REPORT ON EXAMINATIONS

The Examination Committee met at 9:00 A.M., January 17, 1963. Dr. Shell recommended that the Board change the way the examinations have been given in the past in that the Committee would like to form the examination theirselves. Dr. Shell requested the Executive Secretary to prepare a survey of examinations for the meeting in February. The meeting was then opened for discussion. Mr. Young said that the architects were referring back to old examinations quite often so that no duplication occurs and still cover the same general area. Dr. Shell moved that the examination committee form the examinations for April of 1963 from a review of the past examinations given along with other added questions on professionalism that they might come up with. Seconded by Mr. Royden and carried unanimously. Dr. Shell requested the Executive Secretary to write to all other states and procure copies of their examinations if possible. This would help in evaluating the written examination that an applicant has taken in another state. Also, Dr. Shell wished to recommend to the Board that they only give two E.I.T. examinations each year at the same time as our normal examination period. The last week in April was set for the examinations, the E.I.T. to be on April 27th, the rest of the examination the following week. Dr. Shell moved that we do schedule our E.I.T. examination to coincide with the regular examinations. Seconded by Mr. Weaver and carried unanimously. Dr. Shell recommended that this office maintain and purchase, if possible, all books or records of examinations that have been used in the country on professional engineering, including books of the laws of other states. All members were in agreement. Dr. Shell moved that the Board accept the revised list of grades. Seconded by Mr. Young and carried unanimously.

Mr. Girand reported that we hope to have a preliminary rough draft of proposed changes to submit at the June Board meeting. There is nothing specific to present to the Committee today.

REPORT OF THE EXAMINATIONS COMMITTEE

Engineering Committee

Dr. Shell reported that we have been in contact with the two Universities with respect to the examinations. Arizona State University would like to maintain a supply of application blanks for their students to take the Engineer-in-Training examination and to give the E.I.T. examination on campus. They also wanted to know our feelings whether it should be a requisite for graduation that they take the E.I.T. The Board feels it should be encouraged but not mandatory.

Dr. Shell recommended that we do supply the Universities with application blanks. Seconded by Mr. Stufflebean and carried unanimously.

Dr. Shell recommended that we should allow them to give the E.I.T. examination on campus. Question by Mr. Dryden: Would we have to incur any of the expenses?

Dr. Shell answered that Dean Beakley would provide accommodations and we would pay the monitors. Those who do not attend the University but who have to take Parts 1 and 2 will also take them at Arizona State University.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Stufflebean and carried unanimously.

It was also recommended to the Board we compare the curriculum of the two Universities.

The committee recommended that the examinee be allowed to take the examination questions with him at the completion of the examination. Seconded by Mr. Stufflebean and carried unanimously.

The Executive Secretary explained the booklet that would be used whereby they would be easier to grade. The committee recommends that we adopt this booklet. Seconded by Mr. Royden and carried unanimously.

The Executive Secretary is to purchase a trial set of 1000 booklets.

Dr. Shell recommended that past examinations be made public and interested parties notified. Seconded by Mr. Royden and carried unanimously. They are not to be released before the Board has approved them.

Mr. Stufflebean addressed the Installations Design Engineers at Luke Field on the subject of the values of registration.

Mr. Dryden reported that the Northern Chapter of ASPE has taken some action by forwarding a resolution to the State Chapter as being opposed to it.

Mr. Girand has written to several societies asking them to assist in blocking this.

At this time, Mr. Girand gave to each member present a quotation from the Arizona Supreme Court - No. 6541, State Board of Technical Registration vs. Leonard F. McDaniel to wit:

". . . Indeed the Board would be remiss in its duty if it did not investigate complaints made to it to see if such acts constituted professional misconduct sufficient upon which to predicate formal charges."

Mr. Girand felt the Board should follow these instructions handed down by the Arizona Supreme Court.

Mr. Weaver reported architects are not to compete by free sketch drawings which was done in this case. He was not licensed at the time and not under the direct supervision of a licensed architect.

The Executive Committee recommended that it be turned over to the Phoenix Grievance Committee.

The plans were stamped by Mr. Richards and quoted "not an architect". We have no jurisdiction over a non-registrant. The Executive Secretary was instructed to write a letter to Mr. Matthiessen explaining we do not have any authority in this case. He may take civil action if he desires.

This Board should send a copy of Mr. Ross' letter to the Professional Societies without comment.

Mr. Dryden said the reason for this opinion being requested was the Gordon D. Jorgensen who was in responsible charge of a firm in Arizona and did not have his name imprinted on the stationery. The Executive Secretary stated that Mr. Jorgensen had furnished us with a copy of their stationery with his name on it.

- 4. Opinions requested from Attorney General's office.
 - a. How the Board should answer Marx's letter.
 - b. Mohave Construction Company, issuing of building permits.

At this time, The Executive Secretary reported we have had no answer from the Attorney General's office. However, we have sent a copy of the Standard Building Code to Mr. Lawson.

Discussion was brought up regarding Mr. Marx's letter and the merit system. Whether city, county or State engineers are engineers or just technicians or aids. Many of them have worked 30 years and would be unable to pass the examination and are specialized in one field of engineering, i.e., highway, sanitation, etc.

Where is the line to be drawn on the different branches of engineering. There are requests for industrial and electronics branches because of the industries located here.

A booklet, "Curriculum Leading to First Degrees in Engineering", was passed out which had 38 curricula of accredited engineering.

- 5. Meetings attended by the Executive Secretary since the last Executive Committee meeting:
 - January 21 Flagstaff Chapter A.S.P.E.
 - January 28 N.S.P.E. refresher course at Tempe.

 It developed in my mind in a post-meeting discussion with the men attending this refresher course that there was some need of revision in particularly the Electrical classification of registration to permit men highly specialized in electronics with no lighting or power experience or general education to obtain professional status. This was further indicated as a basic need in that Phoenix and Arizona are advancing to the point that they will be eventually known as the electronics center of the country.

This was covered under number four.

6. The Executive Secretary read a letter requesting a temporary certificate.

This man had a temporary certificate in 1958. He asked the committee if the law is interpreted to mean that only one temporary certificate in allifetime or for one project only for a period of 90 days. Mr. Dryden suggested we request an opinion from the Attorney General as to how this law is interpreted. We also had a request for a temporary certificate on two different churches but only one temporary form submitted with a check for \$50.00. The Executive Secretary was instructed to have him submit two temporary forms and another \$50.00.

The Executive Secretary passed out a letter from the Verde Valley Chamber of Commerce. The Executive Secretary was instructed to answer the letter and state that the Board assumes it is perfectly valid and suggest that they contact their attorney for an opinion.

House Bill 177

Changes the present code to allow the design of buildings up to \$20,000.00 and any single family residence.

Mr. Weaver said the younger man who comes out of school could very well be making a living for a few years on these type of dwellings as they start out in the residential field. Whether \$10,000.00 is too low or \$20,000.00 is a little bit too high, he cannot say.

The Board cannot act on this bill; however, as individuals we can accomplish opposing it through the professional societies.

Mr. Royden felt we should look into getting space in the State Capitol complex. We could remain in the same space and use another Board room in the building for meetings since they are only 4 times a year. It was requested we see if there is a room available downstairs for the next Board meeting.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

There was no meeting of the Executive Committee between May 9th and June 13th and no report was submitted.

REPORT OF THE CERTIFIED PUBLIC ACCOUNTANT

No report from the Certified Public Accountant was presented and it was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Young that C. J. Smith be notified that his services as Certified Public Accountant are not required after July 1, 1963, and the he be removed from the payroll as of June 30th. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Stufflebean and seconded by Mr. Girand that the Office Proceedure Committee be charged with exploring the necessity of having an outside C.P.A. for the Board. Mr. Lawson will meet with the Committee and State Auditor in this matter. Motion carried.

REPORT OF BY LAWS AND RULES COMMITTEE

The Rules and By-Laws Committee made its report on the proposed changes to the Rules and By-Laws:

Mr. Girand, Chairman, presented detailed proposed revisions of which the following changes <u>underlined</u> were received without objection:

The following revised Rules and Regulations have been adopted by the Board pursuant to authority of Section 32-106, Arizona Revised Code, 1956.

RULE 1. GENERAL RULES

- 1. The Board meets regularly in March, June, September, and December. Applications to be considered at any of these meetings must be filed at the office of the Board not later than the first of February, May, August, or November, respectively. The Board will not consider any application until all of the required information concerning the application has been received. This includes a standard application form completely filled out (including) signature and affidavit) a fee of \$25.00 if for Architect, Geologist, or Professional Engineer, \$15.00 if for Assayer or Land Surveyor, \$15.00 if for an Architect-in-Training, \$10.00 if for Engineer-in-Training or Geologistin-Training, a transcript of record from all colleges attended (the applicant should arrange to have these transcripts sent directly from the college registrar to the office of the Board), and replies from references. The applicant's sole responsibility regarding references is that of furnishing a suitable list. It is the duty of the office of the Board to request information from these references. These references should include at least three registered persons, if possible in the same general field of experience as the applicant. Other persons will be acceptable as references only if their responsibility and their ability to evaluate the technical competence of the applicant can be established by the Board.
- 2. Engineers desiring registration in more than one branch must submit a separate application for each branch and pay the regular fee with each application. Registration in Engineering will be granted in the major branches: Chemical, Civil, Electrical, Mechanical, Metallurgical, Mining, Nuclear and Structural.
- 3. The Board does not grant registration to residents of other states, except under unusual circumstances, unless they hold registration in the state of their legal residence. Every case is carefully considered on its merits.
- 4. When registration is denied the applicant will be so notified. No. re-application will be considered until one year has elapsed. When applications are denied the following refunds will be made: Architect, Engineer or Geologist \$12.50, Assayer or Land Surveying \$7.50, except that should the applicant take a written examination and fail it, no refund will be made.
- 5. All applicants must complete a personal audience before a member of the Board or a designated representative. The personal audience will be held at a time and place convenient to the Board. However, consideration will be given to applicants for a change in time and place when request is made in writing.
- 6. No application made on any other than a printed form issued by the Board shall be accepted or considered by the Board, excepting that, in the event any printed form issued by the Board does not contain sufficient space for the necessary evidence to be submitted, the applicant may attach additional sheets to said form to any desired extent, but such attached sheets shall be of the same size as the printed form and shall be securely attached thereto.

RULE II. EXAMINATIONS

A. General Rules

- 1. Applicants held for an examination but who fail to take it will be denied registration and forfeit the entire application fee. Applicants who are unable to take the examination on the required date shall notify the Board 10 days in advance and request an extension of time. Applicants who take an examination but who fail to achieve a passing grade will be allowed to take the next examination upon payment of the fee.
- 2. The examinations or portions thereof may be waived by the Board when, in the Boards opinion an applicant has a proven experience record of unusual and comprehensive quality.
- 3. The examinations need not necessarily be held in the same place or on successive days, the schedule being subject to the Board's convenience in conducting the examinations.
- 4. Applicants for Architect-in-Training, Engineer-in-Training and Geologist-in-Training will be permitted to take the basic examination prior to graduation, but their probationary period will not start until they have completed the requirements for graduation. Applicants without college degrees desiring to enter the Architect-in-Training, Engineer-in-Training or Geologist-in-Training program will be permitted to take the examination prior to the completion of four years of satisfactory experience by submitting an application bearing the approval of a registered architect, engineer, or geologist respectively, but their probationary period will not begin until the four years of experience satisfactory to the Board requirement has been met. Any architectural, engineering or geological college student may take the basic examination on a regularly scheduled date by submitting an application on the proper form bearing the approval by his dean or major professor. It will be necessary for him to pay the \$15.00 or \$10.00 fee required as listed above (Rule I.1) for registration as an Architect-in-Training, Engineer-in-Training, or Geologist-in-Training before taking the examination. If he passes the examination, full credit for his payment will be given on his application for registration as an Architect, Engineer, or Geologist. Should be fail the examination he will not be permitted to take it again without submitting another applications form properly approved and paying the fee.

Passing such an examination will not obligate the Board to accept him for registration as an Architect-in-Training, Engineer-in-Training, or Geologist-in-Training. It will satisfy the examination requirement should he be accepted.

5. All professional examinations (Architects, Assayers, Engineers, Geologists, and Land Surveyors) will be given regularly, at least twice annually, during the months of April and October.

Engineer-in-Training and Geologist-in-Training examinations will be given regularly, twice annually, during the first week of December and May. Applications for these examinations must be received by November 15 or April 15 respectively.

Architect-in-Training examinations will be given regularly, twice annually, during the months of April and October. Applications for this examination must be received by March first or September first, respectively.

B. CONTEXT OF EXAMINATIONS

- 1. All examinations shall contain questions covering the code of the State Board of Technical Registration.
- 2. Architect-in-Training This examination will include; History and Theory, concerning the development of architecture; the effect of geography, climate, and material resources; the factors of site and orientation; the influence of science and technology; The varying response to the needs and desires of the changing social pattern; the evolution of design, methods of construction, structural systems, and building equipment; the influence of tradition and law. Typical historical examples. Structural Design, concerning the knowledge of various structural systems; when, how, and why each would be used; the determination of safe and efficient sizes of structural elements and arrangements of combinations of such elements as slabs, beams, girders, trusses, columns, walls, foundations, and footings, designed in various materials by either graphical or mathematical analysis. Building Equipment, concerning principles of design and detailed knowledge concerning heating, ventilating, air conditioning, plumbing, electric wiring, refrigeration, fire protection, and vertical transportation; taking into account scientific, technical, economic and practical factors; also compliance with codes for public health and safety.
- 3. Architecture This examination will be a four day examination, and will include: History and Theory, the development of architecture; the effect of geography, climate and material resources; the factors of site and orientation; the influence of science and technology. The varying response to the needs and desires of the changing social patter; the evolution of design, methods of construction, structural systems, and building equipment; the influence of tradition and law. Typical historical examples. Site planning, a short design problem involving a group of public or private buildings of any type, intended to demonstrate the candidate's ability to safeguard the interest of both client and public with respect to land value, obsolescence, traffic; to develop a functional arrangement of buildings and site which will also result in a visually satisfying composition of forms in space. Architectural Design, a specific practical problem involving application of the principles of space design to solution of the program for a building such as might be found in architectural practice. The solution shall be submitted in drawings of specified number, kind, and scale to present an efficient arrangement, logical structural organization, compliance with basic codes for health and safety; also appropriate economy and satisfying aesthetic quality. Building Construction, the use of materials and methods of construction. The selection of appropriate materials and knowledge of how they are combined for use under given conditions, considering their practicality and durability, also the factors of safety, economy, and architectural expression. Supervision of construction; detection and correction of defects; sequence of construction operations. Structural Design, the knowledge of various structural systems; when, how, and why each would be used; the determination of safe and efficient sizes of structural elements and arrangements of combinations

of such elements as slabs, beams, girders, trusses, columns, walls, foundations, and footings, designed in various materials by either graphical or mathematical analysis. Professional Administration, questions relating to the ethical, legal, and administrative responsibilities of the architect; relationships between architect, owner, and contractor; building laws, lien laws, specifications, contracts, bonds, insurance, certificates, and arbitration. Building Equipment, principles of design and detailed knowledge concerning heating, ventilating, air conditioning, plumbing, electric wiring, refrigeration, fire protection, and vertical transportation; taking into account scientific, technical, economic and practical factors; also compliance with codes for public health and safety. Credit will be allowed registered Architects-in-Training for examinations previously taken and passed.

- 4. Assaying this will be a one day examination which will include questions on fire assaying and gravimetric and volumetric chemical analysis of minerals and mineral products for the more important commercial metals.
- 5. Engineer-in-Training or Basic Engineering This examination will cover such mathematics, basic science and engineering subjects as are common to each curriculum of accredited engineering colleges. This examination may include questions and problems in drawing, mathematics, chemistry, physics, mechanics, strength of materials, hydraulics, fundamentals of thermodynamics, economics and electricity. It will be a one day examination. This examination will generally be required of any applicant for registration as a professional engineer who graduated from an engineering college subsequent to January 1, 1953, and of all non-college graduates applying for registration as professional engineers. This rule will not be waived except in cases of outstanding comprehensive qualities when agreed to by the Board.
- 6. Professional Engineering The complete professional examination for engineers is composed of 5 parts (except for Structural Engineerings which requires one additional day (8 hours) of examination) described as follows:

Part 1 (4 hours written) Basic Sciences and Mathematics

Part 2 (4 hours written) Engineering Sciences

Part 3 (4 hours written) Engineering Analysis

Part 4 (4 hours written) Engineering Design

Part 5 (10-30 minutes oral) Personal Audience*

Any one part, or combination of parts 1, 2, 3, and 4, may be waived by the Board, or a comprehensive oral examination substituted, when, in the Board's opinion, the evidence submitted by the applicant satisfies the Board that the applicant is fully qualified to practice the profession of Engineering in the branch specified.

All examinations are "open book" and the applicant may bring any texts or references desired. A slide rule and tables of logarithms and trigonometric functions will be helpful. Paper will be supplied by the Board. Special instructions are printed on each examination.

A grade of 70% will be required on each part for which the examinate is held.

- 7. Any one part or combination of Parts 1, 2, 3 and 4 in the Engineering examinations outlined in P. 5 and 6 Supra may be waived by the Board or a comprehensive oral examination substituted when, in the opinion of the Board, the evidence submitted by the applicant satisfies the Board that the applicant is qualified to practice the profession of engineering in the branch specified. All examinations are "open book" and the applicant may bring any texts or references desired. Paper will be supplied by the Board. Special instructions are printed on each examination. Records of past examinations are available for study in the office of the Board. However, such records may not be taken from the office of the Board.
- 8. Geologist-in-Training This will be a one day examination in two parts: Part I, examination consisting of questions covering the principles of physical, Thistorical, and structural geology, and mineralogy. Part II, examination consisting of problems in structural geology.
 - 9. Geology The complete professional examination for geologists is

Part 1 (4 hour written) Basic Geology I

Part 2 (4 hour written) Basic Geology II

Part 3 (4 hour written) Applied Geology

Part 4 (4 hour written) Geologic Problems

Part 5 (15-30 minutes oral) Personal Audience*

Any one part, or combination of parts 1, 2, 3, and 4, may be waived by the Board, or a comprehensive oral examination substituted, when, in the Board's opinion, the evidence submitted by the applicant satisfies the Board that the applicant is fully qualified to practice the profession of Geology.

A grade of 70% will be required on each part for which the examinate is held.

10. Land Surveying - This will be a two day examination which will include questions to determine knowledge of the techniques of Land Surveying; also knowledge of rules, regulations, and laws appertaining to the type of work described in Section 32-101 (12) of our State Code.

*Part 5 - Personal Audiences

This is an oral examination of 15-30 minutes given at a time and place convenient for the Board and will include questions covering the "Code, Rules, and By-Laws" of the State Board of Technical Registration.

RULE III. EXPERIENCE

1. Qualifying experience, other than time allowed for education, shall in general be limited to that time in which an applicant has been directly employed in a responsible position of a character satisfactory to the Board.

RULE IV. TEMPORARY PERMITS

1. Temporary Permits may be issued to Registrants of other states covering one project for a period not to exceed 90 days. The applicant for a Temporary Permit shall file an application for registration complete in all respects, with his application for a Temporary Permit, including payment of the Application for Registration fee.

RULE V. SEALS

An imprint of the registrant's valid seal shall appear on each and every sheet of drawings and on the cover and index page of each set of specifications and/or reports or other professional documents, prepared by a registrant or his bonafide employee, over which the original signature of the registrant shall be indelibly superimposed.

RULE VI. REVISIONS

Any revisions in the Rules I and Regulations adopted by the Board pursuant to authority of Arizona Revised Statutes of January 1956 as amended, shall be proposed and discussed at a regular meeting and if approved, publication shall be made and a hearing shall be called as required by Law for the next meeting of the Board, at which time action will be taken.

B Y - L A W S Section I

NAME, SEAL, MEETINGS, AND ORGANIZATION

1. Name:

The name of this Board shall be the State Board of Technical Registration. This organization shall subsequently be referred to in these By-Laws as the Board. Wherever reference is made to Law, the same shall refer to Arizona Revised Statutes of January, 1956, and amendments thereto.

2. Seal:

The seal of the Board shall be as follows: An embossed circular seal consisting of three concentric circles, one and one-quarter ($1\frac{1}{4}$) inches, one and one-half ($1\frac{1}{2}$) inches, and one and three-quarters (1 3/4) inches in diameter. At the top of the annular space between the two larger circles shall appear the words: "State Board of Technical Registration". Beginning near the bottom of the left side between the two smaller circles shall appear the words "For Architects, Assayers, Engineers, Geologists, and Land Surveyors." At the bottom of the annular space between the two larger circles shall appear the words, "Arizona, U.S.A.". Within the inner circle shall appear the Coat of Arms of Arizona.

3. Meetings:

Except as hereafter provided, regular meetings of the Board shall be held quarterly within each of the months of March, June, September, December, the exact date or dates of each meeting to be determined at the preceding meeting, or by the Chairman or Acting Chairman if the Board leaves the decision to him or if an emergency makes it unwise to conform to the decision reached by the Board.

When in the judgment of the Chairman of the Board, the work as prescribed for the Board by statute and by the procedure elsewhere set forth is insufficient to warrant the expense of a meeting of the Board, the Chairman may require a referendum of the Executive Committee, and on such support order the regular meeting to be postponed to another date, or waived for the quarterly period and memorandum of such action entered in the minutes of the next subsequent meeting of the Board.

All meetings shall be called for such time and at such place as may be designated by the Chairman, and stated by notice of such meetings, which notices shall be sent to all members of the Board two weeks in advance of the date thereof. Special meetings may be called at any time by the order of the Chairman, and shall be called by the Secretary when written request is filed therefor by three members of the Board. Due notices of such special meetings shall be given each member.

4. Organization

At the regular meeting of the Board in <u>September</u> of each year the Board shall elect from its members a Chairman, Vice-Chairman and Secretary who shall assume the duties of their office at the close of this meeting.

The Chairman shall, as soon thereafter as practicable, appoint from among the members of the Board the following standing committees: Executive, By-Laws and Rules, Public Information, National Council of Architectural Registration Boards, Budget Committee, Grievance Committee No. 1, Grievance Committee No. 2, and such other committees as may be required to facilitate the work of the Board.

Section II

DUTIES

1. Chairman:

The Chairman shall, when present, preside at all meetings, shall appoint all committees, shall sign all certificates, and other official documents, other than correspondence, and shall otherwise perform all duties ordinarily pertaining to the office of Chairman. All claims shall be signed by either the Chairman or Vice-Chairman. The Chairman shall be Ex-Officio member of all committees.

2. Vice-Chairman:

The Vice-Chairman shall, in the absence or incapacity of the Chairman, exercise the duties and then possess all the powers of the Chairman.

3. Secretary:

The secretary of the Board shall perform all duties as prescribed by the law and shall act as the general advisor of the Board, to the office of the Board. The secretary shall sign all claims encumbered against Board funds.

4. Executive Secretary:

The Board shall retain an Executive Secretary, who shall have charge of the office of the Board, together with such clerical assistance as may be deemed necessary.

5. Executive Committee:

The Executive Committee shall consist of the elected officers of the Board and three other members and its duties shall be to transact all business of the Board during intervals between regular or special meetings (except authorize the issuance of Certificates of Registration) and to make a report to the Board thereon at its next special or regular meeting.

6. By-Laws and Rules Committee:

The By-Laws and Rules Committee shall consist of three members who shall from time to time consider and recommend to the Board such modifications of the by-laws and rules governing examinations and other procedure of the Board as will secure best operating results.

The Committee shall report to the Board at each regular meeting and may report at any special meeting.

7. Public Information Committee:

The Committee on Public Information shall consist of all members, and its duties shall be to disseminate information concerning the policies and activities of the Board.

8. National Council of Architectural Registration Boards Committee:

The N. C. A. R. B. committee shall consist of the ex-officio member and four other members of the Board. The duties of this committee shall be to transact all business relating to the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards.

9. Budget Committee:

The Budget Committee shall consist of three members of the Board. The duties of this committee shall be to present to the Board at each September meeting the proposed budget for the following fiscal year.

10. Grievance Committee No. 1:

This committee shall consist of three members of the Board whose residence shall be convenient to the northern and central part of the State.

The duties of this committee shall be to investigate complaints made against Registrants and Non-Registrants and to recommend Board action.

11. Grievance Committee No. 2:

This committee shall consist of three members of the Board whose residence shall be convenient to the central and southern part of the State.

The duties of this committee shall be to investigate complaints made against Registrants and Non-Registrants and to recommend Board action.

Section III

PROCEDURE

1. Order of Business:

At each regular or special meeting of the Board the order of business shall be as follows:

- 1. Reading of the minutes of the last meeting.
- 2. Report of the Executive Committee.
- Report of By-Laws and Rules Committee (required at regular meeting).
- 4. Report on Examinations.

- 5. Report of Public Information Committee.
- 6. Report of N. C. A. R. B. Committee.
- 7. Report of Budget Committee.
- 8. Report of Grievance Committee No. 1. 9. Report of Grievance Committee No. 2.
- 9. Report of Grievance Committees.

 10. Report of Special Committees.
- 11. Reading of Communications.
- 12. Reading and considering of applications.
- 13. Unfinished business.
- 14. New Business.
- 15. Adjournment.

2. Voting:

. Unless otherwise provided by the Act, a quorum of the Board being present, it shall be considered that favorable action has been taken upon any question if a majority of those present vote favorably.

Section IV

SEALS AND CERTIFICATES FOR REGISTRANTS

1. Description of Seals:

Each person registered under this Act must secure and use an embossed circular seal, or rubber stamp, one and one-half (1½) inches in diameter, consisting of two concentric circles, the outer circle to be one and one-eighth (1 1/8) inches in diameter. The upper portion of the annular space between the two circles shall bear whichever of the following phrases is applicable to the registrant: "Registered Architect", or Registered Professional Engineer", "Registered Geologist", "Registered Land Surveyor", or "Registered Assayer". At the bottom of the annular space between the two circles shall appear the inscription "Arizona, U.S.A.". The inner circle shall contain the name of the registrant and the words "Certificate expires Dec. 31, 19 " and in case of engineers, the branch of engineering in which registered.

2. Description of Certificate:

A Certificate of Registration of such size and form as the Board may approve shall be given to each registrant. Each registrant shall also receive a card on which shall be set forth all the data that appears on the Registrant's Certificate of Registration.

Section V

1. Amendments:

These By-laws may be amended at any regular or special meeting of the Board by favorable majority vote of the members present, provided a copy of the proposed amendment or amendments shall have been mailed to each member of the Board at least two weeks prior to the meeting at which it or they are to be considered.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Stufflebean that the above changes be tentatively approved and be circularized to all professional societies with the information that these changes would be presented for Board approval in September under Sections VI or VII of the By-Laws. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Royden and seconded by Dr. Shell that the Executive Secretary be directed to prepare for the Chairman's signature requests for opinions from the Attorney General on the following:

- 1. Can the State Board of Technical Registration register engineers as Professional Engineers without indicating the branches of engineering under which the applicant has indicated his proficiency?

Reginald Swartz is to be instructed that he should complete requirements for Engineer-in-Training before reapplying for professional registration.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

It was moved by Dr. Shell and seconded by Mr. Girand that the following letter to Land Surveying registrants be sent to all registrants, county supervisors, municipal officials and be published in the local newspapers and technical magazines. Motion carried.

It has come to the attention of this Board that Land Surveyors have been performing work of an engineering nature in connection with land surveys.

This is not authorized under Arizona Revised Statutes, 1956, Section 32-101(12), which is quoted as follows:

"12. 'Land surveyor' means a person who engages in the practice of surveying tracts of land for the determination of their correct locations, areas, boundaries and description, for the

purpose of conveyancing and recording, or for establishment or re-establishment of boundaries and plotting of lands and subdivisions."

A Land Surveyor may perform topographic surveying only solely incidental to the practice of his profession of land surveying and when it is necessary to properly perform his work as a land surveyor.

Where roads, utilities, grading or other construction work of an engineering character are to be laid out or specified as well as the location of land lines, a Professional Engineer shall be in direct supervision of the engineering work; or, the work should be done by a person registered both as a land surveyor and as a professional engineer.

It is suggested that persons registered in Arizona under 32-101(12) as Land Surveyors confine their work to land surveying as defined in the Statutes and, if qualified, secure registration as a Professional Engineer.

NEW BUSINESS

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Weaver that the following letter by the Building Department of the City of Tempe be circulated to all municipal and county officials in Arizona and that the City of Tempe be thanked for the action taken by their Building Department. Motion carried.

Because of the increased volume of building construction activity which the City of Tempe is appreciatively experiencing at the present time, the Building Inspection Department has found it advisable to establish the following "Plan Checking Procedure" in order to expedite the approval of building plans which is necessary prior to issuance of building permits:

- 1. For new buildings or additions and alterations to existing buildings, when the cost exceeds \$1000, there shall be two copies of the plans and specifications submitted to the Department.
- 2. At the time the plans and specifications are submitted, the applicant is requested to fill in the necessary information on a form to be furnished by the Department. (Copy of form referred to is enclosed.)
- 3. After the Department has completed the checking of the plans and specifications, all additions or corrections necessary for compliance with the City codes or ordinances will be outlined in a "plan check report", a copy of which will be returned to the applicant along with the two copies of plans and specifications which accompanied the request.

- 4. All additions or corrections outlined in the "plan check report" must be made in the original tracings of the plans and specifications, and new reproductions of same may then be submitted to the Department for final approval.
- When the plan check reveals no additions or corrections necessary, the building permit will be issued by the Department without further delay.
- 6. Plans and specifications for residential buildings, which are considered "models" and which will be duplicated in the development of a sub-division, need only be filed for plan check at the time the master development plan is filed. If at any time changes or additions to the "model plans" are desired by the developer, the modified plan shall be considered a new plan and two copies of same shall be submitted to the Department for approval.
- 7. After approval of the plans and specifications by the Department, one set will be stamped "Approved" and returned to the applicant and shall be kept on the building site at all times during which the work is in progress, and one set will be retained on file by the Department.

The approved plans and specifications shall not be changed, modified, or altered without authorization from the Department.

8. It will be the policy of the Department that after the plans and specifications have been approved, a building permit will be issued immediately upon the request of the applicant.

We would also like to set forth the following regulatory provisions which require certain plans and specifications to be prepared and designed by an architect or engineer licensed in the State of Arizona:

- One-story multi-family apartment buildings having an occupant load of more than twenty persons.
- New multi-family apartment buildings exceeding onestory in height.
- 3. New buildings which are designed or intended to be occupied for any commercial, industrial or public use.
- 4. Additions or alterations to the above mentioned buildings when the cost exceeds three thousand dollars (\$3,000).
- 5. These provisions are not intended to relieve any person of the responsibility to comply with the Code, Rules and By-Laws of the State Board of Technical Registration.

The following information must be shown on the plans and specifications:

- The first sheet shall give the street address of the building and the name and address of the owner and person who prepared them. (Address of building may be omitted on "Model" plans that are to be duplicated.)
- 2. A plot plan showing the location and dimensions of the proposed building and of every existing building on the property and the legal description of the land on which the work is to be done.
- 3. Plans and specifications shall be of sufficient clarity to indicate the nature and extent of the work proposed, and show in detail that it will conform to the provisions of the Building Code and all relevant laws, ordinances, rules and regulations.
- 4. Computations, stress diagrams, and other data sufficient to show the correctness of the plans, shall be submitted when required by the Department.
- 5. All plans shall be drawn to scale.

We believe that the procedure as outlined herein will provide a uniform basis by which application for building permits may be processed and approved by the City of Tempe Building Inspection Department with the least possible time delay to the building contractor and the property owner.

REPORT ON ENGINEERING EXAMINATIONS

He further reported that each member of the Board was requested to provide, if possible, questions to be used in Part 4 of the Professional Engineering examinations in October. These proposed questions are to be in the hands of the Chairman of the Examination Committee in time for editing and inserting in the examinations.

REPORT OF PUBLIC INFORMATION COMMITTEE

Dr. Shell reported on his attendance at the N.C.S.B.E.E. Convention in Honolulu, Hawaii, as a representative of the Arizona State Board of Technical Registration.

Mr. John Stufflebean reported on the same N.C.S.B.E.E. meeting which he attended as National President of the N.S.P.E.

The Executive Secretary reported on Board public relations and his attendance at society meetings in the period since August 2nd.

REPORT OF N.C.A.R.B. COMMITTEE

Mr. Frederick Weaver and Mr. Martin Ray Young reported on their attendance at the Western Conference meeting of the N.C.A.R.B. in Las Vegas, Nevada, and on progress made by the Conference regarding unified examination procedures. Mr. Young, Mr. Herreras, and Mr. Weaver reported on progress they are making towards the preparation of the October examination for Architectural registration candidates.

REPORT OF SPECIAL COMMITTEES

The Executive Secretary submitted the following tentative proposal for application review:

I. Office Procedure

- A. The file of the applicant is complete in every respect before he is notified that he has apparently met all requirements for registration and must appear for his personal audience.
- B. The office of the Board will poll the members on a rotating basis to arrange for definite time and date for interviews.
- C. The folder of the applicant with a copy of the current Arizona Revised Statutes, Rules and Regulations will be forwarded to the Board member, where at all possible, at least one day prior to the scheduled date.
- D. Personal audiences may be held individually or in a group as the Board member chooses.

II. Personal Audiences

- A. The Board member should by conversation assure himself that data supplied by the applicant and reviewed by the Board is consistent with the answers provided to the interviewing Board member.
- B. The applicant's familiarity with the Arizona Revised Statutes, Code, Rules and Regulations should be delved into by the interviewing member so as to indicate the applicant's familiarity with Arizona. (Each applicant will be provided when notified he is scheduled for personal audience with a copy of the Rules and Regulations.)
- C. The Board member should delve into the applicant's intention regarding Arizona registration and ascertain, if possible, the man's professional approach to his profession.
- D. The applicant should be quizzed by the member as to his familiarity with the geographical, geophysical, and climatic conditions of Arizona.
- E. The interviewing Board member should indicated to the applicant that registration is not granted until the next meeting of the Board following the personal audience by full Board action.
- F. The applicant should be informed that if registered, the Board, in addition to its prescribed police powers, is for the assistance of the applicant in pursuing his profession.

It was moved by Dr. Shell and seconded by Mr. Young that the Executive Secretary's recommendations be accepted. Motion carried.

The Budget Committee reported upon the budgeted amounts for Board operations for the year 1963-1964 and the affect of the electronic data processing upon Board employees and expenditures. It was reported by the Budget Committee that the electronic data processing procedure as proposed by the Office Procedures Committee could be within anticipated Board funds.

It was moved by Mr. Stufflebean and seconded by Mr. Royden that the report of the Budget Committee be accepted. Motion carried.

Grievance Committee #1 held an informal meeting on Thursday, August 15, 1963, at 1:30 P.M., in Room 221 of the Guaranty Bank Building, 3550 N. Central Avenue, Phoenix, Arizona.

The first registrant called before the Grievance Committee was Denis Peter Kutch, Architect #5247, regarding plans for an addition to Wagon Wheel Lanes, 4222 E. Thomas Road, for Delta Construction Company - James C. Reynolds. Mr. Kutch presented his explanation of the incomplete plans on which his seal had been placed and after considerable discussion, the Committee took the following action:

It was moved by Mr. Young and seconded by Mr. Girand that Grievance Committee #1 recommend to the Board that Mr. Denis Peter Kutch be formally reprimanded for his action in regard to these incomplete plans and that a copy of the letter be forwarded to Mr. James Elmore, Dean, Arizona State University Architectural Department, where Mr. Kutch serves as an instructor. Motion carried.

The Board next heard Mr. Robert Ewing, Civil Engineer #2534, in regard to his practicing architecture on an apartment building proposed for the corner of Glenrosa and 27th Avenue by Allied Contract Buyers, Inc. Mr. Ewing explained that he had prepared these plans, structural only, as a favor to

a friend. Mr. Ewing admitted upon questioning that the plans were architectural in nature. After considerable discussion, the Committee took the following action:

It was moved by Mr. Young and seconded by Mr. Weaver that Grievance Committee #1 recommend to the Board that Mr. Robert Ewing be written a formal reprimand and instructed to decease and desist from practicing architecture under his Civil Engineering registration. Motion carried.

William Sferra, Civil Engineer #2960, appeared before the Grievance Committee in the matter of practicing architecture for an apartment building for Nudo Development and Investment Company at 22nd Street and Roosevelt. The 22-unit apartment is now under construction. Mr. Sferra is an employee of Consolidated Western Steel, a division of United States Steel, as Plant Engineer in Phoenix. Mr. Sferra under questioning stated that the plans were drawn by a contract employee of his, that the work was done at a location other than his engineering office, and that he does perform as many as six of these projects a year. Mr. Sferra stated under questioning that the plans are architectural, that he provided only control of his draftsman during the evening hours, Saturdays and Sundays, and that inspection on the project was carried on during the same time. The draftsman used by Mr. Sferra lives approximately four miles from Mr. Sferra's residence. After considerable discussion, the Grievance Committee took the following action:

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Young that this committee recommend to the Board that Mr. Sferra be held for a formal hearing before the Board on the charge of practicing architecture under his Civil Engineering registration. Motion carried.

The Executive Secretary presented to the Grievance Committee a photostat of a letter in which one M. M. McPherson, an employee of John F. Long Homes, Inc., held himself out by signature and title as an Architect. The Executive Secretary was instructed to send Mr. McPherson the standard letter for registration if qualified with a copy to John F. Long.

The Grievance Committee adjourned at 4:00 P.M.

It was moved by Mr. Royden and seconded by Mr. Young that Mr. Denis Peter Kutch and Mr. Robert Ewing be reprimanded as recommended by the Grievance Committee. On the advice of the Assistant Attorney General, Jerry Lawson, it was moved by Mr. Young and seconded by Mr. Royden that Mr. William Sferra, Civil Engineer #2960, be reprimanded for preparing architectural plans under his Civil Engineer registration. Motion carried.

The Executive Secretary was directed to write such reprimands to the registrants involved.

Report of the Rules and By-Laws Committee - Mr. John Girand, Chairman, announced that today the Board would hear discussion of the proposed Rules and Regulations and By-Laws of the Board and, if approved, would select a date for a formal hearing and adoption. Mr. Jerry Lawson commented on the Rules and Regulations as to their pertaining to the Law. Mr. Girand instructed

the Executive Secretary to begin reading the Rules and Regulations and stop whenever a Board member or guest raised a point on a particular rule. Mr. Dryden raised a question on Rule I(A)(2) in that he felt that the branches of engineering to be recognized by the Board should include Highway, Nuclear and Geological Engineering.

It was moved by Mr. Royden and seconded by Mr. Dryden that Highway, Nuclear and Geological Engineering be added to the list of major branches recognized by the Board. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Stufflebean that Rule I(A)(3), the last sentence, "Every case is carefully considered on its merits", be deleted. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Royden that Rule II(B)(4), (6) and (7) wherein the rule refers to Engineer-in-Training and Geologist-in-Training in not permitting re-examination be deleted. Motion carried.

There being no further discussion from the Board or from the floor on the proposed Rules and Regulations, it was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Weaver that formal publication of the Rules and Regulations be made and that 10:30 A.M., Friday, December 13th, be selected as the date of such hearing. Paolo Soleri spoke to the Board concerning his application for registration as an architect, requesting that the Board reconsider their requirements for his registration.

Mr. Girand submitted to the Board the proposed By-Laws of the State Board of Technical Registration. After discussion by members, it was suggested that Section II(5), Executive Committee, be changed so that the Executive Committee consists of all members of the Board.

Section II(8) was revised so that the N.C.A.R.B. Committee consists of the architect members of the Board.

There being no further discussion on the By-Laws, it was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Stufflebean that the corrected By-Laws be adopted and published.

BY-LAWS

Section 1

NAME, SEAL, MEETINGS, AND ORGANIZATION

1. Name:

The name of this Board shall be the State Board of Technical Registration. This organization shall subsequently be referred to in these By-Laws as the Board. Wherever reference is made to Law, the same shall refer to Arizona Revised Statutes of January 1956 and amendments thereto.

2. Seal:

The seal of the Board shall be as follows: An embossed circular seal consisting of three concentric circles, one and one-quarter (1½) inches, one and one-half (1½) inches, and one and three-quarters (1-3/4) inches in diameter. At the top of the annular space between the two larger circles shall appear the words: "State Board of Technical Registration." Beginning near the bottom of the left side between the two smaller circles shall appear the words "For Architects, Assayers, Engineers, Geologists, and Land Surveyors." At the bottom of the annular space between the two larger circles shall appear the words, "Arizona, U.S.A." Within the inner circle shall appear the Coat of Arms of Arizona.

3. Meetings:

Except as hereafter provided, regular meetings of the Board shall be held quarterly within each of the months of March, June, September, December, the exact date or dates of each meeting to be determined at the preceding meeting, or by the Chairman or Acting Chairman if the Board leaves the decision to him or if an emergency makes it unwise to conform to the decision reached by the Board.

When in the judgment of the Chairman of the Board, the work as prescribed for the Board by statute and by the procedure elsewhere set forth is insufficient to warrant the expense of a meeting of the Board, the Chairman may require a referendum of the Executive Committee, and on such support order the regular meeting to be postponed to another date, or waived for the quarterly period and memorandum of such action entered in the minutes of the next subsequent meeting of the Board.

All meetings shall be called for such time and at such place as may be designated by the Chairman, and stated by notice of such meetings, which notices shall be sent to all members of the Board two weeks in advance of the date thereof. Special meetings may be called at any time by the order of the Chairman, and shall be called by the Secretary when written request is filed therefore by three members of the Board. Due notices of such special meetings shall be given each member.

4. Organization:

At the regular meeting of the Board in September of each year, the Board shall elect from its members a Chairman, Vice-Chairman and Secretary who shall assume the duties of their office at the close of this meeting.

The Chairman shall, as soon thereafter as practicable, appoint from among the members of the Board the following standing committees: Executive, By-Laws and Rules, Public Information, National Council of Architectural Registration Boards, Budget Committee, Grievance Committee No. 1, Grievance Committee No. 2, and such other committees as may be required to facilitate the work of the Board.

Section II

DUTIES

1. Chairman:

The Chairman shall, when present, preside at all meetings, shall appoint all committees, shall sign all certificates, and other official documents, other than correspondence, and shall otherwise perform all duties ordinarily pertaining to the office of Chairman. All claims shall be signed by either the Chairman or Vice-Chairman, and Secretary of the Board. The Chairman shall be Ex-Officio member of all committees.

2. Vice-Chairman:

The Vice-Chairman shall, in the absence or incapacity of the Chairman, exercise the duties and then possess all the powers of the Chairman.

3. Secretary:

The Secretary of the Board shall perform all duties as prescribed by the Law and shall act as the general advisor of the Board, to the office of the Board. The Secretary shall sign all claims encumbered against Board funds.

4. Executive Secretary:

The Board shall retain an Executive Secretary, who shall have charge of the office of the Board, together with such clerical assistance as may be deemed necessary.

5. Executive Committee:

The Executive Committee shall consist of all members of the Board and its duties shall be to transact all business of the Board during intervals between regular or special meetings (except authorize the issuance of Certificates of Registration) and to make a report to the Board thereon at its next special or regular meeting. A quorum shall consist of five members.

6. By-Laws and Rules Committee:

The By-Laws and Rules Committee shall consist of three members who shall from time to time consider and recommend to the Board such modifications of the by-laws and rules governing examinations and other procedure of the Board as will secure best operating results.

The Committee shall report to the Board at each regular meeting and may report at any special meeting.

7. Public Information Committee:

The Committee on Public Information shall consist of all members, and its duties shall be to disseminate information concerning the policies and activities of the Board.

8. National Council of Architectural Registration Boards Committee:

The N. C. A. R. B. Committee shall consist of the Architect members of the Board. The duties of this committee shall be to transact all business relating to the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards.

9. Budget Committee:

The Budget Committee shall consist of three members of the Board. The duties of this committee shall be to present to the Board at each September meeting the proposed budget for the following fiscal year.

10. Grievance Committee No. 1:

This committee shall consist of three members of the Board whose residence shall be convenient to the northern and central part of the State. The duties of this committee shall be to investigate complaints made against registrants and non-registrants and to recommend Board action.

11. Grievance Committee No. 2:

This committee shall consist of three members of the Board whose residence shall be convenient to the central and southern part of the State. The duties of this committee shall be to investigate complaints made against registrants and non-registrants and to recommend Board action.

Section III

PROCEDURE

Order of Business:

At each regular or special meeting of the Board, the order of business shall be as follows:

- 1. Reading of the minutes of the last meeting.
- 2. Report of the Executive Committee.
- 3. Report of By-Laws and Rules Committee (required at regular meeting.)
- 4. Report on Examinations.
- 5. Report of Public Information Committee
- 6. Report of N.C.A.R.B. Committee.
- 7. Report of Budget Committee.
- 8. Report of Grievance Committee No. 1
- 9. Report of Grievance Committee No. 2
- 10. Report of Special Committees.

- 11. Reading of Communications.
- 12. Reading and considering of applications.
- 13. Unfinished business.
- 14. New business.
- 15. Adjournment.

2. Voting:

Unless otherwise provided by the Law, a quorum of the Board being present, it shall be considered that favorable action has been taken upon any question if a majority of those present vote favorably.

Section IV

1. Amendments:

These By-Laws may be amended at any regular or special meeting of the Board by favorable majority vote of the members present, provided a copy of the proposed amendment or amendments shall have been mailed to each member of the Board at least two weeks prior to the meeting at which it or they are to be considered.

MINUTES OF THE STATE BOARD OF TECHNICAL REGISTRATION December 13, 14, 1963

The meeting of the State Board of Technical Registration was called to order by Mr. Martin Ray Young, Jr., Chairman, in the Auditorium on the second floor of the Guaranty Bank Building, 3550 N. Central Avenue, Phoenix, Arizona, at 9:15 A.M. on Friday, December 13th.

All members and Mr. Jerry Lawson, Assistant Attorney General, were present.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Stufflebean that the minutes of the special meeting of the Board on November 8, 1963, be approved as written and presented. Motion carried.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

No Executive Committee meeting was held during the period of November 8th to December 13th.

REPORT OF BY-LAWS AND RULES COMMITTEE

Mr. Young surrendered temporary chairmanship to the Vice-Chairman, John H. Stufflebean.

The first item of business under the By-Laws and Rules Committee was the receipt of a report by Mr. Jerry Lawson, Assistant Attorney General, to the members of the Board. Mr. Lawson's comments and report are per the following letter dated November 29, 1963:

I have been supplied with a copy of the final draft of the proposed adoption of rules of the State Board of Technical Registration and the following are my final comments with reference to the proposed rules.

Referring to Rule I-A (3), it is felt that this rule is adding an additional qualification to those enumerated in A.R.S. §32-122. It is felt that this rule is not sound legally.

Referring to Rule II-B (1), it is noted that no specific mention is made of when the Board shall select and publish dates and location of the in-training examinations.

Referring to Rule II-B (2, 3), it is felt that these two rules are somewhat arbitrary for the reason that one allows an in-training examination to be taken only prior to graduation, while another allows an in-training examination to be taken within 12 months after graduation.

Referring to Rule II-B, (4, 6, 7), it is felt that these rules are definitely arbitrary in nature for the reason that one rule permits no re-examination while the other two impliedly permit re-examination, yet all three refer to in-training examinations.

Referring to Rule VI, it is felt that the Board cannot legally limit a temporary permit to cover one project only. This limitation is not called for either specifically or impliedly by any of the statutes governing the Board.

No doubt you will have questions with reference to the above comments and with this in mind I have requested of Mr. Edelblut that a period of time be set aside immediately prior to the hearing on the proposed rules on December 13, 1963, in which to discuss said comments.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Royden that Mr. Lawson's comments contained in his verbal report and letter to the Board be noted. Motion carried.

The Board then reviewed the published rules for which formal hearing was scheduled for 10:00 A.M. this date.

It was moved by Dr. Shell and seconded by Mr. Royden that the words "and mathematics" be deleted wherein it applies to Part I of the Engineer-in-Training and Professional Engineer Examinations. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Young and seconded by Mr. Dryden that the last line of Rule IV(1), "Description of Seals", have the following deleted: ", and the words 'Date Signed'." Motion failed.

It was moved by Dr. Shell and seconded by Mr. Young that Rule II-B (9) be added as follows: "All in-training certificates shall expire eight years after issuance."

During discussion on the motion, the Board was instructed by Mr. Lawson that the addition of this Rule without prior publication was not advisable at this time. He suggested that the Board notify those persons appearing at the formal hearing today that such an additional rule was contemplated and would be published for formal hearing later. At the conclusion of the discussion, Dr. Shell withdrew his motion.

Mr. Young assumed chairmanship of the Board and announced that it was five minutes to 10:00, the hour set for the formal hearing on the proposed repealing of the present Rules and By-Laws of the State Board of Technical Registration and the adoption of the new Rules, Number I through Number VII, and therefore declared a five-minute recess.

Mr. Young called a formal hearing on the proposed adoption of the rules of the State Board of Technical Registration to order at 10:00 A.M. and the following visitors were recorded as present: B. L. Harriott, University of Arizona; J. H. Killingsworth, Arizona Consulting Engineers Association; James E. Keller, Arizona Highway Department; W. T. Hamlyn, Consulting Engineer; H. A. Higbie, Arizona State Highway Department; John Eisenberg, Arizona State Highway Department; Dean Moody, Central Chapter ASPE; C. B. Gambrell, Arizona State University; B. J. Gallaher, Johnson & Gallaher; R. D. Kersten, Arizona State University; George Beakley, Arizona State University.

The Executive Secretary read the following communications to the Board in the record of the formal hearing:

The Executive Committee of the Arizona Section of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers speaking as the management body for our two hundred Mechanical Engineers wish to endorse and lend support to the new rule which you have proposed. Only through a periodic conscientious scrutiny of our profession can the high standards of ethics and morals be preserved.

As an interested Professional Engineer, I have read your publicity bulletin discussing the new rules which you wish to adopt. I will attempt to attend the public hearing on December 13, 1963, but in case I am not able to be there, I would like to express a few observations.

I am in complete accord with the Board's desire to more specifically delineate the registration requirements. However, there are areas where items are unnecessarily vague.

- 1) It seems needlessly inconsistent to require 75% as the passing grade for architects while all others require only 70%. One or the other number should be used throughout the rules to demonstrate a singularity of direction.
- 2) Rule II.B.2 speaks of a probationary period but it does not define it. If it is still four years, why not state it. Whatever the Board's policy is, it should be stated so as to prevent misinterpretation.
- 3) Rule C5 and C6, also F. 1 and F. 4 There is an inter-relationship between the EIT and the P.E. exams. It is not clear what is required in the nature of examinations to become a Professional Engineer.
- 4) Rule F.3. It seems needlessly confusing to use the initials N.C.A.R.B. since not everyone (myself included) knows what they stand for. I could find no other reference to these examinations in the text. I feel, for the sake of clarity and completeness, these examinations should be further discussed.
- 5) My last and most severe criticism concerns Rule II.A.3.

 There should be no exceptions to the rule that every Professional Engineer registered in Arizona be required to demonstrate his technical integrity by a comprehensive written examination. With no intent to impugn the integrity of the Board, it is conceivable that this loop hole may be

used to register an unqualified yet unscrupulous individual. One or two days of written examination not an unreasonable burden to be required of <u>all</u> Professional Engineers wishing to be registered in the State of Arizona.

I hope that these comments are taken in the spirit in which they have been presented. They represent an engineer's attempt at reducing the number of variables in a problem making the solution more accurate and meaningful.

Mr. W. T. Hamlyn questioned the feasability and advisability of the Board expanding the branches of registration recognized under Rule I-A (2). Mr. Dean Moody, representing ASPE, also spoke against the expanded major branches of engineering to be recognized by the Board. Mr. Moody's remarks were answered by Dr. B. J. Shell in great detail as for the reasoning used by the Board of Technical Registration in the proposed expansion. B. L. Harriott, representing the University of Arizona, the representatives from the State Highway Department, and H. A. Higbie spoke for the expansion to include Geological Engineering. George Beakley, representing Arizona State University, endorsed the proposed rules and the expanded branches of proficiency recognized.

The Executive Secretary informed all present of the proposed deletion of the words "and mathematics" as referring to Part I of the Engineering written examination and that the Board proposed advertising for a formal hearing on an addition to Rule II-B by adding number 9, "All in-training certificates shall expire eight years after issuance".

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Dryden that the favorable comments and objections recorded by the visitors be taken under advisement. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Stufflebean and seconded by Mr. Weaver that the formal hearing on the proposed repealing of the existing rules and adoption of new rules be closed since no further statements were presented by those present. Motion carried.

Chairman Young thanked all the visitors for attending and for their interest in professional registration and declared a five-minute recess to permit those visitors who intended to leave to depart.

Chairman Young again called the meeting to order and suspended the agenda to allow Mr. J. H. Killingsworth, attorney for the Arizona Consulting Engineers Association, Inc., to present his commentary in behalf of the Arizona Consulting Engineers Association, Inc.

Mr. Killingsworth stated that the Arizona Consulting Engineers Association had had numerous letters to the Board of Technical Registration concerning purported violations of the Technical Registration Act and they requested that they be advised at this time of the status. The correspondence in question referred to El Tanque Bowling Lanes and the functions of Arizona Foundation, Structural, and Soil Testing Engineers.

It was moved by Mr. Stufflebean and seconded by Mr. Royden that the Executive Secretary be instructed to advise the Executive Secretary of the Arizona Consulting Engineers Association of the actions of this Board in regard to El Tanque Bowling Lanes as are recorded in the minute book of the Board. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Stufflebean and seconded by Mr. Girand in the matter of the Arizona Foundation, Structural, and Soil Testing Engineers, that the Executive Secretary advise the Executive Secretary of the Arizona Consulting Engineers Association that the Board would appreciate factual information as to the violations that the Arizona Foundation, Structural, and Soil Testing Engineers may have committed and provide this Board with assistance in disciplinary action if required. Motion carried.

Mr. Killingsworth thanked the Board for the opportunity to appear before them and accepted the motions made by the members and their discussion of intended course of action.

Chairman Young continued the report of the By-Laws and Rules Committee by John Girand.

It was moved by Dr. Shell and seconded by Mr. Herreras that Ceramic Engineering be deleted from the major branches of engineering presently recognized by the Board as described in Rule I-A (2). Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Royden that all present rules, regulations and by-laws of the State Board of Technical Registration be repealed as of this date. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Dr. Shell that the rules, numbers I through VII, as publicized and filed for notification with the Secretary of State and discussed at the formal hearing this date, be adopted after the deletion of Ceramic from Rule I-A (2) and the words "and mathematics" in Rule II-B (6) and Rule II-C (5 and 6) as relating to Part I of the examinations. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Royden that the by-laws of the State Board of Technical Registration as discussed and recorded at the special meeting of this Board on November 8, 1963 be adopted and published. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Royden and seconded by Mr. Stufflebean that the Executive Secretary be instructed to file the necessary papers for formal hearing on an additional rule, number II-B (9), "All in-training certificates shall expire eight years after issuance.", the date of the formal hearing to be established as March 13, 1964. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Weaver and seconded by Mr. Royden that the Board extend to John Girand a vote of thanks and appreciation for the fine work as chairman of the Rules and By-Laws Committee in the preparation and presentation of the Rules and By-Laws just adopted. Motion carried.

Chairman Young continued the agenda with a call for the report on examinations from the Architectural and Engineering Examination Committees.

REPORT OF GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE #1

Chairman Dryden presented the following report of Grievance Committee meeting held December 4th:

The meeting of Grievance Committee #1 was called to order at 1:30 P.M., Wednesday, December 4, 1963, by Mr. C. W. Dryden, Committee Chairman. Present were Mr. Dryden, H. L. Royden, Frederick P. Weaver and Martin Ray Young, Jr., Mr. John Girand was absent.

Donald Burns Bauer - Mr. Bauer appeared first before the Board at its request concerning a Pet Clinic and Pet Shop in the Darnell Plaza, Tempe, and the Tempe Mortuary. He also appeared regarding an advertisement in the Arizona Architect/Builder by Peter Roosen, Contractor, in which Mr. Roosen holds himself out as the designer. The plans of the Darnell Plaza Pet Shop and the Tempe Mortuary were presented for building permits under the seal and signature of Donald Burns Bauer. Mr. Bauer stated to the Grievance Committee that he was the author of the projects and that Mr. Roosen had previously been an employee and that Mr. Bauer was responsible for the plans. Mr. Bauer stated that he had written the Arizona Architect/Builder and the Salt River Project, the sponsors of the subject advertisement, that he and not Mr. Roosen was the architect on the Tempe Mortuary. Mr. Bauer promised to provide the Board with copies of his letters to the above firms.

The Grievance Committee, after reviewing the matter presented, concluded that there was no apparent violation by Donald Burns Bauer.

Mr. Bauer advised the Grievance Committee of a bowling alley in Prescott, Arizona, on which the apparent owners were Yancey Lewis and Ray Gross and that apparently the plans were prepared by Unisonian Associates but were presented for building permit under the seal of Jack Knighton.

Mr. Bauer agreed to write a formal complaint to the office of the Board regarding this project and the Executive Secretary was instructed to secure from the Building Department of the City of Prescott a copy of the plans and specifications as well as checking all of the files of the State Board of Technical Registration regarding Unisonian Associates for previous violations.

Barrie H. Groen - Mr. Groen appeared to report on Mr. Paul Scott Edell of 8402 N. 16th Avenue who has been holding himself out to be an architect. Mr. Groen presented to the Committee a photostat of a drawing on which the name "Paul Scott Edell" appears. The Committee questioned that since this proposed project with Mr. Edell's name as architect was within the City of Phoenix that perhaps it would be best to wait until they were filed for building permit to see the name of the registrant associated with Mr. Edell. The Executive Secretary was instructed to contact the Building Department of the City of Phoenix to make every effort to secure the plans when presented for a building permit.

Mr. Groen assured the Board that he would assist in any way in concluding the action against this non-registrant.

Carl E. Ludlow - Mr. Ludlow appeared before the Grievance Committee at its request regarding his stamp and signature appearing on the structural sheets of architectural plans presented for a building permit in Flagstaff, Arizona. The referenced building was a medical-dental center on which the apparent owners are Fred Groxton and Jim Smets. The foundation sheets for this building were stamped and signed by J. B. Holmquist and the roof framing sheets stamped and signed by Carl E. Ludlow. All drafting was apparently done by another person and no architect's stamp appeared on the drawings.

Mr. Ludlow informed the Grievance Committee that he had been approached to do the structural roof calculations as a gratis favor for a friend. He was not aware that there was not an architect on the project until his work was complete.

It was concluded by the Grievance Committee that there had been no violation on Mr. Ludlow's part and that since action had been taken by the office of the Board to inform the building officials and the City Attorney of the requirement in the Board Rules and Regulations that all sheets of drawings must be stamped there was no further action contemplated.

Bill Blair - Mr. Blair appeared before the Grievance Committee regarding his operating in Arizona where the office was under the control of Marion L. Vanlandingham and that Mr. Blair was not presently registered. Mr. Blair informed the Grievance Committee that he had recently submitted an application for registration and that all work performed in Arizona was under the direct control and supervision of Mr. Vanlandingham. Mr. Blair further informed the Committee that in the interim period until he receives registration in Arizona, Mr. Vanlandingham's name will be used in the conduct of the firm's business. The Committee concluded that there was no apparent action to be taken at this time.

The Grievance Committee received a letter from the Arizona Consulting Engineers Association regarding plans prepared by R. Paulsell for Cortaro Farms at Cortaro, Arizona, in which the design was apparently inadequate and required re-design by Coe and Van Loo. The Executive Secretary was instructed to acknowledge the letter from the Arizona Consulting Engineers Association, to secure all plans for the project, talk to the persons involved, and to make a written report to Grievance Committee #1.

In the matter of Clare L. Bender of Ash Fork, Arizona, in which he reported a John C. Jackson, the Committee took no further action in that replies to letters written by the Executive Secretary to the Yavapai County Attorney and Mr. Bender had not been received.

There being no further business, the Committee adjourned at 3:30 P.M.

It was moved by Mr. Dryden and seconded by Mr. Royden that the report be accepted. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Weaver and seconded by Mr. Stufflebean that the matter of Charles R. Young, Yuma, Arizona, be turned over to Grievance Committee #1 for investigation. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Weaver and seconded by Mr. Stufflebean that the Executive Secretary write Alan Daily & Associates, Alfred Beadle, and inform them of the requirement of the name of the registrant appearing on the firm's letterhead. Motion carried.

REPORT OF GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE #2

Mr. Stufflebean reported that most of the matters concerning Grievance Committee #2 had been reported on and disposed of by instructions to the Executive Secretary at the time of Mr. Killingsworth's appearance before the Board. Mr. Stufflebean reported that the Tucson members of the Board would ascertain who is in charge of the Hawley & Hawley Assaying Office in Tucson.

REPORT OF SPECIAL COMMITTEES

Mr. Weaver reported on his work with the Minimum Standards and Specifications Committee of the A.T.A.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Royden that the suggested minimum drawings and specifications for projects of architectural nature as presented by Mr. Weaver and Architects Bricker, Green and Haver be forwarded to the Chairmen of Grievance Committees #1 and #2. These committees are instructed to follow the architectural minimums when a matter of questionable ethics is being investigated. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Royden and seconded by Mr. Dryden that the Board extend their thanks to Francis Bricker, Ellery C. Green and Ralph Haver for their work in preparing the schedule of minimums. Motion carried.

The Chairman adjourned the meeting for lunch.

The meeting was again called to order at 1:30 P.M. by Chairman Young for the reading of communications.

The Executive Secretary was instructed to reply to Mr. Robert McConnell that the Board does not consider service in the Peace Corps where the work is performed without the supervision of a registered Architect to be experience of a character satisfactory to the Board.

The Executive Secretary was instructed to acknowledge a letter from Scott Sarber and notify him that should he acquire knowledge of any work by L. L. Johns in the practice of Architecture, he should forward same to the Board.

The Executive Secretary read a letter from the University of Arizona requesting the dates of the Spring examinations.

It was moved by Mr. Stufflebean and seconded by Mr. Royden that the dates of April 17, 18, 20, 21 and 22 be established for the Spring examinations and be circularized to the applicants and universities. Motion carried.

The meeting of the State Board of Technical Registration was called to order by Mr. Martin Ray Young, Jr., Chairman, in the Auditorium on the second floor of the Guaranty Bank Building, 3550 N. Central Avenue, Phoenix, Arizona, at 9:12 A.M. on Friday, March 13th.

All members were present.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Dr. Shell that the minutes of the regular meeting of the Board on December 13, 1963, be approved as written and presented. Motion carried.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Mr. Dryden and Mr. Young reported, for the information of the Board, on information forwarded to them by the technical societies regarding House Bill 238 and House Bill 252.

REPORT OF BY-LAWS AND RULES COMMITTEE

At 10:00 A.M., Chairman Young suspended the agenda to open the formal hearing on Rule II.B.9, "All in-training certificates shall expire eight years after issuance." Notice of this formal hearing was duly filed with the Secretary of State at least 20 days prior to this date. There were no visitors present to speak for or against the proposed rule.

Chairman Young called the meeting back to the agenda and requested discussion or motions on the proposed rule.

The Executive Secretary reported on the announcement in the Daily Engineering/Building Construction News regarding the minimum standards for architectural drawings. This announcement had brough heavy requests to the Board for copies of the standards.

"The Arizona State Board of Technical Registration recently approved a schedule of minimum standards for architectural drawings and specifications.

"While the standards are suggested minimums, it is believed, according to reliable sources, that they will be used as a guide in evaluating complaints received from architect's clients.

"The guide sets forth certain minimum details which will be required for architectural projects in three categories; (1) Residences up to 2,000 sq ft; (2) Residences over 2,000 sq ft, and commercial under \$25,000; (3) All other projects over \$25,000.

"A copy of the requirements is available from the State Board of Technical Registration, 408 Guaranty Bank Bldg, Phoenix, Arizona 85012."

REPORT OF GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE #1

Mr. Dryden submitted a report for consideration of the meeting of his committee held on January 23rd:

The meeting of Grievance Committee #1 was called to order at 1:30 P.M. on January 23, 1964, by C. W. Dryden, Committee Chairman. Members present were Mr. Dryden, Mr. Weaver and Mr. Young. John Girand and H. L. Royden were absent.

Charles C. Young - Plans were presented to the committee for a storage room addition to the Yuma County Court House, Yuma, Arizona, which indicated both that they were prepared by Charles C. Young, Designer, on one copy and sealed and signed by Robert Price Weatherford, Jr., Registered Architect 4574, on the other set. It was also noted that Charles C. Young listed himself in the 1963 Yuma telephone book as "Charles C. Young, Architect" but had changed this classification to "Charles C. Young, Designer" in the 1964 book. Further investigation indicated that the advertising in the telephone book was apparently placed by someone other than Mr. Young regarding the architectural classification and was changed by Mr. Young to designer. The committee decided that further discussion should be had to decide if action should be taken against Charles C. Young or Robert Price Weatherford, Jr.

Robert M. Paulsell, Cotrero Farms - The committee discussed at length the material available to it regarding the design of hydraulic channels and siphons by Robert M. Paulsell for Cotrero Farms. The committee members decided that this matter required further investigation at a later date in that now was not the appropriate time to take action.

REPORT OF GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE #2

A report by Mr. Herreras for Grievance Committee #2 indicated that the clipping forwarded to the Board by William Goldblatt, Architect, of Tucson, regarding a registrant was not sufficient information for any action by the Board.

Mr. Girand spoke of the continued need of the support of the Board by N.S.P.E. and the other organizations, particularly in the field of where engineering affects the health, welfare and safety of the residents of Arizona and where engineering design could cause loss of life during construction.

READING OF COMMUNICATIONS

Kansas Board of Registration - The Kansas Board forwarded a copy of their Statutes and Rules regarding registration of Architects and requested a copy of the Arizona Code.

Excerpts of the minutes of the Arizona Consulting Engineers Association were read regarding correspondence between the Board and the Association on matters reported to the Board:

"Three letters have been received from the Board of Technical Registration. One in regard to the Arizona Foundation of Structural and Soil Testing Engineering. The executive secretary of the Board, Mr. Walter J. Edelblut, Jr., stated that an investigation is in progress, which today has indicated that the formation of this association is legal. However, they are further investigating the work done by this association.

"Another letter applied to the El Tanque Bowling Lanes in Tucson. The letter stated that formal action by the Board has not been taken, but an investigation has been made.

"The third letter concerned Cortaro Farms. Full information was provided the Technical Registration Board regarding poor design on this particular work, and the Board is now fully investigating, has all the facts necessary, and according to a talk with Mr. Edelblut action will be taken on this matter."

American Congress on Surveying and Mapping - This letter was circularized to all Board members and Land Surveying organizations enclosing a tentative schedule recommended for use by any Land Surveying organization preparing State surveying rules.

The following resolution was received from the Arizona Section, A.C.S.M.:

RESOLUTION

PERTAINING TO PHOTOGRAMMETRY PROBLEMS APPEARING ON THE OCTOBER, 1963 LAND SURVEYORS TECHNICAL REGISTRATION EXAMINATION AND THE INCLUSION OF PHOTOGRAMMETRY PROBLEMS ON FUTURE EXAMINATIONS

WHEREAS, the Executive Board has determined that several of the questions and problems relating to photogrammetry on the October, 1963 Land Surveyors examination were beyond the general scope of knowledge required in the field of Land Surveying.

WHEREAS, That Land Surveyors should be familiar with the properties and limitations of aerial photography and photogrammetric maps to insure proper use of these items.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that, in the opinion of the Executive Board, Arizona Section, American Congress on Surveying and Mapping, the Land Surveyors examination continue to include questions and problems concerning photogrammetry and that they be confined to basic general knowledge of photogrammetric mapping and the use of aerial photographs.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that future problem subject matter could relate to: map accuracies to be expected at various scales, area and scale determination of aerial photography, and basic problems on parallax. Questions pertaining to plotter technique and principles should not be included as being beyond the scope of the Land Surveyor.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the weight assigned to the photogrammetry portion of the examination be related to the importance of photogrammetry to land surveying, possibly 10%, at this time.

Ronald Wielgus appeared before the Board regarding reconsideration of his application for registration as Professional Architect. After Mr. Wielgus was thanked for his appearance and departed, the Board discussed his application in detail.

It was moved by Dr. Shell and seconded by Mr. Girand that Mr. Wielgus be granted registration after a satisfactory personal audience. Motion carried.

Gordon Torres Ronneberg appeared before the Board to present his request for reconsideration of his application as a Professional Architect. After Mr. Ronneberg departed, the Board reviewed his qualifications and their requirement that he complete certain portions of the examination.

It was moved by Mr. Weaver and seconded by Mr. Girand that Mr. Ronneberg should be required to pass written examinations D-Site Planning and H-Professional Administration as a requirement for professional registration. Motion carried.

Raymond W. Ceton appeared before the Board requesting reconsideration of his application denied on December 15, 1962. After Mr. Ceton had concluded his presentation, the Board reviewed its requirements of December 15, 1962, and determined that at that time, Mr. Ceton did not have sufficient experience of a character satisfactory to the Board as required by the Arizona Statutes and that the recommendation that three years of additional experience be obtained was in agreement with the findings.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Stufflebean that since Mr. Ceton had not met the experience requirements established by the Arizona Statutes, the denial of December 15, 1962, be re-affirmed. Motion carried.

John Lawrence Duffy requested reconsideration of the findings of the Board at their December, 1963, meeting in which Mr. Duffy was held for the full written NCARB equivalent examination. As Mr. Duffy had not in his letter or his original application certified that he was fully qualified to practice as required, it was moved by Mr. Weaver and seconded by Mr. Royden that the full NCARB equivalent examination requirement of December, 1963, be re-affirmed. REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

(Entire Board) No meetings were held during the intervening period since the March meeting and there was nothing presented to the Board for discussion at this time.

REPORT OF RULES AND BY LAWS COMMITTEE

(Weaver, Girand, Dryden, Herreras) Mr. Dryden proposed the following change to the Rules of the Board:

RULE IV. SEALS AND IDENTIFYING MARKERS FOR REGISTRANTS

- 1. Description of Seals no change
- 2. Use of Seals no change
- 3. Seals, Securing no change
- 4. Identifying Markers, Securing

Registered Land Surveyors and registered Professional Engineers, when engaged in land surveying, shall secure at their own expense, non-ferrous tags, caps or embossed nails which shall show the registrant's Arizona Registration Number as issued by the State Board of Technical Registration and each registration number shall be proceeded by the letters L.S. or P.E. respectively, as the case may be.

5. Use of Identifying Markers

Registered Land Surveyors and registered Professional Engineers, when engaged in land surveying, shall securely attach one identifying marker to every permanent survey control point set during the practice of surveying tracts of land for the determination of their correct locations.

It was moved by Mr. Dryden and seconded by Mr. Girand that the above rule change be published and a formal hearing be held for adoption at 10:00 A.M., September 11, 1964. Motion carried.

REPORT ON EXAMINATIONS.

'(Engineer - Shell, Matsch, Dryden; Architect - Young, Weaver, Herreras)
Mr. Weaver reported that it was proposed that the Architectural applicants
be given the same examination on the same dates as the N.C.A.R.B. Western
Conference. These dates are tentatively December 19th through December 22nd
for the next examination. By adopting the Western Conference examinations,
the Board would insure that their applicants receive the same examinations
as the States of Alaska, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Nevada, Oregon,
Utah and Washington.

It was moved by Mr. Weaver and seconded by Mr. Herreras that the above report of the Architectural Examination Committee be accepted. Motion carried.

Dr. Shell spoke on the use of the Engineer-in-Training examination by the United States Government in lieu of the previously given Civil Service examination. His recommendations were that candidates through the Civil Service for E.I.T. certification be required to complete the requirements established by the Board.

It was moved by Dr. Shell and seconded by Mr. Dryden that the Engineering Examination Committee report be accepted. Motion carried.

It was moved by Dr. Shell and seconded by Mr. Girand that the following Architectural and Architect-in-Training grades of the April examinations be accepted. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Herreras and seconded by Mr. Royden that applicants for registration as Professional Architect who have completed their examinations and apparently having met all requirements of this Board be held for a personal audience. Motion carried.

REPORT OF N.C.A.R.B. COMMITTEE

(Young, Weaver, Herreras) Mr. Weaver reported that he and Martin Ray Young attended the St. Louis Annual conference of N.C.A.R.B. for two days in which 41 states were in attendance. The major highlights of this convention were that States are fast withdrawing Architect-in-Training from non-degree applicants; that N.C.A.R.B. will no longer require United States citizenship for certification; that N.C.A.R.B. now proposes credits of one for three years for Architects in Government; that the length of time for an Architect to receive a blue cover has been reduced to approximately 6 to 8 weeks; that some States are seeking a larger fee from out-of-state applicants.

REPORT OF BUDGET COMMITTEE

(Royden, Shell, Dryden) Mr. Royden presented the proposed budget for the 1965-1966 period which was discussed.

It was moved by Mr. Royden and seconded by Dr. Shell that the 1965-1966 budget be approved. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Dr. Shell that the Chairman of the Board be requested to appoint a committee to investigate another location for the office of the Board subsequent to October, 1965. Motion carried.

Meeting adjourned at 5:30 P.M. until 10:00 A.M., June 26th.

REPORT OF GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE #1

(Dryden, Weaver, Royden, Girand) Grievance Committee #1 met on Tuesday, May 5th, beginning at 1:30 P.M. in the auditorium of the Guaranty Bank Building. Those members present were C. W. Dryden, Chairman, Frederick P. Weaver, H. L. Royden, John Girand, and Jerry Lawson, Assistant Attorney General.

The Committee had called before it for informal discussions the following list of registrants and notified them by certified mail on April 29th:
Robert Marvin Paulsell; Wilfred R. McIlveen; Robert Price Weatherford, Jr.

Mr. Robert Price Weatherford, Jr., appeared before the committee for an informal discussion on one-sheet plans of a store room for the Yuma County Courthouse in that the Board had received one print showing the name of the designer as Charles C. Young and an identical print stamped and sealed by Robert Price Weatherford, Jr., Architect. Mr. Weatherford explained to the Board that Charles C. Young was indeed his bona fide employee during the time these plans were drawn and that he had performed this service for the supervisors of Yuma County on a courtesy basis, Mr. Weatherford's regular employment being for Arizona Public Service Company. The committee accepted discussions with Mr. Weatherford as being satisfactory and thanked him for his appearance.

Neither Robert Marvin Paulsell nor Wilfred R. McIlveen appeared before the committee. It was apparent in the case of Mr. McIlveen that he had not as yet received his certified letter and in the case of Mr. Paulsell, the signature card was returned signed by a female person.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Royden that Mr. Paulsell be held for a formal hearing on his hydraulic design of Cortero Farms unless satisfactory proof is submitted of inability to appear at this meeting. Should satisfactory proof be received, Mr. Paulsell is to be invited to another informal Grievance Committee meeting by registered mail, addressee only. Such meeting will be held concurrently with the June 25th-26th Board meeting in Flagstaff. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Royden that Mr. McIlveen be sent an additional notice, registered mail, addressee only, requesting that he appear before an informal Grievance Committee meeting to be held concurrently with the June Board meeting. Motion carried.

Subsequent to the adjournment of the Grievance Committee meeting, the Executive Secretary heard from Mrs. McIlveen that the letter had just been received and that Mr. McIlveen was not available. The following day, the Executive Secretary heard from Mr. Paulsell that he had been out of town and that the baby sitter had not informed his wife of the arrival of the certified mail.

Both Mr. Paulsell and Mr. McIlveen were informed verbally by the Executive Secretary of the proposed June 25th-26th meeting in Flagstaff and they indicated they would attend upon receipt of formal instructions where to appear.

The meeting adjourned at 3:30 P.M.

Mr. Dryden, Chairman of Grievance Committee #1, reported that Mr. Wilfred R. McIlveen and Mr. Robert Marvin Paulsell appeared before Grievance Committee #1 on June 26th at 9:00 A.M. The committee also discussed a house by a designer for McMillan Construction Company and requested that the Executive Secretary be instructed to write the City of Phoenix pointing out that residences in excess of the amount exempt in the Law must be performed by a registrant of this Board. The Committee recommended that Mr. Alfred Maggs, Mechanical Engineer, and Mr. T. J. Hanley, Civil and Structural Engineer, meet with the Grievance Committee at their next meeting regarding a warehouse; that Claude McLean meet with the Grievance Committee and discuss his certifying as a Chemical Engineer that he is responsible for structural design. The Grievance Committee also recommends that Mr. Robert Marvin Paulsell be held for a formal hearing on an incompetent set of plans for Cortero Farms. The Grievance Committee further recommends that Mr. Wilfred R. McIlveen be held for a formal hearing on an incompetent survey on the Ranch of the Golden Horse Unit 1.

It was moved by Mr. Dryden and seconded by Mr. Weaver that the report of the Grievance Committee #1 be accepted. Motion carried.

REPORT OF GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE #2

(Stufflebean, Matsch, Herreras, Shell) Grievance Committee #2 met at 9:00 A.M., June 26th, in Flagstaff, and has no report to the Board.

Mr. Herreras remarked that in Tucson, the building officials are well instructed that no permits be issued on plans unless prepared by a registered Architect or Engineer.

REPORTS OF SPECIAL COMMITTEES

Office Procedure Committee (Stufflebean, Girand, Weaver) - The Executive Secretary brought up the matter of additional filing cabinets for the office and possible revision on the application forms for engineers. These items were referred by the Chairman to the Office Procedure Committee for discussion.

READING OF COMMUNICATIONS

Honorable Robert W. Pickrell

Dear Sir:

I represent the International Association of Electrical Inspectors, a not for profit corporation, organized among other things for the purpose of continuing the education of its members and promoting the better understanding and application of the national and local electrical codes.

The Association has embarked on an educational program for its inspectors leading to the certification by the Association of those

qualified as "Certified Electrical Safety Engineers." The certificate issued to the recipient will use such term and will also contain the following qualifying statement:

"This certificate does not authorize the holder hereof to practice electrical engineering or to be known as an Electrical Engineer. It applies solely to Electrical Safety Engineering, a realm unique to the Electrical Inspection Fraternity."

There are many terms now in use in the various states which are acceptable. Some states now permit the use of the term "Electrical Safety Engineer" without any registration or without any question being raised. Many states permit the use of the following terms: Insurance Engineers, Locomotive Engineers, Stationary Engineers, Marine Engineers, Hoisting Engineers, Electrical Maintenance or Service Engineers, Traffic Engineers, Waterworks Engineers, Sewage Engineers, as well as others.

The certified Electrical Safety Engineer will in no way practice engineering or offer to practice such. He will in no way represent himself to be an engineer nor will he perform any engineering work. He will continue to be an electrical inspector, certified by the Association as a result of his qualifications as an Electrical Safety Engineer, as has already been done in several of the states. He will in no way imply that he is an engineer.

Under the conditions as set forth above, it is our belief that we will in no way run contrary to any Act in your State. On the contrary, this program should mean an increase in efficiency and pride in the work of the Electrical Inspector who qualifies as a certified Electrical Safety Engineer. We are sure that the projected program will meet with National approval. If there are any suggestions or questions which might be raised in your State which may increase the efficiency of the program so that it will be satisfactory in your locale, I would appreciate your advice.

TO: ALL WESTERN CONFERENCE BOARDS

FROM: WASHINGTON STATE BOARD OF REGISTRATION FOR ARCHITECTS

SUBJECT: SEISMIC EXAMINATIONS

The Washington Board has asked me to convey these thoughts to you, and to seek your guidance.

Perhaps due to the tragic earthquake in Alaska recently, we here in Washington are made very conscious that we too lie in an area very susceptible to shock, with the Puget Sound area where the bulk of our population lives particularly vulnerable. Startin in June 1962 this Board started including in its "F" Building Construction and "G" Structural Design sections questions on seismic forces, and since then have, of course, used the Western Conference examination containing this material in these sections.

As we require this competency in our own registrants, we feel we should require evidence of similar competency in reciprocal registrants from other states. This is particularly true of applicants from midwest and eastern parts of the country. In the interests of public safety these applicants should be made aware of the need for seismic design for practice here. We have noted in recent interviews that many such admit to no real knowledge of this subject, and understand and appreciate our concern, and are willing to obtain and prove competency toward registration here.

We are aware, of course that California has been aware of this problem for a long while. Perhaps other Western States have been also. We should like to know which ones, if any. We are proposing changes in our Rules to accomplish the following:

- 1. To require reciprocal registration candidates to supply us with proof of their competence in seismic design by:
 - A. Having passed the Western Conference Examination in "F" and "G" in 1963 or since, or
- B. Having secured registration in California where seismic design has long been a requirement of registration (and provided California assures us that all their registrants have been so qualified, or furnish individual assurances) or
 - C. Having passed examinations in other states equivalent to the Western Conference examination requirements in seismic portions of "F" and "G", or
 - D. Prepare and submit a treatise of not less than ten pages (double spaced) 8½ x 11 on SEISMIC CONSIDERATIONS for BUILDINGS, with the following areas for discussion suggested:
 - a. Review from historical and geological standpoint of earthquake occurances, their origins, causes and effects.
 - b. Seismic considerations in the architectural design of buildings, their shape, height, bulk, form, etc.
 - c. Seismic considerations in structural design of buildings, methods of controlling seismic forces.

Our purpose is not to set up a road-block for your architects seeking reciprocity in Washington, and

We do not wish to embarrass any Western Conference Board by this proposed step, and before we make it official, we would appreciate your comments. Do you think we are reasonable? Would there be any reason for a reciprocal understanding between us? Would you be willing to include a reference on any grade report furnished us that your architect-candidate had qualified in seismic design by reference to IA, IB, IC or ID, or include a statement that he has not yet so qualified?

Perhaps there is a situation in your State which presents a problem in this or some other area on which Washington could cooperate.

Gentlemen:

We wish to submit for your consideration the advisability of opening a new category in your registration, namely, for the acoustical sciences. An indication of the breadth and diversity of the acoustical science field is shown on the enclosed "Specialties List for use with National Register of Scientific and Technical Personnel". Please note in particular that none of these acoustical specialties require, nor would be particularly benefited by, training or degrees in any of the categories now classified by your board. Although the term "acoustical engineer" is commonly applied to accousticians, the prominence and importance of the acoustical sciences is so recent that there is actually no college degree available in acoustical engineering and, as a matter of fact, there are only a few universities which even offer separate courses in acoustics.

Our professional society, The Acoustical Society of America, founded in 1929, lists ten members and one student member in Arizona in its 1963 membership list. The diversity of training and application of the acoustical sciences is well illustrated by the fact that, of these eleven members, four serve as industrial engineers (2 ar AiResearch, 1 at Motorola, 1 at Douglas Aircraft), one teaches in the Psychology department at ASU, another practices architecture (the only Acoustical Society member in Arizona listed in your 1963 registration list), the writer practices as a consultant in architectural acoustics, and of the others at least two are retired.

Although the writer is the only Arizona party serving in a daily capacity as an acoustical consultant to architects, mechanical engineers, state and local governmental and school agencies, contractors, etc., the mounting importance of acoustical considerations in the design of new construction alone should, we feel, cause you to give careful consideration to the necessity of having acoustical consultants duly qualified and registered with your board.

The writer would be pleased to discuss this matter further with your board or furnish you with whatever other data you may desire relative to this request. We have served many of the architects and mechanical

engineers registered with your board, and will be please to submit a list of these clients and the projects on which we consulted, if you so desire. In fact, this request has been suggested and stimulated by many of these registrants.

We look forward to hearing from you.

Also, as president of the Arizona Landscape Contractors Association, I would certainly like to see a better understanding and use of landscaping in plans and specifications in Arizona.

REPORT ON EXAMINATIONS

He further reported that the Fall examinations would be held October 17th and 18th for the engineers and that all examinations would be given in Tempe at Arizona State University except the Structural portions which will be held in the Guaranty Bank Building on October 19th.

At the request of NCSBEE, the Chair appointed Dr. Shell to be the corresponding member.

Dr. Shell presented to the Board for its consideration a suggestion that the Chair appoint advisory committeemen to aid members of the Board in each of the engineering disciplines, land surveying, assaying and geology. REPORT OF GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE #1

Mr. Dryden submitted the following report of the meeting of Grievance Committee #1 held July 30th in the office of the Board and moved its adoption.

"Committee Members Present:

C. W. Dryden, Chairman John Girand H. L. Royden Frederick P. Weaver Martin Ray Young, Jr.

The committee reviewed the complaint and notice on Wilfred R. McIlveen regarding Ranch of the Golden Horse, Unit 1, and concurred on its filing. The following persons were discussed as possible witnesses at this hearing: Lacy Camp Greer; James S. Mack, previous Vice-President of Union Title Co.; and Daniel Wier to be contacted regarding his serving as impartial expert.

The committee reviewed the complaint and notice of Robert M. Paulsell and concurred on its filing. The following persons were discussed as possible witnesses for this hearing: the manager of Cortero Water Users Association of Marana; representative of Continental Casualty; representative of Coe and Van Loo; and construction contractor, to secure, if possible, the deposition given by Paulsell in Tucson, and discuss with Carl Eyring of Salt River Project the name of an irrigation expert witness.

The committee discussed a letter from Richard A. McIntyre and eleven other Architects of the Phoenix area regarding the practice of David L. Metz, a non-registrant, and the job connection between Metz and Moote, Kempa, and Galloway on a 116-unit apartment complex on the northwest corner of Coulter and 7th Avenue, Kahnweiller-Simons, Contractor. The committee resolved on the information provided in the letter alone there was not sufficient evidence for action, and directed the Executive Secretary to reply to Mr. McIntyre advising him that additional data was needed, more specifically in the form of plans and specifications, and that the continued action of this group of Architects was necessary to bring the matter to conclusion.

The Executive Secretary reported on a non-registrant, Howard Madole, and his connection with Calvin Vanness, Architect. In connection with this matter that the Executive Secretary had on file copies of plans as filed with the City of Phoenix which indicated aiding and abetting of a non-registrant by Calvin Vanness. It was moved by Mr. Royden and seconded by Mr. Weaver that this committee recommend to the Board at its next meeting that Calvin Vanness be held for a formal hearing in the apparent violation of Section 32-128, A(3). Motion carried.

A letter from James F. Ellis regarding Charles C. Young, a non-registrant, was read to the Committee. The Executive Secretary was directed to reply to this letter and advise Mr. Ellis the Board is desirous of taking action against Mr. Young as soon as concrete information regarding his practice can be received. Mr. Ellis' continued efforts in securing documents by Mr. Charles Young was requested.

The committee was advised that Bob Norris of A.C.E.A. had requested consultation with the committee regarding minimum standards for electrical plans and specifications.

A letter from William A. Woolford, registration no. 5167, of Denver, Colorado, was read to the committee. Mr. Woolford's letter was in reply from a letter of the Board regarding the practice of architecture by a registered engineer on a Medical Center for Dr. Kahle in Flagstaff. Mr. Woolford's reply was deemed not satisfactory and he was requested to appear at an informal Grievance Committee hearing, scheduled for 9:00 A.M., September 11, 1964, in the auditorium of the Guaranty Bank Building.

Laszlo Sandor was mentioned by the Executive Secretary and Mr. Weaver regarding the office of the Board building up a file on his practice and association with Alfred A. Beadle.

In regard to Claude E. McLean and Holiday Inn, the committee recommends to the Board that a discussion of the responsibility of Testing Laboratories be undertaken by the Board. Copy of opinion by the Attorney General regarding testing laboratories is attached to this report.

The Executive Secretary discussed with the committee possible revision of the issuing of temporary certificates wherein it was the feeling of the office of the Board that an applicant for temporary certificate should appear in Arizona for pre-evaluation or personal audience before issuance.

Regarding the building addition drawn by Alfred Maggs, mechanical engineer, the committee resolved that since this addition was for his own property, there was no violation and no action could be recommended.

The matter of the Holy Cross Church, Scottsdale, Arizona, was discussed and when a complaint regarding this collapse was received in this office, further discussion would be taken.

The meeting adjourned at 4:00 P.M."

It was moved by Mr. Dryden and seconded by Mr. Stufflebean that the report be accepted. Motion carried.

"Grievance Committee #1 convened at a special meeting at 9:00 A.M., September 11th, and the following persons were in attendance:

John Chopas Dick McIntire Charles O. Biggs John Dellisanti Kemper Goodwin Eugene E. Keller Monty Greene Richard O. Nelson Barrie H. Groen Jack Kaufmann Richard M. Miller Mike Bosco

The Architectural registrants present at this Grievance Committee meeting presented to the Committee copies of numerous letters written to the Board and advertising data indicating that David L. Metz had apparently been listed as an Architect in connection with Castillian Village, a 116-unit townhouse development at the northwest corner of Coulter and 7th Avenue. The project is now reported under the name of Calvin H. Vanness as Architect.

Kemper Goodwin discussed with the Committee if there was a need for any changes which might strengthen the State Board of Technical Registration. There was also discussion concerning the relationship of David L. Metz and Moote, Kempa and Galloway on the same project. Mr. Eugene Keller, Attorney, appeared in behalf of his client in regards to Howard Madole and Calvin H. Vanness in Sedona. There was also a clipping available from a Sedona paper in which Mr. Madole was listed as an architect. At the conclusion of the presentation of those present, the Chairman of the Grievance Committee thanked them for their attendance and those persons were permitted to leave.

There was then presented to the Grievance Committee a set of plans on which the Architect or his employee had apparently misused the seal of a registered Electrical Engineer. The Executive Secretary was instructed to write the registrant involved concerning this matter.

Mr. William A. Woolford of Denver, Colorado, then appeared before the Grievance Committee in response to a request concerning the Medical Center for Dr. Kale in Flagstaff. Mr. Woolford was advised by the Committee that he would be notified of the results of this meeting.

Mr. Archie Brown appeared for Bill Keller of the Arizona Consulting Engineers Association and discussed some plans in his possession in which the work was apparently below minimum standards. No plans were presented to the Committee in the form of a complaint.

At the conclusion of the appearances of those concerned, the Committee makes the following recommendations to the Board:

- 1. That Calvin H. Vanness be held for a formal hearing in the matter of aiding and abetting on the residence for McMillan Construction Company, apparent aiding and abetting in the matter of Castillian Village, and apparent misuse of another registrant's seal (William Eugene Meier).
- 2. That the Executive Secretary and Assistant Attorney General write a letter for the Board to David L. Metz regarding his advertising for architectural services instructing him to decease and desist.
- 3. That William A. Woolford be held for a formal hearing for aiding and abetting a non-registrant in the matter of the Kale Medical Center in Flagstaff.

Grievance Committee #1 then recommends that it be dissolved until new appointments are made by Chairman Stufflebean."

It was moved by Mr. Dryden and seconded by Mr. Girand that the report of the meeting of Grievance Committee #1 held September 11th be accepted by the Board. Motion carried.

REPORT OF GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE #2

It was reported by Mr. Stufflebean that Grievance Committee #2 had held an informal meeting and had discussed the responsibilities of testing laboratories in Arizona. He further moved that Grievance Committee #2 investigate further testing laboratories and the opinion of the Attorney General regarding testing laboratories of August 5, 1963, and report to the Board at a later date.

REPORT OF SPECIAL COMMITTEES

Mr. Stufflebean submitted the following report of the special committee on office procedures and recommended its acceptance.

"A meeting of the Office Procedures Committee of the Arizona State Board of Technical Registration was held in the office of the Board on Monday, August 10, 1964, at 3:00 P.M.

Present: John H. Stufflebean, Chairman

John Girand Fred Weaver Walter Edelblut

Absent: None

- 1. The Committee reviewed the present application form for professional registration. The Secretary was directed to make some changes in the form which usage has indicated are most desirable.
- 2. The Committee authorized a complete change in the format of the EIT-GIT application form to the effect that the new EIT-GIT application form is similar if not identical to the present AIT form.
- 3. The above two actions were positively taken in view of the immediate necessity of reprinting these forms since our stock is depleted. It is therefore requested that the Board ratify at the September meeting the actions outlined above.
- 4. The Committee considered a request to purchase a new five-drawer steel filing cabinet. Following a thorough review of the usage of present filing cabinets, the Committee recommends to the Board denial of this request.
- 5. In lieu of the above request the Committee recommends to the Board approval to purchase a two-drawer filing cabinet for use of the stenographers.
- 6. In order to meet the demand which resulted in a request for the five-drawer filing cabinet, the Committee recommends to the Board that (a) the files of all registrants from 1921 to 1940 be removed from the office proper and placed in cardboard transfer cases to be stored in our dead storage compartment in the basement; (b) the Executive Secretary request proper permission and authority to destroy all files of DENIED applicants older than three years (this is the statutory period).
- 7. The Committee reviewed the bids or quotations received for processing the IBM cards for 1965 and recommends to the Board that Custom Data Processing Service be awarded this contract as the lowest and best bid. This bid was within the budgeted amount.

The meeting adjourned at 4:45 P.M."

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Weaver that the report of the Office Procedures Committee of August 10th be accepted. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Stufflebean that the positive actions taken by the Office Procedures Committee in their meeting of August 10th be ratified by the Board. Motion carried.

Mr. Stufflebean submitted the report of the bid opening on the printing of the Annual Report and code books for the consideration of the members.

It was moved by Mr. Stufflebean and seconded by Mr. Herreras that the low bid of Sims Printing Company be accepted and that the other printers be thanked for their submitting proposals. Motion carried.

READING OF COMMUNICATIONS

The Executive Secretary read letter from Robert Lewis Malkin who requested reconsideration of the Board in registered Landscape Architects.

May I kindly request a current roster of licensed architects in the State of Arizona. It is my intention to relocate my practice to the State of Arizona in the near future, and the purpose of this request is to generally study the distribution of architectual practice throughout the State.

Although I relize (sic) Arizona does not have a "landscape architect's law", I did wish to inquire if any legislature has been attemped (sic) in this direction, or if any legislature is being currently proposed? As you probably know, eight states now have "landscape architect laws" and I, for one, hope to see a further extension of this type of legislature in many more states.

It was moved by Mr. Dryden and seconded by Mr. Weaver that Mr. Malkin be thanked for his interest and that the Executive Secretary convey to Mr. Malkin that under Arizona Statutes, landscape architects could not be considered for registration. Motion carried.

The Executive Secretary read letter from Guy V. LoStracco.

This will confirm our telephone conversation of earlier this week wherein I advised you that the Registrar of Contractors is arranging for a hearing relative to the referenced building.

Based on my personal investigation, I have reason to believe that the Board should ask Mr. Lloyd Pike, the Architect, whose seal appears on the drawings, to appear at that hearing and to answer questions that might be put to him by the parties concerned.

I would also ask that a representative of the Board be present, in order that the Board might have a first-hand report of any alleged irregularities within its jurisdiction that might develop in the hearing.

Unfortunately, the Registrar has not yet announced the date of hearing at this writing, but we expect that the same will be set for a date in late September or early October.

If you should have any questions, or if you should desire my appearance pursuant to this request, please advise me.

Thank you for your cooperation.

It was moved by Mr. Dryden and seconded by Mr. Weaver that Mr. LoStracco be thanked for his letter and that a member may attend as a visitor. Motion carried.

The Executive Secretary was first instructed to get a copy of the plans by request to Mr. Lloyd Pike, Architect, for consideration by the Board.

The Executive Secretary reported on a letter received from Mr. Charles W. Sippel, Jr., President of Magnet Mining Company regarding applicant Mr. Melvin H. Jones.

I recently learned that Melvin H. Jones, an applicant for registration as a geologist, was notified that he failed to pass the examination held by your Board. Instead of the courtesy of a letter outlining the area of failure, your office merely mails a curt card saying that he "failed" with no further explanation.

Mr. Jones is part of our organization and I have known him very well for a number of years and am aware that he is a most capable practicing geologist, and that you and your Board has treated him most unfairly. It has been learned that there is not a single geologist on the Board, and this a most serious deficiency, in my opinion. It is understood that the Board calls on a college professor to prepare and grade the examinations in the geological field. Obviously, someone who has taken the courses of instruction given by the "professor" would pass. I have examined the examination questions and find that they call for answers that are argumentive, controversial and arbitrary, and with such questions, the mere whim of the correcting individual would mean flunking or passing. The question dreamed up by the professor on placing an evaluation on mining property amused me as I imagine Mr. Jones flunked this also under the views of the professor. To my knowledge, Mr. Jones has evaluated six mining properties that have been sold based on his evaluation and both sellers and buyers were most satisfied. Perhaps the professors training in this is theoretical. May I add that I have some knowledge of technical and professional standards as I have my masters in Metallurgical engineering.

Mr. Jones is a mature individual approaching 60 years of age and we do not feel that the Board has given him proper consideration. It is well known that the Board can waive the examination, as has been done in the past many times. As the Board does not have a geologist as a member, its actions and decisions relating to geologists are questionable.

Under the circumstances, this Company and its affiliates, feel strongly concerning the practices of your Board as they relate to Mr. Jones, and we are withdrawing our intended support to the Board appointive authority, this election year, unless ameliorating action is taken without delay.

Dr. Shell reported on the evaluation by the Examination Committee on the examination submitted by Mr. Jones and now in question.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Stufflebean that the recorded results on Mr. Jones' examination be re-affirmed and that the Executive Secretary so notify Mr. Sippel with a copy to the persons indicated as receiving copies of Mr. Sippel's letter. Motion carried.

The Executive Secretary reported on a letter received from Hawley & Hawley, Harold E. Richards, President, in April of this year and not reported at the June meeting. It was determined by Board discussion that no further action was required on this letter other than the answer by the Executive Secretary on April 27th.

I have had the pleasure of discussing the Registered Assayer situation with Dr. B. J. Shell, member of the Arizona State Board of Technical Registration, and he has suggested that I address the Board with a view to clarifying the assaying business as it exists today.

To begin with, the few practicing registered assayers remaining in the state are reaching retirement age, and no new generation of assayers is taking their place. Mr. Hawley is 84, Mr. Charles Diehl recently died, and Mr. Hugo Miller of Nogales died last year. Thus an era of small miners and individual independent assayers is coming to a close.

There are a number of reasons for this, the economics of mining probably being the most important. High grade ores are not as available as in the past, nor is low cost labor. Further, assayers did not keep up with the changing economy by raising their fees commensurate with the increasing cost of doing business, nor did they improve their techniques to match modern extractive metallurgy. The average principal in the assaying business has made less than \$1.50 per hour for his services in, say, the past ten years. This has been due to the price structure and the amount of work that he as an individual could turn out. As a result of these conditions there have been no new assayers entering the field, nor has there been an economic climate that would induce interested persons to invest in the business.

Due to the complexities of modern geology and metallurgy, the exacting requirements for commercial analysis now require infinitely more skills than can be expected of one individual. No one man can adequately render the complete laboratory service that was possible in years past and that the term "Registered Assayer" would imply.

Certainly the typical modest investment of, say, \$2000 per employee only a few years ago in facilities and equipment, as compared to \$10,000 plus per employee today by Hawley & Hawley, is one measurement of this change.

Another change is in the quality of work. As it is impossible for one man to be skilled in all phases of modern geology and metallurgy, today's needs require technicians to be specialists in limited areas of analysis, and by limiting the areas of responsibility, these technicians become highly skilled in their particular fields. For example, Hawley & Hawley is the only laboratory in the state doing umpire analyses for smelters and others both in Arizona and in other parts of the country. Our best umpire work is done by those technicians who for years have specialized in their particular analyses. These men have the highest degree of skill in their areas, but could not qualify for registration. Yet, as indicated by the company's position in the mining industry, they are more skilled in the analyses they do than a registered assayer might be. Under the present system it would be entirely possible for a man to be able to pass the necessary examinations to qualify him for registration, yet in a particular field he would not have the qualifications or the skills of a non-registered technician who has spent years in his specialty.

The reputation of Hawley & Hawley is not dependent upon any one person but upon the skills of many. It is doubtful in today's complex mining industry, that a complete analytical service would be possible on an individual basis without the organizing, financial and supporting services that an established organization can provide.

We therefore suggest that an investigation be made into public assaying. To this end we will be glad to give all the assistance we can in the way of data, practices of other states, etc., and any other information you may desire.

Mr. Lawson reported on an order of the Maricopa County regarding the formal dismissing in March, 1965, of an action filed by a registrant in 1959 for stay on revocation of license in Superior Court. It was determined by the Board that since the registrant had reapplied and had been re-registered, no further action was required.

Mr. Lawson also queried the Board on whether or not his office should endorse the disposal request of the Office Procedure Committee. He was so instructed that the Board action was to endorse this disposal.

The Executive Secretary read for the Board's information a letter by M. J. Sienerth, Superintendent of Building Inspections, to Chopas & Starkovich, Architects, relating to responsibility certificates. There was no action on this letter under the Board's jurisdiction and it was so noted.

READING AND CONSIDERING OF APPLICATIONS

It was moved by Mr. Weaver and seconded by Mr. Herreras that the following applicants for professional registration having completed the personal audience and all other requirements of this Board be granted registration and assigned the registration numbers as indicated. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

The Chair selected the date of 8:30 A.M., December 3rd, for the next regular meeting of the Board and said meeting to continue through December 4th and 5th.

Mr. Girand reported on the proposed changes to the engineer registration as drafted by Hale Tognoni of A.S.P.E. He at that time submitted his comments to the members in written form.

The Architectural members of the Board reported that they proposed that the A.I.A. take this matter under advisement. The Board resolved that although as a unit no formal action could or should be taken, the members as individuals could indicate their approval or disapproval as they so desire.

Mr. Girand reported on a proposal by the Consulting Electrical Engineers for proposed minimum standards similar to those minimum standards adopted on architectural drawings.

It was moved by Mr. Girand and seconded by Mr. Herreras that the following minimum standards of electrical requirements be circularized to the Chairmen of Grievance Committees #1 and #2 for their use when a matter of questionable ethics is being investigated in this area. Motion carried.

The following items are considered the very minimum requirements for any formal electrical plans and specifications:

- A. Show location of outlets, receptacles and junction boxes for all electrically operated devices.
- B. Indicate size of conduits and wiring with number of conductors for branch circuits and specifications.
- C. Show panelboard schedules with breaker or fuse sizes for all divisions of load from service entrance section to and including all panels and electrical devices with separate feeds.
- D. Show panelboard schedules with breaker or fuse sizes for all divisions of load from service.

These minimums are applicable to the very smallest commercial and industrial projects, and could apply to custom residential as well.

Additional requirements are necessary for projects that increase in size, complexity and cost.

- AIA electrical requirements for small residences up to 2,000 square feet is satisfactory, namely, outlets, switches, receptacles and panel locations. It would be desirable to include voltage and ampere ratings for any special purpose receptacle or device.
- 2. For residences over 2,000 square feet and small commercial and industrial projects under \$25,000.00 cost, the four recommended minimum items again apply together with the AIA suggested requirements. In addition, the size and type of service entrance or main switching center should be shown along with the method of installing the electrical lines to the serving utility system. Also, the voltage and ampere rating for all receptacles and special devices should be included.
- 3. For all buildings over \$25,000.00 in cost, the minimums outlined in the four paragraphs together with the AIA suggested minimums <u>must</u> apply. The suggested additional requirements for Paragraph 2 should become a definite requirement for large projects.

For any project over the ATA determined minimum of \$25,000.00, these items are absolutely essential to a complete electrical design.

- 1. Site plan with all utilities and connection details shown.
- 2. Floor plans to locate all outlets, receptacles, switches, signal safety telephone and inter-communication systems conduit runs shown and identified with type and sizes and number of wires in each, whenever they differ from minimum specification requirements. Voltage and amperes for all special outlets and devices to be included. Circuit to be labeled and panel schedules to show phasing and loads.
- 3. Provide complete power distribution system and rise diagrams. Include all major equipment such as air conditioning, heating, ventillating pumps, etc. Give circuit breaker and/or fuse sizes for all equipment and devices connected directly or on separate circuits. Include feeder and branch circuit sizes and protection ratings.
- 4. Service entrance and metering requirements, methods of connection, sizes and connection details should be a part of all major projects.

5. Calculations for electrical requirements, by code method and/or as directly determined from design data and connected loads summarized from actual panel schedules and riser diagrams, must be included.

Chairman Young surrendered the operation of the Board to the new officers elected for the coming year.

Chairman Stufflebean accepted and thanked Mr. Young for his service during the past year to the operation of the Board.

Before adjourning the meeting, Chairman Stufflebean indicated that committee appointments, until the new list was mailed to the Executive Secretary, stood, and when received the new appointments would be listed in these minutes.

MINUTES OF THE STATE BOARD OF TECHNICAL REGISTRATION December 3, 4, 1965 1964

The meeting of the State Board of Technical Registration was called to order by Mr. John H. Stufflebean, Chairman, in the Auditorium of the Guaranty Bank Building, 3550 N. Central Avenue, Phoenix, Arizona, at 8:40 A.M. on December 3rd.

It was moved by Mr. Young and seconded by Mr. Royden that Frederick P. Weaver, Vice-Chairman, be acting secretary for this meeting. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Royden and seconded by Mr. Young that the minutes of the meeting of the Board on September 10th and 11th be approved as written and presented. Motion carried.

Chairman Stufflebean suspended the agenda to first recognize Eldon C. Davis, #64-229, Architect, who appeared to discuss reconsideration of his application. Mr. Davis was thanked for his appearance before the Board and advised by Chairman Stufflebean that he would be notified of the action taken by the Board on his request for reconsideration.

At 9:00 A.M., December 3rd, the Chairman again suspended the agenda so the Board could sit for a formal hearing on Complaint #64-88 against Robert M. Paulsell, a registered Professional Engineer (Civil), in the matter of his engineering design for Cortaro Water Users Association. Mr. Paulsell was represented by Mark I. Harrison, Attorney, Langerman & Begam, 111 W. Monroe, Phoenix, Arizona, and the official court reporter for this hearing was Robert R. Milburn. Hearing was concluded at 5:30 P.M., December 3rd.

The Board reconvened at 8:30 A.M., Friday, December 4th, to hold a formal hearing on change to the Rules and Regulations of the Board which were properly advertised and certified to the Secretary of State as being held this date. The rule change under discussion is as follows:

RULE IV. SEALS AND IDENTIFYING MARKERS FOR REGISTRANTS

- 1. Description of Seals No Change
- 2. Use of Seals No Change
- 3. Seals, Securing No Change

- 4. Identifying Markers, Securing Registered Land Surveyors and registered Professional Engineers, when engaged in land surveying, shall secure at their own expense metal rods, pipes, tags, caps or embossed nails which shall show the registrant's Arizona Registration Number as issued by the State Board of Technical Registration and each registration number shall be prefixed by the letters L.S. or P.E., respectively, as the case may be.
- 5. Use of Identifying Markers Registered Land Surveyors and registered Professional Engineers, when engaged in Land Surveying, shall securely attach one identifying marker to every permanent survey point set during the practice of surveying tracts of land for the determination of their correct locations.

Report of this formal hearing is covered under Rules and By-Laws Committee. James O. Read was present at the hearing representing American Congress on Surveying and Mapping.

At the conclusion of the formal hearing on the rule change, the Board formally met to discuss and act upon Complaint #64-88 against Robert M. Paulsell, a registered Professional Engineer (Civil).

It was moved by Mr. Royden and seconded by Dean Coleman that Mr. Robert M. Paulsell was guilty of incompetence in the hydraulic design portion of his design for Cortaro Water Users Association. The recorded vote was eight ayes, no nays. Motion carried.

It was moved by Dean Coleman and seconded by Mr. Young that Mr. Robert M. Paulsell was not guilty of incompetence in the practice of his profession. The recorded vote on this motion was eight ayes, no nays. Motion carried.

It was moved by Dean Coleman and seconded by Mr. Dryden that the following reprimand be sent in letter form to Mr. Paulsell with copy to his attorney. Motion carried.

You are hereby advised that as a result of evidence introduced at the formal hearing on the above captioned matter before the State Board of Technical Registration on December 3, 1964, the Board finds you not guilty of incompetence in the practice of engineering. However, as a result of your actions as determined from the evidence introduced at the aforementioned hearing, the Board does reprimand you for undertaking a project which was not successfully completed to the client's requirements.

The Board does not feel that suspension or revocation of your license is justified in view of the evidence presented in the above captioned matter. However, it is the feeling of the Board that you have overlooked your professional responsibility to the public by performing in an area in which you are not proficient.

An engineer does not have free reign to attempt any project that might be covered by his license. Instead he must protect the public by undertaking only those projects which his training, ability and experience have qualified him to accomplish. Overambition, bravado and solo performances are not the most admirable traits of a professional. The public has a right to expect the best of engineering design and analysis from a licensee of this Board. To the extent that we undertake to perform that which in reality we cannot accomplish we have failed not only ourselves but all those that practice our profession.

The Board recognizes your acceptance of your error and your attempt at correction. However, it should be remembered by you that the client never did receive the project that he anticipated when he entered a contract for your professional services. As a result, the entire profession as well as yourself is a little poorer.

It is presumed that you will accept this confidence of the Board in your future potentialities and that you will never place yourself in any position that compromises your professional integrity.

The above findings of the Board will become a part of the official records of the State Board of Technical Registration.

It was moved by Mr. Dryden and seconded by Mr. Weaver that the reprimand be made a part of the official record of the Board. Motion carried.

At 9:30 A.M., the Board again suspended the agenda to sit as a formal hearing in the matter of Complaint #64-89 against Calvin H. Vanness, a Registered Architect, charged with aiding and abetting and other misconduct in the practice of his profession. The court reporter for this hearing was Robert R. Milburn and Mr. Vanness was not represented by counsel. All witnesses subpoenaed by the Board under Complaint #64-89 were present or properly excused by the Board. Mr. Jerry Lawson, Assistant Attorney General, opened the hearing by informing Mr. Calvin H. Vanness that it was customary and he was advised that he could be represented by counsel. Mr. Vanness advised the Board that he chose to act as his own counsel and desired that the hearing proceed. Hearing was concluded at 3:30 P.M.

At the conclusion of the formal hearing on Complaint #64-89, the Board began its regular meeting, discussing and taking action first on Complaint #64-89, Calvin H. Vanness, and then the other matters on the published agenda. Mr. H. L. Royden was excused and did not vote on the complaint.

In the matter of Calvin H. Vanness, it was moved by Dean Coleman and seconded by Mr. Weaver that in Count 1 of above referenced complaint, Mr. Vanness was guilty as charged. The recorded vote on this motion was seven ayes, no nays. Motion carried.

It was moved by Dean Coleman and seconded by Mr. Weaver that Mr. Vanness was not guilty in Count 2 of the above referenced complaint. The recorded vote on this motion was seven ayes, no nays. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Young and seconded by Mr. Weaver that the certificate of registration of Mr. Calvin H. Vanness, Registration Number 3008, be suspended as of this date for a period ending December 31, 1965. The recorded vote on this motion was seven ayes, no nays. Motion carried.

Mr. Vanness was notified of the action of the Board as per copy of letter following by registered mail #17015, return receipt, and received said notice December 10, 1964.

You are hereby advised that as a result of evidence introduced at the formal hearing on the above captioned matter before the State Board of Technical Registration on December 4, 1964, the Board finds you guilty as charged in Count #1 of the above referenced complaint and finds you not guilty of the charge contained in Count #2.

Be you further advised that the State Board of Technical Registration has ordered the suspension of your certificate of registration for a period commencing December 4, 1964, and ending December 31, 1965.

I have been further instructed by the State Board of Technical Registration to request the return of your certificate and seal, at once, to the office of the Board. These items will be held by the Board for the duration of your suspension.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Chairman Stufflebean discussed with the members of the Board testing laboratories and their place in registration based upon a letter dated August 5, 1963, by Robert W. Pickrell, Attorney General, in the light of current practices of testing laboratories in the Phoenix and Tucson areas. REPORT OF GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE #1

Letter from John Schotanus regarding Wilsey, Ham & Blair was refered to Grievance Committee #1 for investigation as to the names of the principals and registrants and their status with the Technical Registration Board.

REPORT OF GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE #2

Chairman Herreras reported that Grievance Committee #2 had under discussion the following items: The failure of city and county engineers to use their seals on work performed in their official capacity; under consideration by Tucson Professional Engineers that electrical plans and specifications be required to be prepared by professional engineers; the matter of Gene Anderson-complaint by Tucson Title Insurance Company.

READING OF COMMUNICATIONS

Communications were read and noted from Biddle & Young and John K. Parsons.

November 28, 1964

Approximately two months ago we experience a procedure by a Central Arizona Architect that I feel is definitely beyond the limits of the "Code of Ethics". In as much as this registrant might not be cognizant of the Code of Ethics, I would appreciate the Board reviewing the circumstances, and if the act described is frowned upon by the Board, in view of the Registration Code, please circulate to ALL REGISTRANTS the opinion of the Board relating to acts of this nature.

Our firm designed the Electrical work for a large church for the Architect. This church is located in a nearby city with a well enforced electrical code. The design was in accordance with the applicable code. The Owner questioned certain designed sizes (service entrance section, feeders, panels, etc.) for they are larger than the Owner was accustomed to using in other areas designed under other codes. The code requirements of the local municipality was explained to the Owner's Electrical Consultant (by long distance telephone, from the Architect's office, in the presence of the Architect's Associate) and the Owner acceded that the designed equipment was properly sized.

The design drawings were signed, sealed and delivered to the Architect's office to become a part of the overall job (linen tracings were prepared). In due time the prints were made and delivered to the municipal building department, checked by the proper municipal authorities, approved (stamped to indicate this approval and compliance with the codes) and a building permit was issued.

The building was well under construction when this office was telephoned by a municipal building department inspector to ask why the drawings, with our seal, had been revised and put on the job with equipment sized in contradiction to the municipal code (no submittal of the revised sheets had been made to the municipal building department).

We contacted the Architect's office immediately to question him of the changes on these sealed drawings. We were informed that the changes were made in the Architect's office, by him, at the request of his client, the Church Owner, and that he, the Architect, was not aware that the revisions (in general, one commercial size smaller that the original design) made the design inadequate to meet the requirements of the local code. When questioned about the ethics of changing the sealed drawings prepared by a registered Engineer, he stated that he did not question the ethics, for his seal appeared on the sheets also.

To shorten a long story, the Owner sent in an Electrical Consultant from a neighboring state, who checked our calculations in accordance with the applicable local codes and agreed that our original design was correct and that the revised sizes by the Architect was contra-code. The drawings were restored to the original issue state under my supervision and the municipal building department permitted the construction to resume.

Apparently the Architect was not familiar with what I consider the "right and wrong" of professional conduct, for I do consider his action as "wrong"! If you, in light of the Code of Ethics and the Registration Code, consider this to be a "wrong" action, please condense the circumstances and send a MEMO to all registrants.

If this Architect considers it proper to change the sealed designs of Engineers without consulting or notifying them of his intent and actions, simply because his seal is on the sheet also, then other less informed registrants may be doing this, too.

- 1. This is a complicated structure and requires an experienced contractor familiar with this type of construction. I was told that the shell itself was to be constructed by one of two contractors experienced in this field. The names of these two contractors were designated; however, neither one of these contractors were awarded the job.
- Although the contractor awarded the job might be competent enough to construct this project, it is my opinion that there is a lack of experience.
- 3. The project involves too much risk on both our parts.

Please return our structural drawings as soon as possible.
