth."

Houston: "If they continue the hearing, they automatically allow him to go ahead and practice with this certificate. I think everyone sees it the same way and is agreed that the law works an injustice in this case."

Merritt: "The only thing we can do is revoke his application."

Winsett: "I would suggest to the Board, if I may, that you go into executive session and decide what you want to do."

Dickinson: "I move you, Mr. Chairman, that we immediately go into executive session to consider this matter."

Neeb: "I second the motion."

Merritt: "This is an action quite vital to this young man, and personally, I would like to have him sit right here and hear what we have to say. I don't believe in swinging an axe over this boy's head."

Dickinson: "Mr. Chairman, in support of my motion, this matter can be considered calmly and deliberately if the Board can sit by itself and go ahead and discuss this matter without interruption."

Chairman: "The motion is thatwe go into executive session and act upon the evidence which has been presented, and, if possible, reach a conclusion, I take it. All in favor, say "I." (Weak response). The Chair is in doubt; some not voting. All in favor, show by raising the right hand."

In favor: (3) - Neeb, Becker and Dickinson.

Opposed: (2) - Merritt and Faldner.

Houston: "I would like it understood, gentlemen, if you revoke the certificate, that you revoke only until he becomes twenty-five years of age and that at that time the license will reissue."

Dickinson: "Mr. Chairman, I would prefer the advantage of legal interpretation of the law only."

Exit Mr. Houston and Mr. Moore.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Chairman: "It is my opinion that the law gives us no other alternative or other line of action than the wording as set forth in the legislative enactment. As to the constitutionality or justice of it, we are not called upon to judge. The Attorney General is our counsel, and if he interprets our authority as being limited to the wording of the law, we have no other reaction than to follow that law, because we have given our oath to uphold and support it."

Dickinson: "From what you saw here, do you conclude, on the basis of the evidence, he did demonstrate ability to do this work and meet all of the qualifications except age?"

Chairman: "Yes."

Dickinson: "He also showed us how he falsified that thing all the way through and made it fit." "Now, this question of ethics comes in pretty strong for any professional man, architect, engineer, or anybody who serves the public. (Reads from Section 11). A registered applicant shall be not less than 25 years of age and of good moral character."

Heeb: "How well can a man like that represent his clients if he cleverly misrepresents and falsifies to the Board to get the opportunity to represent his clients?" And he does not qualify as to age."

Faldner: "I want to see that clause knocked out. You can vote at 21."
Winsett: "But you can't do everything at 21."

Faldner: "I made \$5,000.00 when only 19 years old."

Merritt: "It has been stated that we may do one of two things: either cancel this registration or suspend it until Mr. Moore reaches 25 years of age; some two years. Now, the suspending part of it, I am not in favor of. I believe, if I was on this Board, knowing that he has the ability, that I would vote favorably at that time; probably even more so than we are to do to decide that question, so I would like to word this just as politely as I can. I move that the registration of Mr. Cecil H. Moore be revoked due to errors in the application."

Chairman: "Gentlemen, you have heard the motion, which is, that the registration of Cecil H. Moore be revoked, due to errors which appear in the application. Any comments?"

Winsett: "Just in case it might be questioned in Court later, I would suggest that you say, rather than just 'errors in the application''errors in the application amounting to fraud and deceit'. In other words, whatever action is taken, I want you to take it in the words of the statute so that it would stand if ever brought up in Court later on."

Merritt: "I amend my motion to include the corrections as suggested by Mr. Winsett and as required in the statute."

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE STATE BOARD OF TECHNICAL REGISTRATION

Phoenix, Arizona July 18, 1936

The State Board of Technical Registration met at ten fifteen A. M., room 303 Heard Building in Phoenix, Arizona.

Present: V. O. Wallingford, Chairman; L. S. Neeb, Secretary; W. H. Becker;
R. L. Merritt.

Absent; G. M. Butler; W. E. Dickinson; P. E. Fernald.

The minutes of the special meeting on June 10th. 1936, State Capitol Building, Phoenix, Arizona called to consider the case of Cecil Hall Moore were approved as read.

Committee Reports:

EXAMINATIONS:

FINANCE: The trial balance for the year ending June 30th. 1936 as was presented by Mr. Becker, was approved as read.

RULES AND BY-LAWS: The report of the "Rules and By-Laws" committee was held over until the October meeting due to the absence of Dean G. M. Butler.

Philip Slavens-Highway Engineering- Mr. Becker submitted papers presented by Mr. Slavens. The following motion was unanimously carried: That the executive committee study the examination papers and that no definite action be taken until the October meeting, at which time the committee will report its findings.

K. J. Hanak- Architecture- A motion was made by Mr. Merritt and seconded by Me. Becker that Mr. Hanak be advised that he take an examination in the design of columns, beams, trusses, lintels as is required of architects in the design of buildings.

The letter from the National Council of State Boards of Engineering Examiners was read by Mr. Wallingford. Quote:

"The Constitution in Article VII, Section 2. provides that "The annual membership fees from the various Member Boards shall be based on five cents (5¢) per registrant of each State as of December 31 of each year,

with a minimum fee of \$25.00 and a maximum fee of \$150.00 for any one Board, "There is also provision for associate membership fees, but none so far of the engineering associations have become affiliated with the National Council and no funds are being derived from this source. Various proposals have been submitted as bases for an amendment to the Constitution to give us somewhat more money, However, none of them would raise the amount indicated as desirable earlier in this letter. Boiling down the various suggestions, apparently the most practicable arrangement would be as follows; a minimum fee of \$25.00 as at present. Ten cents per registrant from all Boards who require a renewal fee. If the annual fee is \$4.00 or less per year, the return per registrant to be \$0.10 up to 500 registrants in good standing and \$0.05 for all over. If the annual fee is \$5.00 or over, the Member Board to pay \$0.10 per registrant in good standing up to 3000 and \$0.05 per registrant for all over that number.

The effect of this would be to increase the total amount received from the Member Board fees from about \$2000 to about \$2700. Since the present maximum fee would be discontinued, it would increase the membership fees from some of the States having large registrations. This letter is of course, entirely preliminary and no doubt the final words will be the result of recommendations received in replies from the various Member Boards. It would be much appreciated if, in your reply you would answer the following questions:

- 1--Would your Board approve an amendment to the Constitution along the lines suggested?
- 2--What is the maximum amount your Board could pay to the National as membership fee?
- 3.-Are there any legal restrictions in case of your Board which would prohibit your paying the amount called for by the suggested amendment?
- 4.-What suggestions has your Board to offer regarding financing the work of the National Council?

Upon the recommendation of Mr. Wallingford, Mr. Becker made the following motion. "I move that the letter from the National Council of State Boards of Engineering Examiners be referred to Dean G. M. Butler for his opinion and that his recommendations be presented to the executive committee at an early date". Seconded by Mr. Merritt. Carried unanimously. The following information was presented to the Board by Mr. L.M. Fitzhugh Guote:

"Camelback Inn Inc.-New Hotel- Cost approximately \$150,000.00 No. Registered Architect- Ed Loomis Bowes, charge of drawing plans. Jack Stewart, Nanager--Lincoln, Principal Owner. Report Lincoln would object thru his attorney any effort to require him to engage a registered architect".

A motion was made by Mr. Becker and seconded by Mr. Merritt that the secretary be instructed to send a copy of the information presented by Mr. Fitzhugh to the Attorney-General and ask him for an opinion on this case and the possible assistance that the office of the Attorney-General

would give in the event that prosecution of the case became necessary. Carried unanimously.

REPORT ON THE N. C. S. B. E. E. MEETING KNOXVILLE

This was the best attended meeting of any yet held by the Council. All of the members of several Boards were present and two Boards even brought their attorneys with them. Maine, Nevada, Washington, and Alabama have joined the Council since last year's meeting, and no Boards have withdrawn therefrom.

Some very eminent men who are members of Boards were present and active in the work of the Council. It was a pleasure to become better acquainted with them. I have in mind particularly Dr. D. W. Mead of Wisconsin and Dr. C. F. Scott of Connecticut.

It was decided to raise the Secretary's salary slightly by charging member boards 10¢ per registrant, but the Board of Directors was given the power to reduce the assessment of any Board if financially or legally unable to pay the new rate. It was made clear that the Council desires every Board in the country to be affiliated with it no matter how little it can contribute to its support.

The Secretary reported that he was able to persuade the Cuban engineers to modify a provision of the registration law that they were writing which would have required registrants to be Cuban citizens. The law approved April 3, 1936, now provides that "Engineers who are citizens of states which do not require Cubans to be citizens of that country in order to practice the profession of engineering

shall enjoy in Cuba the right of reciprocity."

It was reported that in Colorado an organization of Master plumbers called themselves an engineering society, and could not be prevented from so doing because the law applies merely to persons, firms, or corporations and not societies. Our law has the same defect.

It was reported that the National Bureau of Registration had during the year received 67 applications of which 48 had been approved, 2 rejected, and 17 were pending. It is evident that interest in the Bureau is increasing and that it will become more and more useful as time goes on.

The Committee on Uniform Questions reported that it expected by next year to submit a lengthy report which would include many sample examination questions from every Board. There was much discussion of examinations and the majority appeared to approve of short, practical examinations, and of permitting the use of any books, notes, or tables desired. It should be stated, however, that some of the delegates were emphatic in stating their belief that examinations should be lengthy and should include papers on fundamental subjects like mathematics, physics, and chemistry.

The weather was delightful and the social features of the meeting were very pleasant. Trips to the Norris Dam and the Big Smoky Mountains were especially entertaining and instructive. I em grateful to the Board for making it possible for me to see a part of the country with which I was previously unfamiliar.


FINANCE COMMITTEE:
